# "Superfund" Site Continues to Raise Concerns with Verona Citizens, Part 2

This is part two of a series. Part one can be found in last week's issue of the Advertiser.


After ProPublica's analysis was released, Verona City Mayor Joseph Heck started asking questions and demanded government agencies look into the toxic air pollution and increased cancer risk within the city.

"I started doing my own research and I contacted the EPA with my concerns." said Mayor Heck. "We're a small town and to hear about these chemicals and what they are doing, its just not normal to sit and talk about chemicals like that here. I didn't even know what Ethylene Oxide was."

Ethylene Oxide, the chemical in question, is a known carcinogenic to humans by inhalation route of exposure. Evidence in humans indicate that exposure to the chemical increases not only the risk of Lymphoid females.

After Heck demanded officials look into the BCP facility, the Department of Health and Senior Services launched a cancer study in March of this year and the data released just a few months later confirmed what Heck and citizens of the community had already suspected. Between 1999 and 2018, seventeen individuals were diagnosed with Non-Hodgkins Lymphoma in the 65769 zip code, which has a population of 2,979.

According to an EPA inspection report, EPA Compliance Inspector Lorenzo Sena, along with two other EPA compliance officers, arrived at the facility on June 7, unannounced, for inspection to determine if the facility was in compliance with the Clean Air Act and to investigate a spill of over 1,200 pounds of ethylene oxide which occurred while an ethylene oxide railcar was being Cancer, but Breast Cancer in emptied into storage tanks

on a north loading platform in April of this year. The inspection report showed sixteen deficiencies were found over the two days EPA com-

pliance inspectors were at the facility. This inspection raised even more concerns

# Missouri Republicans Have Historic Night

Tuesdays election made state history for the GOP. Come January 2023, Republicans will hold supermajorities in the Missouri House, Senate, as well as occupying all state-wide elected offices with Scott Fitzpatrick as the

new state auditor and presuming Governor Parson appointments of attorney general and state treasurer are Republicans. 111 of the 163 members of the House and 24 of the 34 members in the Senate will soon be filled by members of the red party.

Eric Schmitt took the U.S. Senator seat by 55.4% statewide (77.82% locally); Barry County local, Scott Fitzpatrick won 59.4% of the votes statewide (84% locally); and Eric Burlison swept the House District 7 position by a landslide, earning 70.9% of the votes statewide (80.67% locally).

County wide unofficial results show the follow candidates ran unopposed: State Representative District 158 Scott Cupps, Associate Circuit Judge Division 1 Johnnie Cox, Associate Circuit Judge Division 2 Robert Foulke, Presiding Commissioner Steve Blankenship, County Clerk Joyce Ennis, Circuit Clerk Craig Williams, Recorder of Deeds Danielle Still, Treasurer Gretta Tripp, Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx, and Collector of Revenue Skyler Bowman.

Of the five states nationwide, Missouri, Arkansas, North Dakota, South Dakota and Maryland, which had recreational marijuana amendments on the ballot, only two states passed. Missouri and Maryland will be added to the list of states approving recreational sale of marijuana in the coming year. Locally, Barry County residents responded with a heavy "No" to Amendment 3 by 68.41%, but statewide, voters were almost equally divided with the "Yes" taking a narrow win by 53.1%.

# **Local Group dedicated to Veteran Mental Health**

"Our motto is 'To serve those who have already served," says Scott Hettinger, leader of Charlie 22 Outdoors, a local veterans group dedicated to "show the meaning and grace that only comes from God," and help veterans through their mental health struggles. "We battle the PTSD and demons our military personnel face everyday."

Hettinger states that one of the greatest issues veterans face is struggling alone with fraying mental health. According to a CDC statement from June of this year, it is estimated that of the 130 suicides per day in 2021, 17 were veterans. However, Hettinger states that some estimates of daily veteran suicide are as high as 44, upon considering acts that aren't direct suicide, but substance abuse leading to eventual death. Individuals in this state may be at risk of putting themselves in deadly situations, with little care for their own health or safety.

"One a day is too many," Hettinger states. Signs to notice, he says, are: "If you notice somebody that is withdrawn, reclusive - they show signs of anxiety or depression, or they make statements that show a reason to be concerned: 'Why do I need to live, 'Why am I here?' It's different for everybody,

Hettinger states that there is an application process for the events that are held nationwide to determine "who could benefit most from coming to an event." These events can be one to four days, and are meant as retreats to bring one closer to who they want to become, as well as to their community. Hettinger says that these issues of PTSD and other challenges that military personnel face are best faced surrounded by those one trusts and can relate to.

Though the program is faith-based, the retreats aren't always to churches. "Church can take place on a boat in the ocean. Church for us is getting the men and women together and letting them heal together. To let the veterans get together with their family and their friends - when they can relate to each other, it's healing. The last two years, I've noticed that every event has been returning veterans coming back to be a part of it, and to help it go forward. To see the veterans take ownership in this ministry - that's what we want, they're like family." Activities the groups do include hunting, fishing, sailing, golfing, horse therapy, and similar outdoor activities to recover communally, including events hosted at Roaring River State Park.

Hettinger states that one of the difficulties arising due to the organization paying for travel expenses and lodging is that of finances, and thus, Hettinger states that "prayer, volunteers, and donations," are what the organization needs most.



and other agencies started paying attention to the Superfund site and how the facility deficiencies could be affecting employees and citizens in the community.



bottle or a wine of inferior quality" to be "shot at sunrise without benefit of clergy."

It included an emergency clause that would immediately put the measure into effect after passage due to the presence of "A matter of grave dispute among some of our best citizens...and there being no adequate means to settle the controversy."

The individual who tried to pass off an inferior vintage was never identified.



# Turkey hunters check 1,846 birds during fall firearm season

Preliminary data from the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that hunters checked 1,846 turkeys during Missouri's fall firearms turkey season, Oct. 1-31. Top harvest counties were Franklin with 70 birds harvested, Gasconade with 52, and Laclede with 50.

They will then be mailed a feather submission packet, including a postage-paid return envelope to submit feathers at no cost. 

# Cassville falls to Reeds Spring in district semifinal

The Cassville Wildcats battled top-seeded Reeds Spring to a draw for three and a half quarters before falling to the Wolves in a Class 3 District 6 semifinal on Saturday, 14-7. The Wildcats could not overcome five turnovers in a game that spilled over from Friday night into Saturday afternoon thanks to a persistent lightning storm.

Despite moving Friday's opening kickoff to 5 p.m. at Reeds Spring, officials made the call to suspend play early in the second quarter with the Wolves leading 7-0.

It was a game that the Wildcats were glad to abandon, after seeing both of their possessions to that point end with interceptions by James

The Wolves also had an early turnover, when Blandy Burall's first pass of the game was intercepted by Garrett Ewing. But the Wolves claimed an early 7-0 lead when Preston Blubaugh escaped for a 50-yard scoring run late in the first quarter.

The Wildcats responded, driving from their own 38yard line deep into Reeds Spring territory. On the twelfth play of the drive, Bodee Rose found Ewing open for a 24-yard gain down to the 2-yard line. That would be the final play of the night. With lightning in the area, officials stopped play, and the game was suspended with 8:50 left in the half.

Eighteen hours after the opening kickoff, Rose wedged into the end zone, and Peter Littlefield's PAT tied the score at 7-7, a score that would last until halftime.

Just like Friday's opening sequence, the two teams traded interceptions to start the third quarter. Starting at the Reeds Spring 48-yard line after the Jake Anthonysz theft, the Wildcats drove in-

side the red zone. But on a crucial 4th-and-1 at the 17-yard line, Moses Barr - a 6-5 and 270 pound anchor dumped Trey Wilson for no gain.

After the teams traded punts to end the third quarter, the Wolves drove 80 yards in 8 plays to retake the lead. Blubaugh keyed the drive with another 50-yard run, and then scored on a 6-yard burst to give Reeds Spring a 14-7 lead with 8:42 remaining.

Needing a touchdown and PAT to keep the season alive, Cassville's last three possessions ended with a punt, a fumble, and an interception.

The clock expired with Reeds Spring clinging to that 14-7 lead.

The Wildcats ended their season with a 5-6 record. Reeds Spring improved to 8-2 and will host Osage in the district championship game

buses at no cost to the district. The grant money also allows the district to purchase infrastructure needed to keep the buses running.

The district anticipates the new buses will be delivered to Wildcat Nation in 12-18 months.

"Receiving 5 new buses to our current fleet is a big deal for our district," said Jake Kloss, Cassville R-IV Transportation Director. "The additional buses will allow us to put new buses on routes that typically use older buses."

After the arrival of the new buses, the district will train with both the local fire department and EMS to educate safety personnel about the new vehicles. Kloss also reported that additional training will be provided to the district transportation



# CHS SADD hosts UNITE's **Arrive Alive Tour and Assembly**

The Missouri Department of Transportation teamed up with UNITE's Arrive Alive Tour and visited the Cassville High School campus on Friday, November 4.

UNITE's Arrive Alive Tour is the nation's number-one ranked drunk and distracted driving simulator in the country. The state of the art simulator allows participants to drive while distracted, drunk, or drugged in a fully functional vehicle without moving or being intoxicated

Senior Dulce Rivera participated in the marijuana impaired driving simulation. When asked how she felt after using the simulation for marijuana impaired driving, she said, "I find it scary that some of my peers could be driving this way. That someone's poor decision can affect other's lives."

Missouri Highway Patrol Corporal Sam Carpenter was also available with a seat belt convincer. A seat belt convincer is an inclined seat, equipped with a seat belt, that replicates a 5 mph crash. Freshman Logan Marple was shocked after her turn on the convincer, "The impact is alot harder than I was expecting.

It is a reminder to put my seat belt on every time."

Later in the day SADD Advisor Trevor McLaughlin headed an assembly that focused on "buckle up, phones down" and the affects of distracted driving. A video was shown, "Faces of Distracted Driving", which highlighted the story of Casey Feldman, a young woman whose life was lost too soon due to distracted driving. Retired Missouri Highway Patrol Sargent John Lueckenhoff also spoke with students during the assembly regarding the importance of not driving distracted and wearing a safety device.

Luekenhoff pointed out that as of November 4, there were 842 traffic crashes in the state of Missouri. In 2021, 1,016 people died in traffic crashes and 60% were not wearing a safety device. Studies show that 1/2 of those individuals would be alive today if they had buckled up.



# How you feed hay this winter is more important than ever

With a shortage of standing forage for cattle and the low availability of hay, it is more important than ever this winter to reduce waste when feeding hay.

Hay waste is normal, but it can be controlled and minimized, said University of Missouri Extension agronomy specialist Tim Schnaken-

There can be considerable loss when livestock producers feed large round or square hay bales, Schnakenberg said. Research shows that losses from improper feeding

of hay bales can be as high as 40%, depending on how hay is presented to the cows, he said. Feeding losses may be more typically around 10% to 20%. A 20% loss can make a \$60 bale of hay cost \$72 by the time it is fed.

Some believe hay can make great bedding for cattle and calves during cold weather. While true, it makes for some very expensive bedding, Schnakenberg said. Even poor-quality hay this year was expensive to roll up.

"There are several methods producers can use

to minimize losses when feeding round bales," said Schnakenberg. At the very least, use a bale ring to restrict full access to the hay and minimize cattle stomping on hay and making bedding out of it. In one MU study, using rings kept losses to about 5% whether feeding a one-day supply or a sevenday supply of hay. Rings or racks are crucial for producers who do not choose to feed cattle on a daily basis, he

"Be sure to purchase enough rings so all cows can eat at the same time," Schnakenberg said. "If you have 50 cows and your rings have 10 spaces for feeding, five rings are needed. If you do not have adequate space, the aggressive cows crowd out the timid cows, forcing them to eat lower-quality

The type of feeder can make a big difference in the degree of hay loss. Studies on types of ring feeders by MU, Oklahoma State University and Michigan State University found very similar results when feeding grass hay. In the MU study, an openbottom ring feeder resulted in a 20% loss of hay. A sheeted-bottom ring feeder had a 13% loss, and a cone feeder resulted in only a 5% loss. The studies found that having a sheeted ring around the base made a huge difference in all cases.

While cone feeders are much more expensive, they can be worth it in the long run, Schnakenberg said. "If you can drop hay losses 8%-15%, that extra cost starts to be made up in hay remaining for cow consumption. These feeders also have a longer life, support heavier bales and have been found to keep cattle from pulling hay off the top and dragging it into the mud. Since they have a longer life, you can spread the investment of that feeder out over more animals."

One of the best ways to reduce losses is to feed hay in small amounts. This gives cattle less opportunity to trample hay and make it unappealing for consumption. This requires some calcula-

tions of how much hay per animal is needed, factoring in potential losses associated with your feeding method. There are some who will unroll hay every day or even twice a day, making cows finish all the hay before they get more. This is the most efficient way to feed hay, but it takes more labor.

Bale unrollers are quite popular, and some producers use bale choppers that leave windrows of hay on the ground. These approaches work very well for distributing manure around the farm by moving the hay feeding to different locations each day. The practice also allows both aggressive and timid cows to eat together more efficiently. The losses can vary greatly from farm to farm depending on how this practice is done.

"If producers use these methods, it is imperative to not feed more hay than your cows can consume in a day," Schnakenberg said. Otherwise, hay losses may be more than 40%, according to one MU study. In this case, seven days of hay was unrolled. In comparison, daily amounts fed at one time resulted in about a 12% loss in that study.

Finally, it's very important to feed in a well-drained area. A pad or an elevated surface for feeding is best. Keeping the area dry helps with body condition. "It has been determined that cow body condition can begin to drop in 8 inches or more of mud," Schnakenberg said. "The most recommended way is to move the feeding area around the farm to better distribute manure and minimize excess mud."

# Pastures, goats benefit from grazing on invasive species

Cattle don't like eating sericea lespedeza, an invasive species in Missouri pastures.

www.mcknightauctionco.com Ralph McKnight Dwight Crume But goats do, according to research at the University of Missouri's Land of the Osages Research Farm in central Missouri.

MU Extension forage specialist Harley Naumann found that goats are also getting a health benefit from sericea lespedeza.

"It works as a natural anti-parasitic," said Naumann. This is because of the condensed tannins produced by the plant.

At the end of the first year of the study, he found as much as a 51% decline in fecal egg counts, using no dewormers or other medications.

While one season of grazing didn't decrease the invasive species, Naumann said it increased both warm- and cool-season grasses. In addition, the grazing decreased the presence of less desirable plants such as sedges.

"We are trying to promote some of our native warm-season grasses that we initially established in these fields that have been overrun by sericea lespedeza," he said. "Primarily big bluestem and Indian grass. But cool-season grass species such as tall fescue responded favorably, too."

Cattle do not like to graze on sericea lespedeza because of the bitter taste and the woody stems in mature plants. But goats seem to like the taste and have no problems chewing the woody



3 teaspoon kosher salt

1 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper

6 cups beef broth, divided 3 teaspoon balsamic vin-

3/4 cup pomegranate juice 3 tablespoon tomato paste tablespoon

minced 3–6 tablespoon olive oil (or avocado)

1 1/2 large yellow onion, diced

9 celery stalks, sliced

9 carrots, peeled and sliced

6–9 russet potatoes, cut into 3 inch chunks

24 oz baby bella mushrooms, sliced (optional)

3 cup frozen peas

3 tablespoon cornstarch

Place cut up venison meat into a medium bowl and sprinkle with salt and pepper; toss to coat. Set aside.

Add beef broth (reserve 1/2 cup), balsamic vinegar, pomegranate juice, tomato paste and garlic to slow cooker. Whisk or stir to combine.

Bring a large cast iron skillet to medium/high heat and add oil to pan; swirl to

Add venison to the pan and sear pieces on all sides, about 2-3 minutes. Remove from pan and place in the slow cooker along with the onions, potatoes, carrots and celery.

Add the remaining 1/2 cup beef broth to the cast iron skillet to deglaze the pan; use a metal spatula to scrap the bits off of the bottom then pour the broth and bits into the slow cooker.

Cover the slow cooker and cook on LOW for 7-8 hours or HIGH for 4-5 hours.

Scoop out approximately 1 cup of broth in a glass measuring cup. Add the cornstarch to the broth and whisk to combine. Pour back into the slow cooker, stir to combine. Add in the peas and mushrooms (if using), stir and cover again. Let cook another 10-15 minutes on HIGH as it thickens.

Taste and add additional salt or pepper, as desired.

Serve and enjoy!

# Homemade Venison Jerky

- 4 pounds venison
- 2 teaspoons freshly ground black pepper
  - 2 teaspoons chili powder
  - 2 teaspoons garlic powder 2 teaspoons onion powder
- 1 teaspoon Hungarian hot paprika, more if you want it
  - 1 teaspoon liquid smoke
  - ¼ cup packed brown sugar
  - ½ cup soy sauce
  - ¼ cup teriyaki sauce
- cup Worcestershire  $\frac{1}{2}$ sauce
- 3 tablespoons hot sauce (or to taste)

Trim fat from venison (if there is any) and slice into 4-inch strips. The venison pieces should be between 1/4 and 1/2 inch thick. It is easier to slice the venison if it is partially frozen. Pound meat lightly and set aside.

Combine rest of ingrediits and mix well. Pour this marinade over the venison strips. Cover and refrigerate overnight.

In the morning, line cookie sheets with foil. Place venison strips on sheets - do not overlap meat.

Preheat oven to 150-175 degrees, or the lowest temperature it has. Bake for 3 hours; turn venison strips over and bake for an additional 3 hours. Venison jerky is cooked when meat is dried out. Enjoy.

She also states she felt lucky to attend the event in the state capitol, an opportunity she doubts she would have been afforded other-


