Barry County named MU Extension County Council of the Year

Hunger and lack of reliable access to fresh food are significant challenges for families in Barry County in southwestern Missouri.

The community ranked these issues at the top of a needs assessment by the University of Missouri Extension Council in Barry County. Those results spurred the council to develop the Barry County Community Garden Project in Cassville, a community-wide plan to improve food access and support the local food pantry.

The Barry County Extension Council has helped 12 families establish 34 garden plots this year. The council has coordinated with organizations and businesses, including MU Extension and Master Gardeners, to deliver nutrition and gardening classes and environmentally sustainable practices to the whole community.

Barry County was named the winner of the inaugural MU Extension County Council of the Year award for its work.

The organization provides a variety of services and programs which address the medical needs of children within a 32 county area of Southwest Missouri and North Central Arkansas. Some of the services

include assistance with medical bills, travel and lodging for appointments, medical equipment, and a mobile health clinic which visits rural schools. CMNH also funds the purchase of pediatric equipment and supplies for various departments within the CoxHealth system, and safety education programs through the Trauma Services Department.

Assistant Executive Director for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals Julie Conway said the telethon is key to spreading awareness of the importance of



helping children and families in the Ozarks, so the children can achieve their greatest potential.

"I have met so many families in my work here and each has a unique story which touches your heart and makes you realize how important organizations like CMN are to people in the Ozarks," Conway said.

Conway has served as the Assistant Executive Director for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals for five years and has watched the Miracle Week Telethon annually since its inception in 1986.

"You never know when you will be the person needing help and how important it is to have resources like CMN in the community," Conway said. "We are a safety net to help people who fall through the cracks."

Regional Publisher Mandy Farrow said it is an honor for the publications to partner with Children's Miracle Network, expressing the importance of spreading awareness for the organization.

"We're excited to be a part of an effort to raise money and awareness for the Children's Miracle Network," Farrow said. "So many families in our area have benefited from their efforts and we want to help by supporting the telethon. We hope our community will see the benefits of the telethon and support it."

In 2022, Children's Miracle Network Hospitals distributed needed funds to thousands of children and their families through multiple grants and services including the following.

Special Needs Fund (2,477 Children)-Funding for family assistance needs such as wheelchairs, leg braces, prescription medications, travel expenses, etc.

Family Care Grants

(42 Children)- Funding for CoxHealth hospital bills including, but not limited to, physical therapy, occupational therapy and

speech therapy.

Community Grants
(199,754 Children)Funding for various areas including, but not limited to, outreach programs that promote child safety and health.

CoxHealth Program Grants (32,279 Children)- Funding for the CARE Mobile, Child Life, etc.

Discretionary Funds (673 Children)- Funding for miscellaneous needs that impact the health and welfare of children.

CoxHealth Grant Funding (60,246 Children)- Distribution and Departmental grants primarily for CoxHealth departments serving pediatrics.

Conway said the statistics are estimates of the number of children served during the 2022 calendar year, and there are a significant amount of roll over numbers of children not counted, for equipment purchased in previous years which are still used on a daily basis.

 Wear safety glasses to protect your eyes from sawdust, pine needles and other debris.

• When operating a trimmer or chainsaw, you'll need ear protection, shoes with slip-resistant soles, chaps and gauntlets.

• If you use a ladder, tie it off to a secure location. Never go anywhere near a power line with a ladder, especially a metal one.

• Be aware of anyone on the ground. It's best to have a spotter watch for people who might wander into your worksite.

"The MU Extension Council in Barry County's work embodied the central role councils have in identifying local opportunities and challenges agriculture, around economic opportunity, education, and health; engaging local communities and representative voices; connecting MU Extension with local partners; and supporting initiatives that create measurable, lasting impact," said Chad Higgins, MU interim vice chancellor for extension and engagement.

After the county-wide needs assessment and the decision to develop a community garden project in the county seat of Cassville, the Barry County council looked to the Shell Knob Victory Garden, established during the Covid epidemic, as a model. "We also had to identify the barriers and how, as a community, we could overcome those," said council member Lainey Harvick.

"Our council did a really good job of keeping things moving forward and making sure there wasn't anything in the way. If there were any barriers, people worked together to move them back," Harvick said. "We really wanted to build partnerships and relationships and have the community completely involved in this project."

With support from council members and local partners — including Barry Electric, Barry County Ready Mix LLC, the City of Cassville, AireServ, Flat Creek Excavation, 7 Valleys Vineyard LLC, and Harvick Farms — the council secured land, a water source, and help to supply mulch, soil, fertilizer, and garden tools. Additional sponsors, including the local community college, helped offset costs for participants who signed up for the 34 garden plots — double what the council had initially aimed for. Volunteers, sponsors,

The council approved the project in March, just before spring planting.

"With volunteers, including council members, we were able to get the gardens going quickly," Harvick said. "Participants had a whole season to get involved in education classes and for us to build relationships and have community outreach in process."

The council engaged University, Lincoln local entrepreneurs, the Missouri Prairie Foundation, and other partners to offer 13 classes on various topics, including safe canning, beekeeping, sourdough bread baking, and invasive plant species control.

Lorin Fahrmeier, MU Extension partnership and council development director, who helped coordinate the County Council of the Year contest, said, "It's amazing to see what can happen when community members pull together for a common cause."

Finalists for the inaugural MU Extension County Council of the Year award were selected from each of MU Extension's eight regions. Finalists presented their pitches to judges in a virtual session on Oct. 17. The winner and finalists were recognized on Oct. 24 at the 2023 **UM System Extension** and Engagement Week awards luncheon in Columbia.
