Settlement reached in massive Tyson fish kill

After a massive fish kill in May of last year, Tyson Foods in Monett was charged by Missouri Attorney General Chris Koster, and this week, Koster reached an agreement with Tyson for damages. The damages in total that Tyson is responsible for paying for totals \$539,898.

Tyson will pay the state of Missouri upwards of \$163,000 for natural resource damages, as well as \$110,000 in civil penalties, reimbursements to the Missouri Department of Natural Resources \$11,000, and \$36,000 to the Missouri Department of Conservation. Also part of the settlement is the contingency that Tyson will replace a bridge at Farm Road 1050 in Lawrence County over Clear Creek that has prevented fish from moving in the stream.

Koster sued Tyson in June after a large investigation linked the company to the killing of at least 100,000 fish in Clear Creek. Investigations linked high ammonia levels that killed the fish to Tyson in Monett discharging wastewater containing an animal feed supplement called Alimet from the Aurora facility into the Monett sewer system. Monett's wastewater treatment facility was not able to process the contaminants.

Tyson released a statement saying, "We deeply regret the incident in Clear Creek, near Monett, Missouri, his past May. We've

worked diligently and cooperatively with state and other authorities to make things right, including entering into a settlement agreement with the state. Tyson Foods' core values include serving as stewards of the environment - in Missouri and every community where we operate - and we take that obligation seriously."

Koster noted, "The agreement gives the state of Missouri the authority to inspect the Monett and Aurora facilities at any time to check for compliance with the law and monitor the progress of all activities required under the agreement."

Koster also said that Tyson has taken steps to prevent similar incidents, including:

- New requirements and practices to prevent, monitor and respond to animal-feed releases at its corporate feed mills
- Additional training on hazardous waste and water discharge for personnel at the Monett and Aurora facilities,
- A new company-wide environmental operating procedure that focuses on storage practices for feed mill chemicals,
- A summit of all managers at all of its operations in Missouri to conduct a comprehensive review or environmental issues at those plants.

Koster said that fish are returning to Clear Creek after the incident.

City, school board filings close for April 7 Election

Filings closed yesterday, January 20, for the open positions with the city and school board positions throughout Barry County. Each city and school board position had openings during the election, but most races did not draw challengers for the seats opening.

The city of Cassville race drew opponents for the alderman positions, however, mayor Bill Shiveley will run unopposed in the election. For the north ward position, incumbent Ann Hennigan will face opponent Jon Horner. South ward incumbent Jan Anthony also refiled for her seat and faces one opponent, Cindy Carr.

The Seligman race will also be an interesting one

to watch with almost every position contested. Current mayor Jerry Montgomery will face two opponents for his seat, Belva Stepp and Joe Foster. For the council positions, the west ward incumbent Eric Freeman initially refiled, but pulled his name yesterday. For the west ward position, the only name on the ballot will be Bob Hughes. For the east ward position, incumbent Ron Corn will face challenger Ralph Marshall for the seat. One other west ward seat also has an opening, but the election will be only for a one-year term due to the passing of council member Shirley Beaver last year. Michael Avers is serving out the remainder of Beaver's term and also has his name on the ballot for the next year for the seat.

The remaining cities' races have no opposition to the seats on the ballot. In Exeter, south ward incumbent Rhonda Scott, north ward incumbent Jimmie Morse, and mayor Rusty Reed all run unopposed. In Purdy, incumbents mayor Steve Roden and second alderman Wayne Rupp run unopposed, as well. However, for the first alderman position, Robert Moser did not seek reelection, and Bo Prock filed for that council

In the Washburn race, mayor John Tiedeman and council members Mary Roller and Jeremy Johnston all refiled for their seats with no opposition. The one-year term vacant council seat did not have anyone

file for it.

Wheaton's three incumbents mayor David Shockley, east ward alderman Gary Bates and west ward alderman Naomi Young all run unopposed.

In the school board races, Cassville and Purdy will be determined by the April election. Cassville incumbents John Sullivan and Carolyn Bowen face opponents Wade Hermansen and Dale Phelps. Purdy's incumbents Ken Terry and Randy Henderson drew one opponent, Carla Schad.

Southwest incumbents Danny Dalton and Robert Catron face no challengers, nor to Exeter's board members Sammy Hudson and Mitch Sorensen. Wheaton incumebnt Bobby Banks refiled, but the other incumbent, Doug Goostree, did not refile. Kenvin Schlessman also filed for the board. Finally, in Shell KNob, incumbents Robert (Bob) Stewart and Jackie Backes refiled for their seats on the board with no opponents.

As of time of press, Butterfield's filing information was not available.

According to county clerk Gary Youngblood, Missouri State law states that there is the possibility that some districts may opt not to put their openings on the ballot if certain conditions are met. If the number of positions open and the number of candidates who file are equal, it is not required that it be place on the ballot.

Cassville's DWI crackdown a success

Declaring Cassville Police Department's participation in the nation's annual "Holiday DWI Crackdown" substanceimpaired driving campaign a success, the Cassville Police Department reported that no substance-impaired driving arrests or other significant arrests were made. The department reported that nine vehicles were stopped and one citation was issued during the enforcement period, which ran from December 12, 2014 to January 1, 2015.

"I am proud of our Officer's for their hard work and dedication to making our area roadways safer," said Dana Kammerlohr, Cassville Chief of Police.

"Substance-impaired driving is more than a reckless choice by a few individuals," Said Kammerlohr. "Each year, substance-impaired driving costs the lives of thousands on America's highways. In 2014, 223 people died in Missouri crashes involving impaired drivers. "That worked out to about to approximately one impaired driving fatality every 1 ½ days."

There were seven people killed and 69 seriously injured over the counting period for New Year's 2013 (6:00 pm, Dec. 31 to midnight Jan. 5). Two of the fatalities and nine of the serious injuries involved a substance-impaired driver.

The Cassville Police Department joined forces with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration and nearly 10,000 law enforcement agencies across the country in this year's "Holiday DWI Crackdown" campaign.

County, City sales tax holding its upward trend

Entering into the first month of 2015, sales tax proves to be holding steady in the upward trend of 2014. Both the county and city of Cassville finished the year strong with significant increases in sales tax revenue over previous years.

Taxes collected in Cassville during the month of December, which is received in January, was a 33.70 percent increase over 2014's revenue. Cassville received \$39,132.65, an increase of \$9,872.39 over last year for

the general one-cent tax. The city's new transportation sales tax also brought in \$27,980.19 which will be used to repair and resurface

Barry County's sales tax increase over last year was \$25.76 percent increase. This year, the county collected \$164,222.71, which \$33,643.68 over last year's \$130,579.03 for the half-cent general revenue sales tax. Revenue collected for all of the county's general revenue sales tax was \$204,457.47.

Crowder continues to expand in Cassville

Crowder College has a rich history in the Barry and surrounding counties communities. What began as a small college in Neosho in 1963, eventually spread to include five campuses as well as classes in various towns in nine different counties. Unofficial results for the Cassville campus were that 405 students were enrolled for the spring 2015 semester.

For 50 years, Jim Tatum, a prominent motor vehicle and farm implement dealer at Anderson, was president of the Crowder College Board, driving much of the effort to expand and provide higher education options to more rural communities in southwest Missouri. For many, Tatum was considered a guiding star of the college's initiative. Today, that initiative has grown to campuses in Neosho, Nevada, Webb City, Cassville and Mc-Donald County.

Degree programs expanded and students were given many more options for completing their degrees to make them more employable without having to move to a more urban community.

The Cassville campus was established in 1999. Angela Seymour is the director of the Cassville campus, and the college has four full-time faculty and four half-time faculty, as well as 52 adjuncts.

The Cassville campus full time faculty include Mary Rogers, who teachers Communication Arts. Rogers has taught at the school since fall 2011 and was an adjunct at the school prior to that. She teaches English Composition 1 and 2, as well as Literature, Honors English and Developmental Writing.

David Jamieson is also fulltime and teaches Life Sciences. Jamieson started full-time in 2011 and was an adjunct before that. His classes include General biology, Anatomy and Physiology 1 and 2, and Microbiology.

Teri George is the school's full-time nursing professor. She teaches a variety of nursing courses and began full time in spring 2010.

The final full-time professor at Crowder is Sandra Wilson, who is the nursing coordinator and also teaches nursing courses. Wilson has been with the school since 2009.

Part-time faculty include Dr. Larry Quinalty, who teaches Communication Arts, Literature and Speech, Dr. Heidi Henderson, who teaches Psychology and Sociology, Kelli Stephens, who teaches College Orientation, College Success, and College Connections, as well as coordinating student activities, and George Remenar, who teaches Physical Science and Chemistry.

In all, the school also boasts another eight full-time staff and three half-time staff as well as students for the federal work-study program.

Seymour said that the Cassville campus has had a slight decline in students the last two years, which she attributes to a few different factors. Seymour said, "We opened a site for classes in Monett and another in Mt. Vernon, which draws several hundred students. The economy also contributes to enrollment. When the economy is poor, we see an increase in enrollment as individuals go back to school to increase skills to get into the work force. As the economy improves, enrollment decreases. Individuals are able to find more jobs, many of which are entry-level and do not need college degrees."

The Cassville campus currently offers full degrees in Business Administration, Criminal Justice, General Studies, History, Nursing, Psychology, Teaching and Social Work beginning this fall.



Mt. Vernon girls escape Cassville with 53-47 win

On Thursday, January 15, years of futility seemed about to end when the Lady Wildcats battled back to take a 26-24 lead over the visitors from Mt. Vernon halfway through the third quarter. That third period ended in a 33-33 tie, and then Mackenzie Farmer plowed a 13-point furrow in the fourth quarter that buried Cassville's upset hopes. The Lady Mountaineers pushed to a double-digit late lead and then hung on for the 53-47 victory.

It was an agonizing end for the Cassville faithful, a cruel finale to a great performance by the Lady Wildcats. But for a couple of missed opportunities, Cassville could have claimed its first win over Mt. Vernon since the Civil War. Okay, maybe since the Spanish-American

War. You get the idea. It has been a while since the Lady Wildcats have beaten the Green Machine.

The game started with Madi Stokes patrolling the lane and blocking a shot in the paint to set the tone for the Cassville defense. Raeghan Blisard and Brooke Fields scored back to back hoops to stake the Lady Wildcats to a 4-0 lead.

When Devyn Callahan flew down the hardwood and banged a fast break lay-up off the glass to give Cassville a 9-4 lead at the 3:01 mark, the crowd sensed that this could be the night to exorcise the demons. The Lady Mountaineers never led in the first period, and Makenzy Durossette's uncontested shot in the lane gave Chris Shore's girls a 14-8 lead at the first

Stokes fueled the Cassville effort, blocking four shots and controlling the boards. But when the big center took a breather, Mt. Vernon seized momentum, and reeled off a 13-0 run to finish the half with a 21-18 lead. Cassville managed only 4 points in the second quarter, and the turnover-prone Ladycats seemed on the verge of a TKO.

Lady Wildcats opened the third quarter with a quick 8-3 burst to claim a 26-24 lead at the 5:57 mark. Blisard and Kaleigh Gorski each scored two goals as Cassville regained the lead. Back to back treys by Maddi Brown and Farmer put Mt. Vernon back in front, but Blisard ended the quarter with a bucket and a free throw to earn a 33-33 tie at the final break.

"E-I-E-I-O"

The fourth quarter belonged to Farmer, Mt. Vernon's senior guard with the All State credentials. She scored the first 8 points of the period, single-handedly giving the Lady Mountaineers a 41-33 lead with 6:49 left to play.

The Lady Wildcats rallied to pull within 6 points twice, but trailed by 10 with just 43 seconds remaining.

Gorski drained a long three from the left corner to cut the lead to 52-45, then scored with an offensive board to pull Cassville within 6 at 53-47. But Farmer, who led all scorers with 22 and poured in 13 points in just the fourth quarter, dribbled out the last few seconds and Mt. Vernon held on for the close Big 8 Conference win.
