## **Investigation of Cassville Fires Still Ongoing**

According to Cassville Police Chief Dana Kammerlohr, three fires over the past two months have been declared arson. Due to the February 20 structure fire at Pop's Pipes on Highway 76, Pop's Pipes was later declared a total loss, and the two adjoining businesses suffered smoke and water damage.

A recent Facebook post from the Cassville Police Department states that "The Cassville Fire Protection District has also reported a rash of trash dumpster and vacant property fires in the Cassville

Additionally, responding to three separate fires in a 12 hour timeframe is uncommon for local fire protection districts, though that is exactly what occurred on the night of March 16, according to Assistant Fire Chief Derek Acheson. The first was a brush fire in the middle of the night. These are common for this time of year, he says.

The second was at 4 a.m., and the call was "for an out building behind [the former] Motor Inn on Main Street.

"As crews were fighting that fire," states Acheson, "a second call came [at 4:26 a.m.] in for a fire on the corner of 5th and Mountain. It was an abandoned structure, no utilities hooked up."

When there is no power, nor utilities connected to a building, and the building is abandoned," Acheson says, these circumstances can lead to believing other causes may be at play.

"It's just worrisome," he says. "I know the police department and Division of Fire Safety are taking note to see where this all leads. There's no pattern in the fires, no real similarities. Normally, investigators look at the type of structure and other possible similarities, but if you get in a situation where the fire gets a head-start on you, that's generally where the evidence gets lost.

"If you see something, say something," he states, "what could seem like nothing to you could be a lot to the police."

If home owners or land owners notice any tampering with gates or locks of any kind, this could be valuable information.

"If something feels off, it may be. Gut feeling goes a long way."

## School Tax Bond Issues on the April 5 Ballot

New bond issues are going to be on the April 5 ballot, and if passed, these would grant large sums of money to two local schools for improvements and maintenance: Purdy and Southwest school districts.

Although the first glance may dissuade you from thinking it's cut and dry, this bond issue is quite simple to understand, however, according to Superintendent of the Purdy School District, Travis Graham. Funds that are granted to schools by popular vote, with no repercussion on taxes or their own income.

"School districts have the ability to access what are called General Obligation Bonds," states Graham, "which can bond up to 15%

of the district's assessed evaluation - so they're funds that the school district asks the community to access. That's why it's a no-tax-increase bond issue. It has no impact on the voter's pocketbook, tax levies, or anything - it just allows the school district to access funds to be able to do improvements on the school district."

This particular bond would "allow the school district to access \$3 million to further secure our entry ways, because as we look at our school distinct, we want our parents and stakeholders to know that this is a secure and safe environment. By redoing our entry ways, we're communicating to our staff, students, parents, and community, that we've got the most priceless commodity

here, your kids, and we're going to secure them in a safe environment that has monitored entry points. It will be a two-stage entry point," thus, says Graham, allowing only authorized individuals to enter the building via the doors only unlocking if a secretary allows them to.

standard guidelines. NFPA 1403 provides minimum requirements for conducting live fire training to ensure they are conducted in safe facilities and a safe manner for participants.

Cassville Fire Protection hosted Exeter Fire Protection District and Butterfield Fire/ Rescue for a live fire training session on March 15, focusing on fire behavior, flow paths and ventilation using a doll house. This training allowed firefighters to see how quickly a fire can grow when fire is provided with appropriate oxygen. They were also

able to study the behavior of fire and smoke in different stages.

Fire Chief Donnie Chadd, of Exeter Fire Protection District, stated, "Live Fire Training is beneficial because it helps you understand fire behavior. Every fire is a little different, so it's good to train for this type of thing. It is more in depth than what you can read in a text book."

As Fire Chief Chadd stated above, fire, as well as firefighters, react differently. The health and safety







who have culinary arts on their radar that experiential learning opportunity in the classroom.

"Our science room is outdated; we've got gas lines that don't work, sinks that don't work - so we've tasked our science teachers to explore what a science room looks like in the year 2022 and 2023. The feedback says flexibility. So, we'd really like to create a flexible learning space that would really allow for innovation in science lab experiments."

The fundamentals of operation, says Graham, are promoting "safety, security, and sustainability. Access to these funds would allow the

school district to really project into the future."

The Southwest school district has cast its gaze more in the direction of athletic improvement. Both Purdy and Southwest have circulated informational fliers, with structural plans laid out for public information. According to Shawn Johnson, softball coach for Southwest, the school plans to improve the baseball and softball experience with the construction of new fields, new fencing, dugouts, and backstops.

"It's for the kids," states Johnson, "not just the current kids, but for the kids coming up, it's a big thing. We want to get more things for the kids to help them more here." According to Johnson, students travel away from the school to practice trap shooting, but with the new improvements, they wouldn't have to leave the property.

"Our softball field is not regulation, it's about 165 feet in the left field - which it should be about 180, and the right field is 173. So, if we wanted, we could not host a district tournament here." If voted on, these issues could be solved, says Johnson. Additionally, the funds would allow a topper to be placed on the fields to prevent the brunt of rain-outs.

If funds allow, further improvements and maintenance will be completed in both schools.



## MDC virtual program on sucker snagging

If you have heard about snagging for suckers and want to learn more about this unique form of fishing, circle April 6 on your calendar.

People wanting to find out more about snagging for suckers can learn more at the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) virtual program "Fishing Skills: Virtual Sucker Grabbing." This online program, which will be April 6 from 2:30-3 p.m., is being put on by the staff of MDC's Shoal Creek Conservation Education Center in Joplin. At this program, MDC

Administrative Specialist Tim Smith will provide information about this unique way of fishing for suckers and other nongame fish species. People can register for this program at: https:// mdc-event-web.s3licensing. com/Event/ EventDetails/ 183165 Snagging (also called grabbing) involves hooking a fish in an area other than its mouth. Missouri also has two snagging seasons for nongame fish; March 15 to May 15 and Sept. 15 to Jan. 31. Only species that are classified by Missouri's Wildlife Code as "nongame fish" are legal to be taken during these seasons. Suckers are main focus of these snagging seasons, but people also snag for carp, buffalo and other species of nongame fish.

At the April 6 online program, Smith will discuss the rods, reels, hooks and other gear needed for snagging season. He'll also discuss the regulations, techniques, and strategies of fish snagging. Though this program is

free, registration is required to participate. Use the link above. Registrants must provide an e-mail, so a program link can be sent to them. People can stay informed about upcoming programs at MDC's Shoal Creek Conservation Education Center and other nearby MDC facilities by signing up for text alerts and e-mail bulletins. #### Simple steps will make calving season easier and safer

If a cow feels threatened can quickly shift into flight or fight mode, and will run over whatever is in front of her in an attempt to get back to what she considered her safe area, i.e., where you weren't bothering her.

In order to focus on an object, a cow often moves its head up and down. When approaching a cow, come in from the side rather than using a direct linear approach. This can be less threatening to the cow. When moving toward a cow, move steadily toward it. Stopping and staying still is predatory behavior. Like people, every animal has a flight zone, similar to a person's comfort zone. Once you breach that zone, the cow instinctively shifts into flight or fight

"Cattle are prey animals," Fulton says. "They will easily feel threatened by anything that moves like a predator. At any time, but especially during calving, stay out of the cow's blind spots and move in sharp turns, what we like to call 'working in triangles' or 'zigzags,' because a predator moves in sweeping turns from side to side."

Cattle have strong herd instincts, and their natural tendency will be to return to the herd if they feel threatened when you are approaching. If you're bringing a cow in to pen-up, be sure to use a large opening with an alley that narrows as

she moves into the pen. This will help in guiding the cow to a specific space.

"First time heifers will be especially nervous the first time they calf," Fulton says. "They're already not sure what's going on with their body and when we ask them to do something or try segregate them from their herd mates, it adds to their stress levels. Take extra time with these first-time heifers."

In some instances. allowing a cow to have the calf outdoors and then moving mother and baby to a barn or shed may be the safest process for both mother and baby.

"You want to keep the cow's stress level as low as possible to prevent delays in labor," Fulton says. "Some cows may be greatly stressed when we try to move them inside to calve. If you feel that's the case, let them calve outside. Keep in mind that, once that calf is born, the cow's maternal instincts will be elevated, causing her to be very protective of the calf. Be aware of her demeanor and never turn your back on any mother cow."

Fulton emphasizes that safely calving during nighttime hours increases the importance of using safe livestock handling principles. Cattle have a natural instinct to move from dark areas to lighter areas, at any time of the day. Using adequate lighting that allows the cow to see what's in the area you're pushing her to will make moving her much easier.

"Because a cow's depth perception and ability to see contrasts is so poor, if you're moving an animal in the daytime and going from bright sunshine into a shaded area or a shed, she will more than likely balk," Fulton says. "Cows don't see shadows well. If they aren't sure what's in front of them, they may perceive that they're stepping off a cliff. Wherever you're working with a cow, make sure there's adequate lighting to help reduce these shadows, helping her to better see what you're pushing her toward."

Regardless of the season or calving location, Fulton advises producers to have a "get-away plan" in case a cow becomes aggressive. In either icy or muddy conditions, moving quickly may be significantly hindered. The last thing a producer wants is to get hung up on a gate or trip and fall and be pinned by the animal.

Keep family members informed of whereabouts during calving, especially at night in case you experience trouble and aren't able to summon help

"If you feel you'll be dealing with an aggressive cow, have a family member or neighbor with you to assist and ensure that you're able to handle her safely," Fulton

Thorough preparation prior to calving and staying focused on avoiding dangerous situations will help make calving season safe and profitable.



Saving calves during calving season is key to profitable operation. However, don't sacrifice your own safety in the process.

First things first, it is important to establish a Veterinary Client Patient Relationship (VCPR) with local veterinarian, the getting them acquainted with your operation and your cows. One of the worst things that can happen to a producer is needing a vet and not having one who's familiar with your operation. Keeping veterinarian contact information close at hand can help a beef producer take quick action when necessary.

"That way, if you need to call that vet at 2:00 in the morning, they have some idea of what to expect at your operation," Jesse Fulton, Extension Educator Director of Nebraska Beef Quality Assurance, says. "If you know a cow needs calving assistance or you suspect that they do, take every precaution not to get that cow agitated before the vet arrives. Increasing that



Minimize risk by diversifying your investments

Sometimes investing is like walking across a frozen farm pond. Interesting, but risky. Which also describes the current stock market with all its volatility. Interesting, but

Larry Burkett described a market environment similar to today's market in his book Preparing for Retirement. In it, he addressed the impact of inflation on bonds or other fixed-income investments.

"An inflationary cycle can easily erode the value of a long-term bond fund since interest rates on long-term bonds are locked in for years at a time.

"If the current interest rates rise (as they would in an inflationary period), the value of the bond fund declines.

"At that time, it would be advantageous to be able to switch over to a good stock fund. But in cycles where

the market is overvalued, stocks and stock funds can lose much of their equity, so a bond fund can help protect your assets." (Burkett; Preparing for Retirement)

When the future of the market is uncertain, the need for diversification is strongest. Market risk, interest income risk, and inflation risk can all be mitigated by simply diversifying. Your momma told you never to put all your eggs in one basket.

The Bible even gives wisdom about diversifying in Ecclesiastes where it says, "Give portions to seven, yes to eight, for you do not know what disaster may come upon the land."

Larry Burkett spoke about diversifying a \$100,000 investment portfolio. He said, "The one thing you should be able to achieve with more resources is greater diversification. If you will set a limit of say \$10,000 per investment (maximum), the risk will then be spread into ten different areas.

Even a loss of 50 percent

in any one investment would only dilute your assets by 5 percent."

(Burkett; Preparing for Retirement) I agree with his advice but would amend it to say you should limit investments to a 10% weighting in any given investment.

A diversified portfolio will look different for each person, but regardless of how it specifically looks, spreading your money out over a few different investments has its advantages.

One example is that it can reduce business segment (such as manufacturing, transportation, real estate, finance, etc.) or geographic volatility.

If a person is invested only in real estate, then they will feel the full effect of a downturn in the real estate market.

But if they only have 10% of their investments in real estate and there is a downturn, then they only feel the negative effect of the downturn in 10% of their invest-

Similarly, if a person was only invested in New Orleans-based companies before Hurricane Katrina, they would have felt a greater than normal negative effect of the hurricane.

I learned this lesson as a child trying to win a bet from my cousin. I bet him that I could cross my Poppy's frozen pond.

Even fat boys from Galena can cross the ice on a frozen pond; the secret is spreading your weight around (Don't do this at home!).

Just like I spread my weight out on that ice so I wouldn't fall through, it may help to spread out our investments, so our portfolios don't take a drastic hit.

Invest in investments that are in different types of businesses, located in different parts of the country, and are exposed to different kinds of


