Influential Woman of the Ozarks

Dr. Mary Jane Northcutt-Newman-Meredith, An Essay for Women's History Month

Barry County was the home for most of her life to Dr. Mary Jane Northcutt-Newman-Meredith, better known as Dr. Mary by her patients.

In honor of Women's History Month, I was asked to research Dr. Mary's story. At the time I am writing this I am 17 years old, which is the same age Dr. Mary was when she graduated from college to become a doctor. Dr. Mary was truly astounding with numerous accomplishments.

Dr. Mary was born March 1, 1914, in Exeter, to Walter Northcutt and Maude Mc-Mahan Northcutt, both locals to Southwest Missouri. She attended school in Rogers, Arkansas, Cassville, and Seligman, then attended the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville, where she graduated at the age of 17. She went on to attend the University of Arkansas School of Medicine in Little Rock, and earned her doctorate of medicine in 1937 at the age of 23. She was one of only two women to graduate in a class of 61, as well as the twelfth woman to graduate in the school's history.

Dr. Mary went on to Woman's Medical College in Philadelphia for her internship, then moved back to the Ozarks to live out her dream of being a doctor.

In 1938, Dr. Mary started her first practice in Eureka Springs, Arkansas with the assistance of her father. In the February 11, 1976, issue of the Barry County Advertiser, Dr. Mary was quoted as saying, "I was the doctor, nurse, receptionist and jani-

Later that year, Dr. Mary moved her practice to Cassville and shared space above the Rowland's Store, located



on the southwest corner of home near the high school, the square.

In 1940, after marrying Dr. George Newman, she moved her practice to the Barry County Hospital and Clinic, which was situated in the big William LeCompte

In 2002, the Board of Healing Arts issued her a tribute for being licensed to practice medicine in Missouri for over 60 years. Dr. Mary loved her work. Delivering babies was a highlight of her career and she had the privilege of delivering several

babies over the years.

Mary loved her community as much as she loved her work. In an interview from 1976, Mary said, "I never wanted to live anywhere else."

Mary served as President of the six-county Ozark Medical Society. She was one of two female doctors in the Ozark Medical Society in 1976. With Mary's field at the time mostly being filled by men, she has said that she was never discriminated against in her profession for being a woman. Although it did take a while for men to get used to a female doctor. Mary was an amazing, accomplished, and vivacious woman who loved her community.

"I am really proud of all of their hard work. They had never thought about using community service as their senior project," PCA teacher Victoria Robertson said. "They put this together start to finish and did all the legwork themselves."

Southwest R-V approves General Obligation Bond

The Board of Education of the Southwest R-V School District of Barry County approved a parameters resolution at a regular meeting on December 16, 2021, that authorized a final terms committee consisting of Danny Dalton, Board President; Tosha Tilford, Superintendent; and Larry J. Hart, CEO of L.J. Hart & Company. It approved the sale of \$895,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds to its Municipal Bond Underwriter, L.J. Hart & Company of St. Louis within certain reoffering yield ranges. On January 26, 2022, the final terms committee was able to lock in interest rates ranging from 0.650% to 1.300% compared to an average interest rate of 4.020% for the Series 2017 Bonds. Through this refinancing, the District reduces future interest expense by \$119,841. It is the result of the strong current municipal bond market that is producing interest rates near historical lows. This \$119,841 plus the savings of \$428,342

from previous refundings and prepayments means that the District has saved \$548,183 of interest expense since 1998.

Ms. Tilford expressed enthusiasm and support for the refunding option selected by the Board of Education. "This plan achieves significant savings and allows the District to capture better conditions in the municipal bond market for the benefit of our taxpayers. It also preserves considerable flexibility for the District for the April 5, 2022, election for the notax rate increase," Ms. Tilford remarked.

Neil Branham, Assistant Vice President of L.J. Hart

& Company of St. Louis prepared the refunding proposal and explained how it can fit into the long-range plans of the District. He mentioned that the three significant factors making the Series 2022 refunding attractive were the lower interest rates than in 2017, the fact that the Series 2017 Bonds are subject to prepayment at no penalty on March 1, 2022, and the District's ability to participate in the State of Missouri's Direct Deposit Program. This program makes it possible for the District to receive a "AA+" rating from S&P Global on the refunding bonds. Mr.



Branham complimented Ms. Tilford for her prompt and thorough preparations to supply the data necessary for the official statement, as well as the Board of Education for their foresight in making the Series 2017 Bonds callable in five years. The Series 2022 Refunding Bonds will have a five-year call feature of March 1, 2027, at no penalty.

The Series 2022 Refunding Bonds were made available to local financial institutions as part of the marketing procedure. The Freedom Bank of Southern Missouri agreed to purchase \$275,000, the Security Bank of Southwest Missouri committed to \$200,000, and Peoples Community Bank acquired \$420,000 of the Bonds as well. The closing for the Series 2022 Refunding Bond issue occurred on February 17, 2022. Ms. Tilford stated that she was pleased efforts were made to accommodate local investors. "It is great that our marketing procedures facilitated this local involvement while still receiving attractive interest rates. We appreciate the support of the Freedom Bank of Southern Missouri, Security Bank of Southwest Missouri, and Peoples Community Bank," Ms. Tilford replied. Several board members commended Ms. Tilford and L.J. Hart & "We are glad to be able to save \$119,841 of our taxpayers' money by taking advantage of the most favorable conditions in the municipal bond market Dalton.







The nursery provides not only vegetables, flowers, herbs,


shrubs, indoor plants, soil and mulch, but plans to bring in products from other local businesses so they can continue to support local small businesses.



Once again, the April election is right around the corner, and once again, the city is coming to the Cassville voters with its hand out begging for more tax dollars.

Most all of you will recall the 3/8 cent sales tax that was going to pave all the streets in Cassville in a mere seven years time frame? In fact, on 3/12/14, one of the local newspapers quoted Bill Shively as saying, "If the tax is passed, all revenues would be specifically earmarked for streets and transportation." Well, guess what? Seven years has come and gone, and during that time the city has collected more than 2.66 million dollars from this tax, yet I doubt that 5% of the streets in Cassville have been resur-

In April of 2017, an 11 million dollar bond issue was passed to upgrade the city's water and sewer system, but five years have gone by and they have yet to break ground on either of these projects. Because of such poor planning, I can assure you that the 11 million will be far from enough once the project does get underway. (If it ever does). Yet they are now asking for more money

by passing another tax.

At the same time, the county is asking for a 1/2 cent "law enforcement" sales tax, in addition to what they already collect. But how can we, as taxpayers, be certain that by passing this tax, the commissioners won't reduce funding that's already in place? It's a fact that the Sheriff's office is underfunded. It's a fact that we need a new jail. But the label of "law enforcement tax" covers a very broad range of agencies, varying from the criminal courts to the juvenile court. This makes me question how much of this tax will really go to the Sheriff's office to cover their shortfalls.

Last of all, if the county is to build a new jail, why would they build it on one of the last remaining partials of commercial land available? By doing this, they would be destroying any commercial prospect this property may have for the future. After all, how many retail shops can you think of that would want

to build near the county jail? Why not build the new jail on Gravel Street, right behind the judicial center? This would allow for an above ground walkway that would link the jail to the judicial center for the moving of prisoners, with the area between the judicial center and the jail available for parking. After all, the county already owns this property, so the saving would be significant. Please consider all of these issues thoroughly before you vote.

I recently took the time to contact the Missouri Department of Revenue regarding the amount of sales tax charged to people shopping in Cassville. The individual I spoke with sent an official print out of all the taxes that are in effect, and it really concerns me when I saw how frequent these taxes are in-

creased.

For instance, the State of Missouri has not increased it's sales tax in 32 years. Yet city and county increases are extremely frequent. In 2000, the city passed a 1/2 cent sales tax. In 2012, the county passed a 3/8 cent sales tax. In 2013, the county renewed an existing 1/2 cent sales tax. In 2014, the city passed a 3/8 cent sales tax. In 2020, the

city passed a 1/2 cent sales tax.

This is a total of 2 1/8 percent increase in sales tax rates just since the year 2000, all from local government. So I guess my question is, why can't the local government bodies be as frugal as the state is? Five sales tax increases since 2000 compared to no sales tax increases in 32 years by the state? Yet now, the county is asking we approve another 1/2 cent sales tax which will be on the next ballot, bringing the total increases since 2000 to a 2 5/8 per cent.

I am sure that the county needs a better jail, and that's obvious. But is this the way to address it? Many may say that costs have gone up, but you have to realize that as a parent, my costs go up in the same way.

Another thing I wish to bring up is the fact that increasing the sales tax hurts business. If I live outside the city, and I have a choice of shopping here in Cassville or going to Monett where the tax is less, I will go to Monett. I have to say that as a business owner and a parent, I can't support the proposed sales tax increase.

pounds of venison to the state's Share the Harvest program this past deer season, including 5,053 whole deer.

MDC and CFM also thank the participating meat processors throughout the state who grind the donated deer meat into ready-to-use packages, and the many sponsors who financially support the program.

Meat-processing fees are covered entirely or in part by numerous local sponsors, along with statewide sponsors that include Shelter Insurance, Bass Pro Shops, Feeding Missouri and MDC.

The donated deer meat goes to local food banks and food pantries to help feed hungry Missourians all around the state. To get Share the Harvest venison, contact local food banks or food pantries.

Share the Harvest is coordinated by MDC and CFM and is celebrating 30 years of helping to feed hungry Missourians. Since the program was started in 1992, it has provided nearly 5 million pounds of lean, healthy venison to help feed hungry Missourians, including this past season's donations.

River is in great shape. The level is 118 CFS at the moment, no rain in forecast, so it will continue to drop some everyday. The water is still murky, not muddy, just not 100% clear. Still, the dry fly fishing has been pretty good. Cadddis and BWO's every day, tricos every morning for a few hours. Blue wing olives, parachute adams, griffiths gnats, cracklebacks, elk hair caddis are all good dries to try right now. Pheasant tails, sow bugs, burlaps, copper johns and small black zebra midges are all working pretty good. 9' 6X leaders are great for nymphing, 7X on dries, and if you're fishing a bigger streamer, I'll use 5X or sometimes 4XGlo-balls. San juan worms, thread jigs, small john deeres, mega worms, and mop flies are all catching trout right now. Rooster tails will work if you fish them early and sometimes during the day black, brown, green have been good colors. When you fish any spinner, reel it in as slowly as possible, just fast enough to keep the blade spinning. Power bait is still a safe bet if you just want to catch a fast limit. The cheese yellow, orange, pink, and the white have been good colors in both eggs and worms. Marabou jigs in olive, black/yellow, white, brown, tan, and gray have been working well all week. Fishing the bigger 1/16, and 1/8 jigs seems to be working the best in zone 2; in zone 1, smaller is working a bit better, smaller micro style jigs are pretty good right now.

Good luck on the river this week, have fun.

Paddlefish season underway on Table Rock Lake

Spring paddlefish season began March 15, 2022, and will run through April 30, 2022, on Table Rock Lake.

Paddlefish, commonly known as spoonbills, due to their paddle-shaped snouts that account for upwards of a third of their body, are one of America's largest freshwater fish and can weigh more than one hundred pounds.

Since the first stock of fingerling paddlefish were introduced in Table Rock Lake by the Missouri Department of Conservation in 1972, paddlefish have become popular among anglers due to their speed and strength. They are commonly found in the upper reaches of the James River Arm within three miles of Flat Creek. Public access includes Cape Fair and Bridge Port in Stone County.

A new regulation change established a statewide minimum length limit of 32 inches-measured from eye to fork of tail- for sport/recreational taking of paddlefish, up from the previous minimum length of 24 inches. The existing minimum length limit of 34 inches-measured from eye to fork of tail-will remain in effect for Table Rock Lake.

A fishing permit is required, unless exempt. New regulations to Table Rock Lake are as follows:

The daily limit is two paddlefish, with the possession limit set at four paddlefish. No one can continue snagging after taking their daily limit of two paddlefish.

The Missouri state record for paddlefish changed hands and lakes on March 18, when Illinois man, Jim Dain (pictured right), snagged his 140 pounds, 10 ounces paddlefish from Lake of the Ozarks. The previous record of 140 pounds,

9 ounces, had been held since March 2015, by Andy Belobraydic, of Richwoods, from Table Rock Lake.
