Over Half a Pound of Meth Retrieved After Crash

After a crash on the night of April 9, nearly 3/3 of a pound of methamphetamine was allegedly discovered in the vehicle of Lawrence Gwinup, 43, of Cassville. Gwinup is now charged with eight felonies and two misdemeanors (unlawful use of a weapon, six counts of possession of drug paraphernalia, second-degree drug trafficking, second-degree property damage, and a DWI).

According to a probable cause statement filed by Barry County Deputy Michael Stribling, Gwinup's vehicle impacted a barbed wire fence on Farm Road 1145 and Farm Road 2180 at approximately 4:45 a.m. on April 9.

Upon contact with the police, Gwinup consented to the search of his vehicle by Stribling and Deputy James Myers. Stribling states this resulted in approximately 290 grams of methamphetamine being discovered in the vehicle, separated into a total of seven bags.

Additionally, Stribling and Myers allegedly found a Smith and Wesson SD40 handgun, several digital scales, a bong, as well as a glass pipe. At the time of this publication, Gwinup is being held on a \$50,000 cash-only bond and his next scheduled hearing is May 11 at 9:30 a.m.

Barry County Man Leads Police on Chase; Narcotics Recovered

According to a probable cause statement filed by Travis Wolfe, on the night of April 1, at around 10:48 p.m., Wolfe was observing traffic at the intersection of Highways 112 and 76, and noticed a blue pickup truck with a tail light out. The vehicle then quickly pulled into a gas station parking lot, Wolfe states. The vehicle then pulled out of the parking lot at a high rate of speed, heading for Roaring River State Park.

Wolfe activated his emergency light in an attempt to stop the vehicle, yet the vehicle allegedly pulled off the roadway and into a housing district in an effort to escape.

Wolfe pulled in behind the vehicle, and the driver continued south into Roaring River State Park. According to Wolfe, at the intersection of Highway 112 and Highway F, Missouri State troopers had placed spike strips, which successfully damaged the tires of the blue pickup. This caused the driver to nearly lose control of the vehicle before reaching Highway 86, via Highway F.

Approximately one mile before reaching Highway 86, the driver and passenger allegedly began throwing unknown items from the driver and passenger windows.

Upon reaching 86, Wolfe states, the driver attempted to head west, but could no longer maintain control over the vehicle after the tires had been so severely damaged. The driver attempted to turn, though the vehicle continued straight, leaving the roadway and high centering into a ditch on the north side of Highway 86.

The driver then allegedly exited the vehicle and attempted an escape on foot. Wolfe followed on foot,

alongside other members of state police. Upon being caught, the suspect was placed into custody, where Wolfe attempted to identify the individual.

The suspect would not cooperate, however, and according to Wolfe, began ceaselessly kicking the patrol vehicle door.

After departing the scene to transport the suspect, Wolfe states the suspect was identified as Jason Swift, 29, of Barry County. En route to the Barry County Jail, Swift allegedly claimed to be overdosing, and that he required medical attention. Wolfe requested EMS to meet them at the jail.

Upon arriving to the jail, Wolfe states he had to forcefully remove Swift from the vehicle and escort him, with Swift continuing to resist and pull away.

Swift was evaluated by

EMS, who determined he did not need further medical attention.

While at the jail, Wolfe was notified by another deputy that a large quantity of suspected methamphetamine and a small amount of marijuana were retrieved from Swift's vehicle's center console.

Presently, Swift is being held in the Barry County jail on a \$50,000 bond. Swift's next hearing is on May 11 at 8:30 a.m. with Judge Robert Foulke.

Morel Season is Upon Us

A common family tradition in Southwest Missouri households is the yearly search for morel mushrooms. These wild mushrooms are renowned for their pleasant flavor and considered quite the Midwestern delicacy by many.

Though, their surprising rarity is notable, with many hunters pleased to discover one solitary mushroom, and avoiding the toxic mimics.

There are three morel species that grow in Missouri: conditions and a moist earth;

the yellow morel (also referred to as the "common morel"), the black morel, and the half-tree morel.

With caps that resemble brains, but a neutral, nearly dull coloration, they're easy to miss, though quite recognizable once unearthed. Veiled in forest-floor flora, the mushrooms present a challenge to be found, though there are tricks.

Spring is the optimal time to begin your pursuit, as thawing months offer warm two crucial conditions for

According to the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC), when day temperatures hover in the low 70s, and the night is in the low 50s, the Goldilocks Zone has been reached, and conditions for growth are right.

Additionally, the morels' peak season lies in tandem with the blooming season for lilacs. When lilacs bloom, so do morels.

Largely, however, tips on where exactly to locate the mushrooms are predominantly anecdotal, as each morel only rises above the ground some years - based primarily on soil temperature and water availability. Therefore, even specific root systems are unreliable on an annual clock.

Morels can be difficult for new-comers to differentiate from similar-looking mushrooms that can cause illness, or even death.

These are easily differentiated if you know what to discern: one key being, morels are always hollow-stemmed. Also, the conical cap of a morel is carved with pits and ridges, resembling a sponge or honeycomb.

Furthermore, black and yellow morels have a head directly attached to their stem, whereas many "false morels" have free-hanging heads, unattached to their stem.

With half-tree morels however, the bottom half of the cap is unattached to the stalk. It is vital to remember,

A Common Heart Problem That's Often Ignored

Dear Savvy Senior,

What can you tell me about atrial fibrillation? Every so often, I've noticed my heart starts beating rapidly for no particular reason. Is this something I should be worried about?

Anxious Annie Dear Annie, Heart palpitations can be harmless if they are brief and infrequent. But if you're experiencing an erratic heart rhythm, you need to get checked out by a doctor for atrial fibrillation, or AFib.

AFib - which is marked by rapid, fluttering beats can lead to serious complications such as stroke and heart failure, when the weakened heart can't pump enough blood to the rest of the body.

Normally, your heartbeat follows a steady rhythm as your heart contracts and relaxes. But when you have AFib, the upper chambers of your heart (atria) beat rapidly and irregularly, sending blood to the lower chambers (ventricles) less efficiently. These episodes can last for minutes to hours or longer, and can cause palpitations, lightheadedness, fatigue, and/or shortness of breath. Over time, AFib tends to become chronic.

Age is a common risk factor for AFib, which affects roughly 10 percent of people older than 75. Other factors include genetics, obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure, and alcohol and tobacco use. The condition has also been linked to viral infections, including COVID-19.

Diagnosing AFib

If you're experiencing AFib-like symptoms you need to see your doctor who will listen to your heart and likely recommend an electrocardiogram (EKG) or a treadmill heart test, or you may wear a portable monitor for several weeks to look for abnormal heart rhythms to confirm a diagnosis of AFib. Such tests can help distinguish AFib from less serious conditions that may cause the heart to flutter, like anxiety and stress.

AFib affects some three million adults in the United States, a number that is expected to quadruple in the coming decade as the population ages and risk factors like obesity, diabetes and high blood pressure become even more common. The lifetime risk of developing AFib is greater than 20 percent, yet many people don't even know they have it.

Treatment Options

A growing body of research underscores the importance of lifestyle steps such as exercise, a healthy diet, and limiting alcohol for treating AFib.

Depending on your age and symptoms, your doctor may prescribe drugs to help control your heart rate, like beta blockers such as metoprolol (Toprol XL); and/or rhythm, such as antiarrhythmics like flecainide (Tambo-

You may also need an electrical cardioversion, an outpatient procedure that delivers an electrical shock to the heart to restore a normal rhythm. You will be sedated for this brief procedure and not feel the shocks.

Catheter ablation is another outpatient treatment for AFib that scars a small

area of heart tissue that causes irregular heartbeats. This procedure is becoming more common based on evidence of its safety and ability to normalize the heart rhythm and ease symptoms. Ablations can be effective in people 75 and older, but medication may still be required afterward.

If you're at higher risk for stroke, you may be prescribed a blood thinner, too. In the past, Coumadin (warfarin) was the only such drug widely available, but it requires monitoring with regular blood tests. Newer anticoagulants, like apixaban (Eliquis) and rivaroxaban (Xarelto), don't have that requirement and have been shown to be just as effective at preventing strokes.

rooms that can cause illness or death (a rather gaunt alternative to a fun family dinner), may have similar caps, though may also have caps riddled with folds, lobes, or wrinkled.

These mushrooms are absent of the signifying pits or ridges a true morel's cap displays.

Moreover, these false morels will not be fully hollow - both cap and stalk will fail to resemble the hollowness of a true morel, and instead be likely filled with a cotton-like substance.

While some false-morels are entirely edible, and, ac-
