### J.C. Duncan family honored with memorial plaque

The Cassville School Board meeting on Thursday night was standing room only, and the reason for the crowd was a special presentation planned for Patty Duncan, widow of the long-time Cassville basketball coach J.C. Duncan.

Patty was invited to the meeting by the school board and Superintendent Dr. Richard Asbill, but for what, she did not know. What awaited her was a section of the floor from the gym where J.C. coached for 31 years. The center court section of floor was framed with a photo of J.C. and a plaque.

A teary-eyed Asbill unveiled the plaque in front of Patty, her three children and a large group of friends at the board meeting. For Patty, the moment was overwhelming, she said. She continued, "It was such an honor. This community always reaches out to peo-

ple, and I'm so glad I live

Obviously taken by surprise, Patty said, "When they asked me to come to the meeting, I never dreamed it would be that."

When asked what J.C. would have thought about the honor, she said, "He was a pretty emotional person. He would have thought about all the kids he coached. He always thought that he had the best group of kids to teach and work with."

This isn't the first time the Cassville R-IV School District has honored Duncan, who also served as the assistant football coach in his early years and dean of students, as well. In 2008, the gym, typically referred to as the rock gym because of its rock exterior, was renamed the J.C. Duncan Gymnasium. Duncan passed away the following year.

The gym was originally

constructed in 1935. Duncan started teaching and coaching for Cassville in 1956 and retired in the last 1980s. It was a group of former players and community leaders that proposed the name change of the gym back in 2008, according to Ashill

Then, in January when the building flooded from frozen pipes that burst, it was apparent that the floor was going to have to be replaced. Asbill said, "When the water damage destroyed the floor, we knew we'd need to replace it, and right around the time I suggested we save a piece of the floor for the Duncan family, the museum also contacted me about saving a piece of the floor for them."

He said, "J.C. basically coached in the rock gym his entire career. This was an effort to recognize what he had done for all of the students and the district while he was there." The district

also gifted a piece of the floor to the Barry County Museum.

Asbill continued, "A lot of people actually asked for pieces of the floor. It was such a big part of many people's memories of this area. We thought if we could save

some of those memories to the Duncan family, it would be the right thing." With the gym floor being over 40 years old, it meant that many, many students had memories of playing on it

### Gifted land gets Shell Knob closer to new library

A proposed land donation could help the Barry-Lawrence Regional Library take a big step towards its goal of building a new library in Shell Knob.

At their meeting on Thursday, October 16, the Library's Board of Trustees received a proposal from Charles W. Singleton III and the Danny Street and Catherine Street Income Only Trust to donate a three-acre parcel of land located in Shell Knob along Highway 39, adjacent to Meeks Lumber Company and Red Barn, for construction of a new library building. In return, Singleton would gain the right to name the new building. The board voted to accept the proposal.

Gina Milburn, Barry-Lawrence Library director, is hopeful that the actual land acceptance will take place when the board next meets on November 20. When asked about Singleton, Milburn said she had not met him personally. "My understanding is that he vacations in Shell Knob in the summer, he is a strong supporter of the community, and he wanted the library to have a nice location," she said.

As part of the proposal, the library will agree to as-

sume any costs involved with the land transfer. Milburn said she was not certain what those costs would be at this time. She also stated it was too early to say when the new library would actually be built.

Suzy Anglim, Shell Knob Branch supervisor, said the news of the proposal is very welcome. "We're very excited here at the Shell Knob Library for the donation of that parcel of land, because it is in the heart of Shell Knob," she said. "It's centrally located, and the decor of the future building will fit into the decor of Shell Knob."

Anglim said a lack of usable space makes a new Branch location a necessity. The current building has a total of 3,000 square feet divided equally between two levels. However, only the top level can be utilized as there are only two full-time employees to supervise activities. Anglim is hoping the new location will provide library users with 4,500 square feet of usable space.

The current Shell Knob branch already hosts a book club, preschool story time, a monthly movie program, and classes in yoga and sewing. However, according to Anglim, the new location will

### Seligman PD begins prep for Shop with a Cop

Since 2011, the Seligman Police Department has given back to the community through their Shop with a Cop program that enables children in the Seligman community to buy Christmas gifts each year. Now, for the fourth year, new Seligman Police Chief Terry Burgess is continuing the tradition and is looking to the community for help.

In years past, the depart-

ment has given each child between \$100 and \$135 to buy gifts with. They've taken the kids to Dollar General in Seligman and also Walmart in Cassville. Previously, they've taken up to 18 kids.

Burgess said the program is important to the Seligman community, "It builds trust between the Seligman citizens and the police department, and it shows that we care about our citizens."

This year, Burgess is rais-

ing the bar for how much he hopes to raise. He said, "I would like to raise around \$3,500 this year, because the more kids that we can affect with this program, the more successful the results will be."

Other changes might also be in store, although it has not been decided as of yet. Burgess said, "In the past, they've chosen ten kids or so and taken them shop-



The Cassville Wildcats celebrated Senior Night by wrapping up fourth place in the Big 8 standings and extending their current winning streak to three with a 41-8 win over the Seneca Indians at Wildcat Stadium on Friday night. The 'Cats also secured a home game in the first round of the Class 3 District 4 playoffs.

River Phelps had another stellar game for the Wildcats, rushing for 143 yards on 14 carries and scoring three touchdowns. Gabe Kirk ran 13 times for 86 yards and had an excellent night throwing the ball too. Kirk completed 8 of his 11 passes for 88 yards and a touchdown.

But Seneca's Derek Burr was intercepted by Jordan Fisher for a 74-yard pick-six on the ninth play of the drive, and the Wildcats took a 13-0 lead with 1:59 left in the first quarter.

The Wildcats scored on their next three offensive possessions to open a commanding 34-0 halftime lead.

The Indians blocked a punt late in the game, and then Dylan Snow scored from 8 yards out in the final minute to spoil the shutout bid by the Cassville defense. Final score: 41-8.

to 5-4 with the win, while Senecca dipped to 3-6 for the regular season. Cassville will host Mt. Vernon on Friday night in the first round of district playoffs. Kickoff is set for 7:00 p.m.

### New aviation business beginning in Cassville

Around Cassville, people have been abuzz about the number of planes flying overhead recently. The reason behind all of the extra air traffic are the happenings at hangar nine at the Cassville Municipal Airport.

Doug Rands, a retired mechanic for Boeing, moved into the hangar around a year and a half ago with his friend, Danny Hendricks, joining him a few months ago to build a new business. Rands hailed from Wichita while Hendricks came from Arkansas, and the duo came together in Barry County to start Southwest Missouri Aviation, a business dedicated to airplane maintenance.

Maintenance on airplanes is much different from that of a car. Each year, there are five inspections that a personal airplane has to undergo, and additional if you have a for-hire plane. Hendricks is already certified for all of those inspections, and between his talents and Rands' mechanic experience, they will offer a full service for airplaneowners.

In addition to the maintenance aspect, which will be opened in full on March 21, 2015, they also have a flight school and flying club based out of the hangar. With so much going on, the men decided to approach the city about building an additional 60' by 60' hangar to make room for their business growth.

Steve Walensky, City of Cassville Public Works Director, said that the fuel sales at the airport have doubled since the pair began their efforts. He stated, "We've exceeded our budget allotment for fuel at the airport for the year, and we don't want to run out. So we are ordering more than anticipated." Fuel is a revenue-generating source for the city.

The move to this area was mostly due to the cooperation with the city in working on their business. "We both are connected to the area because this is where we want to retire. It's a small airport, and the city is willing to help us out. We appreciate that. It is a big plus," Rands said. Rands lives in Golden, and Hendricks plans to move here soon.

"Sometimes smaller communities aren't willing to bring in more planes and business to their small airports, but Cassville has welcomed them with open arms, said Hendricks.

"Everyday day we're increasing the number of planes here at the airport. We're redoing this hangar with new paint, remodelling the bathroom and repainting the floor so that by March, things will look good, and we'll be ready to do for our official opening," Hendricks said.

"We like Cassville, that's why we are here. We want a slow, small growth. We're not here to change anything, just a slow, incremental growth," Hendricks explained at last month's city council meeting.

Even with small changes, it does mean changes for the way they run their business. Rand stated, "We will be bringing in a new mechanic soon. If we get to the level we want to be, we'll need the extra help. It's been really busy."

"In five years, we think that we'll have 75-100 planes in the maintenance part of our business. We'll open with 20 planes in our maintenance program and will probably go to 25 soon after that," Hendricks said.

Hendricks went on, "When an owner trusts someone, they tend to come back and spread the word. It doesn't take much to get more business once you've proven yourself."

Rands said, "Our maintenance business will focus on three different areas. There will be the maintenance, but also maintenance planning and education. We want to manage them from the beginning to the end. We want to be exclusive for people who use us all the time, and eventually we won't be open to the public."

The new hangar being constructed by the pair will be purchased by Southwest Missouri Aviation on a 30 year lease. At the end of that, it will belong to the city.





### Kenneth Corn exhibit opened at the Barry County Museum

Do you remember a seven-foot paper mache gorilla that was paraded on the streets of Cassville when the original Mighty Joe Young was shown? Perhaps you recall places like the Mid-America Shopping Center, Crowe's Dinner House or Miller's Holiday Motor Motel? Or maybe you remember the most ironic Santa Claus who rode in the Christmas parade and visited with children? If so, chances are you also reof Barry County's most talented artists.

Floyd Kenneth Corn was born in 1918 to Fred and Martha Chastain Corn in Barry County. He went to elementary school in Wheaton and then high school in Fairview.

in life. He made his first known painting, a portrait of a Native American astride a horse with his arms raised in prayer, when he was five. The painting demonstrates a level of ability and insight far beyond most adults.

At one time, Corn was an artist for Hollywood, where he painted sets for a number of movies. He was involved in the 1939 production Jesse James, which was filmed mainly in Pineville and Southwest City.

He put his art career on member Kenneth Corn, one hold in 1941 to join the United States Army, where he was part of the Special Service Division. During this time, Corn traveled with the USO and helped with sound systems for shows put on to entertain the troops.

Corn continued his ca-Corn demonstrated a reer in Hollywood after strong talent for art early being discharged from the

Army in 1945, but in 1947, he returned to Wheaton to open his own commercial art studio, Corn Signs. In 1950, he married Ethlyn Duncan and had two children, Gary and Gail. That same year, he moved his business to Cassville.

Corn's artistic skills were in high demand at this time, as numerous businesses wanted him to stencil artwork on their store windows and commercial vehicles. He also designed

numerous area billboards, campaign posters for those who ran for office and signs for local events.

In addition to being a highly successful commercial artist, Corn was also a skilled architect and cartographer. He designed the blue prints and artist perspectives for a number of local buildings such as First Baptist Church, the Big M Marina, Eagle Rock Boat Dock, the Mid-America Shopping Center, Crowe's

Dinner House and Millers Holiday Motor Motel. He also drew maps of various areas, including one of Cassville.

Though he was primarily an artist, Corn also had a construction ability that complemented his skill as an architect. At one point, he needed a silk-screen press. Rather than buy one, Corn designed a press and then built it by hand.

Corn did not limit himself to two-dimensional art. He also worked in paper mache, making various props for movies as they came into town. When the original Mighty Joe Young was released in 1949, Glenn Hall, owner of Hall's The-

ater, had Corn make the paper mache gorilla that was placed on the back of a platform truck and driven around town. An article about the gorilla was published in the October 22, 1949 edition Box Office, a national movie magazine.

Though he was a busy man, Corn was very sociable and outgoing and always had time to talk to someone, no matter what he was doing. His son Gary, who now owns his father's business, said Corn would spend a long time talking to the customers who came into his shop. "He would talk to someone for an hour before actually taking the order," Gary said.

Corn's outgoing personality was reflected in his portrayal of Santa Claus at Christmastime. He first played the role during a Christmas parade in Louisiana and loved the role so much that he continued to play Santa for 47 years, participating in parades, visiting houses and sitting with children for pictures.

While he did a lot of art

projects, there were some jobs Corn would not agree to do. He lived by the slogan, "God owns my business, I just work here," which he displayed behind his desk with a picture of Jesus. Gary said, "He wouldn't do vulgar work, and he wouldn't do work for a liquor store because he was a good Christian man, and he didn't agree with that."

Corn spent the rest of his life in Cassville and died on June 24, 2001, at the age of 83. He was buried in Rocky Comfort Cemetery, near his hometown of Wheaton.

Many of the businesses Corn did artwork for have closed their doors and the billboards and road signs he designed have long since been taken down. One of his works, however, can still be seen at its original loca-

In 1976, Corn painted a tribute to the Barry County veterans of World War II on a wall in the Barry County Courthouse. In his tribute, he listed the name of every Barry County resident who

served in the military during the war, almost 2,200 people. In a special section of the tribute, he listed in red the names of the 85 Barry County residents who were killed in action as having made the supreme sac-

In Corn's honor, the Barry County Museum is

displaying a collection of about 40 pieces of his work through the end of the year. Though it is only a small sampling, the collection gives a strong insight to Corn's artistic ability.

Schrediah Mahurin, who is responsible for the display of Corn's artwork, said, "I wanted to display Ken-



neth for a long time because

he was so well known." Among the items the display at the Barry County Museum contains are Corn's boyhood painting of the Native American, the head of the paper mache gorilla, the campaign posters and signs he created, several of his blue prints and building perspectives, several pictures of the billboards he designed, his Santa suit and several pictures of him as Santa sitting with area children. Another work by Corn, a fisherman and his wife painted on plywood, is on permanent display in the Roaring River Collection.

The Barry County Museum is located one mile south of Cassville on Highway 76/86, and is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Admission is free and open to the public. Call (417) 847-1640 for more information.

It will allow us to have breastfeeding peer counselors available at least 2 days/week in our Cassville and Monett offices in order to provide education and support for our breastfeeding moms and babies as well as our prenatal population. The WIC program will continue to offer referrals, nutrition education and food packages to all participants. 
