Two California men sentenced for Monett meth conspiracy

Two California men were sentenced in federal court for methamphetamine conspiracy that involved distribution in Barry County.

Jamie Gonzalez-Alvarado, 33, a Mexican citizen residing in South Baja, Calif., and Camilo Acosta, 22, of Imperial Beach, Calif., were sentenced to September 30 by U.S. District Judge M. Douglas Harpool. Gonzalez-Acosta received 15 years incarceration in federal prison without parole, and Acosta received 11 years incarceration in federal prison, also without parole.

From March 2012 to October 2013, the two California men were involved in a distribution of methamphetamine being transported to Monett. Multiple people were arrested in connection with the trafficking scheme.

On October 11, 2013, Oklahoma law enforcement confiscated one of the meth shipments while enroute to Julio Vinctene Mendoza, 33 a Mexican citizen living as a resident alien in Monett. The 15 bundles of methamphetamine in that shipment weighed 14.61 kilograms.

Missouri law enforcement then did a controlled delivery of some of the methamphetamine confiscated to Mendoza's home in Monett. Mendoza and multiple others were arrested during the operation. A search warrant yielded \$57,660 in a safe, \$3,000 in a bedroom, a handgun and ammunition, 35 grams of methamphetamine as well as a drug ledger and paraphernalia.

Gonzalez-Alvarado was the director of the drug trafficking, but others were also charged for their involvement. Mendoza, Ernie Soto, 22, and Armando Arizpe, 24, both of Los Angeles, Calif., pled guilty to drug-trafficking conspiracy and were each sentenced to three years incarceration in federal prison without parole.

Law enforcement who aided in the investigation included the Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Barry County Sheriff's Department, the Barry County Prosecuting Attorney's Office, the Canadian County, Okla., Sheriff's Department and the Drug Enforcement Agency.

Seligman officers to get body cameras, new pistols

At Seligman's City Council meeting on Monday, October 12, they decided the police department needed new equipment. The city held an auction, open to the public, of items that the city owns such as confiscated firearms and miscellaneous items acquired over the years.

Silent bids were submitted from people in the community and the money raised from the auction goes into the city's general fund. The auctions are only held every couple years.

Two of the highest priced bids that the city received were for two of the rifles they sold. The total of this year's auction was \$2,340.03. The last auction the city held was approximately four years ago.

This year, with the money raised, the police department is ordering one vehicle camera kit, two body cameras and four new pisThe body cameras and car kits are a fairly new move most police departments are installing. "There is a multi-purpose for the body cameras and the car cameras. It tells the public that we have nothing to hide and also creates a great level of trust. It will also provide as an evidentiary purpose and be an unbiased witness," said Seligman Police Chief Terry Burgess.

Along with the body cameras and car kit, the police department is also purchasing four new Glock pistols. At the moment, the department only has one issued pistol, the other officers carry their own pistols.

The price for the four pistols was \$1,428, and the cost for the body cameras and car kit was \$5,820.

The city's general fund will be used to purchase all the new police equipment. "My point at the city council meeting was that with

Showing kindness catches on



Garner said, "We're excited about how our congregation has rallied to support this special night of service to our community. Hopefully, neighbors that don't even attend our church will see the value of what we are doing and want to help. We invite everyone to join us."

Three arrested on drug charges after being found in elderly woman's house

Three were arrested on drug charges on Saturday when they were found in an elderly woman's home on Presley Drive in Cassville

According to an affidavit of probable cause, Christopher Youngblood, 31, of Cassville, Kevin Anthony Elkins, 45, of Cassville, and Rebecca Marie Drye, 35, of Exeter, were found after the Cassville Police Department was called about unknown persons being in an elderly woman's home. Then officers entered the residence; the front door was open. The homeowner said that there were strangers in her son's bedroom. Officers found Youngblood, Elkins and Drye in the bedroom with drug paraphernalia in plain sight.

When officers tested the drugs on the floor and

dresser, they were positive for methamphetamine. Officers also found a cut can with methamphetamine residue inside and a syringe.

Each of the three were charged with possession of a controlled substance and possession with drug paraphernalia with the intent to use. They are each being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 cash-only bonds.

Project replacing Southwest senior photos lost in '74 fire begins

Walking the halls at Southwest High School, you can peruse the graduating classes beginning in 1975 up to the present. However, any graduates prior to 1974 are missing because photos were lost when the high school burned in 1974. Now, a member of the 1966 graduating class is working to find those seniors' photos and put them back up.

Freddie Napier graduated from Southwest High School in Washburn in 1966. The spring marks his 50th year reunion, and his class is in charge of organizing the all-school reunion. Napier said that when he started working to organize the reunion, he thought of replacing the seniors photos

and having them ready for the reunion on May 28, 2016. He said, "No one's thought to do this in all this time, and I think all of us would like to see our pictures up with everyone else's."

Napier approached the Southwest School Board to get permission to take on the project, but he also wanted to make sure that Seligman School graduates were also included. Prior to 1954, Seligman and Washburn had separate schools. The school board, Southwest Superintendent Bob Walker and Southwest Principal Tosha Watson were all in favor of the project, so Napier began looking for all of the older annuals to be able to pull photos from and compile

composites to hang with the other graduating classes pho-

Napier is collecting annuals from Seligman and Washburn from 1944 up to the consolidation of the schools in 1954. He has already gathered all of the annuals for Southwest from 1954 to 1974 when the school burned down and the photos were lost. Napier said, "We've been taking pictures of the annuals as we've found them, then if we find a better copy, we use that one instead. It's been a lot of work, but I think it'll be worth it."

Napier said, "I'm still missing a couple of the Seligman annuals, but we're doing good. I still need 1944 to 1947 from Seligman, so if people have

those, that would be great."

Once photos are taken of the original annuals, Napier has been taking the photos to the high school where one of the teachers is having her students help with the project. Sharesa Rodgers, who teaches advanced computer applications and web design, is having students print the photos and design the pages. Walker said, "The school will also provide the panels to display the finished pages."

When asked why the project was important and they decided to support is, Walker said, "I think it will bring a lot of enjoyment to the graduates and their families to be able to view their senior pictures during the reunion and at other

functions at the high school.

"Pictures from the past always seem to be of interest to people. I also think having the pictures all together will bring a sense of unity that will enhance the tradition and history of our school district."

Walker continued, "This is not the school's project, but rather the vision of 1966 graduate Freddie Napier...He should be given credit for this endeavor."

Napier said that he and a few others have been working on the project, but he plans to share the work as soon as it is complete. He said, "I'll be giving flash drives of the copies of the annuals to Southwest and also the Barry County Museum to keep."

When asked why he decided to do this, Napier said, "We want to give the alumni a reason to come back. I wanted to

do something for the school, and this is what I could do. We're trying to do stuff different than classes before. It will be a historical event."

Napier added, "I'm just doing this for my class, but also the school. All of the alumni deserve to be recognized and remembered."

Napier plans to unveil the new composites at the all-school reunion next year on May 28. Anyone wanting to make a contribution to help pay to have the composites done may do so at People's Bank in the Southwest Alumni bank account. Napier said, "We'd love for people to donate and be a part of history."

Halloween safety tips

• MOTORISTS: Young children excited by Halloween could dart in front of a vehicle. Slow down, and drive with extra caution. If you are headed to a costume party, make sure the costume doesn't hamper your vision while you're driving to the event. Motorists picking up and dropping off trick-or-treaters may increase the number of vehicles on the road, therefore affecting traffic patterns. Please be courteous and stay alert for trick-or-treaters of all ages.

- PARENTS: Tell your child to approach only familiar houses that are well lighted. Remind them they should never enter a stranger's house or vehicle. Consider trick-or-treating with your children for their safety and because it's fun way to spend an evening.
- TRICK-OR-TREATERS: Keep costumes short to prevent tripping and consider make-up rather than masks. Masks can make it difficult to see oncoming traffic. Wear light-colored clothing or add reflective tape to dark costumes to make them visible. Flame resistant costumes are the best ones. Remember to look both ways when crossing the street. Use sidewalks wherever possible when you're walking around a neighborhood.

Trick-or-treaters are urged to do so while it is light outside. Increase visibility by taking a flashlight with you, especially after dark. An adult should always accompany small children, and older children should stay in groups.

ADULTS: Consider spending Halloween at home answering the front door. If you attend a Halloween party that includes alcohol, make sure you have a sober, designated driver for the trip home. Alcohol, even in small amounts, slows reaction time and dulls the senses. Drinking alcohol could have a sad and possibly deadly result.

SOUTHWEST SCHOOL BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

As part of continued efforts in keeping patrons informed, the Southwest R-V School administration provides monthly information concerning board meetings.

A recap of the October 15 regular meeting is as follows: The Board convened at 7 p.m., approved the agenda, and moved into closed session for the communications item.

The Board reconvened in open session and approved the consent items, including the hiring of library assistant Jayme Reuter and special education aide Tiffany King. In respect to old business items, the Board approved Bob Vice as the district's homeless coordinator, 504 compliance coordinator, and foster care liaison for the 2015-2016 school year. In addition, the Board approved contracting with CEI Engineering Associates, Inc. for civil engineering services pertaining to possible future campus grounds improvements.

Under new business, the Board approved bus routes for the 2015-2016 school year. Also approved was the district's annual secretary to the Board report for school year 2014-2015, as well as this year's MSBA full maintenance agree-

Various reports were reviewed by the Board, including the district's A+ program as provided by coordinators Jeff Dickson and Stacey Hopper. Special education director Bob Vice submitted reports pertaining to special education. Superintendent Bob Walker provided reviews of the federal programs and early childhood services. Also reviewed were the regular monthly reports provided by the other district administrators and the maintenance director. The Board approved Walker's recommendation to contract with the L. J. Hart Company for services related to the refinancing of current bonds, as well as work in advance of a possible April bond issue. The Board also designated as surplus property various items that are no longer being used within the district. These items will be advertised and sealed bids will be taken from interested parties.

The Board entered executive session at 7:56 p.m. to discuss personnel matters and returned to open session at 9:16




