
This year, the park handed out 1,062 fishing tags to kids 15 and under to fish the park. There were also a number of classes and special events, including music, for kids once they caught their limit.

# Exeter's drug dog's nose leads to two arrests

Two men are in jail thanks to the sniffing power of one particularly special member of the Exeter Police Department. Bailey, a three-year-old black labrador, helped Exeter Police Chief Morgan Struble arrest two men in the last week for possession of methamphetamine thanks to her nose and training.

When Struble pulled over Christopher Pulliam on Monday, May 12, on Glenda Street, Pulliam refused a search. However, when Struble brought Bailey out and walked her around the car, she indicated that the car contained narcotics. With probable cause established, Struble found drug paraphernalia and methamphetamine on Pulliam.

Then again on Monday, May 18, just before midnight, Bailey found methamphetamine in a vehicle when Struble pulled Scott Boden over on Merrimac.

Pulliam was charged with possession of a con-

trolled substance, a class C felony. Boden is charged with intent to deliver a controlled substance, a class B felony.

Struble has been involved in training dogs for police use for over ten years, and after being hired as the chief in Exeter about a year ago, he trained Bailey to be his partner to help get drugs off the street.

Struble said, "I enjoy dogs, and I have a knack with them. I was always good with them. They respond well to me, and I've had a lot of people say that I was a natural." Struble started training dogs when he was 16, but knew by 18 that he wanted to be a police officer.

He said, "The training was fun, but I wanted to be the guy out there using the dog." Now, he and Bailey are a team and, where he goes, she goes.

Struble's been a police officer for the past six years and worked for the Reeds Spring Police Department before taking the chief position at Exeter. He got Bailey certified to detect narcotics in November, and since then, she has been responsible for multiple traffic arrests.

Struble said, "It's hard to say how many arrests she is responsible for because her presence alone has brought

# Viney Creek to be operated by Missouri State Parks again

Missouri State Parks announced that, for the second year, they will be operating the Viney Creek Recreation Area on Table Rock Lake. Missouri State Parks entered into a temporary lease agreement for management and overseeing operations of the campground and day-use areas.

Viney Creek was originally tabbed for closure in early 2014 when the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, who operates the park, announced that they would not be opening for the season because it was the least visited site on Table Rock Lake. After the announcement, the Barry County commissioners looked into leasing the site to keep it open for area residents, but it was Missouri State Parks who ended up operating it last year.

This year, Missouri State Parks agreed to manage the side again after some controversy last year involving renovations that are needed to the septic system at the park. Information officer for Missouri State Parks Steph Deidrick said, "Missouri State Parks will operate the existing wastewater treatment facility in a manner to ensure compliance with the Missouri State Operating Permit. In the event that the facility is unable to properly treat the wastewater, it may be pumped and hauled to a municipal wastewater treatment facility for more effective

treatment."

Missouri State Parks director Bill Bryan said, "During our first year operating Viney Creek Recreation Area, we received a great deal of the support from local residents, and we're pleased to be able to manage the property for the 2015 recreation season. This spot, located on Table Rock Lake, provides a great opportunity for guests who want to picnic, camp, boat and enjoy outdoor recreation in the

Viney Creek will open for the season starting on Friday, May 22, at noon, just in time for Memorial Day weekend. Staff have been on site for the last week preparing the area for the opening.

The area will remain open until September 13 of this year.

Viney Creek features dayuse areas like a playground, picnic sites, and water access for free. The campground has 22 basic sites, 16 electric/water sites and seven electric/water premium sites which are all available on a first-come firstserved basis. The boat ramp is a \$5 fee daily.

Advance reservations can be made beginning May 22 through mostateparks.com or by calling (877) ICampMo (877-422-6766).

Viney Creek is located near Golden on Table Rock Lake in Barry County.

a lot of arrests. Just knowing that I've got the dog gets people to hand over whatever they've got." For those who don't voluntarily hand over their illegal drugs, Struble will walk Bailey around the car and, if she indicates the presence of drugs in the car, that gives Struble probable cause for a

When Struble takes Bailey out to work, she will either do free air passes around a car stopped for a traffic violation or when officers are executing a search warrant at a residence. Bailey's indication of the presence of drugs is known as a passive indication, meaning she will sit when she finds something. Struble said, "If I have consent to search a vehicle, she can help locate the drugs inside a car, as

Bailey's nose is actually so powerful that she can even detect lingering odors if something's been a vehicle fairly recently. Struble said, "If she indicates with a lingering or residual alert, it lets me know that this is someone I should keep an eye out for in the future, as well."

Bailey is certified by two different organizations: the National Narcotics Detector Dog Association (NNDDA) and the North American Police Dog Association (NAPWDA). Her certifications are good in all 50 states, and Struble takes her to be recertified once a year with each organization. She is able to detect marijuana, cocaine, methamphetamine, heroin and all of their derivatives like hash, crack and others.

Even though Bailey is used by Struble on the force, she isn't owned or maintained by the city. Struble



said, "She's my dog. She's not agency-owned, so she's my responsibility." Struble covers all of her expenses unless someone wants to donate to her care. This year, the Southwest Chapter of the Midwest Pet Breeders Association made a donation for food and veterinary expenses, but donations don't cover all of her costs.

Putting a value on Bailey is a hard thing to pinpoint because of how much training is involved, even on a continuing basis. Struble acquired her from a friend through a trade. She is the third dog that he has worked on the streets in his career. However, when Bailey came to Exeter, she needed to be trained. She had been a pet first in North Dakota before being chosen as a police dog. Struble got her from Iowa, and then worked to train her and get her certified. Police dogs that do what Bailey does are valued at anywhere from \$3,000 to \$10,000 each because of how much time and training is invested in them.

Bailey's continual training includes a lot of repetition and involves at least four hours a week of oneon-one time. Struble said selecting a dog with the right temperament is also important. He said, "Finding a dog that is obsessive about a toy, especially a





ball, is helpful. They need

to have a high prey-drive,

and they need to like to find


# The history of Memorial Day Piano 88's music

Initially known as Decoration Day, Memorial Day is a day to remember those military members who died in service of the country.

Memorial Day as we know it today can likely be traced to Charleston, S.C., where teachers, missionaries and some members of the press gathered on May 1, 1865 to honor fallen soldiers. During the Civil War, captured Union soldiers were held at the Charleston Race Course and hundreds died during captivity. Upon their deaths, soldiers were buried in unmarked graves. When the Civil War ended, the May Day gathering was organized as a memorial to all the men who had died during captiv-

General John A. Logan is often cited as inspiring similar events in the north. As commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, a veterans' organization for men who served in the Civil War, General Logan issued a proclamation just five days after the Charleston event that called for Decoration Day to be observed annually across the country. Logan preferred the event not be held on the

at local businesses

# anniversary of any particular battle, and thus the day was observed for the first time on May 30.

In 1868, events were held at more than 180 cemeteries in 27 states, and those figures nearly doubled in 1869. By 1890, every northern state officially recognized Decoration Day as a state holiday. But southern states honored their dead on a different day until after World War I, when the holiday was changed to recognize Americans who died in any war and not just the Civil War. Nearly every state now celebrates Memorial Day, a name for the holiday first used in 1882, on the last Monday in May.



# Barry County Museum acquires train engine for display

If you have been by the Barry County Museum, then you may have noticed a new addition. The Museum recently acquired a 25-ton Plymouth train engine, similar to the one that ran on the C&E Railroad track.

The C&E Railroad celebrated the first run of the train on July 4, of 1896, and its last voyage was in 1956. It ran from Cassville to Exeter and, when it was finished in July of 1896, the length of it was five miles and 400 feet. It was the shortest standard gage railroad in the United States.

The rolling stock consisted of a box car, two engines, a combination baggage and a passenger coach. The railroad did everything from hauling mules being supplied to the army, hauling fruit, rock, timber, cattle, sheep, hogs, agricultural and commercial products.

Every summer a large

number of visitors came to the C&E railroad. The ride over to Exeter and back was always fun for the locals, too. C&E maintained a regular freight and passenger schedule and had a total of seven employees.

The original C&E railroad engine was a 50-ton Plymouth engine made by the Plymouth Locomotive Company in Plymouth, Ohio. The engine was acquired by the Ashley family in the early 1950s, and the engine was taken to Kansas City on a short line railroad. Then in 1970 they donated it to the Railway Museum in Greenbay, Wisc., to be preserved.

Corky Stehlik, of Cassville, has been interested in the C&E Railroad since he moved to Cassville in 1958 as a young boy.

Out of curiosity, Stehlik later called the Railway Museum to see if the C&E Railroad engine was still there. The man he talked to said he thought it had been cut up for scrap years prior, and there was no trace of it that he could find.

Recently, Stehlik was on an auction site called PurpleWave and came across a railroad engine that was very similar to the one that ran on the C&E railroad. The major difference was that this engine is a 25- ton, and the one that ran on the C&E was a 50- ton.

The person selling it was a railroad contractor who had plans of restoring it but never got around to it. Stehlik noticed how well of a teaching tool this could be for the people of Barry County and said, "When I saw it, I just knew we had to have it."

Stehlik decided to give the Barry County Museum a call, and the museum was able to purchase it. It was brought down from Kansas City, unloaded using two large cranes and is now sitting out front of the museum on display.

Stehlik had previously purchased a wooden railroad car that did travel on the C&E railroad from a lady out of Joplin. The car currently has a good frame but the wood needs to be restructured. Future plans are to bring the car to Cassville, restore it and attach it to the back of the engine so it can be on display, as well.

The Barry County Museum is open Monday through Saturday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Donations are accepted to help with the upkeep and maintenance.

The C&E went through a number of different names, owners and managers over its 50 years of operation. For a full story, see The First 150

# Mexican national pleads guilty to Barry County meth conspiracy

Dickinson, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Mexican national pleaded guilty in federal court today, as his jury trial was scheduled to begin, to his role in a conspiracy to distribute large amounts of methamphetamine in southwest Missouri.

Jaime Gonzalez-Alvarado, 34, a citizen of Mexico residing in South Baja, Calif., pleaded guilty before U.S. District Judge M. Douglas Harpool to participating in a conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine in Barry County, Mo., from March 1, 2012, to Oct. 11, 2013. He also pleaded guilty to possessing methamphetamine with the intent to distribute.

Co-defendants Julio Vincente Mendoza, 33, a Mexican citizen who is a resident alien residing in Monett, Mo., Camilo Acosta, Jr., 22, of Imperial Beach, Calif., and Ernie Soto, 22, and Armando Arizpe, 24, both of Los Angeles, Calif., have pleaded guilty to their roles in the drug-trafficking conspiracy.


By pleading guilty today, Gonzalez-Alvarado admitted that he directed the delivery and then the distribution of methamphetamine, which was being delivered from California to Mendoza's residence in Monett. This methamphetamine was then distributed by Gonzalez-Alvarado and others in the Monett area and throughout southwest Missouri.

On Oct. 11, 2013, law enforcement officers in Oklahoma seized one of these shipments of methamphetamine that was enroute to Mendoza's residence in Monett. Officers seized 15 tape-wrapped bundles of methamphetamine weighing 14.61 kilograms.

On the same day, Missouri law enforcement officers conducted a controlled delivery of a portion of the methamphetamine to Mendoza's residence, where they arrested Gonzalez-Alvarado and the other co-conspirators. Officers executed a search warrant and seized \$57,660 found in a locked safe, \$3,000 found in a downstairs bedroom, a Smith and Wesson 10mm semi-automatic handgun with 50 rounds of ammunition, packaging material consistent with the packaging of methamphetamine, approximately 3.5 grams of methamphetamine, a glass pipe commonly used to ingest methamphetamine and a drug ledger notebook which contained names, numbers, and currency amounts.

Under federal statutes, Gonzalez-Alvarado is subject to a mandatory minimum sentence of 10 years in federal prison without parole on each of the two counts. A sentencing hearing will be scheduled after the completion of a presentence investigation by the United States Probation Of-

This case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Randall D. Eggert and Special Assistant U.S. Attorney Nhan Nguyen. It was investigated by the Drug Enforcement Administration; the Missouri State Highway Patrol; the Canada County, Okla., Sheriff's Department; the Barry County, Mo., Sheriff's Department; and the Barry County, Mo., Prosecuting Attorney's Office.







Track Sectional Qualifier for Shot Put







# Southwest's Mrs. Larson retires after 23 years with the district

After 23 years with Southwest Schools, Laura Larson is retiring and a whole school of former students is telling her goodbye.

Larson started at Southwest after teaching in Jefferson City for four years. She came to the school when then-principal Judy Randall interviewed her and was extremely excited about her experience with children with disabilities. Larson was hired as a preschool teacher because of her experience with children with cerebral palsy, autism, Asperger's and hearing impairments and other disabilities.

Larson taught preschool for ten years with the district before switching to kindergarten. A lot of her experience in special education helped her to deal with students over the years. She said, "My experience with special needs and the training I received before I came here really enabled me to be more compassionate and be a more empathetic teacher, because I know what its like for those students."

Larson moved to Southwest to be back closer to her family years ago. She said, "My family was back here and my mother was going to eventually need help in the long run. It was definitely a God thing." Now, Larson's mother lives beside her on her and her husband's property in Washburn. She added, "My calling to teach came directly from God,

and there was a reason he wanted me here."

Part of the reason she feels like she was here was to serve the children and family in the community, regardless of their home life. When she was a preschool teacher, she visited a lot of families in their homes to work with them about the individual needs of the students. Larson said, "I love these kids no matter what their home life was. As a preschool teacher, I'd try to educate parents on how to work with them at home individually. I was never afraid of any place I went because I was there for the kids. It didn't matter where they lived."

With two generations of students who have received the foundation of their education from Larson, she can proudly said that she has a former student in every grade up through the graduating class, something that many teachers never experience.

Even though she is retiring, Larson said she still plans to visit the friends she's made during her years at Southwest. She said, "I've told my friends that I'll come in and make copies for you, but then I'll wave and say 'bye.' I just want to volunteer and then get to go home."

Now that Larson is moving on from the school, her faith is what is driving a lot of her and her husband, Ed's, plans for retirement.



# MoDOT mowing projects

Drivers across southwest Missouri can expect to start seeing MoDOT crews out mowing roadsides over the next few weeks, the Missouri Department of Transportation said.

Crews will focus first on local communities, addressing visibility concerns at intersections, and touching some of the highest volume traffic routes ahead of Memorial Day.

Crews set bush hog mowers to a height of 7 to 8 inches to minimize the risk of throwing rocks or large debris. Mowers will make one pass, or shoulder cut, at least six-feet wide on each side of the roadway.

MoDOT crews will mow 14,700 miles of vegetation in the 21-counties of the Southwest District to address safety concerns including high grass that obstructs visibility. The first phase of mowing for 2015 should be completed by June 11

Drivers are urged to use caution around slowmoving operations such as mowers, as crews and equipment will be working in and near the roadways.

Weather delays could alter the work schedule.

Michael Middleton, Southwest District Maintenance Engineer stated, "We appreciate customer concerns about the vegetation height. We are currently running all of our mowing operations to address these concerns. We will have all routes mowed with this one pass by June 11."

# May is Move Over and Slow Down month

Colonel J. Bret Johnson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol would like the public to be aware that Governor Jay Nixon signed a proclamation designating May 2015 as Move Over And Slow Down Awareness Month in Missouri

In 2002, the Missouri Legislature passed a law aimed at insuring the safety of the men and women who work roadside in emergency services, including state, county, and local law enforcement, fire and rescue workers, ambulance personnel, and tow truck operators. At the time, this legislation—commonly referred to as the "Move Over" law- directed motorists to take one of two courses of action upon approaching a stationary emergency vehicle displaying lighted red or red and blue lights. Motorists must proceed with caution and yield the rightof-way, if possible, with due regard to safety and traffic conditions by making a lane change into a lane not adjacent to that of the stationary vehicle, if on a roadway having at least four lanes with not less than two lanes proceeding in the same direction as the approaching vehicle. If it is not possible to change lanes, motorists must proceed with due caution and reduce the speed of their vehicle, maintaining a safe speed for traffic conditions.

Nine members of the Missouri State Highway Patrol have been killed in the line of duty and several others seriously injured after being struck by vehicles in the performance of their duties. Four of those line of duty deaths occurred after the Move Over law passed. Emergency personnel working on the side of the road remain in danger of death and serious injury from being struck by a vehicle.

In 2012, the Missouri Legislature expanded the Move Over law. The law was amended to include vehicles owned by the State Highways and Transportation Commission and operated by Missouri Department of Transportation employees. Thus, drivers of motor vehicles approaching stationary MoDOT vehicles displaying amber or amber and white lights "shall proceed with caution by making a lane change away from the stationary vehicle, if possible." The act further modified the definition of "emergency vehicle" to include any vehicle owned by the commission and operated by a Department of Transportation employee that is marked as an emergency response or motorist assistance vehicle (Section 304.022 RSMo.).

"Missouri's Move Over law is designed to protect the people who are serving and protecting all motorists," said Colonel J. Bret Johnson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol. "May is Move Over And Slow Down Awareness Month. Every day our safety is in the hands of each motorist on the road. Please pay attention when you drive. Recognize that flashing lights of any color warrant careful reaction from you, the driver."

# Second graders learn to dial 9-1-1 at special assembly

For the past six years, the Barry County E9-1-1 Center has done a special program at area schools to ensure kids know the proper reasons for dialing 9-1-1.

The program is run by Ann Hennigan, GISTech for the E9-1-1 Center. She said, "I love visiting with the second graders, so I'm happy to say that I get to go to all the schools." The program is directed at the seven and eight year olds in all Barry County Schools. Hennigan visits Cassville, Exeter, Purdy, Southwest, Shell Knob and Wheaton each at a different point during the year, but the program is the same at each school.

During the assemblies, Hennigan is interactive with the kids, asking questions like when would the fire department, police or ambulance respond to a 9-1-1 call. She also makes sure the kids know when to call 9-1-1 and to always stay on the phone to make sure the dispatcher gets all of the information they need to send help.

Hennigan said, "We've all seen news stories about children calling 9-1-1 who need help for themselves, a parent or caregiver or even a stranger. I believe that it is important for kids to know when, why and how to call 9-1-1 and what to expect when they are talking to a dispatcher. It also gives us an opportunity to remind kids how important it is to know their address and, if they are travelling or in a strange place, what things they should

be looking for to help dispatchers pinpoint their location."

During Cassville's assembly, Hennigan talked about how to look at landmarks while the kids are travelling. She talked about water towers, street signs, specific buildings and others that could help a dispatcher locate where an accident happened or where to send help.

The E9-1-1 Center also provided tips for parents to discuss with their kids about how to deal with emergencies and dialing 9-1-1:

- Help your child learn their address.
- Post your address on the refrigerator or other conspicuous place in case of emergency.
- If your child accidentally dials 9-1-1, tell

Delivery Available them not to hang up. They should talk to the dispatcher and explain that it was an accident.

- Children should not dial 9-1-1 for a prank, because they're bored, or as a joke.
- If your child hangs up after calling 9-1-1, a dispatcher will call back to make sure everything is okay. If no one answers, they may send an officer to make sure.
- When you call 9-1-1 in an emergency, make sure to speak clearly. Don't hang up until the dispatcher tells you it's okay to hang up.
- (Parents) Before you give your child an old cell phone to play with, make sure to remove the battery, even if the phone is not activated, it can still dial

9-1-1.

Henigan added, "We appreciate all of the schools and teachers allowing the E9-1-1 Center the opportunity to talk about 9-1-1 awareness. Everyone is very welcoming and the kids are always attentive and ask great questions. it is truly my favorite work-related activity, and I look forward to it each year. 



# Highway Patrol offers safety tips for Memorial Day weekend

The first long weekend of summer will be here soon. 


