#### Angela Seymour **Retires from Crowder**

Angela Seymour, Director of the Crowder College in Cassville, is retiring from her position after 23 years of serving her community, staff, and students.

Angela grew up in Columbus, Nebraska, then went to the University of Missouri in Rolla, playing basketball as an engineering major. "While I was there," Seymour says, "I fell in love with tutoring people in math, and changed my major to Math Education, which Rolla didn't have, so I ended up transferring to Evangel in Springfield, and getting my degree in Math Education and a minor in Science. Then, when I started looking for a job as a math teacher, I didn't wanna go back to Nebraska. Winters there start before Halloween and end after Easter. Brad Farwell is the new manager of the Missouri Department of Conservation's (MDC) Roaring River Fish Hatchery, earning the title after the previous manager, Paul Spurgeon, retired from the position earlier this year after 11 years at the park. Farwell grew up in Eagle Rock and graduated from Cassville High School.

Farwell's father, Marvin, worked in the hatchery for 32 years, stocking fish from 4 p.m. to midnight; though Brad has quite the notable history at Roaring River himself. Alongside many families who count Roaring River State Park as one of the great memory-makers with their children, grandchildren, and even beyond, Farwell spent time at the park not only as a tourist or visitor, but as a part-time and later full-time employee.



#### Cassville FFA to Establish Wild C Research Farm

Cassville R-IV School district purchased over 60 acres of farmland located on 13th street in Cassville in October of 1998.

The district had plans to utilize the space for a building project, however, in an effort to keep all district buildings centralized on or near Main Street, the building project did not come to fruition. Beginning this summer, the land will be home to the district's new agricultural research farm, Wild C Research Farm.

Wild C will be a student based agricultural research farm that will provide handson-learning experiences for Cassville High School (CHS) ag students. Students will gain first-hand knowledge in raising livestock type animals, such as beef cattle. In addition to hands-on experience with live animals, students will learn farm management skills, including budgeting, fence repair, hay

production, forage testing,

ultrasound procedures and

vaccinations.

"The ag department has a tremendous opportunity for our students to build this farm from the ground up," said CHS agricultural teacher Mr. Jordan Ellis.

"Barry County is the number two beef producing

county in the state of Missouri, which is why we will focus on beef production."

In the beginning stages of building the farm, students will have stock/feeder calves with the hope of eventually having cow/calf production.

"The agriculture industry is constantly changing and evolving," said Ellis. "This farm will allow Mr. Hinson and I the opportunity to teach our students the most current industry standards and update our instruction as industry trends evolve and

Agriculture courses at both the high school and middle school are taught by Ellis and Mr. Jimmy Hinson. All students who enroll in any ag course at CHS will have the opportunity to complete lab work at Wild C.

"Agriculture is the biggest contributor to the economy in Barry County. The Board of Education and administration are excited about the potential for providing hands-on farm related learning opportunities for our students," said Superintendent Dr. Merlyn Johnson.

"Our Vo-Ag teachers have worked hard to develop a five year implementation plan and timeline for this worthwhile project. I look forward to watching these plans materialize over the next few school years as we strive to encourage our students to learn more about how to be good stewards of the land and to make a living as a farmer."

Ellis and Hinson plan to grow lab opportunities for CHS students as the farm becomes more established. The ag department's longterm goal is to offer a two hour farm management class where students will have the opportunity to spend an extended amount of time at the farm managing the details involved for sustaining the farm.


Like puzzle pieces, Seymour says she loves finding exactly what jobs our area needs, and trying to facilitate those with education. "I hope

#### Organization in Exeter Provides Beds to Children

It is no secret that many local families struggle with poverty, though the nuanced realities of the situation sometimes escape immediate thought. Sleep in Heavenly Peace, a nonprofit organization seeks to help in one huge way: supplying children with

"No child sleeps on the floor in my town," says James Alverson, pastor for the Assembly of God Church in Exeter. Alverson is working with other local people in his church to combat this issue, and provide as many children with beds as they can.

'This all started in 2012 with a man in Twin Falls, Idaho," Alverson states. "Luke Mickelson started building a bunk bed, and wondered if there was anybody around who would need it. From then, people kept donating sheets and pillows, assuming he would keep building bunk beds, and he did. Not only does Sleep in Heavenly Peace build the bed, but we also deliver them, so the child doesn't only get a new mattress, they get sheets, pillowcase, everything ready to go, all delivered to their home."

This organization is on the rise, says Alverson, with the total number of nationwide chapters at approximately 100 circa 2018, now reaching over 300 in 2022. Alverson is ensuring Exeter has the next one.

"I learned about this myself as of last September. The Assembly of God had a meeting in Osage Beach and

there was a man from Marshfield, Mis., Alan Bomber, and he brought a trailer-load of wood and set up and assembly line for us to build, and we ended up building 30 beds. Being that I'm a pastor, I asked if he would like to come to my church and tell of this, but he showed me that all you have to do is go to shpbeds.org and you will find a website where you can donate, volunteer, or apply for a bed. It's a nonprofit, not religious, just helping people."

Alverson's Presently, chapter is based in his Assembly of God church, "But what we want to do is open it up to the community," he says. On Wednesday, May 18, Alverson plans to attend a school board meeting in which he hopes to secure property owned by the school district for a new facility.

"I work at the school, driving a school bus, since 2012," says Alverson. "When I got involved with Sleep in Heavenly Peace, I showed the principal of Exeter the program and she said 'Wow, yes, there is a great need.' There are a lot of families who are doubling up. They have to share homes with their parents or grandparents, and that puts the kids in crowded areas where they don't even have a bed. Or, you have foster homes, or divorce, all kinds of situations that cause instability. One thing that really touched my heart is I was driving the school bus and I said to the kids, 'Hey, I'm going to start

building bunk beds for kids that are sleeping on the floor, and there was a pause, and I heard a little girl say, 'Well, I don't have a bed,' and I asked her where she sleeps, and she said she sleeps on the couch."

Alverson plans to host the first big build on Saturday, June 25, where Alan Bomber will attend and bring his own team to help.

"I want to build a bunk bed, fully furnished, and have it out there. That way when people see us out assembling, they can see the finished product."

Alverson and his team are restricted to the Exeter zip code at the moment, however "We want to take in the whole county. We don't want this to just be Exeter SHP, but Barry County. I believe every county in the nation could have one and still not meet the need - 3% of the children in this county don't have a bed." As of 2020, Barry County has a population of 35,615, meaning that there are approximately 1,070 children without a bed.



In local communities, options may exist for special needs individuals who need help, but many are unsure of where to go, whom to ask, or even that they could get help.

Shauna Oltjenbruns, of Cassville, has been working with Community Support Services of Missouri for 11 years to diminish this unawareness and coordinate local disabled individuals with the services that suit their specific needs.

"Most people don't know they need help," Oltjenbruns

According to her, many disabled people, or their caretakers, grow accustomed to their responsibilities, regardless of how daunting they become over the years.

"A lot of what we see in this area, which is not a bad thing, is families taking care of families; but, as fam-

ily members age, they're so used to taking care of their family member that they're ashamed to ask for help. We see a lot of grandparents taking care of autistic children, and we see a lot of 70+ year old parents taking care of their aging children."

The spectrum of assistance offered is broad as the spectrum of special needs themselves, though according to Oltjenbruns, transportation is the largest need for most.

"When OATS started providing services for our individuals, it was a huge benefit - life changing for a lot of people, going from essentially home-bound to being as independent as they want

"People can participate in their community, go to rehab, independently." According to Oltjenbruns, however, OATS offers more assistance than those necessities alone. "People need transportation for basic survival needs," she said, "a lot of individuals

who need a little help don't drive, so if their help doesn't show up, or if mom gets sick, they're home bound."

Anyone with an intellectual or physical disability (down syndrome, autism, cerebral palsy, etcetera) can qualify for assistance. "There are many qualifying mental diagnoses," Oltjenbruns says. Community Support Service Case Management coordinates services for those who qualify, primarily for those who have a developmental disability prior to 21, though CSS Case Managers provide services to individuals of all

Services can range from personal assistance, residential services, and transportation to referrals for music, art, and dance therapy, and beyond, "even some dental services," says Oltjenbruns. According to her, the full list of services is virtually unending, and can match anyone to their individual assistance requirements and limitations. Budgetary restrictions

are something that Community Support Services works with.

The services strike specificities that aren't immediately seen as vital, but in the long-run, may facilitate lifelong assistance. "Champion Athletes is a program headed by Susan Miles that supports social skills through sports for the developmentally disabled," Oltjenbruns states. Additionally, getting a child into these services early can be heavily beneficial in the long-term, says Oltjenbruns.

"The earlier the better," she says. "If somebody can get on developmental services when they're a child, we can help with the transition from childhood to early adulthood, and the transition from early adulthood to adulthood. I just encourage people who have a family member with a developmen-

Savvy Senior How Medicare Covers Al-

zheimer's Disease Dear Savvy Senior,

What exactly does Medicare cover when it comes to Alzheimer's disease? My husband was recently diagnosed with early-stage Alzheimer's, and we would like to find out

what's covered and what isn't.

I'm very sorry to hear about your husband's diagnosis, but you'll be happy to know that most medical costs to treat beneficiaries with Alzheimer's disease are covered by Medicare. Unfortunately, long-term custodial care costs that most patients eventually need are not. Here's a breakdown of what Medicare does and doesn't cover when it comes to Al-

zheimer's disease, along with some tips that can help you plan ahead.

Medical care: For the most part, ongoing medical care to diagnose and treat Alzheimer's disease is covered by Medicare Part B, including visits to primary care doctors and specialists, lab tests, speech and occupational therapy, home health care and outpatient counseling services. Medicare pays 80 percent of these costs, and you will be responsible for the remaining 20 percent after you've met your annual \$233 Part B deductible.

Sixty days of inpatient hospital care is also covered under Medicare Part A after you pay a \$1,556 deductible. Beyond 60 days, a daily coinsurance fee is added.

Medications: Most Alzheimer's medications are covered under Medicare's Part D prescription drug plans, but coverage varies so check his plan's formulary. The only exception is Aduhelm, the controversial new drug that is estimated to cost \$28,200 per year. Medicare Part B will only cover this drug if your husband is enrolled in a clinical trial.

Long-term custodial care: It's important to understand that original Medicare does not cover long-term custodial care. This includes nursing home care, the costs of assisted living facilities and adult day care. Medicare does, however, pay for some shorter-term nursing home care, but only up to 100 days following a three-day inpatient hospital stay.

Hiring home help for bathing, toileting and dressing (this is known as custodial care) is not covered by Medicare either unless your husband is also receiving skilled-nursing care or physical or occupational therapy.

To help with these costs, you may want to look into getting a long-term care insurance policy or short-term care plan (see aaltci.org/stc) if possible, or if your income and assets are very limited, you may qualify for Medicaid. To investigate your financial options for longterm care, go to PayingForSeniorCare.com.

Hospice: In the final stages of the disease, Medicare Part A covers nearly all aspects of hospice care, including doctor services, nursing care, drugs, medical equipment and supplies, physical and occupational therapy, homemaker services, counseling and respite care. To qualify, a doctor must certify that a patient has six months or less to live.

#### Other Insurance and Assistance

If your husband is enrolled in original Medicare and he doesn't have a supplemental insurance (Medigap) policy, you should consider getting him one. A Medigap plan will help pay for things that aren't covered by Medicare like copayments, coinsurance and deductibles. To search for plans in your area, go to Medicare.gov/plancompare and click on "Medigap policy only."

Or, if you're enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan (like an HMO or PPO), his plan must provide him at least the same coverage as original Medicare does. Some advantage plans may also offer additional coverage for home care services.

If you can't afford your Medicare out-of-pocket costs or need help with medication expenses, there are Medicare Savings Programs and the Extra Help program that provide financial assistance for medications. To learn more, see Medicare.gov/ your-medicare-costs/gethelp-paying-costs.

You can also get help through your State Health Insurance Assistance Program (see ShipHelp.org or call 877-839-2675), which provides free Medicare and long-term care counseling.





#### From the Roots Up

I hope your garden has survived the last round of bad weather. Hail and strong winds can be brutal to a garden. The latest round of rains Sunday left my lettuces and spinach lying flat on the ground. I was in church when it happened, and well, all you can do is pray at that point. I always try to protect my raised beds by covering my plants with five-gallon buckets, putting supports up on the corners, and throwing thin plywood a few inches above the plants. I know from experience that with lowlying plants, they will survive wind and, in a few days, will be standing upright on their own. It is devastating to go to

hard work looking destroyed.

It makes me wonder how our ancestors, who depended on the garden for their year's food supply, survived. Raising my own food has given me a new respect for my ancestors!

So today, I want to share the importance of mulch in the garden. This week I have been weeding the potatoes and adding straw between the rows for mulch. I brought up the dirt and previously placed straw around my plants and added more straw between the rows using my hoe. I also mulched my cabbages and kale with straw. I use straw because of the size of my garden. Straw is cheap, and my garden is big, so I need cheap mulch. I sometimes use shredded tree trimming mulch for my raised beds that I purchase by the scoop (cubic yard) from Hansen's in Reeds Spring.

For a smaller garden, you can buy mulch in the bag. It

comes in several colors and decomposes nicely into the garden

So why do I mulch?

Mulch helps control weeds, adds nutrients to the soil, reduces water evaporation, regulates soil temperature, and helps prevent erosion. Mulch can be organic such as bark and shredded wood from tree trimmings, leaves, grass clippings, straw, and sawdust. These are the types I use. There is also manmade synthetic mulch such as landscape fabric, plastic, rubber, stone, and gravel. The advantage of organic mulch

your soil, adding essential nutrients as it decomposes. It does have its disadvantages, though, it must be reapplied every year, and it can attract bugs and harmful insects to your garden. Organic mulch is more temporary, whereas if you use synthetic mulch and want to change your garden beds, you will have to remove all the mulch. In my first few years of gardening, I used gravel between raised beds. After a few years, the weeds and grass grew through the gravel. I had my work cut out for me when I decided to re-

move the gravel and replace it with wood chips. Somehow that gravel was easier to put down than to take up.

I only use organic mulch now. As you work in your garden this summer, I encourage you to mulch. Enjoy!





can history. Congress should use its constitutional authority to rebalance the Supreme Court, which has been taken over by a supermajority that holds extreme views outside of the mainstream of legal thought and out of step with most Americans.

That's why Congress must pass the Judiciary Act, which would add four seats to the Supreme Court and help stem the right-wing supermajority's attacks on our fundamental freedoms, including the right to access abortion care.

There's nothing stopping Congress from adding justices—except for the political will to do it, of course. In fact, recent polling showed that the majority of the American voters they represent support expanding the court.

That's why I'm urging Congress to pass to support the Judiciary Act of 2021 and add four seats to the Supreme Court.

It was a great Kids' Fishing Day on Saturday. The hatchery did a fantastic job as usual, as did the DNR employees. It looked like all the kids had fun.

Power bait is really the best thing to catch a quick limit, yellow, pink, brown, white, and orange have all been good colors in plastics.

If you are near the hatchery, then the hatchery brown

plastic eggs work great.

Water is still murky, and we are still getting away with 4lb line, 2lb is still great, but with the amount of lead we are using right now, 4lb is just a bit better.

#10 hooks have been best for worms and grubs, and for the eggs and smaller plastic baits, we are using as small as a #16 hook.

Fly fishing is getting better everyday, as the water

falls the dry fly fishing will get better, there are still a few fish rising and hitting beetles, ants, elk hair caddis, and several trout were caught on stimulators this past week.

Still running 9' 6X leaders right now, and as the water falls and gets clearer we will start using 9' 7X leaders on dries.

Spinners are still working very well, black, blue, pink, brown, and white spinners

are doing very well.

Still seeing lots of fishermen fishing 3" Rapala type lures and doing pretty good in the murky water.

A lot of trout were caught last week on small spoons. Gold seemed to be the best color last week.

#### FDA Expands Eligibility for COVID-19 Vaccine Booster Dose

Today, (May 17) the U.S. Food and Drug Administration amended the emergency use authorization (EUA) for the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine, authorizing the use of a single booster dose for administration to individuals 5 through 11 years of age at least five months after completion of a primary series with the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine.

"While it has largely been the case that COVID-19 tends to be less severe in children than adults, the omicron wave has seen more kids getting sick with the disease and being hospitalized, and children may also experience longer term effects, even following initially mild disease," said FDA Commissioner Robert M. Califf, M.D.

"The FDA is authorizing the use of a single booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for children 5 through 11 years of age to provide continued protection against COV-ID-19. Vaccination continues to be the most effective way to prevent COVID-19 and its severe consequences, and it is safe.

"If your child is eligible for the Pfizer-BioNTech CO-VID-19 Vaccine and has not yet received their primary series, getting them vaccinated can help protect them from the potentially severe consequences that can occur, such as hospitalization and death."

On Jan. 3, the FDA authorized the use of a single booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for administration to individuals 12 through 15 years of age after completion of primary vaccination with the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine.

Today's action expands the use of a single booster dose of the vaccine for ad-



ministration to individuals 5 through 11 years age at least five months after completion of a primary series of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine. The FDA has authorized the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for use in individuals 5 years of age and older and has approved Comirnaty (COVID-19 Vaccine, mRNA) for use in individuals 16 years of age and older.

"The Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine is effective in helping to prevent the most severe consequences of COVID-19 in individuals 5 years of age and older," said Peter Marks, M.D., Ph.D., director of the FDA's Center for Biologics Evaluation and Research.

"Since authorizing the vaccine for children down

to 5 years of age in October 2021, emerging data suggest that vaccine effectiveness against COVID-19 wanes after the second dose of the vaccine in all authorized populations. The FDA has determined that the known and potential benefits of a single booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for children 5 through 11 years of age at least five months after completing a primary series outweigh its known and potential risks and that a booster dose can help provide continued protection against COVID-19 in this and older age groups." Data Supporting Effective-

Data Supporting Effective

The EUA for a single booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for children 5 through 11 years of age is based on FDA's analysis of immune response data in a subset of children from the ongoing randomized placebo-controlled trial that supported the October 2021 authorization of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine primary series in this age group. Antibody responses were evaluated in 67 study participants who received a booster dose 7 to 9 months after completing a two-dose primary series of the Pfizer-BioN-Tech COVID-19 Vaccine. The antibody level against the SARS-CoV-2 virus one month after the booster dose was increased compared to

before the booster dose. FDA Evaluation of Safety

The safety of a single booster dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine in this age group was assessed in approximately 400 children who received a booster dose at least five months (range 5 to 9 months) after completing a two-dose primary series.

The most commonly reported side effects were pain, redness and swelling at the injection site, as well as fatigue, headache, muscle or joint pain and chills and fever.

The FDA did not hold a meeting of its Vaccines and

Related Biological Products Advisory Committee on to-day's action, as the agency previously convened the committee for extensive discussions regarding the use of booster doses of COVID-19 vaccines and, after review of Pfizer's EUA request, the FDA concluded that the request did not raise questions that would benefit from additional discussion by committee members.

The FDA will make available on its website relevant documents regarding today's authorization.

The amendment to the EUA was granted to Pfizer Inc.
