Barry County Youth Camp celebrates 50 years of helping kids

The Barry County Youth Camp is celebrating a special milestone this year. This week marks the 50th year of the Barry County Youth Camp bringing a special camping experience to underprivileged kids.

Shirley Bass is one of the co-chairs of the camp and has served on the board for 49 of the 50 years. Her co-chair is Jane James, and, to-gether, they are seeing that 105 Barry County kids go to camp this year with the support of the community.

Bass said, "We take kids that might not be able to go camping otherwise." Campers are recommended by the area schools each year. Cassville, Exeter, Monett, Purdy, Shell Knob, Southwest and Wheaton all have students that attend camp

each year.

The camp started when a group got together because they saw a need for a program like this in Barry County. It began through the vision of a youth agent, Ozarks Area Community Action Corporation (OACAC) and the Department of Family Services. Over time, the program grew and thrived with support from the community.

The camp is geared toward children ages seven to ten years old. When the camp first began, they held two different camps with the other being geared toward older kids up to age 14. However, Bass said that was discontinued and now they just focus on the one group. She said, "It was hard to find enough staff to run the two different camps, so

CCC Lodge renovation back on track

After much consideration, Roaring River State Park's CCC Lodge renovation will continue as planned, according to Missouri State Parks division information officer Steph Deidrick.

Missouri State Parks director Bill Bryan announced that state parks would be investing \$1.25 million into a full renovation of the CCC Lodge at the Roaring River informational meeting last September with an anticipated opening date of Opening Day 2016. However, after issues with funding, the

project was tabled until decisions were made regarding what projects would proceed and which would be postponed.

Deidrick said, "Since the legislature passed the Fiscal Year 2016 budget without the Governor's recommended \$15 million in reappropriation for state parks projects, some of Missouri State Parks projects had to be put on hold.

"Despite these funding cuts by the legislature, Missouri State Parks has determined that renovations to

we decided to do it this way instead."

The Barry County Youth Camp does not have a special set of financial guidelines for the campers who wish to attend, nor do they take any federal funding to make the camp happen. Campers are just expected to come with no financial obligation at all for a week

of fun and friendship with other kids from all over the county. Individuals, churches and organizations from the county donate to send the campers each year Bass said, "Everyone supports us really well."

The kids attending this year get to have many of the traditional camping experiences, like swimming,

fishing and hiking. They started their first evening off with making s'mores with volunteers from the 7 Valleys Chapter of Bikers Against Child Abuse. The group of bikers answered the kids' questions about what they do for children being abused.

Man freed after pinned under tractor

A Shell Knob man had to be freed using the jaws of life by the Central Crossing Fire Department last Thursday.

Stefan Daskiewic, 69, of Shell Knob, was driving the Case 350 tractor on Farm Road 1262 six miles south of Shell Knob when he travelled off the right side of the roadway and overturned, according to a crash report by the Missouri State Highway Patrol.

According to a state-

ment by Central Crossing Chief Rusty Rickard, "Central Crossing crews were dispatched to a report of a man trapped under a tractor. Upon arrival we found a large tractor that was upside down in the ditch with the driver trapped underneath." The department used the jaws of life and air bags to free Daskiewic.

Daskiewic had moderate injuries but needed to be airlifted to a hospital for treatment. Rickard said, "Due to a large amount of fuel and oil that had leaked, a full patient decontamination had to be performed, then the patient could be loaded and flown to the hospital." He was flown to Mercy Hospital in Springfield

Rickard called the response a "team effort" between the fire department, Barry County E9-1-1, Cox Ambulance, Mercy Lifeline and the Missouri State Highway Patrol.



Cassville receives 100 backpacks for food program

For the past nine years, the Cassville School District has utilized the Backpack Program started by Primary School counselor Kristie Preddy. The program provides children food for meals every Friday that they take home, a program that ensures children have adequate nutrition outside of the walls of the school.

The meals are inside a backpack provided by the school. Inside are the makings of a total of six meals and two snacks, enough for three meals a day over the weekend. During times when teachers are busy with students doing other activities, the staff puts the meals into the kids' backpacks so it isn't noticeable for the other students.

The older students who receive the meals usually have them placed inside their backpack in their locker while they are in class. The school tries to make it as private as possible to protect children from any stigmas about their home life.

Yesterday, May 26, the Helping Hands Community Food Pantry in Eagle Rock donated 100 backpacks for the upcoming year. Jill LeCompte, Cassville Assistant Superintendent, said, "We had kin-

dergarten classes donate to the Helping Hands Community Building, and, in return, they help us."

Helping Hands treasurer Ed Trease said, "Our passion is providing for the children in our area with the hope that none go to bed hungry and all have some food in the household daily."

Throughout the school year teachers watch the students and turn in referrals for the ones they think need help from the Backpack Program. This program is offered through each of the schools at Cassville, although the elementary and primary have the higher numbers of kids who need this assistance.

The younger students receive food that easier to handle without much preparation, and the older students will receive several things that they can cook at home.

Once a teacher turns in a referral for a child, the counselors then fulfill the responsibility of issuing the bags.

All the funding for this program is through private donations. Now that the Helping Hands Community Food Pantry has supplied the bags, it will be easier for the school to buy food with donations.

A Cassville woman is in jail after allegedly threatening a man with a tazer on Wednesday.

Laura Lea Burton, 41, of Cassville, allegedly forced her way into a residence on State Highway 112. According to the affidavit of probable cause written by Barry County Sheriff's Deputy Chris Hutson, Burton then pulled out a pink stun gun tazer on her victim and prevented him from dialing 9-1-1.

After preventing the victim from reaching his cell phone, Burton took his keys and then left. When questioned, Burton claimed to have thrown the keys out of the window as she was driving him, however, the Sheriff's Department found the keys under a step at her residence. 

Local teen revamps cemetery to become Eagle Scout

Local Boy Scout Alejandro Jimenez, a senior at Southwest High School, is taking on a large task to benefit a local cemetery as part of his drive to become an Eagle Scout.

Jimenez has been a Boy Scout since he was 11. This summer, he hopes to complete the requirements to become an Eagle Scout, and with that in mind, he planned a special service project to benefit the True Love Cemetery.

Jimenez, through the help of others from his church and the Boy Scouts, are doing a large landscaping project at the cemetery to improve the grounds. Typically, an Eagle Scout project consists of around 30 man hours between all of the people involved, however, this project is anticipated to be over 150 hours with everyone who is helping.

Jimenez said, "It's bigger than most projects, but I wanted to have the community involved as well, because it gives a good name to the Boy Scout organization. By landscaping along the fence line, the community and the relatives of people who are buried here will appreciate it."

When asked why he became interested in scouting, Jimenez said, "The LDS Church is a huge proponent of the Boy Scouts, so that's why I decided to get involved. It builds leadership and gets me involved not only in academics and school, but something that gets me out of my comfort zone." Jimenez laughed, "I don't think I even have a comfort zone anymore."

True Love Cemetery is located between Exeter and Washburn and lies next to where Iimenez lives with his family. He said, "I live right there and can see my contribution every day, so that's why I chose this proj-

Iimenez continued, "My dad got into communications with the True Love Cemetery Association, and that's where it all started." Jimenez then got help from a member from his church,

Pat Endicott, who drew up the landscaping plans.

A variety of businesses in the community contributed to the project once they learned what Jimenez was hoping to accomplish. the historic lodge at Roaring River State Park will proceed.

"Additional projects in Missouri State Parks continue to be on hold while the impact of these cuts is evaluated."

State Parks initially halted the project due to \$15 million in General Revenue funds not being reappropriated for historic site renovation and maintenance at state parks. According to State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick, the decision to not reappropriate those funds was due to issues with the construction of a new state park.

Fitzpatrick said, "Last year, we gave State Parks \$20 million out of General Revenue, which was on top of what they already get from dedicated funds. We were providing additional funds that were intended to be used for maintenance, repair, and rehabilitation projects at existing state parks.

"Then, without discussing it with the legislature, they started building a brand new park in Shannon County on the Current River that is expected to cost around \$60 million. We appropriated new money under the impression that they needed it to take care of existing parks, and then they started building a whole new park. We felt like they needed to fix what we already have before starting a new project."

Missouri State Parks operates on funds from use fees and a 1/10-cent tax that is split with soils. Typically, State Parks does not receive

General Revenue funds to operate or do maintenance on parks.

Initially, the legislature appropriated \$20 million to State Parks, but they only spent \$5 million before the new budget was decided on. After the remaining \$15 million wasn't reappropriated, Governor Nixon requested both the \$15 million reappropriation and an additional \$50 million through bonding for state park maintenance despite the funding being used on the new Shannon County state park.

Fitzpatrick said, "The department's options in responding to the legislature's decision to not reappropriate the \$15 million are not limited to halting projects at all the other state parks. It is clear to me, and I told them this in our budget hearings, that they could slow the construction at the new state park for a year and carry on with all of their other planned projects."

At time of press, State Parks had not responded to questions regarding when the CCC Lodge renovation is expected to be completed or where they are in the renovation process.

MDC says watch for turtles

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) encourages motorists to give turtles crossing roads a brake. Turtles are struck by cars throughout warmer months, but are at special risk this time of year because they are on the move. Young males make up most of the travelers as they search for territories of their own and for female turtles. Comfort is also a factor. Like other reptiles, turtles are cold-blooded so basking on warm asphalt feels good on cool spring days.

MDC encourages motorists to slow down when they see a turtle in the road and check to be sure they can

safely steer around it. If helping a turtle cross a road, keep human safety as the numberone concern. Check for traffic and be sure to move the turtle across the road in the direction it was traveling.

The three-toed box turtle is the species most often seen crossing roads in Missouri. Primarily a woodland species, it is found everywhere but the extreme northern part of the state. It is so named because it has three toes on each hind foot, unless a few appendages have been taken by predators or frostbite.


