Barry County Fugitives Tracked Through Kansas

Three inmates escaped from the Barry County jail on the night of Thursday, June 2. Each of the escaped inmates are considered armed and dangerous, and should not be approached if seen.

Lance Stephens, of Washburn; Matthew Crawford, of Springfield; and Christopher Blevins, of Golden, all face charges of escape from confinement in addition to their preexisting charges. According to online records, Stephens had been arrested on drug-related charges, Crawford for theft, and Blevins

for driving with a revoked license among other charges.

The Barry County Sheriff's Office initially led the pursuit, though have since turned over the search for the escapees to the U.S. Marshals. Investigators have revealed that the three men escaped by punching a hole in the ceiling and entering a water heater storage area in a maintenance room. The inmates then walked out the maintenance room door at 8:30 p.m. and escaped. It was not until the next morning's breakfast check on Friday, June 3, that the inmates were

discovered to be missing.

The night of the escape, the men stole a white 2002 GMC Sierra 2500 pickup on Y Highway, taking it to Salina, Kansas, and abandoning it upon arrival. In Salina, the men then stole a maroon 2005 GMC Yukon valued at \$6,000. The owner of the Yukon reported the vehicle stolen at 8:45 p.m., and had last seen it at approximately 7:45 p.m., unlocked with the keys inside.

Authorities suspect Stephens and Blevins continue to collaborate on the run, however Crawford is believed to have separated. The last known location of the inmates is Sharon Springs, Kansas, less than 20 miles east of the Colorado border.

The Barry County jail has reported being understaffed at this time, though this has not diminished the confidence of authorities to pursue and locate the escaped inmates.

Light construction is being performed in hopes to cease further escape attempts. The holes in the ceiling of the cell have been boarded, and the attic is being examined and fortified further. Additionally, other areas of possible escape in the facility are being examined and corrected.

If anyone is aware of their location, or any other relevant information to the investigation, they are advised to call 911 immediately.

Federal Indictment Handed Down in Large Drug Bust

Commander Chad Allison, Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team

Three defendants were indicted by a federal grand jury today for their roles in a conspiracy to distribute large amounts of methamphetamine in southwest Missouri after law enforcement officers seized approximately 29 pounds of methamphetamine.

Brian E. Hall, 44, of Aurora, and Jacqueline Aldrete Bojorquez, 28, and Jeffrey L. Hughley, 37, whose addresses are unknown, were charged in a six-count indictment returned by a federal grand jury in Kansas City. Today's indictment replaces a federal criminal

complaint that was filed on May 2.

According to an affidavit filed in support of the original criminal complaint, law enforcement officers executed a search warrant at Hall's residence in Barry County on April 28, 2022, as part of an ongoing methamphetamine investigation.

Officers seized seven pounds of methamphetamine, a Taurus 9mm semiautomatic pistol, approximately \$57,000 in cash, and drug paraphernalia used for the packaging and sale of methamphetamine.

When Bojorquez and Hughley arrived at Hall's

Burden-sharing, Haircuts, and the Creditor's Outside Option" won both, and argues that when a country has a partial default, creditors have an outside option which strengthens their bargaining power with debtors.

"I wanted to feel like I had contributed something original," he says, "something I had produced with the help of some really smart people, and a project I have completed on my own from start to finish. A senior thesis is the best way to do that."

John A. Haigh, Co-Director of the Mossavar-Rahmani Center for Business and Government at Harvard University, said that the thesis is "of significant interest to the Mossavar-Rahmani Center for Business and Government. It was ambitious and well-executed and our review committee was impressed with the sophistication of his analysis."



residence later that night, they were taken into custody as well. Officers searched their vehicle and found approximately 22 pounds of methamphetamine in the trunk and a Taurus 9mm semi-automatic pistol in the floorboard of the front passenger seat.

Today's indictment charges Hall, Bojorquez, and Hughley with participating in a conspiracy to distribute methamphetamine in Barry County and elsewhere from Jan. 1 to April 28, 2022.

In addition to the drugtrafficking conspiracy, Hall is charged with one count of possessing methamphetamine with the intent to distribute, one count of possessing a firearm in furtherance of a drug-trafficking crime, and one count of being a felon in possession of a firearm.

Bojorquez and Hughley are charged together in one count of possessing methamphetamine with the intent to distribute and one count of possessing a firearm in furtherance of a drug-trafficking crime.

The charges contained in

this indictment are simply accusations, and not evidence of guilt. Evidence supporting the charges must be presented to a federal trial jury, whose duty is to determine guilt or innocence.

This case is being prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Jessica R. Eatmon. It was investigated by the Ozarks Drug Enforcement Team, Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Drug Enforcement Administration, and the Barry County Sheriff's Office.

Phone and Internet Discounts Available to CenturyLink Customers

The Missouri Public Service Commission designated CenturyLink as an Eligible Telecommunications Carrier within its service area for universal service purposes. CenturyLink's basic local service rates for residential voice lines are \$21.00-\$26.50 per month and business services are \$32.00-\$37.00 per month. Specific rates will be provided upon request.

CenturyLink participates in a government benefit program (Lifeline) to make residential telephone or qualifying broadband service more affordable to eligible low-income individuals and families. A household is defined for the purposes of the Lifeline program as any individual or group of individuals who live together at the same address and share income and expenses. Lifeline service is not transferable, and only eligible consumers may enroll in the program. Consumers who willfully make false statements in order to obtain a Lifeline discount can be punished by fine or imprisonment and can be barred from the program.

What kinds of clothing options are available to mobility challenged seniors who have a difficult time dressing?

Looking for Mom

Dear Looking,

The chore of dressing and undressing in traditional clothing can be difficult, time-consuming and even painful for millions of people with certain health and mobility problems. Fortunately, there's a wide variety special clothing, known as "adaptive clothing," that can help with most dressing challenges. Here's what you should know.

What is Adaptive Cloth-

Adaptive clothing is specially designed garments for people with mobility issues, disabilities and cognitive challenges who have a difficult time getting dressed. This type of clothing incorporates discreet design features to make dressing and undressing easier, while still having the outward appearance of typical clothing.

Depending on your mom's needs, here are some of the many different types of adaptive clothing options that could help.

For self-dressing seniors who suffer from Parkinson's or other disabilities that affect dexterity, there are pants, shirts, dresses and outerwear made with Velcro or magnetic closures instead of buttons and zippers, which are much easier to fasten and unfasten. But be aware that magnetic closures are not suitable for those who have pacemakers.

For those who are disabled or who have limited range of motion and need assistance dressing, there are adaptive pants with zippers or snaps on both sides of the pants that are easier to pull on. And a wide range of rear closure shirts, tops and dresses with Velcro or snap fasteners in the back for those who can't raise their arms over their head.

For wheelchair users there are higher back and elastic waistband pants that don't slip down, as well as pants with fabric overlaps at the seat to allow for easier toileting access.

For people with tactile sensitivity, there are garments you can purchase that have soft and stretchy fabrics without tags and are sewn with flat seams to help preventing chafing.

And for seniors with Alzheimer's disease there are one-piece jumpsuits that have a back-zipper access to prevent the wearer from disrobing inappropriately.

Where to Shop

Because each person's dressing needs and style is so specific, finding appropriate adaptive clothing can be difficult.

Recently, mainstream clothing stores like JCPenney (jcpenney.com), Target (target.com) and Tommy Hilfiger (usa.tommy.com) have started offering a line of adaptive clothing for adults that combines fashion and functionality, but their instore options are limited. To get a bigger selection, visit the store's website and type in "adaptive clothing" in their search engine.

You can also find a large selection at online stores that specialize in adaptive clothing like Buck & Buck (buckandbuck.com) and Silverts (silverts.com). Both of these companies have been selling adaptive clothing for decades and offer a wide variety of garments to accommodate almost any need, condition or style, for independent selfdressers and for those who need help.



From the Roots Up

Last week or so has been wonderful gardening weather. We have had a few dry days between a few rains and moderate temperatures. It makes for a very comfortable time to work in the garden. I hope yours is growing well and you are satisfied with the progress.

Today I want to talk about growing cabbage. My cabbage is thriving. I have about 28 cabbages growing that I planted in a raised bed. Cole slaw made from a fresh green head of cabbage right from the garden is a summer treat at my house.

I hope to make sauerkraut this year, and I always freeze some sliced cabbage to put in beef vegetable soup in the winter or fry with Italian sau-

In the past, I have struggled with something eating my cabbages. Last year they destroyed my cabbage. First came holes in the leaves, then more and more holes. I saw some caterpillars, so I tried picking them off. That didn't

work, so I put food-grade diatomaceous earth on my plants. That didn't work. I looked it up on the internet and tried sprinkling flour with cayenne on my plants.

That didn't work. Then the worms hatched, and I had white moths flying everywhere. My grandkids loved the white moths; they thought it was fun trying to catch them. I gave up, pulled my eaten cabbages, and fed them to the pigs.

This year when I saw the first holes in the leaves, I went to the local feed store and talked to the gardening expert there. I came home with a bottle of Bacillus Thuringiensis, commonly called BT. I put a tablespoon of the dark green liquid in a half-gallon of water, mixed well, and sprayed the stalk and both the top and bottom of the cabbage leaves. It's been two weeks now, and I have no more holes in my leaves. My cabbages are thriving.

> So what is BT? Is it organic? My research

tells me it is an organic insecticide, and no health hazards have been linked to using it, according to the EPA. It is a natural non-pathogenic bacterium found naturally in the

It is one of the safest natural pesticides and has been used for years by gardeners. It does not harm beneficial insects or bees. The cabbage worms eat the spray off the leaves, and it paralyzes their digestive system causing them to stop eating and die.

Spray the stalk and both the top and bottom of the leaves. It is best to spray early in the morning or evening when no rain is forecast. It is effective for 3 to 7 days. If it rains within 8 hours, you must reapply.

It takes several days to see the results. The directions say not to save the leftover mixture. It also says to reapply several weeks later as needed, not routinely, as immunity can build up. It can also be used on kale, broccoli, and cauliflower.

now, and probably will remain a great pattern until it cools down again in the fall. When using dry flies, it is best to use a 9 foot 6X or 7X leader. The water level at this time is 141 CFS, at 150 and down the fishing is generally pretty decent.

The water is clearing and you can see fish quite often. In some of the holes that slow down a little quicker you can see fish a little better. Fishing woolly buggers, pheasant tail nymph, sour bugs, and burlaps have all been good.

We are still catching quite a good number of fish on San Juan worms egg patterns and on mega worms. Jig fishing is much better now black and yellow, white, olive green, and brown have all been good colors the past few weeks.

Jigs sizes right now that we are using a lot is 1/32 and one 16th. If you are fishing with an indicator, sometimes they'll fish a jig smaller than 1/100, and this is very effective in some of the areas of the park.

Plastic worms in orange, yellow, pink, and white have all been very effective the past few weeks, I think as the water clears, the white and the orange will become even better.

Plastic salmon eggs are very effective right now. The fish oil, the shrimp, and the Hatchery Brown have been very good. Of course, the Hatchery Brown will work a little better when fishing

around the Hatchery. With the excess food coming out of the hatchery, the fish will eat it readily.

Spinners are very good early in the morning we call them 30 minute wonders and that's about how long they work if you fish a spinner longer fish it very slow and as deep as you can work it without losing it on the bottom you can't catch fish all day on the spinner but the bite usually slows down after the first 30 minutes or so.

The water is clearing at 2 pound line will become very important in the next few weeks if we don't get a bunch of rain for best results probably best not to go above 4 pound test right now and try to avoid lines that are very bright clear lines or lines with a little bit of brown or green in them dearly work better when the water is clear.
