Four charges filed in Golden man's murder case

Formal charges were filed on Wednesday last week in the murder of Ed Smith, 68, of Golden.

Michael Beatty, 50, of Golden, was charged with first degree murder, attempted arson, armed criminal action, and tampering in the first degree. Beatty is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$1,000,000 cash-only bond.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, a caller informed the Barry County dispatch at 11:18 a.m. on Tuesday, June 9, that Smith had been killed and that the suspect, Michael Beatty, had fled the scene in Smith's car. The caller also stated that Beatty was armed and that the caller was afraid for his life.

When officers arrived at

the scene, Smith's trailer on Farm Road 1255 in Golden, Barry County Sheriff's Deputies Angela Cole and Bill Watkins found Smith under a pile of clothes and sheets soaked in gasoline on the bed in the trailer.

Officers immediately began a search of the area looking for Beatty or Smith's car, a white 2013 Chrysler 200. A road block was set up at the Golden Post Office and Sheriff Mick Epperly, the Missouri State Highway Patrol and Detective Doug Henry began a search near Mayo Beach.

Smith's car was located wrecked against a tree about three miles from the scene on Farm Road 2250, and Beatty was found hiding in bushes in the woods near the wreck. According to Epperly, Beatty was taken into custody by

the Sheriff's Department and the Missouri State Highway Patrol at 12:44 p.m. without incident.

Epperly revealed that Beatty was intoxicated when taken into custody, so he could not be immediately interviewed. Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx filed charges based on the investigation on Wednesday, June 10, before Beatty's 24-hour hold expired.

Upon investigation, officers discovered that Beatty had been living with Smith at the trailer in Golden, and there had possibly been some type of altercation. Epperly said that Beatty had strangulation-type marks and bruising on his neck when he was taken into custody, but it was unknown as to the circumstances of the injuries.

A closer investigation of Smith's body indicated that he had been shot multiple times in the head and possibly chest before having his clothes stripped and piled on top of him on the bed in the trailer. Deputy Watkins observed blood on the bedding as well as the walls of the bedroom in the trailer. Accord-

ing to the probable cause, a small pile of leaves had been set fire in the living room, but had gone out, making the arson attempt unsuccessful.

According to the affidavit of probable cause, Beatty attempted to clean himself up before fleeing the scene. Epperly stated that Beatty also had a bag with him before wrecking near Mayo Beach in Smith's car, leading them to believe that he was attempting to run.

An autopsy on Smith's body was done on Wednesday, June 10, at 8:30 a.m., but the results have not been released, according to the Sheriff's Department.

Beatty has a disposition hearing scheduled for Thursday, July 9, for 9 a.m.

Three arrested for home invasion at knife point

Three people have been charged with a home invasion on the Stone County side of Shell Knob earlier this week.

Duane Michael Parrish, 34, of Eagle Rock, Destinee Kay Naugle, 20, of Shell Knob, and Spencer Blake Osborne, 33, of Holiday Island, Ark., were each charged with burglary in the first degree, armed criminal action, and robbery in the first degree through the Stone County court system.

According to affidavits of probable cause from the Stone County Sheriff's Department, on June 14, there was a home invasion on Lindenwood Street in Shell Knob. According to the victim, a man forced her to let him in her home where he forced her to take her clothes off at knife point and then tied her up.

Once in the home, the suspect then ransacked the house, stole the victim's purse, drivers' license, cell

phone and prescription medication before fleeing on foot.

The three suspects were described to officers as a white female and two white males travelling in a white passenger vehicle. When officers located the vehicle in a traffic stop on Highway YY, it was being driven by Naugle. Osborne and Parrish had been passengers.

After being questioned, Naugle claimed that she

Two Barry County Deputies were recognized by Sheriff Mick Epperly for their work leading to the arrests of suspects in two burglary cases.

Deputies Angela Cole and Bill Watkins were each commended for pulling fingerprints from two different crime scenes that, once analyzed, led to charges against four different suspects. Epperly said, "I'm just proud of the two. One of the steps is getting anything you can, and it makes cases a lot easier with fingerprint and

DNA matches."

Deputy Cole investigated a report on May 12 of this year where a quarter of a million dollars worth of jewelry was stolen from a residence in Washburn. When Cole arrived at the scene on Highway 37, she located a fingerprint on the back storm door.

After sending the fingerprint to be analyzed in the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS), the department received information back on June 8 that matched a suspect already in custody

in Iowa.

Gregory Wayne Myers, 56, of Davenport, Iowa, was charged with class C felony burglary in the second degree and class B stealing. Myers is currently in jail in Muscatine County, Iowa, on similar charges. According to the affidavit of probable cause, some jewelry has already been identified at various pawn shops.

Epperly said, "We will be getting Myers back here when they are done with

Sales tax revenue up for the month for county, Cassville

Both Barry County and the City of Cassville received a significant bump in sales tax revenue collected in May. Funds received at the first of June were up 21.46 percent over 2014's totals for the county and up 13.8 percent for Cassville over 2014. Cassville also received the largest total to date on their relatively new 3/8-cent transportation sales tax.

Barry County received \$201,581.24 that was collected through May. For 2014, that total was only around \$164,000, giving the county a big jump in revenue of an extra \$31,116.73 for the month in General Revenue.

May was also good month for the county's 1/8-cent sales tax, bringing in \$50,367.24, an increase of \$9,627.02 over last year's totals.

The City of Cassville's

general one-cent sales tax collected in May was \$81,096.42. The 13.8 percent increase meant \$9,846.59 over 2014's collected funds. The transportation sales tax instituted last year after citizens passed the 3/8-cent transportation tax was \$30,392.38 for the month. The funds received at the beginning of June for May's collections were much higher than each month prior. Tax received monthly for the transportation sales tax was running in the mid-\$20,000's prior to this month.

For the year, the city of Cassville is still up 5.6 percent in sales tax revenue over 2014. A sharp downturn in revenue last month had brought that figure down, but May's figures raised the annual total.

Barry County is up 5.72 percent for the year on sales tax revenue. That increase meant an additional \$50794.45 for the year for the county thus far.

Shell Knob woman killed in head-on propane truck crash

A Shell Knob woman was killed in a car crash yesterday when the car she was driving collided with a propane tanker truck on Highway 76 west of Shell Knob.

Amy L. Zogleman, 29, of Shell Knob, was driving a 2012 Chevrolet Impala westbound when she crossed the center line and struck a propane tanker head-on, according to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report. Zogleman was pronounced dead at the scene by Barry County coroner Jim Fohn.

The driver of the 2007 Kenworth tanker truck, Charles M. Cooper, 46, of Cassville, received moderate injuries from the crash and was taken by private vehicle to Cox Monett. Cooper was wearing a seat belt, but Zogleman was not.

According to the Central Crossing Fire Depart-

ment, their crews were dispatched to the scene around 12:50 p.m. to the site near Lohmer tower. Crews remained on the scene until around 7 p.m. with the Missouri State Highway Patrol, the Barry County Sheriff's Department and Barry County E9-1-1 assisting with the incident.

Highway 76 was completely closed at times and also restricted to one lane during the time that officers and first responders were on the crash scene.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol, the crash was investigated by Trooper Bryan and assisted by Sergeant Horton, Trooper Ray, Sergeant Talik and Sergeant Curnes.

Man in custody for alleged sex crime against three-year old



Locals learn tricks of the trade of organic farming



Jon Toombs, of Berryville, Ark., spoke to the Front Porch Conversations with Garden People at the Cassville Library on Thursday, June 12, about organic farming practices that he utilizes on his farm.

Jon Toombs, a full time farmer from Berryville Ark., owns Homestead Farms, a farm that uses strictly organic methods.

On Thursday, Toombs made an appearance at the Cassville Library to give some helpful information about how to grow organic foods and what tools to use to keep pests out of your garden.

Toombs runs his farm year-round, growing many different kinds of fruits, vegetables and spices. Homestead Farms is planted more like a garden, rather than a crop field. Toombs sells most of the products they grow in Eureka Springs.

“You can grow organic foods that are not good for you,” Toombs said at the presentation. “It can be hard for most people to believe that.” Toombs added that it is extremely important to use the appropriate products if you are trying to accomplish growing a healthy garden.

For example, years ago farmers were known to use tobacco concoctions to kill insects. Those tobacco products will soak into the food and will be harmful for people to consume.

Toombs went on to say that he uses organic gardening catalogs to find the products he wants to use to kill pests in his garden. In some cases soap and water can be useful to kill insects but isn’t always effective.

The gardening process is all about observation. “The more you know about your garden, the better you can control it,” said Toombs. One of the major things that will keep your garden in good condition is to keep the soil in good shape. Although, getting your soil optimal and healthy can be a lengthy process. For some farmers, it can take years to get the soil where they want it.

Toombs expressed that if you take time in your garden and pay attention, it will be successful.

Getting an early morning start working on the garden can help with the control of insects. Early when dew is still on the plants, grasshoppers and other insects can be hand-picked off, and it makes a difference in the population of the bugs.

Toombs also said, “If you abuse your insect controls, the only things that survive is what was immune to it; you want the controls to be at a manageable level.”

Some major things you can do in your garden to keep it thriving is give it significant attention, use traps, apply repellents, lots of hand picking and crop rotation.

In the conclusion of the presentation, Toombs said, “Knowledge is power. Use books and the internet to find information you’re looking for.”

Cassville contracts new building inspector

After six months without an official building inspector, the City of Cassville hired Roger Day of Better Products to assess future building projects within the city limits. The Cassville City Council approved using Day as a consultant for building inspections when they passed a resolution at their meeting on Monday, June 8. Day's contract is effective July 1 through June 30, 2016.

Cassville moved to make the decision after their former inspector informed them of his retirement. Larry Angel, a contractor from Berryville, Ark., contracted for the city for four years. Public Works Director Steve Walensky has been approving building permits since Angel's retirement toward the end of last year.

At Monday's meeting, Walensky said, "Roger has been providing that guidance for and filling that role for us in recent months, and we're glad to have him."

A few council members questioned why the city did not hire someone locally for the position, but according to Walensky, no local contractors were interested, so he began checking with other cities in southwest Missouri to see who they used for their inspections.

Mayor Bill Shiveley pointed out to the council that none of the local con-

tractors were certified for the position and there can be conflicts of interest since they would be inspecting plans of competing construction companies.

It was by contacting a variety of other cities that Walensky received the recommendation to use Day for Cassville.

Prior to passing the resolution, alderman Jon Horner asked, "With Roger being in Republic, is that going to be an issue with out residents and contracts with him being out of town?"

Walensky assured that council that that was not the case. He said, "I've been taking photos with my phone and it's been sufficient at times when he isn't here. It's worked fine. For bigger projects, we've explained the situation and asked for notice prior to them needing an on-site inspection. It's worked well."

Alderman Terry Heinz stated, "For the first time in Cassville history, we have a truly qualified man doing the inspections. I think the old days of walking in the door and saying, 'I need a building permit today' are gone. It may be a day or two, but it'll be worth it."

Walensky said that he initially reached out Day in January after Angel's retirement, but the official decision to enter into the contract was not until the June meeting and goes into

effect July 1.

Day's responsibilities as building inspector will remain the same as the inspector before him. His primary function is to do plan reviews and inspections as well as ensuring that all plans are 2006 International Building Code compliant.

Walensky said that Day will possibly assisting with two new projects, as well. He plans to have Day reevaluate the building permit fees charged by the city to see if they are comparable to other cities locally and review current ordinances as they relate to standard building codes.

Walensky said, "The building permit fees have not been changed in a long time, so we want to make sure that they are set at the right rate and in line with other areas."

All of Day's charges will be paid out of planning and zoning funds in the 2015 budget. Revenue from building permit fees go into that account, as well.

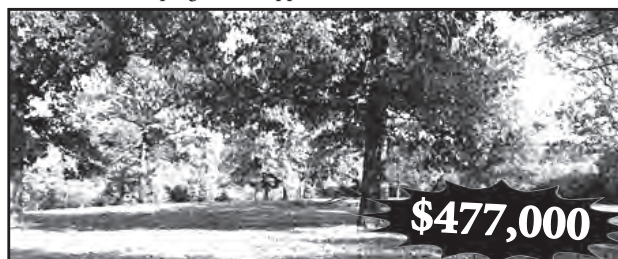

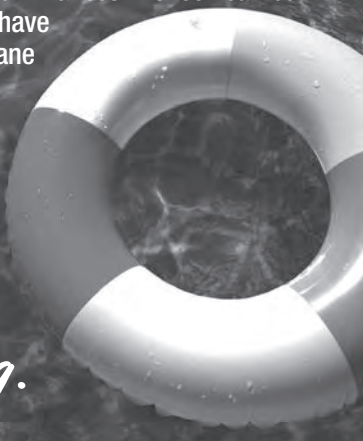

Jury trial set for 2nd degree murder case

The jury trial has been set for Seligman man Brian Sharp who is accused of the wreck that resulted in the death of his passenger in the fall.

Sharp, 32, was charged with second degree murder, driving while revoked or suspended and leaving the scene of a motor vehicle accident with an injury on August 7 last year. On Tuesday, June 16, Sharp's attorney's, Darwin Groomer, of Monett, request for a speedy trial was sustained by Barry County Judge Jack Goodman. Sharp's trial is set for Wednesday, September 16, at 9 a.m.

On August 3, 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol was dispatched to a motor vehicle crash on Missouri 90 two miles west of Washburn around 6:14 p.m. When a trooper arrived, a 1979 Chevrolet Corvette was totalled when

it ran off the roadway and overturned. The passenger in the car, Kenneth A. Patterson, 48, of Seligman, was pronounced dead at the scene.

Upon investigation, cold beer cans were found all around the car at the crash site, and a cell phone was laying on the ground. When officers made contact with the vehicle's owner, Sharp's mother, she gave them his cell phone number. When the number was called, the cell phone from the wreck began to ring.

Sharp had multiple driving while revoked or suspended charges prior to the crash. Sharp is still held in the Barry County Jail on a \$100,000 cash-only bond.

him, but I want to recognize the officer for outstanding work on that fingerprint."

After Cole's initial report, Detectives Rob Even-son and Doug Henry have been working on the case and locating the jewelry that Myers allegedly pawed after the burglary. Epperly said, "He's pawned a lot of stuff along the way, and we're in recovery now. He had jewelry on him at the time of his arrest as well as in a briefcase. We've already got some pictures on that and the detectives are analyzing those."

Deputy Watkins also pulled a fingerprint that led to arrests and charges filed against three different people from out of state. On October 5, 2014, Watkins was dispatched to a crime scene between Washburn and Seligman for a burglary. According to the affidavit of probable cause, entry was made by cutting a window screen. Once inside, jewelry totalling \$8,316.60 and a Beretta .25 caliber pistol were stolen from the home.

During his investigation, Watkins found three fingerprints at the scene that were then submitted to the Missouri Crime Lab in Carthage. On December 19, 2014, the prints matched to Jeffrey Allen Mounts, 23, of Huntington, Va.

Once the investigation was complete, Mounts, Charlene Hayes, 46, Sweetwater, Tenn., and James Wagner, 51, of Madisonville, Tenn. were all arrested for the burglary. Mounts was charged with stealing and burglary in the first degree. Hayes and Wagner were each charged with stealing and burglary in the second degree.

Epperly said, "I don't think they would have been solved without the fingerprints the deputies found."

Parrish was released from the Barry County Jail on a \$100,000 bond on Tuesday, June 16. Naugle and Osborne are each being held in the Stone County Jail in lieu of \$100,000 bonds.
