Same-sex marriage licenses to be issued in Barry County

After a historic decision by the United States Supreme Court to lift state bans on same-sex marriage in a 5-4 decision on Friday morning, it may be three weeks before the Barry County recorder's office will offer the licenses locally.

According to Barry County Recorder of Deeds Craig Williams, licenses will be offered beginning July 21. Williams said, "It is 25 days after the decision. This should allow for our computer software to be updated."

Barry County is one of around 30 rural counties in the state that have software that has spaces for "husband" and "wife" in their system. Those software issues will be resolved across the state so that the two parties on the licenses are not sex-dependent. Other rural counties anticipate having the issue resolved faster than Barry County.

While the effects of a ruling must be implemented 25 days following a ruling, recorders can issue licenses before that if they choose. According to Jan Jones, the president of the Recorders Association of Missouri, "The sum and substance of the ruling makes clear the Fourteenth Amendment to the US Constitution re-

quires a State to license marriage between two people of the same sex."

She added, "It is also important to point out there is no restriction with regarding to implementing the ruling before 25 days."

Missouri was one of 13 remaining states that still had a same-sex marriage ban in place. With the Supreme Court's ruling in Obergefell v. Hodges, all 50 states are constitutionally required to issue marriage licenses and recognize same-sex marriages under the new Fourteenth Amendment.

Locally, State Senator David Sater (R-Cassville), said, "I am very disappointed in the decision. The Supreme Court has once again gone outside of their function, which is to apply rulings based on the constitution and not to legislate. Marriage has only been between a man and woman for thousands of years. For a few lawyers to even consider making this decision is ridiculous."

State Representative Scott Fitzpatrick (R-Shell Knob) said, "In 2004, 71 percent of Missouri voters overwhelmingly voted to define marriage as between a man and a woman. Every single county except

She joked, "I married Papa for his mules and wagon." But she continued, "God brought him into my life to bring us on this journey. To be given a task 25 years ago and to be put with the one person to make it happen is pretty amazing."

Gene has made many impressive journeys by wagon or horseback. He's ridden to all 48 contiguous state capitals, from the arctic to the equator where he then gifted his horses to the president of Ecuador, and a trip from the Pacific Ocean to the Atlantic Ocean and back again. With the amazing journeys that Gene has made, he's been met with much adversity, including blood poisoning, openheart surgery and, on this trip, having a pacemaker put in. He said, "Always within six weeks,

I was back on the road driving the team."

The dynamic between Noqoa and Gene, who lovingly refer to each other as Mama and Papa, shows the love and appreciation they have for life and their work in the missions field. Gene said, "The last few years of my life, I've been about to live the life that many people dream about in terms of being a missionary."

For Gene, they journeys are a reflection of his personality and outlook. He said, "I'm a bit of a practical joker. The Bible says that laughter is good like medicine, so maybe that's why I've been around for 80 years."

New charges for accused Golden murderer

been filed against Michael Beatty, the man accused of murdering Golden resident Ed Smith in his trailer on


Beatty is now being charged with misdemeanor driving while intoxicated, misdemeanor careless and imprudent driving, misdemeanor driving without a license and failing to wear a safety belt. According to an affidavit of probable cause by Missouri State Highway Patrol Trooper T. Coffey, who was dispatched to the homicide of Ed Smith, 68, of Golden, Beatty had driven the victim's car away and crashed it off the south side of Farm Road 2250 east of Farm Road 1247.

Beatty had fled the scene and was hiding in nearby bushes when he was found

by the Highway Patrol and Four new charges have the Barry County Sheriff's Department. Coffey noted in the report that the investigation determined that Beatty had been travelling too fast for the conditions and he failed to negotiate a left curve, leading to the crash against a tree.

After Beatty was arrested, Trooper Coffey attempted to administer tests to determine if he was intoxicated, but Beatty was uncooperative. He was reported to smell strongly of alcohol, have blood shot eyes and dilated pupils, according to the officers' observations.

Barry County Judge Robert Foulke issued a \$4,500 cash-only bond for the new charges, bringing his bond to \$1,005,500 with the \$1,00,000 bond on his murder charges and \$1,000 for a failure to appear from a

domestic assault in the third degree from Greene County. Beatty is still being held in the Barry County Jail.

Beatty is facing murder in the first degree, attempted arson in the second degree, armed criminal action and tampering with a motor vehicle for the death of Smith.

Beatty has a disposition hearing scheduled for Thursday, July 9, for both cases against him.

Governor's warrant brings man back to Barry County

An Exeter man was extradited back to Barry County on warrants from April after a Governor's warrant was issued.

Martin Davis, 39, of Exeter, was being held in the Boone County, Ark., jail, according to Barry County Sheriff's Office, but he refused extradition back to Missouri and it took a governor's warrant to get him back. Boone County, Ark., Jail held Davis on the outstanding warrants from Barry County from April.

Davis is charged with tampering with a witness, harassment, two counts of stealing a firearm, making a false report and property damage in the first degree. He was also charged with domestic assault in the third degree from March.

According to the affidavits of probable cause, Davis filled out a statement with the Barry County Sheriff's Office that a woman had assaulted him with a knife, damaged property and stolen firearms from a safe belonging to another person in late March. When interviewed, the woman said that the



firearms were in Davis's possession in his home in Arkansas. The woman then drove to his residence and took them to the Sheriff's Office, according to the re-

Then, on April 10, Davis called the woman and threatened her about the case against him for the firearm thefts and false report, according to the court documents. Davis allegedly threatened the woman's life and told her to get the charges dropped







emptions, the Fourteenth Amendment requires that same-sex marriage be recognized and allowed by government entities. Other issues facing the LGBTQ community regarding protection against discrimination will be dealt with locally, or federally, in other rulings.

In the official ruling of the Supreme Court, it states, "The history of marriage as a union between two persons of the opposite sex marks the beginning of these cases. To the respondents, it would demean a timeless institution if marriage were extended to same-sex couples. But the petitioners, far from seeking to devalue marriage, seek it for themselves because of their respect - and need - for its privileges and responsibilities, as illustrated by the petitioners' own experiences."

In the Opinion of the

Court of the Fourteenth Amendment, Justice Anthony Kennedy "From their beginning to their most recent page, the annals of human history reveal the transcendent importance of marriage. The lifelong union of a man and a woman always has promised nobility and dignity to all persons, without regard to their station in life. Marriage is sacred to those who live by their religions and offers unique fulfillment to those who find meaning in the secular realm. Its dynamic allows two people to find a life that could not be found alone, for a marriage becomes greater than just the two persons. Rising from the most basic human needs, marriage is essential to our most profound hopes and aspirations."

In closing, Justice Kennedy stated, "No union is more profound than marriage,

for it embodies the highest ideals of love, fidelity, devotion, sacrifice, and family. In forming a marital union, two people become something greater than once they were. As some of the petitioners in these cases demonstrate, marriage embodies a love that may endure even past death. It would misunderstand these men and women to say they disrespect the idea of marriage. Their plea is that they do respect it, respect it so deeply that they seek to find its fulfillment for themselves. Their hope is not to be condemned to live in loneliness, excluded from one of civilization's oldest institutions. They ask for equal dignity in the eyes of the law. The Constitution grants them that right.

MSHP urges have a safe Fourth of July weekend

The 2015 July Fourth holiday brings to mind sunshine, barbecues, friends, and fireworks-all of which are ways to celebrate the freedoms we enjoy in this country. Americans are a diverse group, but this holiday represents what is universal about us. Many people will travel somewhere to enjoy the three-day holiday. Whether your plans will take place on land or on the water, Colonel J. Bret Johnson, superintendent of the Missouri State Highway Patrol, reminds Missouri's travelers of the importance of safety during the upcoming July Fourth holiday.

In 2014, nine people were killed and 525 injured in Missouri over the holiday in 1,233 traffic crashes. One person was killed or injured every 10.8 minutes. Over the 2014 July Fourth holiday, troopers arrested 155 people for driving while intoxicated.

The 2015 counting period for the July Fourth holiday will be from 6 p.m., Friday, July 3, to 11:59 p.m., Sunday, July 5.

The July Fourth weekend is also one of the quarterly DWI enforcement mobilization dates. Many of the troops have checkpoints and saturations scheduled for this period. Troopers have a zero tolerance for drinking and driving, whether on the road or on the water. Drinking and driving don't mix.

The Highway Patrol will be participating in Operation C.A.R.E. (Combined Accident Reduction Effort) over the July Fourth holiday weekend. All available officers will be patrolling Missouri's roadways enforcing Missouri's traffic laws in addition to being available

to assist motorists. There is never a good reason to drive over the speed limit. There is always a good reason to wear your seat belt. Drinking and driving don't mix. Remember: Statutes direct motorists to drive with the highest degree of care. Please be a courteous driver and follow all traffic laws.

Troopers throughout the state will participate in a 20-Mile Trooper operation on Thursday, July 2, and Sunday, July 5, 2015. This operation will include Interstates 35, 44, 55, and 70, and U.S. Highways 60 and 63. Troopers will be highly visible while targeting all traffic violations, and be especially vigilant of aggressive driving violations.

Motorists who need assistance or who witness criminal activity while traveling on Missouri's roadways can contact the nearest Highway Patrol troop headquarters by calling the Patrol Emergency Report Line at 1-800-525-5555 or *55 on a cellular phone. Motorists may call 1-888-275-6636 to check for road construction or possible flooding along their travel route.

The Highway Patrol also reminds the public that the Fourth of July holiday is one of the busiest boating holidays of the year. In 2014, there were 21 boating crashes, which included 16 injuries and two fatalities. Four people drowned during last year's July Fourth holiday. One person drowned at Table Rock Lake



in Stone County; one person drowned at Lake of the Ozarks in Camden County; one person drowned in the Castor River in Wayne County; and one drowned on private property in Maries County.

Troopers will be working on the state's waters to ensure safety. Missouri's boaters are asked to do their part by remaining alert for other boats and swimmers, and being courteous on the water. With more boats on the water, it is even more important to pay attention when operating your vessel.

Remember:

- · Distractions and alcohol consumption slow reaction time.
- · Closely monitor the boats around you.
- · Make evasive maneuvers early and deliberately.

The many firework displays after dark attract many more boaters at night.

At night, remember to:

- · Check your vessel's navigation lights before heading out, and be sure to have spare bulbs on board.
- · Avoid overloading your boat with too many passengers. This can cause the boat to become swamped and affect the handling of the boat.
- · Observe Missouri's nighttime speed limit of 30 miles per hour on the water.

· Slow down and take your time. Nighttime crashes tend to involve more serious injuries and damage, due to the lack of visibility.

Finally, it is illegal to discharge fireworks from a vessel, so leave them in a safe place on shore.

"Motorists and boaters must make safety a priority every time they are behind the wheel. Drivers make sure your passengers wear their seat belts; boat captains should insist that everyone wear a lifejacket," said Colonel Johnson. "Please be courteous whether operating a vehicle or a vessel. If your celebration includes alcohol, designate someone else to act as your sober chauffeur."

Approximately 63 percent of Missouri fatal crash victims who are required to be restrained are NOT at the time of the traffic crash. The Patrol urges motorists to protect themselves and their passengers by making sure everyone in the vehicle is properly restrained in a seat belt or child restraint. Join us in supporting the Drive To Zero Highway Deaths. Watercraft operators should ensure that everyone in the vessel is wearing an approved life jacket. Click It 4 Life And Wear It!!

With two years of marriage under their belts, they journey together to complete a mission they both believe was ordained by God.

Noqoa said, "The vision was given by the Creator, and you don't question those instructions and think, 'why, why,' you just do it."

So with their three mules, Kitty, Kate and Buddy, and their dog, Bell, or as Gene calls her, "my ding-a-ling Bell," the duo left Ashville, North Carolina, on April 8, 2014, toward Red Clay Tenn., where the Trail of Tears began. From there, they set out to make the journey, at a pace of around 10 to 15 miles a day, so as not to exhaust their mules.

Gene and Noqoa passed through Barry County as part of their mission to take the trip Noqoa was destined to take. They passed through Butterfield on Wednesday, June 24, and stopped to rest before making it into Cassville on Thursday, June 25, where they rested at the Barry County Museum until setting out again on Monday.

Noqoa said, "This has been one of the kindest, softest places we've ever been. The whole community has been so kind. We've been so blessed by this community." She mentioned the number of people who have helped them locally by bringing food, shoeing their mules, or just sitting and visiting.

She continued, "We would like to thank the city of Cassville from the bottoms of our hearts to give us such a soft place to land and have a place to rest. And thank you to Butterfield, too. They were so kind and helpful."


As Noqoa and Gene continue their journey, they will be met with trials and triumphs. It is with great joy and passion that they move on with their mission, sharing the Gospel as they go, and impacting the lives of the people who they meet along the way.

The original trail claimed the lives of an estimated 4,000 to 8,000 Cherokee of the 15,000 who began the journey and became known as "Nuahi-dunadlo-hilu-i" or "the Trail Where They Cried." It is a somber reality to think of how difficult the journey through the Appalachian Mountains and walk more than a thousand miles to their final destination in Oklahoma.

Noqoa is still taking the trip with her son, although it is his ashes that ride along in the covered wagon with her, Gene and Bell, but at the end of the journey, she will have fulfilled the mission she was assigned. It is with appreciation and positivity, the sharing of the word of God, and warm smiles that Gene and Noqoa make the journey that so many Cherokee did not survive so many years ago.

Barry County E9-1-1 continues Geographic Info System mapping for safer citizens

When most people think about the Barry County E9-1-1 Center, emergency dispatching comes to mind. However, the local center is much more than meets the eye, and it is much more than dispatching that keeps Barry County citizens and tourists travelling through safe in the event of an emergency.

When E9-1-1 first came to be, a company based out of Virginia was contracted to begin initial mapping process and address notification changes of the county. Instead of Rural Routes, Barry County was converted to a Farm Road system that allows emergency dispatchers to pinpoint addresses better.

Mike Phillips, the current director for Barry County E9-1-1, was the first person hired to work on a mapping system as an employee for the center. Phillips began working on the Geographic Information System (GIS), which serves to map the entire county with addresses, landmarks and geo-

graphic features to make dispatching faster, more effective and keep citizens safer.

In April, Ann Hennigan, former office manager, moved to the GIS position and is working to make the mapping system locally even more precise and detailed.

Hennigan said, "Basically, GIS is made up of three parts: the database, the map and tools." The database keeps specific information about anything on a map, such as a specific address, landmark or town border. The map shows everything in the database in relation to the earth's surface, and the tools are what Ann uses to create and edit the existing database and map.

Recently, Hennigan has been working with Kerry Hays, the natural resource manager at Roaring River State Park, to make sure that all locations at the park match up to a number in GIS for effective dispatching. Each building and campground at the park just finished being mapped and assigned numbers. Up next will

be the hiking trails not only in the park, but also throughout the county.

Hennigan said, "It'll really help tourists if they don't know a physical address for where they are, but it'll also help us to dispatch our emergency responders to the correct place."

As far as mapping the trails, Hennigan said, "A lot of people twist their ankles when they're out and about, not just in the park, but on all of the trails in Barry County, and we want to be able to find them, too."

Hennigan's job means spending three days a week out of the office, driving around with a tablet and pinpointing addresses, which is a very detailed system in the county. When the E9-1-1 Center was established, the address switch meant a detailed system to help make addresses more uniform.

The addressing system in the county is known as the Mile Marker System. The system assigns a number based on the number of miles that particular point lies from the northern and western county

lines. For example, if you live at 15747 Farm Road 1240, you are approximately 24 miles east of the western county line and 15.747 miles south of the north county line. While it seems complicated, it is a simple system to establish ad-

dresses that are seamless for mapping purposes.

Hennigan said that Stewart Lombard, who did GIS after Phillips, was responsible for accurate addressing in Wheaton, Washburn, Exeter and Butterfield. She added, "He also reached out to Google because the addresses for Barry County are often wrong. He sent all of that data to them and hopefully we'll have addressing correct. They don't have access to

Southwest Schools Semester Review

Bob Walker, Superintendent of Southwest Schools

As our summer session winds down, school year 2014-2015 officially draws to a close. Consistent with what we typically do at this time, I would like to provide a recap of this past semester. The purpose of these reviews is to share information concerning our differ-

ent programs and accomplishments, as we hopefully provide to our patrons more insight in respect to what is going on at Southwest R-V.

Certainly we enjoyed more consistency this past semester as there were far fewer weather issues compared to the winter of 2014. We only missed six days due to snow and ice, all of

which were made up, and still ended school by May 18. This will allow our students to benefit from a full summer break before returning to school on August 10. I might mention that in

addition to finding the date for the first day of classes, the entire calendar for next school year can be found at on our recently upgraded web site, www.swr5.net. The 2015-2016 calendar will be similar to this past year, incorporating 172 student days and eight professional development days. Please visit our web site. I think you will find it very informative.

In respect to capital improvements, the district's Agriculture department received a new greenhouse this past spring. A Conley Gable Series 7500 unit was completed just as school was ending, for a cost of just over \$70,000. Ap-

proximately half of its expense was reimbursed back to the school through a career education state grant. It is a great addition to our school and our Ag teachers and students are looking forward to putting it to good use.

Work was also completed

on our new preschool facility. As reported in our previous review, Southwest was fortunate to receive a grant through the Missouri Preschool Program this past fall. This included establishing classroom space in the form of a new modular building, as well as constructing a new outside play area. Everyone involved in transforming the property at the southeast corner of our campus into a top notch preschool facility, did an excellent job. I want to especially acknowledge our maintenance director Tom Lawrence in this endeavor. It would also be appropriate to mention our preschool director and teacher Rachel Stephenson. Rachel has done a good job getting our program off and running, and is enthusiastic about having things in place for a full year when school resumes in August.

From an academic standpoint, Southwest had another productive year. Again, it really helps when the weather allows for school to stay in session on a consistent basis. Final results from spring testing are not yet known, but initial indications are encouraging. The whole testing dynamic, as well as state learning standards are really hot topic items at this point in time. These along with more stringent evaluation models can create an atmosphere of anxiety. Like most things, there has to be a balance. I think Missouri, along with most other states across the nation, is trying to find that balance. I'm very much in favor of making schools accountable. However, expectations for both students and educators need to be realistic. Regardless, I'm very proud of our kids and very pleased of with our staff members for the improvements made academically.

Southwest students continue to participate in a well-rounded extracurricular program of activities. Although there were no state or district championships won this past semester, our kids competed and performed well in a va-

Basketball players who received all district recognition included Blake Barnes (1st team), Brad Daniels (2nd team), Shannon Mitchell (1st team), and Jamie Shrum (1st team), with Shannon also being named Ozark Seven Conference Player of the Year. Baseball players receiving all district recognition were Garrett Hobbs (1st team) and Lane England (2nd team), while softball all district players included Holly Crow, Sidney Delosantos, Jamie Shrum, and Taylor Swindle. 



Those who have access to the maps are the four dispatch stations, some Emergency Medical Services and some law enforcement and fire departments. Hennigan said, "If they have a laptop, we can load a map onto it. They can't make changes, but they can find where they are going a lot faster."

Hennigan said, "It's a big county. It's a lot of miles to cover. They're all over, so you spend a lot of time driving to cover all of theses places, but it's all worth it because everyone deserves to be found in the case of an emergency."

In the bigger picture, Hennigan also plans to label the type of road (i.e. gravel, chip and seal, asphalt, etc.) and sources of water. Hennigan said, "If there is any type of incident, we want to know what road is going to be faster. Obviously a chip and seal road is going to be faster than a gravel road." She said mapping the water sources will be useful for if a fire department needs to refill their tanker when working a fire.

Hennigan said, "What we're doing now is just the tip of the iceberg."




