#### **Bottle Rocket Wars**

Bottle rocket wars were one of the highlights of my teenage years. We would hold the bottle rocket between two fingers and shoot it right at a friend. Somehow no one lost an eye and my mom didn't wring my neck when she would eventually find out about it. These days I prefer celebrating in a peaceful nonbodily maiming way. I hope the stock market does July in a peaceful non-maiming way as well.

As the calendar has turned to July, most of us want to forget the first six months of 2022. The first half of this year was rough for the market but thankfully July is historically a good month for stocks. Over the past 10 years, the month of July has been particularly good, with the S&P 500 Index averaging a monthly gain of about 2% according to LPL.

Both stock and bond markets have been challenging this year, but history gives us a little optimism. Right

after the seven biggest twoquarter market drops since WWII, stocks rose an average of 21.5% over the next six months, going positive every

For several months now both bonds and stocks have been going down in unison, a relatively rare occurrence. This relationship has been starting to normalize in recent weeks, suggesting a possible return of the historical pattern but it's dependent on how the Federal Reserve's policy plays out. However, long-term rates traditionally peak before the Fed ends its interest rate hiking campaigns, which could be good news for bonds in the coming months.

As for stocks, I feel like things could start getting better. Several indicators show stocks were oversold but it's too early to say. I think any good news on the inflation front could spark a rally. LPL Research updated its yearend target for the S&P 500 Index to a range of 4,300 to 4,400, which allows for potential 12-15% gains from current levels through year-

This may happen, especially if a recession can be averted in 2022 as I expect. Though many analysts believe if our economy does go into recession in the next 18 months, it would be a minor recession.

## Man Arrested with \$150,000 Bond

Kelvin Salas has been arrested for the alleged offenses of: unlawful use of a weapon, armed criminal action, stalking, and tampering with a victim. Salas is currently being held in the Barry County Jail with a cash-only bond of \$150,000.

According to a statement of probable cause filed by Officer Iannaccone, at approximately 11:15 p.m. on July 6, officers of the Monett Police Department were dispatched to a gun-related harassment call at a residence in Monett. Before arriving, officers were given information that the suspect was Kelvin Salas and he was driving a green pickup truck.

Upon arrival, Officer lannaccone spoke with the reporting party. The reporting party informed lannaccone that she was standing outside of her Monett residence when she noticed Kelvin Salas drive by with his vehicle's headlights off, proceeding to slowly stop outside of her residence. Salas then allegedly pointed a black pistol at the residence, and the reporting party stated she heard the "slide of a pistol being cocked."

Officer lannaccone also spoke with a second reporting party who recently had an order of protection approved against Salas, however, he had not yet been served. The second reporting party informed the officer that Salas repeatedly drives by with different vehicles, harassing and stalking her and her sisters.

The second reporting

party and her sisters then informed lannaccone that they are "mentally exhausted and scared for their safety because of Salas."

According to lannaccone, Salas has been repeatedly involved in reports of harassment and stalking these individuals, as well as a third reporting party, her children, and her paramours. The third reporting party additionally reported that Salas threatened her with a gun on June 22, 2022.

The third reporting party states that Salas had shot a gun in her direction while at the Monett South Park and her paramour reported that on two different occasions Salas allegedly chased him with his vehicle.

Salas was arrested on July 7 and has been charged with two counts of unlawful use of a weapon, two counts of stalking in the first degree, and two counts of armed criminal action.

Still having some of the best dry fly fishing of the year right now. Ants, hoppers, beetles, crackle backs, caddis, BW0's and trico hatch is very good early in the morning, but put your glasses in your vest, we are using #22 and #24 flies to match the hatch.

Very small zebra midges have been good, #18's and smaller are really doing well. Scuds, sow bugs and copper johns are good right now. I've got a local tyer tying scuds right now, and he is staying busy.

Pheasant tails and burlaps are still pretty good, and the chamois worm is as good as ever. Black buggers, and olive buggers are working well, as are the orange, pink, and the white san juan worms. 9' 7X leaders work best on the smaller dry flies, and nymphs, but I'm using 6X on my hoppers and beetles and on the buggers.

If you are using plastics, then the fish oil eggs, and the shrimp eggs are still doing very well, the orange worms are still pretty good, and pink seems to work everyday, the white eggs are working and the yellow and pink grubs have been very good lately, the brown hatchery eggs are really doing a good job up around the hatchery.

Sight fishing with a marabou jig is great right now, you'll need 2 lb line to really have a good day, 4 lb will work, but you'll get less activity.

Good jigs have been 1/64 and smaller but still getting plenty of trout on the bigger jigs, lots of people fishing the micro style jigs and the smaller jigs under indicators, this is extreme-

Spoons, Roostertail type spinners and other hard baits work really good early in the day, and sometimes in the last few hours of the day, so throw em if you got em, black, olive, gold, copper and cream colors are working pretty good, a rebel teeny crawfish will work most days.

2lb line will be your best bet this week, the water is low and clear, 47 CFS at the moment and it drops a bit every day with no rain in the two week forecast.

Thank you for the enlightening articles in the Advertiser about the duties of the Presiding Commissioner-or "PC" for convenience. It occurs to me that electing a PC is comparable to hiring the Chief Executive Officer or CEO of a corporation. The county has various departments or offices, each with its own duties, personnel, and budget. The PC must interact with all of these and settle amicably any conflicts between departments and persons. Each of the other two commissioners represents a specific portion of Barry County, but the PC must consider the good of the entire county, sometimes arbitrating between the other two. My description simply touches the surface of what the PC needs to do. It is a highly demanding office.

In hiring a CEO or PC, we should consider the qualifications needed in the job. Certainly the person should be experienced in running a business, hiring personnel, and managing finances and budgets. Those in business learn to deal genially with all types of persons, an essential quality for the PC.

People in other states and other parts of Missouri think of us in the southwest part of the state as ignorant. To me, it is important to have a PC representing our county who can refute this stigma by

speaking cognitively and eloquently, and by writing literate and grammatical letters and reports.

Our PC should be civicminded and public-spirited. He or she should be a person who has displayed this charitable spirit by serving in organizations and on boards for the improvement of the schools and community.

Before I vote, I plan to study the candidates and see which of them best fits my ideals for our Presiding Commissioner.

At age 93 my brain is still fairly good and my body is weary. The possibility of nursing home care is concerning, so I have done a bit of research and then I have a question.

Eleven percent of nursing homes in America are privately owned. I was curious if there is a difference in care in the facilities. I quote: "A review and meta-analysis of 62 studies showed higher quality, higher staffing, and fewer pressure sores in notfor-profit facilities." Life Care Centers of America is the largest nursing home owner with revenue of ten billion dollars annually as of 2021.

I wondered about margin of profit and could not find that information. What I did

find was: "For-profit providers reaped \$16 per resident per day more than non profits." Assuming the non-profits make a profit, that means the for-profit make \$480 dollars MORE every 30 days per person!


I am wondering if there is a better way of taking care of the elderly? It seems unfair, even obscene, for people to live conservatively, save carefully, over a working lifetime, and have it gobbled up at a very rapid rate.

My question is: do cities and even small towns, consider a more economical way to care for senior citizens who need this kind of special care? If nursing homes make a profit, could cities and towns make a lesser profit and perhaps provide at least as good or better care? Inquisitive minds would like to know.

# **Imagination Library Expands Across Barry County**

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a service that sends books, free of charge, to children up to age five. Parents sign their children up via an online or paper form and eight to ten weeks later, books will begin arriving until the child turns five or the family moves. Completely free of cost to the parent, a child receives a new book every month in their name. This is meant to ensure that each child has access to early literacy and becomes comfortable with the idea of reading. The program has spread across the United States, Canada, Europe, and Australia, and now covers nearly all of Barry County as

"New research has shown that the number of books in the home is a key indicator of academic success," says Teresa Phillips, Program Manager and Imagination Library Affiliate. "In fact, children with just 25 books in the home are more likely to com-

plete an additional two years of school. Vocabulary development by age three has been shown to predict a child's achievement by third grade."

Seven months after opening in Cassville and Exeter on January 3 of this year, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library has experienced exponential growth and flourished across the county.

"I wanted to start it smaller, to take it step by step," Phillips says. She wanted to gauge the reaction and the interest before adding any other towns and to ensure that funding was available.

"When we opened it," she continues, "immediately, there was a really good response from the entire community. Dolly Parton Imagination Library gives us the number of eligible children in the area, as well as the projected amount they think will register each month, and we were beyond the projections immediately for Cassville and Exeter."

After gaining several in-

dividual donations, Phillips states that as the project has gained momentum, Imagination Library has received a number of donations from local businesses and this, according to Phillips, is the source of the majority of the current funding.

"The Dolly Parton Imagination Library Foundation covers all the cost except for \$2.10 per child per month, so about \$25 a year per child. The Affiliate's responsibility is to raise that portion of the funds."

After the project took root in Cassville and Exeter, the Thrifty Closet volunteered to sponsor an expansion into Shell Knob/Viola. A few months later it was decided to expand to Wheaton, Washburn, Seligman, Eagle Rock, and Golden. Although some donations have been received, funding is an ongoing effort for the affiliate.

"Purdy school opened their own, and so the only areas of Barry County that we don't cover are Purdy and Monett." Phillips says that Monett is on the horizon, though the funding would have to be secured to advance the program into such a comparatively dense population.

Currently, Phillips's branch of the program has 287 children registered across southern Barry County, but this number is growing every day, according to Phillips. "I had five this morning," she says. "It's been going really well. Since July 1, our registrations have doubled."







How to Find and Claim Your Family's Forgotten As-

Dear Savvy Senior,

A while back I read an article about some online tools that can help people search for lost or forgotten money left behind by their deceased relatives, but I've misplaced it. Can you help me with this? My mom, who passed away in January, was always bad about keeping up with her money, so I'm wondering if there was anything she left behind.

Searching Son

Dear Searching,

Forgotten or lost money is actually very common in the United States. According to the National Association of Unclaimed Property Administrators, there are literally billions of dollars in unclaimed funds sitting in state treasuries and other agencies just waiting to be found.

are from accounts that are inactive or whose owners, or their heirs, cannot be located. Unclaimed funds can include things like lost or forgotten saving or checking accounts, stocks, utility security deposits, tax refunds, life insurance policy proceeds, un-cashed dividend checks, matured savings bonds and much more.

This typically happens

These unclaimed funds

because of a change of address (the owner moved), a name change (the owner got married or divorced), or the owner dies, and the estate was unaware of the money or the heirs could not be located. By law, companies and financial institutions that can't find the owner or their next of kin within two to five years must turn the property over to the state where it's held in-

About 10 percent of all Americans have some unclaimed money out there waiting to be found, so it's very possible your mother had some too. To start your search, go to Unclaimed.org, which has links to all state programs that will let you do a state benefits search online for free. Or you can do a multi-state search in 39 states at MissingMoney.com.

definitely.

Be sure to check every state in which your mother lived, worked or did business. Also, make sure to check under your mom's maiden name, and if she had a frequently misspelled name, search those misspellings too. Using her first initial and her last name is also encouraged to make sure everything comes up.

Every state can tell you immediately if your mom has some unclaimed money, as well as how to go about col-

In addition to state treasuries, here are some other resources that can help you look for unclaimed money that may have been overlooked.

Forgotten retirement benefits: To search for lost or forgotten 401(k) funds your mom may have left behind with an old employer, use

the National Registry of Unclaimed Retirement Benefits UnclaimedRetirement-Benefits.com. Or to search for lost pension benefits, use the Pension Benefit Guaranty Corporation trusteed plan search tool at PBGC.gov/ search-trusteed-plans.

Lost life insurance: To track down a lost or forgotten life insurance policy, the National Association of Insurance Commissioners, an insurance regulatory support organization, offers a free policy locator service at https://eapps.naic.org/lifepolicy-locator. savings

Unredeemed bonds: It's very common for people to lose track of U.S. saving bonds because they are often given to children as gifts, then forgotten before the bonds reach maturity. To find out if your mom had any, the U.S. Department of the Treasury provides an online search tool at TreasuryHunt. gov for finding matured, uncashed savings bonds over 30 years old and no longer earning interest.

Federal tax refunds: Each year thousands of refund checks totaling millions of dollars are returned to the IRS by the post office. To look for lost Federal tax refund checks go to IRS.gov/refunds or call 800-829-1954.
