### Sen. Roy Blunt replaces stolen flag at the Cassville Senior Center

Yesterday marked an unexpected surprise for the local Cassville Senior Center when U.S. Senator Roy Blunt came to present a new flag to replace the one stolen two weeks ago.

After being a target for vandalism multiple times over the last few years, a new low was realized when someone cut the ropes on the senior center's flagpole and stole the flag that flies in the parking lot. The flag served as a welcome sight to all seniors who visit the center, particularly veterans, and it's theft left them shocked.

Administrator Adena Cox-Holloway said that

when they arrived at the center one morning, they saw that the flag was gone. A police report was made, but no information was received about the perpetrator of the crime. The Cassville Police Department believed it to be an isolated incident, and no other flags were stolen.

After reading that the flag was stolen, Senator Blunt made arrangements to get a new flag and presented it to the center himself on Tuesday afternoon. Senator Blunt presented the flag to Cox-Holloway in front of a group of senior center regulars and said, "This is a flag that flew over the Capitol with the purpose that it would be brought here to

### **Butterfield Fire receives \$151K grant**

The Butterfield Fire Department just received word that they were approved for \$151,200 grant to purchase new equipment. Fire Chief Tommy Ray said that they got confirmation on Tuesday, August 11, that they would be receiving the funds

Ray said, "It's a 95/5 grant, so they give us 95 percent and then we have to provide five percent." Numbers mean that the federal government will deposit \$144,000 and the local department will contribute \$7,200.

Ray said this is the fourth



or fifth time the department has received the grant which is called the Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG). Within the grant application, the department has

The annual fall Kids' Fishing Day at Roaring River State Park is this weekend. Kids 15 and under can fish for free on the state park's upper banks on Saturday from the opening buzzer at 7 a.m. until closing at 8 p.m.

The day will be packed with fun activities and plenty of opportunities to kids to learn valuable lessons about not only trout fishing, but the great outdoors,

Paul Spugeon, hatchery manager at Roaring River, said that his staff are stocking the river with 3,000 trout for the special fishing event. Among those will be 100 lunkers which weigh three pounds or above.

Also on site that day will be plenty of volunteers to help kids learn the art of trout fishing.

Tags will be available at the main tent near the hatchery during the event on Saturday, or you can pick up a tag on Friday at the Hatchery Office.

Spurgeon said preparing for Kids' Fishing Day this year involved a lot of flood clean-up. He said, "We've got the river back in good shape with all the flood damage that we had. We had to get gravel removed from the pools and dams built back up, but we've got it ready for kids to fish."

Spurgeon added that



### **Barry county included in primary** natural disaster areas designated by USDA

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has designated 33 counties in Arkansas as primary natural disaster areas due to the combined effects of excessive rain, flash flooding, flooding, hail, high winds, lightning and tornadoes that occurred during the period of March 1, 2015, and continues. Those counties are: Carroll, Columbia, Conway, Craighead, Crawford, Cross, Faulkner, Franklin, Fulton, Greene, Hempstead, Independence, Jackson, Jefferson, Johnson, Lafayette, Lawrence, Little River, Logan, Madion, Miller, Nevada, Perry, Phillips, Poinsett, Pope, Prairie, Scott, Sebastian, Sharp, White, Woodruff, Yell.

"Our hearts go out to those Arkansas farmers and ranchers affected by recent natural disasters," said Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack. "President Obama and I are committed to ensuring that agriculture remains a bright spot in our nation's economy by sustaining the successes of America's farmers, ranchers, and rural communities through these difficult times. We're also telling Arkansas producers that USDA stands with you and your communities when severe weather and natural disasters threaten to disrupt vour livelihood."

Farmers and ranchers in the following counties in Arkansas also qualify for natural disaster assistance becasue their counties are contiguous. Those counties are: Arkansas, Baxter, Benton, Boone, Clark, Clay, Cleburne, Cleveland, Crittenden, Desha, Garland, Grant, Howard, Izard, Lee, Lincoln, Lonoke, Mississippi, Monroe, Montgomery, Newton, Ouachita, Pike, Polk, Pulaski, Randolph, St. Francis, Saline, Searcy, Sevier, Stone, Union, Van Buren, Washington.

Farmers and ranchers in the following parishes and counties in Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Oklahoma and Texas also qualify for natural disaster assistance because their counties are contiguous. Those counties are: (in) Louisiana: Bossier, Caddo, Claiborne and Webster; Mississippi: Bolivar, Coahoma and Tunica; Missouri: Barry, Dunklin, Howell, Oregon, Ozark, Taney and Stone; Oklahoma: Adair, Le Flore, McCurtain and Sequoyah; Texas: Bowie and

All parishes and counties listed above were designated natural disaster areas on July 29, 2015, making all qualified farm operators in the designated areas elibible for low interest emergency (EM) loans from USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA), provided elibibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible parishes and counties have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability. FSA has a variety of programs, in addition to the EM loan program, to help eligible farmers recover from advertisity.

Additional programs available to assist farmers and ranchers include the Emergency Conservation Program, The Livestock Forage Disaster Program, the Livestock Indemnity Program, the Emergency Assistance for Livestock, Honeybees, and Farm-Raised Fish Program, and the Tree Assistance Program. Interested farmers may contact their local USDA Service Centers for further information on elibibility requirements and application procedures for these and other programs. 



flooding across the county. According to

Public Works Director Steve Walensky, the City of Cassville spoke with both FEMA and SEMA (State Emergency Management Agency) when they came to assess the flood damage in the week after it occurred. Governor Jay Nixon also came down to Roaring River State Park to see what had happened and make statements about how help would be provided.

Gov. Nixon requested a disaster declaration for Barry County, among others, on July 21, but the final decision was not made by FEMA until last week. While public funds will be available to cities and other entities, no decision has been made regarding individual assistance for individuals who had property damaged from rising waters in July. There is no anticipated date for when or if individual disaster assistance will be available.

Walensky said that the City is still working on a final damage estimate. "There are so many pieces to this, it isn't an easy process because so many areas were damaged. I just got in a couple of estimates for damage on some parking lots this week, so we are still getting information together."

He said, "All I did was an original estimate when FEMA and SEMA came down before. It was preliminary information on damage to the fencing and bridge, but we are still getting damage estimates from different vendors."

While some of the areas affected were obvious, such

as the 7th Street bridge and fencing around the city park, ball park and well, other areas also will need major repairs. The dirt at the ball fields will need to be replaced, as well as various electrical systems. The city will also need multiple loads of gravel, mulch for the playgrounds that were flooded and concrete to the Greenway Trail.

According to FEMA, funding guidelines for assistance are:

• Payment of not less than 75 percent of the eligible costs for emergency protective measures taken to save lives and protect property and public health for state and local governments on a cost-sharing

• Payment of not less than 75 percent of the eligible costs for repairing or replacing damaged public facilities such as roads, bridges, utilities, buildings, schools, recreational areas and other publicly-owned property. Non-profit organizations involved in community service will also be

that we can buy with the money." While that lump sum of

money may sound like a lot, Ray said it doesn't stretch as far as many would think. One Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) costs around \$7,000. With 25 volunteers on the force and equipment needing to be replaced regularly, grants like the AFG ensure the volunteers stay safe.

This grant specifically will cover 23 sets of headto-toe gear, 13 SCBA's and classes Firefighter 1 and 2, that are certified through the Division of Fire Safety. All of the equipment purchased with the grant money will go through a bidding process through the Butterfield Fire Department Board.

Ray said, "Our gear was purchased ten years ago, and it only has a shelf-life of ten years. It costs so much to replace it, and we have such a small budget, the grants are important. Even \$100,000 doesn't go very far when you consider the cost of the gear or the SCBA's."

The typical operating budget for the department for the year is \$55,000 and includes funds for fuel, building payment, utilities and miscellaneous equipment.

The Butterfield Fire Department is a volunteer-only department with Ray as chief since 2003, Scott Brophy as Deputy Chief and Donnie Privett as Assistant Chief. None of the positions are paid. They respond to 100 or more calls each year, which include fire response, first responder assistance, car wrecks and mutual aid for other departments.





### Wildcats optimistic heading into 2015 season

After posting a 6-5 record in 2014 and finishing fourth in the Big 8 Conference, the Cassville Wildcats are hoping to take another step forward in the 2015 football season. The loss of 17 lettermen and nine starters creates some challenges, but there is a lot of reason for optimism at Cassville High School.

Lance Parnell, the thirdyear head coach, acknowledges the challenge of replacing key players. But with a roster teeming with upperclassmen, Parnell has a glasshalf-full vision.

"We will have some key holes to fill, especially on the defensive side of the ball," he said. "We are excited to see how some young kids will step into roles this fall."

The Wildcats return four of the five interior linemen on offense: seniors Zack Boley, Colton Dilbeck, Wil Edmondson, and junior Devin Phelps, plus senior blocking tight end Kane Kellner. Both Kellner and Dilbeck earned all-conference and all-region honors last season.

With senior Leigh Cox taking over the quarterback position and joining allconference/all-region running back River Phelps in the backfield, expect Cassville to lean heavily on the ground

"Leigh Cox is a tough kid that plays very hard and is a good leader," noted Parnell.

Phelps started every game for the Wildcats on defense last year at free safety, but didn't start as a ball carrier until midseason. Now an experienced junior, he will be playing an even bigger role in the Cassville offense.

But the key for the Cassville season likely lies on the defensive side of the ball. The Wildcats were inconsistent

on defense last year, pitching a pair of shutouts over McDonald County and East Newton and holding Seneca to just 8 points, but surrendering 30 plus points in each of the five losses. Opponents averaged 195 rushing yards and 84 passing against the black and gold defense.

"We return six defensive starters from a year ago," Parnell observed. "Two of them being linebackers we will look for big things from."

Zane Everett started all 11 games as a junior in 2014. and the Cassville coaching staff expects him to be a force his senior year. Gilbert Medina moved into the starting job at middle linebacker last year as a sophomore, and should provide a solid anchor in the 4-3 defensive set.

Newcomers will have to carry a big load this year, and Cassville has a solid crew of upperclassmen waiting in the wings. Seniors Jacob Bredeson, Dusty Huett, Jacon Holz, Tyler James, Devin Mesbarger, Dakota Townsend, and Paofu Vang plus juniors RJ Elliot, Riley Fletcher, Satchel Hill, Steven Hunter, Austin McLintock, Kobe Mueller, Troy Rose, and Cole York provide a lot of options for the Wildcats. Expect sophomore Garrett Knight to see to complete the thin home action as well.

The schedule is not kind to the hometown fans, so the sinking gas prices are a blessing for the Wildcat Nation. Fill up the minivans and get ready to tailgate. Cassville only plays four regular season home games in 2015. After the home opener against Aurora on August 21, the a key match up," said Parnell. The Missouri State Highway Patrol reminds drivers that schools throughout the state are starting their 2015-2016 school year. It will be a big change for these young people after the summer break of fun in the sun, sleeping in, going to camp, or summer employment. Instead, young people will be walking, biking, and driving to school, which brings a change in traffic patterns. It is critical for drivers to be alert, especially near school zones, playgrounds, and bicycle paths. School buses and parents taking their children to school will join other motorists on the road and affect the morning and afternoon commute. Whatever route you drive, expect this additional traffic and prepare by allowing extra time to reach your destina-

Afternoons can be especially dangerous. Most traffic crashes involving young drivers (under the age of 21) in 2014 occurred between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m., when school typically lets out. Drivers need to be aware of the increased traffic during this time-not just in areas around school, but all around town. Remember: Many of these drivers are inexperienced. It is important to encourage those young drivers to remember driving is a full-time job. Using a cell phone, texting, or adjusting the radio can be the distraction that leads to a traffic crash. Texting is against the law for anyone under the age of 22.

Missouri law also states that on a two-lane road, if a school bus is stopped and displaying warning signals while loading or unloading children, drivers must stop when meeting and following the bus. However, it is only necessary to stop on a four-lane highway when following the bus. Drivers, when you see a stopped school bus, be alert. Children may not be aware of traffic and dart unexpect-
