# Area schools show increase in enrollment

Local schools released their initial enrollment numbers for the 2015-2016 school year, and the results were showing positive trends for enrollment in each of Barry County's school districts. Overall, Barry County's enrollment across the districts is up by approximately 3.07 percent over last year's numbers. This year, 4,210 students are enrolled in Cassville, Exeter, Purdy, Southwest and Wheaton districts. Last year, the enrollment was 4,059.

Cassville Schools saw a pretty big bump in their enrollment for the new year. Last year, the district had 1,821 students, which was actually an increase from the year before this. This year, however, the school's enrollment for preschool through seniors is 1,954. This year's graduating class is 135 students, which is a jump from last year's class of 118. Cassville's largest class this year is the third grade, which has 166 students.

By the numbers, Cassville has 84 preschoolers, 136 kindergarteners, 133 second graders, 166 third graders, 132 fourth graders, 126 fifth graders, 138 sixth graders



# Local firefighters gear up and climb stairs in memory of fallen comrades

A number of local firefighters across the county participated in the annual stair climb to honor the 343 firefighters who lost their lives on 9/11. Their participation served as a stark reminder of what the men who gave their lives to save others went through on one of the most tragic days in our nation's history.

Scott Brophy, deputy chief of the Butterfield Fire Department, participated in the climb along with two of his sons, Geoff and Johny, and a number of other firefighters from departments in Barry County. This year, the climb took place at Echo Holler at Silver Dollar City, who sponsored the event, and all of the proceeds were donated to the families of the 343 who died.

and raise money, firefighters and anyone who wants to contribute, walk the equivalent of the 110 stories of the World Trade Center. Each of the firefighters puts on their gear and climbs, regardless of conditions, to remember the sacrifice of those brave people.

Brophy said, "I've always wanted to do the stair climb, and two of my boys were able to join me this year. I'm glad that my sons came with me to do this for the first time." For the prior two years, the Springfield event was held at Hammons Field where the Springfield Cardinals play. By allowing Silver Dollar City to host, more of the funds generated could be donated to the families of the fallen firefighters. It is anticipated that Silver Dollar City will To honor the firefighters continue to host the event

in the future. Memorial Stair Climbs have become a growing trend to draw attention to the memory of the 343 firefighters. This year, the speaker for the event was Captain Michael Dugan, a 27-year veteran of the Fire Department of New York. The moving words of Capt. Dugan put the entire event into perspective for those who showed up to take those tedious steps strapped with gear.

Brophy said, "It really impacted me quite a bit. But to actually walk that like they did, it made you really think."

He added, "When we walked the stairs, there were so many firefighters that we were shoulder-to-shoulder. It was packed."

Brophy explained that each of the firefighters

were assigned an ID of one of the 343 firefighters to wear while they walked. After each five flights, the men were required to take a break. When asked if he plans to participate again, Brophy replied, "Absolutely."









# Cassville PD joins in Labor Day DWI crackdown

Local police will be out in full force as part of the nationwide August/Labor Day Crackdown weekend Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over crackdown on substance-impaired driving. The crackdown will include high visibility enforcement throughout the Cassville area and will run from August 21 through September 7.

The effective nationwide substance-impaired driving crackdown will include high visibility enforcement, high profile events, and will be supported by national paid advertising, creating a comprehensive campaign to curb substance-impaired driving over the August/Labor Day weekend holiday.

The Cassville Police Department said its officers will be aggressively looking for substance-impaired drivers during the crackdown and will arrest anyone caught driving impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.

Although it is illegal in all 50 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to drive impaired (having a blood alcohol concentration of .08 percent or higher), far too many people across the nation get behind the wheel after consuming too much alcohol and/or drugs. The latest statistics from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration underscore the serious nature of the nation's continuing impaireddriving epidemic.

"Every year, about onethird of all motor vehicle traffic deaths involve one or substance-impaired more drivers or motorcycle operators," said Dana Kammerlohr, Cassville Chief of Police. "197 fatal and 659 serious injury crashes in 2014 involved at least one substance-impaired driver. That equates to one substance-impaired ing fatality every 1 3/4 days and one substance-impaired driving serious injury every half day."

Chief Kammerlohr added, "The August/Labor Day weekend holiday is particularly dangerous. During the Labor Day weekend holiday in 2014, there were 11 people killed and 42 seriously injured in Missouri traffic crashes involving a substance-impaired driver from August 15 to September 1."

"Research has shown that high visibility enforcement like the Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over campaign reduces the substance-impaired driving fatalities by as much as 20 percent. By joining this nationwide ef-

fort, we will make Cassville's roadways safer for everyone throughout the holiday," said Chief Kammerlohr.

Sgt. Privett noted that being arrested for driving impaired brings a wide range of negative consequences into one's life. Substance-impaired drivers face jail time, loss of their driver licenses, and steep financial consequences such as higher insurance rates, attorney fees, court costs, lost time at work, and the potential loss of job. When family, friends and coworkers find out, violators also often face tremendous personal embarrassment.

"Substance-impaired driving is simply not worth the risk. So don't take the chance. Remember, we will be out in force and we will be watching, so Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over," said Sgt. Privett.

organizations "PNP should contact Missouri Office of Emergency Management at (573) 526-9100 to obtain information about applicant briefings," said Director Tanya N. Garfield of SBA's Disaster Field Operations Center-West. "At the briefings, PNP representatives will need to provide information about their organization," continued Garfield. FEMA will use that information to determine if the PNP provides an "essential governmental service" and is a "critical facility" as defined by law. If so, FEMA may provide the PNP with a Public Assistance grant for their eligible costs. If not, FEMA may refer the PNP to SBA for disaster loan assistance.

SBA may lend PNPs up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory, and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to help with the cost of improvements to protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

For certain private nonprofit organizations of any size, SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) to help with meeting working capital needs caused by the disaster. EIDLs may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that cannot be paid because of the disaster's impact. EIDL assistance is available regardless of whether the nonprofit suffered any property damage.

The interest rate is 2.625 percent with terms up to 30 years. The filing deadline to return applications for property damage is October 6, 2015. The deadline to return economic injury applications is May 7, 2016.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure website at https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela.

Disaster loan information and application forms are also available from SBA's Customer Service Center by calling (800) 659-2955 or emailing disastercustomerservice@sba. gov. 





plans to use the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to impose more government control and regulation over U.S. carbon emissions. In a 1,560-page EPA rule, Obama is requiring power plants to reduce emissions 32 percent below 2005 levels by 2030 while forcing each state to meet different emission targets by a certain date. Those emission cuts range from an 11% reduction in North Dakota to 72% in Washington. Missouri would be forced to reduce its carbon emissions from 67.3 million tons in 2020 to 55.4 million tons in 2030, a decrease of almost 18 percent.

There are two options (if you can call them options) for states to comply with the new regulations. Either states can voluntarily develop state plans that meet arbitrary EPA assumptions or standards or face an ultimatum - the federal government will impose a plan on you.

The first option is designed so that states will share in the blame when electricity rates soar, jobs are lost (even EPA analysts agree it will result in job losses), and the energy grid is put at risk. Any which way you slice it, electric rates will go up. NERA Economic Consulting estimates that the Clean Power Plan will cost \$366 billion and bring double-digit electricity-rate increases to 43 states. On top of that, many regulators are warning that the plan could destabilize the national electric grid by forcing many power plants to close before new ones can be built. Those new power plants would have to be built with carbon capture and storage, technology that is not fully developed or

The fact is, stable energy policy is essential to our economy. Fuels such as coal, oil, and natural gas, provided 87 percent of America's energy needs in the past decade and have been the overwhelming supplier for over a century. Missouri relies on coal for nearly 83 percent of its electricity needs, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration. A plan that requires us to change our source of power so drastically and so quickly will be devastating to our economy. The Heritage Foundation estimates that electricity prices will increase by an average of 17 percent between 2017 and 2031 if Obama and the EPA have their way. Nick Loris, an energy economist also with the Heritage Foundation, wrote that the "cumulative economic impact of higher energy prices will be hundreds of thousands of jobs lost and more than \$2.5 trillion in lost economic growth."

Obama's new regulation comes just weeks after the U.S. Supreme Court flatly rejected the EPA's 2012 energy rule to reduce mercury and other emissions. In Michigan v. EPA, the court said the Obama Administration and the EPA failed its legal obligation to compare the cost of its mercury standards with the benefits. In other words, the EPA didn't care how much it would cost the American people, they were going to impose their regulations regardless. I don't always agree with the Supreme Court, especially not lately, but they got this one right.

The situation puts Missouri in a tough spot. Do we develop our own state plan and be complicit in the federal government raising our energy prices and killing Missouri jobs? I don't know about you but I am tired of this relationship between the states and the federal government where we have to ask for permission to do something the Constitution already gives us the authority to do or we are forced into doing something through threats of withheld funding or fines. If we go along with the "Clean Power Plan," the EPA or administration could change it at their whim and put all authority in the hands of bureaucrats in Washington, D.C. Our other option is a better one. The governors of Oklahoma, Mississippi, Wisconsin, Indiana, Texas and Louisiana have already refused to submit state plans of compliance with the "Clean Power Plan" and 13 states are challenging the plan in federal court as unconstitutional. Needless to say, the plan's prospects are far from certain. Missouri should join this lawsuit and refuse to go along with the plan. Doing otherwise is guaranteed to hurt our economy, put Missourians out of work, and raise our electric rates. That combination will do nothing but hurt Missouri.





# Mercy athletic trainer to work with Cassville

Cassville football players are back on the field and warming up for the first game, but this year, their closest ally won't be watching from the stands. Play by play, Mercy athletic trainer Josh Bell will be right alongside them.

"I'm so excited to be the first dedicated athletic trainer in this district," said Bell, who now provides full-time sports medicine services to Cassville R-IV Schools through a partnership with Mercy. That includes injury prevention, medical evaluations and rehabilitation. "I'm evaluating athletes ahead of practice and I'll be on standby in case there are injuries during games."

"Josh offers us peace of mind that's been long overdue," said Lance Parnell, head football coach at Cassville R-IV Schools. "Football is a high-risk sport with 80 athletes involved, so it's going to be great to have someone qualified to get them evaluated and treated right away."

While football is Bell's primary focus, he'll be available to students and staff all year, offering help for cheerleading, wrestling, basketball, volleyball, soccer, softball, cross-country and more. He'll cover a wide range of issues, like heat-related illness, concussions and sprains something long overdue in the region.

"For the last 10 to 12 years, we've had a strong pipeline of students traveling to Springfield from Cassville for sports medicine services," said Jim Raynor, Mercy Sports Medicine director. "We realized the district needed a more hands-on, direct health care provider. This is a testament to our sports medicine program and the quality of care we've been able to provide."

"I'm already feeling right at home," said Bell, a Lebanon native and Missouri State University alum. "I met a lot of the local athletes during summer camps over the last month, and we've already started talking about proper hydration and nutrition." But that's just skimming the sur-

"Let's say there's an ath-

lete who is asthmatic or diabetic, or has a sickle cell trait. We'll be able to adapt our treatment to his or her needs," Raynor said. "Josh will be Mercy's point person who can get students to primary care or the emergency department, orthopedics or specialty care, then during the recovery process through rehab."

Bell, a U.S. military veteran, was deployed to Iraq before returning to Missouri. He and his wife, along with his 3-year-old son, will soon call the region home. "We're moving into our first place and starting from scratch. Being an athletic trainer is something I've been working toward for a very long time."

With Cassville High School's first game this Friday, he couldn't have gotten there quickly enough.

"This will be the first time in my 20 years of coaching that I won't have to be the one taping ankles before the game," Parnell laughed. "We're just so happy to have



# Cassville benefits from Jamboree experience

The high school football Jamboree at JFK Stadium in Springfield on Friday may have birthed more questions than answers for the Cassville coaching staff. The Wildcats had a shaky defensive start against Willard, then improved as they moved into action against Parkview and Bolivar. On offense, Cassville had some impressive performances, scoring once against Willard and twice against Parkview. Only the Bolivar Liberators kept the Wildcats out of the end zone.

But it was that opening defensive series against Willard that got everyone's attention.

The Tigers scored on just four plays against the Cassville defense, gashing the line for gains of 11, 17, and 4 yards before scoring on an 8-yard pass play.



# County, Cassville sales tax revenue continues to rise



Both Cassville and Barry County's sales tax revenues are up, yet again, for the month. Revenue collected in July is received in August, and numbers are positive for yet another month. Thus far, Cassville and Barry County have only had three negative months for the year, but overall percentages are still up regarding revenue received.

Barry County had a 5.63 percent increase in revenue for the month when compared to last year's totals. Revenue received for the 1/2 -cent sales tax was \$140,122.62, which as \$8,505.79 more than last year. The 1/8 cent tax generated \$34,533.64 for the county, which was \$1,401.24 more than last year.

Cassville's general onecent sales tax generated \$68,693.23 for the month, a huge 14.3 percent increase over last year. Last year's collected revenue was \$60,110.52 for the month. The new 1/8 -cent transportation tax generated \$24,597.02 for the month, which was one of the lower totals since January.

For the year, Barry County is currently up 4.51 percent in revenue collected through their general ½-cent sales tax. Cassville is up 10.6 percent over last year's totals for the same time period. Barry County's revenue generated for the ½-cent tax is \$1,285,291.43, and Cassville' revenue for their onecent tax for the year so far is \$617,254.39.

offered a complimentary physical provided exclusively by Mercy.



# Old Church Gallery showcases rich art history

Tucked away off the main drag in Shell Knob is a hidden treasure of a small 108 year-old building. The small church sits off the road and is filled with a unique menagerie of art, jewelry, minerals and more.

The Old Church Gallery opened its doors 13 years ago when owners Tom and Nancy Rochovansky purchased the church from its congregation. Nancy said, "We always admired this old church, and we heard they were selling it. So, we talked to the preacher before anyone else knew and bought it." The church's congregation had dwindled, and the Rochovanskys saw the building as a prime place to open their own shop.

For years, they spent time acquiring art, minerals and rocks, and antiques. They would travel to various shows across the country selling their wares. When they retired to the Shell Knob area in 1999, having owned property there for ten years, they decided to try a retail shop.

Much of the collection housed in small church came from Tom's passions over the years, such as jewelry making, rock and fossil

collection and antiquing. Nancy said, "Tom collected rocks and fossils since he was a kid. Then, he got into antiques because his mom and grandma were both into antiques."

The various wares were priced, art was hung on the walls, and today, they still strive to make sure there is something for everyone in every price range.

Fine art adorns the walls and a few of the cases, but smaller items that range from fossils and rocks to knickknacks and historical pieces of interest are all over. Each counter and case offers a new and unique experience for those pursuing the shelves.

Perhaps one of the most interesting stories behind the Old Church Gallery is how Tom and Nancy came into possession of some of the items for sale inside the doors. Tom's father worked for sculptor James Earle Fraser, the artist most wellknown for the buffalo nickel and sculpture "End of the Trail." His father worked for Fraser for years as a studio assistant and eventually began enlargement work. Most of Fraser's and his wife's work was sent to the Cowboy Hall of Fame and Syracuse University. What was left was to be thrown out. Nancy said that Tom's mother and father rescued the other pieces from an untimely death, noting that they weren't ones to let something go to waste.

Many of Fraser's pieces available at the store are rough sketches of eventual larger and more detailed pieces. Sculptors carve out sketches for their pieces just as painters, and those

and bronze adorn shelves in the gallery with varying price tags.

Through Tom's father's work with Fraser, he also came to know another artist featured in the Old Church Gallery. Blendon Campbell, a painter, had a studio space close to Fraser in New York. When Campbell moved from New York

molds and casts in plaster to California, Tom's father helped him pack his art. The pieces that Campbell chose not to take he gifted to him, and eventually, the pieces were passed down to Tom. Now those paintings hang on the walls throughout the shop, ready to join someone's personal collec-







As part of continued efforts in keeping patrons informed, the Southwest R-V School administration provides monthly information concerning Board Meetings.

A recap of the August 13 Tax Rate Hearing and regular meeting are as follows:

The Board convened for the Tax Rate Hearing at 6:33

Superintendent Walker presented information pertaining to the district's assessed valuation, which totaled \$36,017,358. This figure reflects a growth from last year's assessment of approximately 4 percent. The Board approved maintaining for the 2015-2016 school year, the current tax rates of \$2.75 and \$.85 for the district's incidental and debt service funds, respectively.

Following the hearing, the regular meeting was called to order at 6:50 p.m.

The Board approved the consent items, including the following additions to the district substitute teachers list: Kyle Brewen, Cody Hobbs, Deborah Lay and Leah Mitchell.

There were no old business items for this meeting.

Under new business, the Board approved several policy revisions as proposed by the Missouri School Board Association, as well as the district's IDEA Assurance Statement, the Special Education Compliance Plan and the Proportionate Share Plan.

Under administrative and program evaluations, building administrators reported that with four days into the new school year, things were going very well. Initial enrollment figures indicate a slight increase compared to this time last year. However, it was acknowledged that it is still very early and numbers may fluctuate through Labor

Also shared was information pertaining to MAP/ EOC scores from last spring. After an update on the Kuno devices at the middle school, the Board approved contracting with AirWatch as the management system for the tablets, contingent on its level of performance through its current trial period.

The Board was in executive session for approximately an hour and adjourned at 8:26 p.m.
