FEMA meeting sets wheels Community steps up to in motion for flood repairs

After the President made a formal disaster declaration for Barry County after severe flooding in July, the Federal Management Emergency Agency (FEMA) held a meeting with city and county representatives to gather contact names and set meetings to begin dispersing funds for repair efforts.

Steve Walensky, Public Works director for the City of Cassville, attended the meeting in Nixa with city clerk Jennifer Evans on Tuesday, August 25. The three-hour meeting was primarily informative to provide resources on how to apply for grant funding needed for repairs and what documentation. It also served to gather initial contacts for meetings to begin with various cities and government entities that need funds to help recovery efforts.

Walensky said, "They're really trying to come up with

better ways to handle things after big disasters and change their policies. I think it was reassuring to see that the government is learning better ways to provide aid." Part of that is a pilot program that might help the city take preventative measures to prevent damage from future floods.

While grant funding through FEMA is reserved for repair to damage, the pilot program might allow Cassville to get approval to use part of the funds to dig retention ponds that were suggested by a 2012 hydrology study. Walensky said, "We want to see if FEMA or SEMA could help fund it if we put in those two retention ponds. We have a shovel-ready storm water project for Cassville, and we're hoping it could be part of their pilot program."

Retention ponds could alleviate a significant portion

Purdy Schools go on lockdown after threat

Purdy R-II Schools were put on lock down on Tuesday morning after an alleged threat intercepted by the Purdy Police Department.

Purdy R-II Schools posted the following on their Facebook page on Tuesday just before noon: "In response to advice from local law enforcement regarding a situation within the city limits, the Purdy R-2 Schools campus issued a modified Lock-Down order at 10:15 a.m. this morning. This precautionary lock-down involved securing all exterior doors, and recess, physical education classes and all other outdoor activities were moved inside. Normal daily routines continued within the buildings. The lock-down was lifted at 11:15 a.m. It is the top priority of the Purdy R-2 School District to provide a secure learning environment for all students and staff members."

According to Purdy Police Chief Jackie Lowe, the lock down request was made after threats were made regarding a student at the school. He said, "It was a precautionary measure. We had received a call that there were some threats that a subject was en route to the school with a firearm. It was a child custody dispute."

The Barry County Sheriff's Department investigated the

incident. According to Sheriff Mick Epperly, an employee at the judicial center overheard the man say that he should go get a gun and get his child from the school. Epperly said that he made contact with the man via a cell phone.

Epperly said, "I was able to get a cell phone number for him and when I called him, he said he was on his way to Springfield to get a lawyer for custody. I asked him to stay where he was until I could get a State Trooper to verify where he was." He said that the man's story checked out, that he did not have a weapon on him, and there was never any danger to students in the district.

He said, "As a precautionary measure, everyone did what they were supposed to do. All of the agencies worked together well and it worked out. In this case, it's better to be safe than sorry."

Epperly also said that the man was cooperative to the investigation and that no charges were filed. He stated, "I contacted the Prosecuting Attorney to see if charges would be filed. If she would have pressed charges, we would have had him extradited back down here, but that wasn't the case." The man was not taken into custody once his story was corroborated.

support five year-old's cancer battle



A matter of a few weeks and what seemed like a minor childhood illness altered an Exeter family's lives forever, but the community has stepped up provide support like they never could have imagined.

Blazi Lowe, a five year old girl from Exeter, was a normal girl. She started kindergarten this year and was happy and healthy until about five weeks ago. Blazi's grandmother, Melissa Whisenhunt, said that she had what Whisenhunt and her daughter thought was allergies or a stomach bug. Whisenhunt said, "She was throwing up first in the mornings, and we thought it was just a little thing. Then, it progressively got worse. We ended up in the E.R. because she couldn't keep anything down, and she acted so lethargic."

After multiple doctor's appointments, blood tests and more, her doctors prescribed her antibiotics and anti-nausea medications. However, Blazi's illness that would seem to get better for a few days and then get worse took a dramatic turn.

Whisenhunt said, "On Friday (August 21), the baby sitter called and said that Blazi was crying with

a headache and throwing up again. When I called the clinic, they said to take her to Springfield immediately." Once there, blood tests and a CAT scan were done and the family received devastating news: Blazi had a brain tumor.

Whisenhunt said, "Not even 20 minutes after the CAT scan, a nurse came in to stay with Blazi and a chaplain took us to another room. They said they knew why Blazi was so sick. She had a brain tumor. From then, its like you're underwater. You can't hear anything the doctor is saying. You're just in shock."

By Sunday, Blazi was in surgery with a surgeon flown in from St. Jude's in Memphis. The tumor, which was growing out

Three arrested after late night assault

Three local men were arrested after an alleged latenight assault near the Rowdy Beaver on Sunday. A Cassville man and his girlfriend were allegedly beaten by the men and a woman with them just after midnight.

According to affidavits of probable cause, Cassville Police Officer Garry Thornton responded to a call around 12:47 a.m. on Sunday for a fight. Allegedly, the victim

and his girlfriend were sitting on their front porch when the three men, AJ Hunter, 30, of Purdy, Andy Hunter, 33, of Butterfield, and Matthew Moore, 30, of Cassville, pulled up in an SUV and attacked the victim without any cause. A woman, Georgette Wall, allegedly prevented the victim's girlfriend from helping him.

When Thornton was on the scene, the vehicle drove toward Main Street where Barry County deputies pulled

them over. The victim was transported to Mercy Hospital in Cassville for his injuries. The victim was treated for a broken nose as well as swelling to his face, according to the probable cause.

All three men were charged with assault in the second degree, a class C felony. AJ Hunter is being held in the Barry County jail in lieu of a \$75,000 cash-only bond. Andy Hunter and Moore are being held on \$15,000 cashonly bonds.

Injunction prevents expansion of **Clean Water** Act


Much to the relief of Missouri farmers, a federal judge has blocked the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) Clean Water Rule from going into effect in the

A temporary injunction of the rule was placed by North Carolina U.S. District Judge Ralph Erickson which would prevent an expansion of the Clean Water Act to smaller streams and tributaries. Missouri was one of 13 states that filed suit against the act. Attorney General Chris Koster filed that lawsuit in June.

Farmers in Missouri were primarily concerned that federal jurisdiction over smaller streams could impact their farming practices, particularly cattle grazing.

Only states that had sued over the new rule will be protected by the injunction, leaving 37 states without protection for farmers. Proponents of the act purport that farmland would be largely unaffected by the expansion of the Clean Water Act.



Local family raising funds to end Alzheimer's Cassville Cancer Expo

In the United States, one in nine people over the age of 65 have Alzheimer's disease. Worldwide, it affects almost 44 million people. One Barry County family is doing their part to help find a cure for a devastating disease that affects so many.

Wayne Gage was diagnosed with Alzheimer's in spring 2014, and his family has stepped up to raise funds for the Alzheimer's Association in his honor. Katrina Williamson, Gage's granddaughter, and 11 other family members are participating in the Springfield Walk to End Alzheimer's in Springfield. To raise money for their team's entry into the event, they are putting on a local event for Wayne's Walking Warriors to get the community involved and raise awareness.

Alzheimer's is a disease that is becoming more and more prevalent, but people regularly mistake the symptoms for typical aging. Alzheimer's is a form of dementia that causes problems with memory, thinking and behavior. It is degenerative and there is no known cure. However, there are medications and treatments that can slow the progression of the degenerative disease. Early detection and intervention are key to slowing the progression. New research is being done to look for alternative treatments and a cure for it.

The hope for a cure is what is driving Gage's family to participate in walking events and raise money for the Alzheimer's Association. Last year, Gage's family did the Walk to End Alzheimer's in Branson, starting a family tradition to raise money for a good cause and also show support for Wayne.

Williamson said, "They want you to donate money for the event, so this is what

When talking about her grandfather, Williamson said, "He has a great attitude and loves his family and his church. And he has an awesome sense of humor. This is all because of him, and because we all love him and want to honor him in anyway we can. We want to find a cure and bring awareness to the community."







Treatment for Blazi will probably include either chemotherapy or radiation. Right now, Whisenhunt said they are focused on her four different therapies to combat the brain damage from the surgery. She said, "She gets frustrated, but she is really trying. A lot of her capabilities will come back after four or five weeks, but she is still basically paralyzed on her left side. She is learning everything all over again, like walking, talking, motor skills."

She continued, "Kayla [Blazi's mother] has told people the surgery is nothing compared to watching her struggle. It's the hardest part. We knew Blazi before the surgery, and she still knows everything, but she just can't make it come out.

"I've seen strength out of my daughter that I couldn't even imagine. For being a single mother, she has been dealing with all of this in an amazing way."

In response to Blazi's recent diagnosis and surgery, the entire community is stepping up to help the family. Whisenhunt said, "We are just so overwhelmed by all of the support with prayer and everyone that follows Blazi's page on Facebook. For the community to come together with the way the world is, it restores your faith in humanity."

Right now, "Blazi's Fight" has over 1,300 likes on Facebook. Exeter Schools started a change drive in their classrooms for Blazi, and this year's Pumpkin Run 5K at the Exeter Corn Maze will be donating the proceeds to help Blazi and her family, as well. With no idea about what treatment Blazi will need or a time line, the community is offering up support for her family.

Whisenhunt said, "We

think we will be going to Memphis this week, but we don't know what treatment will be. We do know that once we get this behind us, she still has to go to St. Jude's every three months for five years to make sure she is okay."

She continued, "This type of tumor, even if a single cell drops, the cell will grow into a new tumor. There is no way of knowing how or why this happens. It could be slow or aggressive, but we won't know until treatment starts. They told us the cancer gets angry and fights back.

"It's going to be a battle, but we are leaning on faith. She's tough and can do this."

She said, "[People from the community] might not even know us or like us, but they're stepping up for this little girl. If it was someone else's kid, we would be right there. We truly appreciate each and every person who is praying, thinking of us and messaging us. It's one less worry to know that so many people are supporting



of the flooding during heavy rain. Walensky continued, "It's clear to me that there are parts of the government that they're trying to make new pilot program for what they learned from previous disasters like Hurricane Sandy and the Joplin tornado." The pilot programs are geared toward preventative work that could save FEMA from further damage funding in future emergency incidents.

The next step in the process will be for the city to meet with a FEMA team to begin planning projects for grant funding. Walensky said that he was not given an idea as to when that would happen but Cassville has submitted their application and is still collecting bids and estimates on flood damages.

Primary projects that Walensky wants to address first are the 7th Street bridge, the Greenway Trail bridge by the Aquatic Center and the fencing around the parks. While a total damage estimate is not complete, the 7th Street Bridge is expected to cost around \$120,000 to replace, and the damage to fencing was

Individual projects that cost less than \$121,600 are considered small projects and qualify for up-front FEMA funding. Anything over that would only be reimbursed once work is complete. Waensky said, "We want to avoid having to pay for the 7th Street bridge up front because it potentially would mean we have to wait until next year to be reimbursed."

Once FEMA sets up a meeting, the city will have 30 days to complete a request for grant funding. Walensky said, "I have all of our paperwork ready, so we will get this done as quickly as possible."


















Cassville falls to Mountain Grove, 15-6

The Cassville Wildcats dropped a bruising defensive struggle at Mountain Grove on Friday night. The Panthers scored on the game's first possession, and added a late touchdown and two-point conversion to claim the 15-6 victory. River Phelps tightroped the sideline for a 45-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter for Cassville's lone score.

While Cassville was pushed to the limit in the 21-20 season opening win over Aurora, Mountain Grove cruised to an impressive 51-0 romp over Logan-Rogersville. The highly-regarded Panthers were eager for a chance to even the series record against the Wildcats. Cassville claimed wins of 40-7 in 2010 and 35-14 in 2011, while Mountain Grove won last year's meeting, 30-19

That 30-19 game was a black eye for the Wildcats, both figuratively and literally. The Panthers dominated that game physically, and served up a recipe on film of how to handle Cassville. Lance Parnell was determined that his team would not be manhandled in that manner or to that extent again.

But Mountain Grove tested Cassville's resolve immediately on Friday, taking the opening kickoff and scoring in just three plays. Sophomore quarterback Carter Otwell broke into the secondary and raced into the end zone from 63 yards out barely a minute into the game. Blaine Halford's PAT gave the Panthers an early 7-0 lead.

Then the Wildcats misplayed the kickoff and were fortunate to recover inside their own 10-yard line. Three plays later, River Phelps drove a rugby-style punt into a vacant secondary, and the ball rolled to the Mountain Grove 38-yard line for a 45-

yard swing in field position.

Mountain Grove drove to the Cassville 25-yard line, but surrendered on downs when running back Trystan

With 5:24 left in the third quarter, the Panthers punted and the Wildcats took over at their own 16-yard line. For Cassville fans, it was the drive worth the drive.

The Wildcats pounded for three first downs, with Leigh Cox, Kyle Ruark and Phelps fighting for every yard. On 3rd-and-2 at midfield, the offensive line surged forward to give Phelps room for firstdown yardage.







Secretary of State Jason Kander announced that he will push for legislation to make family farm corporations exempt from unnecessary paperwork and fees. The legislation has been filed on Secretary Kander's behalf by Sen. Mike Parson (R-Bolivar) and Rep. Diane Franklin (R-Camdenton). It has the support of the Missouri Farm Bureau.

"Missouri is home to hundreds of family farms that feed and fuel the world," Kander said. "Farms don't move from year to year, so it doesn't make a whole lot of sense to make them reconfirm their address annually. They are exactly the type of business that should be exempt from annual reports and fees, and I will continue

to work to help our family farms succeed in Missouri."

"As Missouri's top industry, agriculture is critical to our state's well-being," Parson said. "I am happy to partner with Secretary Kander in this effort to make it easier for our state's family farms to do business."

Like other corporations, family farm corporations are required to file annual reports with the secretary of state's office. Under this legislation, family farm corporations would be exempt from filing these reports and the accompanying fees unless important corporate information has changed within

the past year.

"Reducing fees and paperwork is a common-sense idea that I encourage my colleagues from both sides of the aisle to support in the 2015 legislative session," Franklin said.

"Missouri Farm Bureau applauds Secretary of State Kander's efforts to reduce unnecessary paperwork and regulations for Missouri farmers and ranchers," said Blake Hurst, Missouri Farm Bureau President. "We look forward to working with the General Assembly to see that these measures are passed."

The bills are SB 148 and HB 233.





MDC sets waterfowl hunting dates for 2015-2016

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) announces that duck hunters will again have a 60-day season for 2015-2016 hunting. The Missouri Conservation Commission set upcoming Missouri waterfowl hunting seasons at its Aug. 19 meeting.

Duck Seasons:

North Zone: Oct. 31 -Dec. 29

Middle Zone: Nov. 7 – Jan.

South Zone: Nov. 26 – Jan.

Shooting Hours: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

Daily Bag Limit: Six ducks daily with species restrictions

4 mallards (no more than 2 females)

- 3 scaup
- 3 wood ducks
- 2 redheads
- 2 hooded mergansers 2 pintails
- 2 canvasback (increased from 1 last year)
 - 1 black duck
 - 1 mottled duck

Possession Limit: Three times the daily bag limit (18), including species restrictions.

Coot Seasons:

Concurrent with duck seasons in the respective zones with a daily bag limit of 15 and a possession limit of 45.

Goose Seasons:

Light geese: snow, blue, and Ross's: Statewide, Oct. 31 - Jan. 31

White-fronted Statewide Nov. 7 - Jan. 31

Canada geese and brant: Statewide Oct. 3 - Oct. 11 and Nov. 26 - Jan. 31

Shooting Hours: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

Daily Bag Limit and Possession Limit: No more than three Canada geese and brant geese in aggregate daily and nine in possession, 20 light geese (snow, blue, or Ross's) daily with no possession limit, and two white-fronted geese daily and six in possession.

Youth Hunting Days:

North Zone: Oct. 24 and

Middle Zone: Oct. 31 and Nov. 1

South Zone: Nov. 21 and

Bag Limit: Same as during regular waterfowl season.

Shooting Hours: Same as during regular waterfowl sea-

Participation Requirements: Any person 15 years of age or younger may participate in the youth waterfowl hunting days without permit, provided they are in the immediate presence of an adult 18 years of age or older. If the youth hunter does not have hunter-education certification, the adult must meet permit requirements for small-game hunting and have in his or her possession valid hunter-education certification unless born before Jan. 1, 1967. The adult may not hunt ducks, but may participate in other seasons open on the youth days.

Light Good Conservation Order:

The Conservation Order for light geese will be in effect Feb. 1 through April 30 with no bag limit. Hunters may use electronic calls and unplugged shot guns. Shooting hours are from one-half hour before sunrises to one-half hour after sunset. A Conservation Order permit is the only permit required for resident and nonresident hunters.

Season for Falconry Ducks, Coots and Mergan-

The federal framework allows 107 days. Falconry is open during teal season (16 days), regular duck season (60 days), and youth season (two days) in the respective zones, leaving Feb. 11 - March 10 (29 days) for extended falconry statewide.

Hunting Hours: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

Bag and Possession Limits: The daily bag and possession limits shall not exceed three and nine birds, respectively, singly, or in the aggregate, during the teal, regular duck, youth waterfowl and extended falconry seasons.

Teal Seasons: As previously announced by MDC in July, blue-winged, green-winged, and cinnamon teal may be taken from Sept 12 through Sept. 27 from sunrise to sunset with a combined daily limit of six and a combined possession limit of 18 for all three species. Additional details are published in MDC's 2015 Migratory Bird Hunting Digest available where hunting permits are sold, at MDC offices and nature centers, and online at mdc.mo.gov.

Waterfowl Population Estimates:

According to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the total number of North American ducks is estimated to be at a record high for the fourth year in a row at 49.5 million, 43% above the long-term average (LTA). Estimates of breeding populations for various duck species from 2015 survey results are:

Mallard numbers are similar to the 2014 estimate and 42 percent above their long-term

Blue-winged teal numbers are similar to 2014 and 73 percent above their long-term

Green-winged teal numbers increased by 19 percent, which puts them 98 percent above their long-term aver-

Northern shoveler numbers dropped by 17 percent but still remain 75 percent above their long-term aver-

Gadwall and American wigeon numbers are similar to 2014 and 100 and 17 percent above their long-term averages, respectively.

Redhead numbers are similar to 2014 and 71 percent above their long-term aver-

Canvasback numbers increased slightly. They are now estimated to be 30 percent above their long-term aver-

Scaup numbers are similar to the 2014 estimate and 13 percent below their long-term average.

Pintail numbers are similar to 2014 and 24 percent below their long-term average.

Hunting Outlook:

MDC Resource Scientists note that there are three factors equally or more important than overall population numbers in contributing toward a season's outcome: local habitat conditions, weather, and migration timing. They caution that preseason outlooks for habitat and weather are less than ideal.

"Wetlands should have plenty of water going into fall, but extensive and repeated flooding over the summer will mean food and cover could be patchy," explained MDC Resource Scientist Andy Raedeke. "Moist-soil seed production will be excellent in wetlands that benefitted from a wet spring and early summer but did not have latesummer flooding. Those that did experience late flooding will likely have poor moistsoil seed production and limited vegetation for cover. Due to flooding, food provided by crops, such as corn, will likely be well below average."

Raedeke added weather conditions play a significant role in affecting duck movements and distribution. "Long-term weather forecasts are calling for milder than normal fall and winter weather in the upper Midwest," he

Habitat conditions and weather combine to influence waterfowl migrations.

"The primary uncertainty is how ducks will respond if we have a hunting season with mild weather, plenty of water, and below average food and cover," said Raedeke. "In the absence of significant cold fronts, ducks may disperse throughout the Mississippi Flyway resulting in lower peak numbers in Missouri. Once ducks arrive in Missouri, habitat conditions will influence how long they stay. Spe-

cies that depend entirely on wetland sources of food may depart sooner than normal. For species that also field feed, such as mallards, the combination of ample water for roosting and harvested grain fields for feeding may help offset effects of below average wetland conditions."

He added that hunters will need to be flexible in when and where they hunt. "If it is a mild fall, it will be especially important to time hunts with cold fronts and migration events. Hunters should also be willing to try new locations for potentially better habitat conditions," Raedeke said.

Patrol addresses new legislation that affects motor vehicles, boats

The Missouri General Assembly recently enacted new legislation affecting motor vehicles and boats, and Governor Jay Nixon has signed the legislation into law. Unless otherwise noted, these laws go into effect August 28, 2015. The Patrol wishes to make the public aware of several of these new laws or changes to increase public awareness and education.

HB 269 - Fire Extinguishers On Vessels

This bill requires every Class 2 vessel operating upon the waters of this state to carry two B1 type fire extinguishers, one B2 fire extinguisher, or a fixed fire extinguishing system and one B1 type fire extinguisher. Currently, the requirement is to carry either one B2 extinguisher, or two B1 type fire extinguishers. (Section 306.100 RSMo.)

HB 650 - Auxiliary Lighting On Motorcycles

This bill allows white and amber auxiliary lighting on motorcycles. The lighting must be non-flashing, nonblinking, non-oscillating, and directed toward the engine and drive train of the motorcycle to prevent interference with the rider's operation of the motorcycle. Among other types of lighting mentioned, LED strips are included. (Section 307.128 RSMo.)

HB 686 - Motor Vehicle Registration

This bill revises the definition of "junk" vehicle to include a vehicle that has been designated as junk or an equivalent designation by any other state. (Section 301.010 RSMo.)

The transferor of an interest in a motor vehicle or trailer must include the name of the transferor in the required notice to the Department of Revenue. The bill allows for the electronic signature of the transferor on the notice. A notice of sale is effective even though it contains minor errors that are not materially misleading. (Section 301.196 RSMo.)

The bill allows the purchaser of a junk vehicle to

SB 12 - Agriculture

Weight Limitations: This act adds livestock to the current milk exemption for weight limits on highways, except interstate highways, for up to 85,500 pounds. This act also allows trucks hauling grain and grain co-products during harvest to exceed weight limits by up to 10 percent again, excluding interstates. (Section 304.180 RSMo.)

SB 231 - Watercraft

Fire Extinguishers For Watercraft, This act requires every Class 2 recreational motorboat operating upon the waters of this state to carry two B1 type fire extinguishers, or one B2 fire extinguisher, or a fixed fire extinguishing system and one B1 type fire extinguisher. (Section 306.100 RSMo.)

Recreational Water Use Laws Brochure: This act requires the Water Patrol Division of the Missouri State Highway Patrol to develop a brochure regarding recreational water use laws and distribute it to recreational water equipment rental facilities and all county commissioners in the state. (Section 306.910 RSMo.)

SB254 - Motor Vehicles License Plate Mounting: This act allows trailer and motorcycle license plates to be mounted horizontally or vertically. (Section 301.130

Intoxication Related Offenses: This act allows the Department of Revenue to extend the period a motorist is required to maintain the ignition interlock device on his or her vehicle by three months if the ignition interlock device detects an attempt to tamper with the device or detects an alcohol concentration above the set point within the last three months of the required installation period. The time must be extended until the motorist goes three months without any violations. Under current law, except for a first time DWI offense, alcohol-related driving offenses require a certain period of suspension before an individual is eligible for limited or restricted driving privileges. This act expands the list of offenses that allows an individual to receive limited driving privileges provided that he or she has an ignition interlock device installed. This act also removes the mandatory suspension period for alcohol-related offenses but requires that an individual must have an ignition interlock device installed on his or her vehicle. This act also removes the requirement that DWI courts cannot grant limited driving privileges to a participant for the first 45 days of participation. This act authorizes the court to order a defendant to submit to continuous alcohol monitoring or verifiable breath alcohol testing performed a minimum of four times per day in any DWI, driving with an excessive blood alcohol content, boating while intoxicated, and boating with an excessive blood alcohol case. The provisions under this heading are effective January 1, 2017. (Sections 302.010, 302.060, 302.525, 302.574, 577.010, 577.012, 577.013, and 577.014 RSMo.)

SB 272 - Commercial

This act adds Boone County to the municipal commercial zone previously defined for the city of Columbia. Commercial zones limit the maximum height and axle weight of commercial vehicles within those zones. (Section 304.190 RSMo.)

SB 456 - Ownership Of Motor Vehicles

Transferred License Plates: This act makes it lawful for a motor vehicle to be operated with transferred license plates for 90 days if the dealer is selling the vehicle without yet having obtained a certificate of ownership. (Section 301.140.1 RSMo.)


Temporary Permits: This act makes it lawful for a motor vehicle or trailer to be operated by a buyer under a temporary permit for 90 days if the dealer is selling the vehicle without yet having obtained a certificate of ownership. (Section 301.140.1 RSMo.)



Cassville Schools welcome two new resource officers



Cassville's two co-Student Resource Officers are pictured above from left to right: Officer Troy Wenzel and Officer Colt Beck.

In partnership with the Cassville Police Department (CPD), the Cassville School District welcomed Officer Troy Wenzel and Officer Colt Beck as the co-School Resource Officers (SRO).

Both Officer Wenzel and Officer Beck are members of the CPD and will alternate each month serving as the Districts SRO. Their primary goal is to ensure the safety and well-being of the student body along with promoting positive relations between youth and law enforcement.

"Officer Wenzel is new to our department; however, he has law enforcement experience," stated Chief of Police Dana Kammerlohr. "Officer Beck had inquired

about the SRO position and was interested. The school had approved having two officers share the position, so I decided to ask both men if they would be interested in doing this. They both agreed they would like to try this arrangement."

Wenzel became employed with CPD in August. However, he has over eight years of experience in law enforcement. He was previously employed for the Department.

Beck has served with the CPD for nearly two years and has been in law enforcement for six years with his previous post at the Barry County Sheriff's Department.

"Both officers have outgoing personalities and are able to get along with people. They are thorough in their work and motivated," stated Chief Kammerlohr.

While the SRO office is in the high school, the officer on duty will spend time at all four campuses serving as a resource to students and faculty, patrolling parking lots and hallways, implementing K-9 searches, coordinating traffic control at the junction of Y Highway and Highway 37 and monitoring the cross-walk at the intersection of Main Street and 14th Street.

The SRO is also available to assist in the case of a medical emergency and will serve as security during sporting events that take place on campus.

"Safety for our students is priority at Cassville Schools," stated Dr. Richard Asbill, Cassville R-IV Superintendent. "We value our partnership with the Cassville Police Department, Officer Wenzel and Officer Beck. They have an integral role in ensuring the safety of our students and staff, along with providing

Carroll County Sheriff's a vital educational component that will teach our students the importance of a healthy, safe lifestyle."

Wenzel and Beck will be involved in the Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) Club along with providing assistance to DARE Officer Mike Moore with the Barry County Sheriff's Department.

"This is the pro-active side of law enforcement, which is a nice change, rather than being reactive," stated Chief Kammerlohr.

Both officers plan to attend the Missouri School Resource Association training in Jefferson City in December. The training is 40 hours and is provided by the Missouri Police Chief's Association. Participants will study laws pertaining to juveniles as well as training in active shooter scenarios.

Small, nonfarm businesses in 112 Missouri counties and neighboring counties in Arkansas, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Nebraska, Oklahoma and Tennessee are now eligible to apply for low-interest federal disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA). These loans offset economic losses because of reduced revenues caused by the excessive rainfall and flooding in the following primary counties that began March 1, 2015, announced Director Tanya N. Garfield of SBA's Disaster Field Operations Center - West.

"SBA eligibility covers both the economic impacts on businesses dependent on farmers and ranchers that have suffered agricultural production losses caused by the disaster and businesses directly impacted by the disaster," Garfield said.

Small, nonfarm businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations of any size may qualify for Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) of up to \$2 million to help meet financial obligations and operating expenses which could have been met had the disaster not occurred.

"Eligibility for these loans is based on the financial impact of the disaster only and not on any actual property damage. These loans have an interest rate of 4 percent for businesses and 2.625 percent for private nonprofit organizations, a maximum term of 30 years, and are available to small businesses and most private nonprofits without the financial ability to offset the adverse impact without hardship," Garfield said.

By law, SBA makes EIDLs

available when the U.S. Secretary of Agriculture designates an agricultural disaster. Secretary Tom Vilsack declared this disaster on August 26, 2015.

Businesses primarily engaged in farming or ranching are not eligible for SBA disaster assistance. Agricultural enterprises should contact the Farm Services Agency about the U.S. Department of Agriculture assistance made available by the Secretary's
