Wildcats top Mustangs with second half surge

Leading just 14-6 after two quarters of play, the Cassville Wildcats rode the second half heroics of River Phelps to a 42-14 road win over the McDonald County Mustangs on Friday night. Phelps, who did not play in the first half, ripped off 129 yards with just 12 carries and scored a pair of touchdowns as Cassville improved to 2-1 on the season.

There's no way around the ugly truth: McDonald County has been a get-well game for the Wildcats in recent years. The last three meetings have seen a brutally one-sided series. Cassville won all three games, recording a pair of shutouts and posting a conglomerate score advantage of 145-7.

Although the Mustangs opened this season with consecutive losses, their unexpected 21 points of offense against Aurora stirred hopes of an upset against the Wildcats. That optimism was evident when Mac won the coin toss and

elected to test the Cassville defense instead of deferring.

The Mustangs fashioned an 8-play, 66-yard drive to take an early 6-0 lead. A 34-yard reverse by Mark Kailbourn sparked the drive, and then Israel Desantiago churned for the touchdown on 3rd-and-goal from the Cassville 1-yard line. The PAT failed, but McDonald County held its first ever lead against Cassville.

Cassville would answer in just four plays following the kickoff. On 3rd-and-10 from his own 48-yard line, Leigh Cox scrambled out of the pocket and found a lane between the hashmarks. Cox evaded the safety at the 15-yard line and motored into the endzone to complete the 52-yard scoring run. The Wildcats went for 2 on the conversion but came up short, and the score remained tied at 6-6 with 7:43 left in the opening quarter.

Sen. McCaskill tours Purdy dairy, hears farmers' concerns

Missouri Senator Claire McCaskill made a special stop in Barry County last week as part of her Agriculture tour. Sen. McCaskill visited Edgewood Dairy and Creamery in Purdy to learn about dairy production and listen to farmers' concerns on Thursday, September 3.

McCaskill met with dairy owners Charles and Melissa Fletcher at the newly-opened

Edgewood Creamery. Edgewood Dairy and Creamery is family owned and operated by Charles and Melissa, their son Tyler and his wife, Aubrey, and their daughter Mikala.

McCaskill was impressed by the operation and said, "There's nothing better than a multigenerational family operation. Parents and kids coming together to grow an operation, it's amazing. It's harder and harder to make that happen. It just doesn't get any better than this."

The aim of McCaskill's ag tour was to speak with agriculture representatives from across the state to give her an idea as to what Missouri needs. She said, "Most Missourians don't understand that agriculture is the most important economic

strength we have in the state. So, I'm out here listening to what farmers have to say to protect their interests."

Reagan Bluel, regional dairy specialist for the University of Missouri Extension Office in Barry County said, "The design of the ag tour is to ensure that our US Senator is aware of the agricultural needs throughout the state, through first hand discussions.

"I was delighted to hear that Senator McCaskill had specifically requested to visit a dairy farm in Barry County. Charles Fletcher serves as an amazing advocate for the dairy industry both locally and large through his milk marketing coop, Dairy Farmers of America. It was for

Man who burglarized CCC Camp sentenced to three years

The man arrested for burglarizing the CCC Camp in Shell Knob was sentenced in court last month.

Sean-Michael Anthony Hand, 22, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree for multiple burglaries at the camp located on Highway YY. The burglaries were originally reported on May 6 of this year. On June 30, Detective Doug Henry with the Barry County Sheriff's Department installed a game camera at the pavilion to attempt to capture images of the person who was repeatedly breaking and entering. On July 2, the camera captured a white male entering the pavilion through a window.

Detective Henry was able to identify the subject

as Hand on July 9. While in the camp, he removed wiring from above a window and went back later to remove something that could not be seen by the camera.

Hand received a three year incarceration sentence with the Department of Corrections that began on August 17.

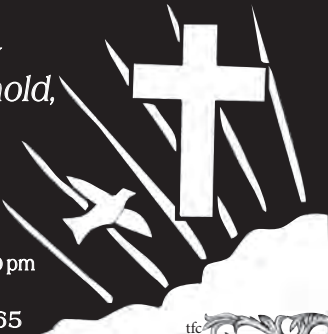

this reason that the Fletcher Dairy and Edgewood Creamery was the first location I recommended for her to visit."

The Fletchers' farm is 350 cows on 260 acre of their own land, plus another 100 acres that they rent. McCaskill asked Charles what the most important issues were for farmers. Charles responded

that the trade agreement that allows New Zealand dairy imports, GMO labelling and the Clean Water Act are all high priority for farmers. McCaskill listened and addressed each point, giving perspectives on both sides of the issue and assuring that she would consider that during the legislative session. Fletcher said, "I think she lis-

tened to what we had to say and responded really well."

McCaskill also took a tour of the creamery, including the pasteurization room where they make cheeses.

At the end of the day, she also purchased fresh milk and a variety of cheese from Edgewood to take with her.

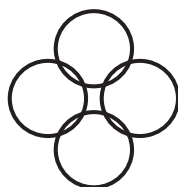

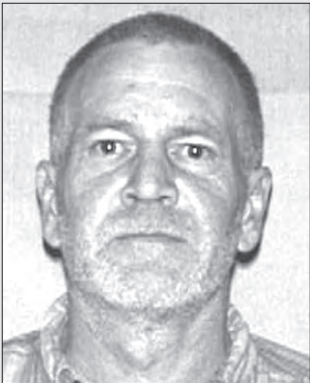

Barry County courts send seven to prison in August

• **Erica Rose Akins**, of Eagle Rock, pled guilty to three counts of possession of a controlled substance between November 2013 and August 2015. Akins was granted a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation on two of the charges and a suspended execution of a seven year sentence on the final charge.

In 2013, Akins was arrested three times while in possession of methamphetamine packaged for distribution. Two times she was pulled over either driving or in a vehicle by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. The third time, the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force investigated a car she was in in the Casey's parking lot in Monett.

Akins is to serve proba-

tion until August 17, 2020.

• **Melecio Perez Barrientos**, of Wheaton, pled guilty to DWI-Alcohol as an aggravated offender. Barrientos was granted a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and give years supervised probation.

On September 20, 2014, Barrientos was found by the Barry County Sheriff's Department unconscious in his vehicle. When asked, Barrientos stated that he was too intoxicated to perform any field sobriety tests. Barrientos had multiple prior driving while intoxicated convictions.

Barrientos is to serve probation until September 18, 2020.

• **Charlie Douglas Branham** pled guilty to assault law enforcement officer.

Branham was granted a suspended execution of a four year incarceration sentence and is to serve four years supervised probation.

On December 11, 2014, Branham was arrested when the Monett Police Department was dispatched to his apartment on Pleasant in Monett. When officer arrived, Branham had attempted to slash a Monett firefighter with a knife and threatened officers with it.

Branham is to serve probation until August 18, 2019.

• **Ricky J. Buller**, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of non-support with the total arrears of more than 12 months. Branham received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years unsupervised probation.

Buller was in arrears on

child support for two different children. As of December 2013, he was in arrears \$13,009.06 for one child. As of June 2014, he was in arrears of \$8,808 for a different child.

Buller is to serve probation until August 17, 2020.

• **Trevin Dean Carver**, of Marionville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Carver was sentenced to four years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On January 25, 2014, the Monett Police Department began following a suspect on foot. When he ran into a residence, the owner gave permission to search. Carver and another man were hiding in the attic with a container with 13 syringes, baggies of methamphetamine, two digital scales to glass smoking pipes, three spoons with residue and two measuring spoons.

• **Joseph Ivan Cline**, of Seligman, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree. Cline received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years unsupervised probation.

On January 22, 2012, Cline struck a victim in the arm with a baseball bat breaking the victim's elbow.

Cline is to serve probation until August 18, 2018.

• **Cynthia L. Crabb**, of Monett, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Crabb received a suspended imposition of sentencing with five years supervised probation.

After investigating a drug incident on January 21, 2014, the Missouri State Highway Patrol obtained a search warrant for another vehicle. Crabb's purse was in the vehicle and contained a syringe of methamphetamine. She also had methamphetamine and paraphernalia in her room at the residence.

Crabb is to serve probation until August 18, 2020.

• **Michael Lee Dotson**, of Cassville, made an Alford plea to domestic assault in the second degree and felonious restraint. Dotson was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

them to leave a residence and kicking them in the stomach, head butting her on the head and dragging her by her hair. The victim received physical injuries to her back, bruising on her arm and abdomen and a large cut to her ear.

• **Kevin Anthony Elkins**, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a chemical with the intent to manufacture a controlled substance and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in 2012. Elkins' probation has since been revoked, and he received a suspended execution of a seven year incarceration sentence and supervised probation for five years.

In October 2010, Elkins was charged for possessing chemicals to manufacture methamphetamine, including lye, camping fuel and a shake and bake methamphetamine manufacturing method bottle. Then, in December 2010, Elkins sold a Bose radio and a cordless drill/saw that had been stolen from a residence on North Spring Street.

Elkins is to serve probation until August 17, 2020.

• **Ricky Wayne Goodine**, of Monett, pled guilty to two counts of distribution of a controlled substance. Goodine received a suspended execution of a six year incarceration sentence and give years supervised probation.

On April 5, 2013, the Missouri State Highway Patrol executed a search warrant on 4th Street in Monett. Inside a safe in the home was 56 grams or marijuana in eight different baggies. There were also oxycodone tablets, street prices written

down for narcotics and digital scales.

Goodine is to serve probation until September 9 2020.

• **Sean-Michael Anthony Hand**, of Shell Knob, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree. Hand was sentenced to three years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On May 6, 2015, the CCC Camp in Shell knob reported a burglary. After using a game camera, the Barry County Sheriff's Department identified Hand as the culprit to break-ins.

• **Samantha May Hostetter**, of Cassville, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in March. She has since been ordered to serve 120 days of shock incarceration.

On May 2, 2014, Hostetter was the passenger in a vehicle that was pulled over for speeding by the Missouri State Highway Patrol. She was found to be in possession of methamphetamine and paraphernalia.

• **Jesse Merrill**, of Neosho, pled guilty to burglary in the second degree and theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. Merrill received three years incarceration with the Department of

Corrections.

On September 28, 2012, errill burglarized Barry County Ready Mix and stole a Walmart gift card, cash and a customer check. Merrill used the Walmart gift card . Once questioned by the Cassville Police, Merrill admitted to burglarizing the business.

• **Duane M. Parrish**, of Eagle Rock, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance in 2010. His probation has since been revoked and he is to serve seven years incarceration.

On October 12, 2007, Parrish was found to have been in possession of 49 grams of psilocybin mushrooms and unidentified white pills.

• **Akeen Carl Purifoy**, of Monett, pled guilty to distribution of a controlled substance. Purifoy received five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On June 11, 2014, the Monett Police Department obtained a search warrant to check a box that was located in a vehicle owned by Purifoy and another woman. Inside was over a pound of vacuum-sealed marijuana. Text messages showed the two discussing drug sales.

• **Joshua Ratliff**, of

Springfield, pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance. Ratliff received a suspended execution of a five year incarceration sentence and five years supervised probation.

On December 10, 2013, the Monett Police Department investigated Ratliff's vehicle. He was in possession of a baggie of 4 grams of methamphetamine.

Ratliff is to serve probation until August 17, 2020.

• **Devin Rust** pled guilty to distribution of a controlled substance. Rust received a suspended execution of a five years incarceration sentence, give years supervised probation and was ordered to complete CRISP.

On September 27, 2017, the Missouri State Highway Patrol conducted an undercover investigation. Rust sold them one-half of an ounce of marijuana on U.S.

Highway 60 near Monett for \$200.

Rust is to serve probation until August 25, 2020.

• **Patricia Lyn Sigman**, of Aurora, made an Alford plea to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000. Sigman received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

On June 7, 2010, the Missouri Loan Center in monett reported theft from the business. While Sigman was an employee there, multiple cash payments made by cus-

tomers were not received by the business. The total loss was \$1,166.02.

• **Herman Thomas Tilford**, of Seligman, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree. Tilford received a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.


On July 4, 2013, The Barry County's Sheriff's Department investigated an assault at the Washburn Prairie Cemetery. The victim was

WILDCATS from FRONT

McDonald County answered with another long drive against the Cassville defense. Jake Will ripped off a 30-yard run to give the Mustangs a 1st-and-10 at the Cassville 13-yard line. But the Wildcats stiffened on defense, stuffing Will for just a yard on first down. Kennedy Hobson threw incomplete on three consecutive plays, and the Mustangs surrendered the ball on downs.

Cassville punted on a three-and-out series, but the Mustangs fumbled the ball right back to the Wildcats.

After struggling with the passing game against Mountain Grove, the Cassville offense showed a new commitment to the pitch-and-catch against Mac. Cox found Allen Lambel open for a first down on a 3rd-and-4 play. Two snaps later, Cox delivered again, and Lambel raced through the secondary for a 44-yard score. Kyle Ruark plowed into the end zone for an extra-value PAT and the Wildcats opened a 14-6 lead.

That score would last into halftime. The second quarter was marked by penalties and turnovers. A costly infraction wiped a Cassville touchdown off the board, and the Wildcats had to settle for the one-score lead at intermission.

The appearance of River Phelps on the field totally

changed the tone of the game. AWOL for the entire first half, Phelps became the bell cow on Cassville's opening possession of the third quarter. His 16-yard scoring burst on a 1st-and-10 draw play and successful PAT gave the Wildcats a 21-6 lead at the 7:50 mark.

McDonald County suffered the anguish of the penalty on their next possession, as a 67-yard scoring scamper by Desantiago was wiped away. The Mustangs went for a 4th-and-7 at the Cassville 44-yard line later in the drive, but the possession died with an incompleting.

Phelps ripped through the line and jetted to a 56-yard score on the very next play. His true PAT upped the Cassville lead to 28-6 with 5:52 left in the quarter.

Even with a lot of time remaining, that play closed the door on the Mustangs. Few teams can recover from a lead of that size. It's a lot easier to keep up than it is to catch up, an axiom that holds true for all sports.

The Mustangs squeezed out a first down after the kickoff, but a Troy Rose interception put the Wildcats back in business at the McDonald County 25-yard line with 3:57 remaining in the quarter.

It took ten plays for the

Wildcats to score, but Cox finally found the endzone. Cassville's senior quarterback sneaked in from the 1-yard line to start the fourth quarter, and another Phelps PAT established a 35-6 score.

Late in the game, Cassville's Braden Strahan replaced Phelps in the backfield, and ripped off a 36-yard touchdown run on his first varsity carry. Another chip shot by Phelps upped the lead to 42-6.

The Mustangs managed one more clip for the highlight reel. Desantiago blazed through the Cassville reserves for a 63-yard scoring run in the waning minutes to establish the final score of 42-14.

The Wildcats exerted their will on the Mustangs in the second half. A vastly-improved passing game opened up the field for the offense. The defense was solid but still surrendered a few big plays. This Cassville team is a work in progress, but certainly showing improvement every week.

MDC seeks input on bass changes Exeter Corn Maze to open Sept. 19

Smallmouth bass and rock bass, also called goggle eye, are very popular with anglers on Missouri's Ozark streams. However, research by the Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) shows that both species grow slowly and that many do not reach a quality size before dying from natural causes or being caught by anglers.

As a result, many anglers surveyed by MDC have reported that fishing quality for rock bass has declined over the past decade. Many anglers also have responded that the minimum-length limits and daily limits for smallmouth on rivers and creeks varies and can be complicated.

According to MDC fishing regulations, there is no existing statewide minimum length limit for rock bass, but some rivers and creeks in MDC Special Management Areas have an eight-inch minimum. Smallmouth bass have a statewide minimum length limit of 12 inches with a six-fish daily limit, while MDC Special Management Areas have a minimum length limit of 15 or 18 inches with a daily limit of one or two fish.

As a result of research and angler feedback, the

Conservation Department is proposing changes to fishing regulations for these two popular game fish that would help grow smallmouth and rock bass while simplifying regulations for smallmouth in MDC Special Management Areas.

For rock bass, MDC research shows that a majority of anglers favor a single, statewide minimum length limit. MDC is proposing setting it at seven inches.

For smallmouth bass, the proposed changes would maintain the current statewide length limit of 12-inches with a daily limit of six fish, but change all Special Management Areas to a 15-inch minimum length limit with a daily limit of one smallmouth bass.

Proposed regulations would also create a new Special Management Area on the Current River and expand the Special Management Areas on the Big Piney, Big River, Jacks Fork, and Meramec rivers.

MDC is seeking public input on these potential regulations changes and will host a series of open houses around the state to provide more information, answer questions, and get public comments. The Department

Cassville Methodist church offers grief support

Cassville United Methodist is again offering a program for area residents to receive comfort and hope following the death of a loved one. "There was a need for a support group in Cassville" says church Pastor Andy Lambel. "Our church's vision is engaging in authentic relationships with the community around us to share the faith, hope and love of Jesus Christ through passionate worship, contagious fellowship, and acts of service," and we offer Griefshare to our community in an act of service." "Many people in the Cassville area are hurting, and removing the weight of traveling to another city helps to ease the burden."

Griefshare, a 13-week support group for the grieving, will return Wednesday at the United Methodist Church, September 9th, at 6 p.m., and will run for 13 consecutive weeks. Since all sessions are a complete lesson, persons may join the group at any time.

Support during a time of loss is a primary mission of Griefshare. The sessions include the video presentation followed by group discussion. The discussion portion allows for open conversation and support for group members. David Samuel, group

facilitator, says that often candid talk helps each person better understand what takes place when grieving. "We equip ourselves with a tool bag that helps us work through our grief." Samuel lost his wife to death three years ago, and has been conducting Griefshare sessions at the church since January. "First of all, we acknowledge God is our counselor. Every week we view a video featuring many experts in the field of grief, death, and dying; and persons who have suffered their own personal loss and how Griefshare has helped them." Says Samuel. "It takes a lot of courage to face your grief, and too many persons seem to think needing a support groups means you are weak—this is so far from being true. Grief is a process we have to work through—God meets us halfway. God strengthens us to do the work we need to do so we can move forward in joy."

The Church's goal is to offer comfort and encouragement to those who lost someone close to them. "During the small group discussion time, participants will have the opportunity to interact with others' experiences, each will find that there is healing from grief,

and that mourning can become joy again." Pastor Andy Lambel said. "Griefshare is a Bible-based study and support where participants not only share their experiences, but hear encouraging words from the Bible, from which we can find our strength." Participants are additionally given a GRIEFSHARE workbook to reflect on daily between each of the sessions.

Comments from person who have attended the class include:

"I wanted to know what I was experiencing was normal."

"I now believe I can find joy again in my life." "It hurts, but now I am doing something productive to work through it all."

"I was in a rut, going nowhere. Now I see the journey mapped out in front of me."

"I can now claim Grace, feel free of guilt, and can move forward with joyful memories."

All counties listed above were designated disaster areas between July 24, 2015 and August 7, 2015. Farm operators in the designated area eligible for low interest emergency (EM) loans from FSA, provided eligibility requirements are met. Farmers in eligible counties have eight months from the date of the declaration to apply for loans to help cover part of their actual losses. FSA will consider each loan application on its

own merits, taking into account the extent of losses, security available and repayment ability.

Loans for physical losses must be used to replace or repair damage to buildings, fences or to compensate the farmer for losses of basic livestock, stored crops, or supplies on hand, equipment, etc., that was lost due to the disaster. Loans for production losses may also be used to buy feed, seed, fertilizer, livestock, or to make payments on real estate or chattel debts. Generally, loans for production losses cannot be approved until crops have completed their production cycle or have been harvested.

In order to qualify, a farmer must have suffered 30

percent loss in production or an actual physical loss that was essential to the successful operation of the farm.

USDA also has made a variety of other programs available to assist farmers in recovering from the disaster, including the Emergency Conservative Program (ECP); Federal Crop Insurance; and the Non-insured Crop Disaster Assistance Program.
