Gen. Assembly overrides veto on Sater's abortion waiting-period bill

With the Missouri General Assembly's veto session over, one controversial bill sponsored by Senator David Sater, R-Cassville, will be passed into law despite Governor Jay Nixon's veto. Sen. Sater sponsored the original SB 519 that would change the waiting period between when a woman has an initial abortion consultation with a doctor to when the procedure is actually performed from 24-hours to 72-hours.

HBs 1307 and 1313 were the House versions of SB

519 that actually passed during the regular legislative session this year. Those bills were some of more than 30 bills and 100 budget items that Nixon vetoed after the session ended. While not all bills were focused on during the veto session, the abortion waiting period bill was one of the first to receive an override with a 117-44 vote in the House and 23-9 in the Senate. All bills that are granted an override during the veto session will go into effect 30-days after the veto session which only lasted one

day, beginning Wednesday, September 10, and ending early Thursday morning at 3:30 a.m.

Senate Minority Leader Jolie Justus, D-Kansas City, led a filibuster of the bill, but Republicans voted to end the debate and force a vote. Republicans passed the override on a party-line vote.

Missouri's 72-hour waiting period on abortions puts the state in the same group as Utah and South Dakota who also have the three-day waits. Sen. Sater stated, "Another 48 hours could very well be the difference between a life saved and a life ended. Knowing that a life is at stake, this is the least we can do for these children. Since *Roe v. Wade*, over 52 million children have been aborted in the U.S. When are we going to say enough is enough and do the right thing?"

The bill has drawn heated debate from both sides of the issue since the beginning. Gov. Nixon's initial comment about his veto on the bill was that it was

"extreme and disrespectful" mostly due to the lack of exception for rape or incest. Rep. Judy Morgan, D-Kansas City, stated, "This is designed to demean and shame a woman into changing her mind."

Other opponents have said that the new law will impact low-income women most. Currently, Missouri has only one abortion clinic which is located in St. Louis. Those opposed say that a woman travelling and having to wait three days puts them at an economic hardship because of the length of time away from work and staying in a different city.

Despite opposition, both bills passed with overwhelming majority in both the Senate and the House, evening picking up an additional nine Democrat votes in the override session.

Sen. Sater stated last Wednesday during the override session, "I want to thank my colleagues in both the Senate and the House from both sides of the aisle for voting in support of life today. In Missouri, we be-

lieve life is worth protecting and today's vote sends a clear message that Missouri intends to defend those who cannot defend themselves."

Representative Scott Fitzpatrick, R-Shell Knob, stated, "I was pleased with the outcome of the 72-hour wait period bill at veto session. The house overrode the Governor with an overwhelming bipartisan super majority, far in excess of the minimum votes required. I am glad the Senate was able to finish the job. I'd like to congratulate Senator Sater on successfully handling the most difficult bill of the year."

Injured Washburn soldier vows to walk again

On April 30, 2011, Nicholas Mendes, a specialist in the U.S. Army from Washburn, was on patrol in Afghanistan when an improvised explosive device was detonated, severely injuring his spinal chord. Doctors believed he would remain a quadriplegic for the rest of his life. Mendes, 24, is determined to prove them wrong.

Mendes's story was originally featured in the June 8, 2011 edition of the Advertiser. According to Mendes's mother, Edythe Lane, Mendes has undergone a stem cell operation, which Mendes and his family hope will regenerate his spinal chord. "He is only the third person in the nation to receive this surgery," Lane said.

Even before the surgery, Mendes progressed beyond what his doctors thought possible. According to Lane, he regained some mobility in his right arm and leg, and also was able to move his fingers. He learned how to write again and, for a Mother's Day gift, penned Lane a note saying he loved her. "He is determined he is going to walk again," said Lane. "He is going to regain full use of his body."

After he was wounded, Mendes was told there were only three locations in the United States where he could get the rehab he would need. He chose to go to the rehab center in San Diego, where he had some family.

Mendes has since completed his inpatient rehab and is active in veterans affairs. According to Lane, he has appeared in numerous

commercial spots for veterans causes and even has an annual "Nick Mendes Honors the Troops Day" aboard the Queen Mary. "He's just amazing," Lane said. "Nothing ever keeps him down."

Mendes has also found love. He met Wendy Eichler, a contracted caregiver for the Veterans Administration in San Diego when she went to do an evaluation on him.

The care Mendes required during in-patient rehab was beyond what Eichler would be able to give professionally, but she continued to stay in contact with him as friends. Their relationship continued to grow, and now they are engaged and will be married on September 28 at Breaker's Beach in San Diego.

Lane and the rest of Mendes's family in Barry County are excited about the upcoming wedding, but Lane said the price of attending will be steep. There are nine of them attending, one of them Mendes's grandmother, whom he has not seen since Christmas

Cassville Drug Take-Back set for September 27

The Cassville Police Department is again participating in the D.E.A. Prescription Take Back Day. This will be held September 27, 2014 between the hours of 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. The address to drop off the medication is 300 Main, Cassville City Hall/Cassville Police Department. The entrance will be in the back of the building using the Council Chamber door.

The Prescription Take

Back Day is to help people to properly dispose of unused medications. Proper disposal of medication helps to protect the environment and keeps the medicine from being flushed into our water systems. This also helps keep the medication out of the hands of people who do not have a prescription or need for the medication, but want to use it for recreational use only.

They are encouraging

people to take the time to clean out their medicine drawers and cabinets and properly dispose of their unused medicine. They also accept over-the-counter medications.

Please note: inhalers, illegal drugs and sharp objects (syringes) will not be accepted. No medications can be accepted from medical clinic's pharmacies or veterinary clinics.

Stella's Yang sentenced for sex crime

Tammy Dickinson, United States Attorney for the Western District of Missouri, announced that a Stella man was sentenced in federal court for transporting a minor across state lines for illicit sex.

Tong Yang, 46, of Stella, was sentenced by U.S. Chief District Judge Greg Kays to 13 years in federal prison without parole.

Yang, who pleaded guilty on May 1, 2014, admitted that he traveled to Minnesota to pick up a 15-year-old girl and bring her back to Missouri on Dec. 7, 2013, with the intent to engage in illicit sexual activity.

Yang had contacted

the minor victim a couple of weeks earlier by sending her a friend request on Facebook. Yang talked to her about coming to live with him in Missouri and told her he owned his own business. The minor victim went to her mother's house to retrieve some clothing on Dec. 6, 2013, and while there, she asked Yang to come get her. She snuck out and met with Yang in front of her mother's house the next day, and they drove to a hotel in Neosho where they engaged in unprotected sex.

This case was prosecuted by Assistant U.S. Attorney Patrick Carney.

It was investigated by U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) Homeland Security Investigations (HSI), the Cassville Police Department and the Neosho Police Department.

Two were arrested on drug charges Tuesday after an alleged theft at Dollar General in Cassville.

Officers with the Cassville Police Department were called by the store around 4:10 p.m. stating that a man and a woman were in the store and had possibly stolen items without paying for them and were driving a white van.

Officers located the van at 101 Main Street. The driver, Patricia Harvey, 52, Seligman, gave consent for officers to search the van for the stolen items. Her passenger at the time was Jessica George, 25, Seligman.

During the search, officers found a used syringe,

a metal spoon with an unknown substance that had been heated and a used Fentanyl patch in the floorboard in front of the middle seats of the van. When officers asked who they belonged to, the women refused to answer.

Harvey and George were each charged with possession of a controlled substance and are being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$10,000 bond. Harvey has other pending drug charges for possession of a controlled substance and manufacturing a controlled substance from July of this year.

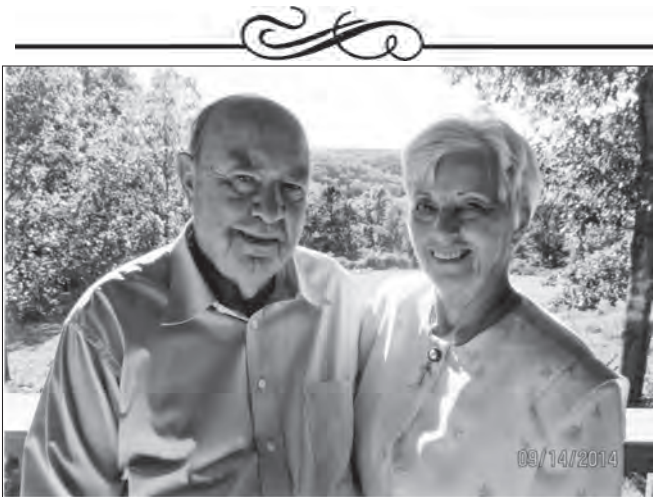

Did You Know...

The Barry County E 9-1-1 Center is responsible for assigning all addresses in rural Barry County and the City of Seligman. Barry County has adopted an addressing style called a Mile Marker System. That means every 5.28 feet there is a different numeric which allows for up to one thousand addresses to be assigned within one mile (1mile = 5,280 feet). So when people build a new house next door to an existing house their neighbor's address won't have to change.

All addresses originate from the northern & western county lines. The higher the address is, the further it is from the northern or western county line.

A road that begins with a '1' identifies that it primarily travels in a north/south direction.

A road that begins with a '2' identifies that it primarily travels in an east/west direction.

While travelling east and south, the odd numbered addresses will be on the right hand side of the road and the even numbered addresses will be on the left side of the road.

To determine your address location, place a decimal point three spaces from the last number of your address

Barry County E 9-1-1 issues addresses to livable structures and businesses. The minimum requirements necessary to acquire an address are: 1) you must have an established driveway. 2) The location of your structure must me marked.

The following items will be accepted at the curb: barbecue grills; patio furniture; outdoor furniture; sofas; dressers; loveseats; recliners; desks; televisions; bundled guttering; beds, including hide-a-beds, mattresses and box springs; wood pallets; waste from small remodeling or wood projects, materials must be cut into four-

foot sections and stacked; sinks; toilets; cabinets; vanities; carpet that is cut into four-foot lengths and bundled; fencing that is cut into four-foot lengths; and bicycles.

Republic Services will not accept tires, yard waste, large quantities of ash, dead animals, raw sewage, waste oil, hazardous materials, wet paint containers, chemicals, flammable substances, lead or acid batteries or waste from large remodeling or construction projects.

They are again offering this year for Cassville resi-

dents who want to dispose of large appliances and metal.

One option will be to take only metal or large appliances to a dumpster located at 503 Mill Street. This is across the street from the Barry County Sheriff's Office. This option is free.

The other option will be to have Cassville residents set at their curb side large appliances for Republic Services to collect. There is a \$15 fee. Residents must pay the fee to Republic Services in order to schedule the pick-up of the appliance. The following large appli-

Cable Restraint class in Neosho Sept. 20

The Missouri Department of Conservation will hold a cable restraint trapping certification class at 10:30 a.m. Sept. 20 at the Neosho National Fish Hatchery meeting room, which is located at 520 E. Park St. in Neosho.

When used correctly, cable restraint devices can hold animals alive and allow trappers to release non-target animals unharmed.

The devices can be used to take furbearers during Missouri's furbearer trapping season (see the Wildlife Code of Missouri for details on season dates and regulations) by trappers who have successfully completed a cable restraint training course, validated by a certified instructor.

This free course will cover the basics of safely and legally utilizing cable re-

straints to capture furbearers. Regulations, proper set location and cable restraint construction will be discussed.

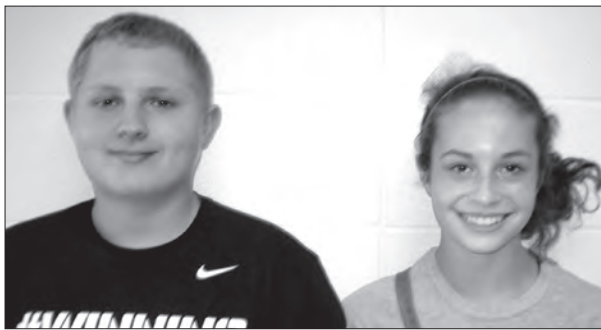

Mr. Jordan presented the Board with the Elementary report. 89 percent of elementary students are above 90 percent attendance. Mr. Jordan discussed the usage of Google Calendar and gave a technology update. He also discussed the Chromebook usage schedule.

In the past, there was just one type of flu vaccine regardless of age. Now there are several flu vaccine options. Not all options may be available at every medical provider. The CDC does not recommend one flu vaccine over the other. The important thing is to get a flu shot every year.

Different vaccines are listed below with additional information.

• High-dose Fluzone: 65 years and older (not approved for those under 65 years).

High-dose Fluzone contains four times the amount of antigen (the part of the vaccine that prompts the body to make antibodies against the flu). Human immune defenses become weaker with age. Aging decreases the body's ability to have a good immune response after getting influenza vaccine. A higher dose of antigen in the vaccine is supposed to give older people a better immune response, therefore better

protection against flu. The High-Dose contains three flu strains: two "A" strains and one "B" strain. The "A" strain of the influenza virus is particularly severe, especially in older adults. The "B" strain of the influenza virus tends to cause more serious illness in children. (People 65 and older can receive the Quadvalent or Trivalent Flu Vaccine if desired).

• Quadvalent Flu Vaccine: infants age six months old and up, children and adults.

The Quadalcent vaccine contains four strains of flu: two "A" and two "B."

• Flumist, Quadvalent Nasal Spray: two years old through 49 years old.

Flumist contains four strains of Influenza Virus: two "A" and two "B" strains. This is only for healthy children and adults age two years through 49 years. It is not recommended for those with asthma.

• Trivalent Flu Vaccine: infants age six months old and up, children and adults.

The Trivalent vaccine contains three strains of Influenza Virus: two "A" and one "B" strain. This has been the traditional flu vaccine.

• Pneumovax 23 (Pneumonia vaccine): 65 years and up for general recommendation.

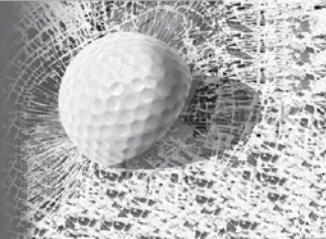
