
# Cassville man arrested on rape charge

A Cassville man was arrested last week on rape charges for an incident in Wheaton. Joel William Pyle, 33, of Cassville, is being charged with rape in the first degree and is being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$30,000 cash-only bond.

According to an affidavit of probable cause by Barry County Sheriff's deputy Scott Salkill, Pyle grabbed the victim around the neck on October 29 around 1 a.m. and forced her into her residence on Kelly Street in Wheaton. Pyle then allegedly raped her over the couch in her living room and then left.

1130 near Cassville later that day, and he was placed on a 24-hour hold until charges were filed by Barry County Prosecuting Attorney Amy Boxx. According to the affidavit, Pyle had a previous criminal history.

# Springfield driver seriously injured in three car crash

A Springfield driver was seriously injured in a three-car crash on Thursday morning. No other people were injured in the crash.

According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, a 2009 GMC truck driven by Scotty R. Henson, 44, of Cassville, crossed the center line and struck a 2006 Chrysler 300, driven by Bradley D. Beach, 62, of Springfield.

The wheels of the truck came off and struck a third

vehicle, a 2014 Nissan Rogue driven by Sadonya L. Labonte-Thomas, 37, of Nixa.

The truck received extensive damage, the Chrysler was totalled and the Nissan had moderate damage.

Bradley had to be airlifted to Mercy Hospital in Springfield for serious injures. No other drivers reported injuries at the time of the crash. Bradley and Labonte-Thomas were wearing seatbelts, but Henson was not.

# Business partners support local classrooms through fun, learning

Each year, area businesses partner with the Cassville Primary to support local classrooms. The goal of the program is to harbor a relationship between businesses and kids in the community. The program, which started more than 20 years ago, is still growing strong, with kids getting to enjoy new fun learning experiences thanks to the businesses who help their classrooms.

Principal Catherine Weaver said, "What we're trying to is just build a rapport between our students and the community. With our little guys, they don't know what is out there career wise because they are so little. We want to expose them to all of those possibilities"

Cassville physician Dr. Lisa Roark, owner of the Roark Family Health direct-care clinic in Cassville, partnered with Mrs. Crawford's first grade classroom. With Halloween over the weekend, Dr. Roark decided to offer up a lesson on the skeletal system for the kids.

On Thursday, Dr. Roark and three of the other women who work in her clinic helped the first graders assemble and label skeletons, as well as giving each child a box of skeleton candy that they put together. During the lesson, kids learned which bones are where and other facts about the skeletal system.

Dr. Roark opened her

new clinic this summer after deciding to step away from working in a hospital environment. She said, "As a doctor, I've never been a part of the school or the community, because I just worked all the time. Now I can be a part of their everyday activities. I can go eat lunch with them and share those memories. Part of being here as a business partner is being a part of that." Roark's son Eli, 6, is one of the students in Mrs. Crawford's class, and she said it's great getting to share that time with him and the other children.

She continued, "I want my clinic to be a strong part of our community, and I think if we can start teaching our kids at a young age how to be healthy and understand their bodies, they'll be a lot easier to take care of in a long run."

Weaver said that businesses have different ways of helping the classrooms. Most years all classrooms have a partner with a few exceptions. She said, "It varies often depending on how many business sign up for it. What we do is we have a teacher committee that organizes it and sends out requests through the Chamber and our Facebook page. Most of the classes have the partners and they do all kinds of things with the kids. Our push isn't financial support or looking for money, but we've been blessed by many businesses doing things that way.

We've had businesses give the teachers to purchase books through the book fair for the classrooms."

Businesses go into the classrooms to read books, sometimes they will eat lunch with their classes, and more. Weaver said, "We've had them read books, do lessons. Frequently, they will share about their business to tell them about career-focus, talk about their job and company and what they do, and why they do it. The kids just love it when we have business partners come in. They are like heroes in my kids' eyes. It's a great way to build that bridge with them."

For Dr. Roark, tying in health with Halloween was a great way to help kids remember the information. She said, "I thought this would tie into Halloween and would be fun. We've got another presentation planned for the circulatory system and that kind of stuff. I figure if we make it fun, they're going to remember it."

Dr. Roark said her clinic also purchased Wildcat shirts for the kids to wear on Fridays, and she and her staff wear the same shirts to match their classroom.

Dr. Roark lives in Cassville with her husband of 16 years, Griff, and her children, Maddock, 8, Eli, 6, Jocelyn, 4, and Sylas, 3. Maddock, Eli and Jocelyn all go to Cassville School.


Two drivers were injured in a crash on Tuesday, Ctober 27, in the afternoon near the bridge.

# Reeds Spring claims 20-13 district semifinal win over Cassville

The Cassville Wildcats saw their season end on a cold, wet night at Reeds Spring on Friday night. The Wolves, the top seed in Class 3 District 4, earned a 20-13 win over Cassville with a strong defense and a relentless, ball-controling running

The Reeds Spring running game was a three-headed monster, with quarterback Nick Haddock, and running backs Korey Robinette and Colton Pomeroy piling up yardage with long, clockconsuming drives.

Cassville struggled on first down much of the night but came up with big plays to stay in the ballgame. Freshman quarterback Shannon Haney showed his arm could complement the bread and butter running attack of Leigh Cox and River Phelps.

Senior tight end Jacob Holtz was Haney's favorite target. His clutch third down catch late in the second quarter set up Cassville's only offensive touchdown midway

through the second quarter. On a night when Aurora toppled Monett and Carl Junction came within an eyelash of an ESPN-worthy

upset of the Webb City dynasty, Cassville had the look of a spoiler team throughout the game. Despite Reeds Spring's advantage on the line of scrimmage, the Wildcats hung in and trailed by only 6-0 at the end of the first

But that touchdown by the Wolves set the stage for what the Wildcat Nation would see all night: long drives that drained time off the clock like a four-barrel carb stealing gas from a '69 Mach I Mustang.

Reeds Spring's 80-yard, 12-play drive took all but 43 seconds of the last 6:00 of the first quarter, as Haddock found Shaun Baker with a 29-yard touchdown strike to give the Wolves a 6-0 lead.

The Wildcats answered, driving 68 yards in 17 plays to take a 7-6 lead at the 5:40 mark of the second quarter. The Haney to Holtz combo rescued the drive twice with third down completions, and Phelps vaulted over the line on second and goal from the one-yard line as Cassville claimed the lead.

But Reeds Spring roared back on a 14-play, 68-yard drive to reclaim the lead with less than a minute left in the half. Haddock carried six times in the drive, and Robinette swept around right end for a 16-yard scoring run on a 3rd-and-11 play. The Wolves completed the twopoint conversion for a 14-7

After a short kickoff gave Cassville the ball at its own 45-yard line, the Wildcats fed River Phelps on three consecutive plays with the clock running down, for gains of 3, 15, and 19 yards. Phelps attempted a 37-yard field goal as time expired, but his try sailed wide right in the gusting wind.

The Wolves received the second half kickoff, and the Wildcats dug in for a critical series. Pomeroy gashed thre line for four yards on first down. On the next snap, Haddock fumbled in the backfield and a prisonbreak scramble saw the ball kicked and batted down the field until Dakota Townsend scooped it up and rumbled into the endzone for a Cassville touchdown.

The bizarre gift pulled the Wildcats within a point, 14-13. But the PAT sailed wide, and Reeds Spring clung to the lead.

The Wolves then took control with another long drive. Six minutes bled off the clock as Reeds Spring plowed 85 yards in 12 plays. Robinette scored on a reverse from 17 yards out, and Reeds Spring took a 20-13 lead with 5:50 left in the third quarter.

There would be no more scoring but plenty of action.

The Wildcats went three and out following the score, but Colton Dilbeck stripped Haddock to get the ball back at the Reeds Spring 44-yard line with a minute left in the quarter to set up the most critical drive of the season.

Two penalties against the Wolves helped move the bll down to the 22-yard line. Then, Leigh Cox battered the line three straight times to set up a fourth-and-three at the 15. Haney tossed a pass over the middle into traffic and Holtz pulled it in to move the

Phelps fought to the 5-yard line on first down, but was held to no gain on the next play. on third-andgoal, Haney rolled out and stretched to the 2-yard line. Fourth and goal

This was the ultimate pressure cooker for a freshman quarterback. The situation harkened back to a Saturday afternoon in 2010 when David Large decided to for a fourth and three late in the fourth quarter instead of kicking a field goal that could have given the Wildcats the lead. Ricky Nichols was stopped short and Cassville suffered its only loss of the season. Richmond went on to win the state title the following week.

With the game on the line at Reeds Spring, Haney took the snap and was almost immediately tripped up in the backfield by the Reeds Spring run blitz. Haney manged to keep his feet, planted and dove for the end line.

He came up inches short. There were still seven minutes left in the game though, and Cassville's defense had a golden opportunity in front of them. A negative play would cost the Wolves a safety and possession. Just a defensive stop would get the ball back for the Cassville offense in great field position.

Instead, Reeds Spring ran out the clock with a methodical drive. The Wolves drove from the shadow of their own goal posts to the Cassville 39-yard line in 17 plays. Big fullback Colton Pomeroy was unstoppable in the second half in general and on this drive in particular. Every time the Wolves needed a first down late in the game,

Pomeroy answered the bell. Reeds Spring's victory formation signalled the end of Cassville's season as the Wolves claimed the 20-13

Reeds Spring improved to 10-1 with the victory, and will face Aurora in the district final. Cassville finished the 2015 season at 5-6, snapping a three-game winning streak.

After the game, Cassville's Lance Parnell praised his team, especially the seniors, for what they accomplished and how they handled adversity throughout the season.





# Barry County courts send five to prison in the month of October

• Brian Dail Adams, 31, of Pierce City, pled guilty to DWI - Alcohol as a persistent offender. Adams was sentenced to two years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

On September 20, 2015, the Missouri State Highway Patrol responded to US-60 at MO 97 for a suspected intoxicated driver. When they made contact with Adams, he failed multiple sobriety field test, but refused to take a breathalyzer. Adams had three prior DWI convictions from 2006 to 2014.

• John Jason Bartholomew, 36, of Wheaton, pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree and possession of a controlled substance. Bartholomew was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

The Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force investigated Bartholomew after children living in his home claimed that he was doing drugs and possibly manufacturing methamphetamine. When the task force searched the residence, they found marijuana, multiple used and new syringes, methamphetamine residue on baggies, as well as multiple items of paraphernalia.

While searching the home, officers noted that the house was in very unsanitary conditions. They reported seeing food and clothes on the floor of the home, as well as animal feces throughout the home. All five children

were taken into custody either by child protective services or moved to a relative's home

Bartholomew is to serve probation until October 19, 2020.

• Glen M. Bise, 31, of Rogers, Ark., pled guilty to driving while revoked or suspended. Bise was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On April 18, 2013, the Missouri State Highway Patrol responded to a motor vehicle crash on Farm Road 1065 around 6 a.m. When officers arrived, there was a passenger intoxicated and passed out in the back seat of the vehicle. The Trooper also reported multiple broken beer and liquor bottles around the car. Upon investigation, it was determined that Bise was driving the car but fled the scene after the wreck. Bise had two previous driving while intoxicated convictions and two charges of driving while revoked or suspended.

Bise is to serve probation until October 20, 2018.

• Jacky Edward Burnette, 49, of Summers, Ark., pled guilty to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. Burnette was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

On November 3, 2014, the Cassville Police Department assisted the children's division on a hotline call at a residence on Main Street in Cassville. According to the call, there were two children in

the home, ages four and six, and they reported that their father, Burnette, had passed out in the kitchen in his own vomit over the weekend.

Once in the home, a prescription of 180 hydrocodone filled three days earlier was found to have 10 pills remaining. The four-year-old also found loose pills on the ground, including oxydocone and morphine, and gave them to the investigators. The conditions of the home were cluttered with dirty clothing, trash and feathers from a pillow.

Burnette is to serve probation until October 27, 2019.

• Jeremy L. Burton, 40, of Aurora, pled guilty to one count of passing a bad check of \$500 or more. Burton was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

According to the complaint filed, Burton was originally charged with six counts of passing bad checks for writing checks to various Barry County businesses drawn on a nonexistent account.

Burton is to serve probation until October 20, 2018.

• Cynthia Carr, 54, of Monett, pled guilty to fraudulent use of a credit or debit device. Carr was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

Between December 27, 2014, and January 7, 2015, Carr used the credit card numbers off of her friend's husband's credit card to make purchases online and make payments on leased property. She also took statements and replacement cards from their mailbox so that they wouldn't find out about her making charges on their account.

Carr is to serve probation until October 19, 2019.

• Kevin Duane Collins, 38, of Brookline Station, pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree. Collins was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

In August 2013, the Missouri State Highway Patrol, acting undercover, contacted Collins about a Craigslist

posting about a car that he would sell with a VIN tag that he would "let go with the car." The officer purchased the car and the extra VIN tag,

Collins is to serve probation until October 19, 2018.

and Collins was arrested.

• James Robert Harper, 23, of Monett, made an Alford plea to property damage in the first degree in 2011 and was on probation. Harper's probation was revoked, and he is to serve 120 days of shock incarceration as part of a four year sentence.

On June 18, 2009, Harper spray painted "Wash Me" in blue on the driver's side of a vehicle in Monett.

• Steven Bradley Hunter, 28, of Cassville, pled guilty to multiple charges over the past seven years, serving probation for varying lengths of time. Hunter pled guilty to new charges, and his probation has since been revoked. Hunter is to serve five years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Hunter's first probation violation stemmed from a guilty plea to a charge from April 2008. Hunter was charged with burglary in the second degree, tampering with a motor vehicle and property damage motivated by discrimination in the second degree. Hunter broke into the Cassville Booster Club concession stand and stole candy and soda. He also spray painted on buildings and cars swastikas, "KKK" and a racial slur on a black man's vehicle. Hunter was sentenced to four years on those charges.

Then, in September 2008, Hunter pled guilty to tampering with a motor vehicle in the first degree and knowingly burning property. Hunter stole a 2002 Ford F-150 from 704 West Street in Cassville and then set it on fire on Farm Road 2212 about a half of a mile west of Highway 37

In July 2013, Hunter and two others beat and stomped a man unconscious at the Washburn Prairie Cemetery. He was charged with assault in the second degree for that incident. He was sentenced to three years incarceration.
