Cassville to begin airport taxi lane repaving project

After a vote during the Cassville City Council meeting on Monday, September 14, the city will be utilizing grant funding to begin a repaving project at the Cassville Municipal Airport.

The aldermen voted unanimously to accept grant funds through the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) from the Federal Aviation Association (FAA) as part of a 90-10 matching program to get the pavement on the taxi lanes connecting the hangars to the runway repaved. They also approved a contract with Lochner, a design firm out of Kansas City, to design the project.

The project is estimated to cost around \$281,970

in total, but with the grant funding, Cassville's airport fund will only have to pay for \$28,197 of that amount with the rest supplied by grants from the FAA. The design part of the project with Lochner will cost \$60,595, construction is estimated to run \$171,375, and the inspection is estimated at \$50,000.

As a small airport, the Cassville Municipal Airport is eligible for \$150,000 each year for projects as long as the funds are matched 90-10. Cassville can go back for up to four years for funds for the project, however, the airport must maintain a certain amount of air traffic to qualify. The airport qualified in 2012, but lacked the traffic for grant funds in 2013 and 2013. The city fully expects to

Helicopter, deputies search for burglary suspects

Both the Barry County Sheriff's Department and the Missouri State Highway Patrol were on a manhunt last night trying to find two suspects who stole a car from Eagle Rock. Multiple deputies and troopers searched for two suspects who fled on foot near the Highway 86, Highway F intersection north of Eagle Rock.

According to Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly, deputies and the Highway Patrol responded to a vehicle theft from Uncle Roy's on Highway 86 in Eagle Rock. He said, "They stole a vehicle that had the victim's purse in the back, and then we came across the vehicle that had run off the road." The two

suspects fled on foot.

The Highway Patrol had a helicopter circling while deputies and troopers searched on foot. According to Epperly, "They got down a big ravine, and we didn't catch them, but we will."

Epperly declined to release the names of the suspects involved, but he did say they found the car within 30 minutes of it being reported stolen. He said in the back of the car were TV's that they suspect had been stolen.

Epperly continued, "We think they've been involved in multiple burglaries around the area, and maybe Jug-n-Plug." Jug-n-Plug was burglarized in the early hours of Thursday, September 17.

Four charged with burglary, arson after stolen dog found

Four men have been charged with a burglary and arson from April after Barry County deputies located a dog stolen from the home. Two of the four men charged, Norman Baez, 25, of Monett, and Tyler Rubert, 18, of Crane, are currently being held in the Barry County Jail, and warrants have been issued for the other two, Theodore Peterson, 42, of Rocky Comfort, and Charles Peterson, 44, of Rocky Com-

According to the affida-

vit of probable cause, the four broke into a home on Farm Road 2170 in Purdy on April 6 with the intent to steal property to satisfy a perceived debt owed by the owner.

The four allegedly stole tool boxes, tools and tow ropes from the home.

Charles Peterson allegedly told the home's owner and another person that during the burglary, something had gone wrong, so they burned the house down to destroy any evidence left behind. Ac-

A Shell Knob man is in custody after allegedly hitting a sleeping man with a hammer last week. Joseph Samuel Bickel, 34, is charged with assault in the second degree, a class C

According to Deputy Scott Salkill's affidavit of probable cause, the assault took place on Thursday September 3, around 4 a.m. on Big Creek Road in Shell Knob. Bickel allegedly entered the victim's bedroom with a steel claw hammer while he was sleeping. He then struck the victim with the hammer at least twice on the head and multiple times on his arms and legs.

Bickel then allegedly began beating the victim's head against the floor.

Bickel is currently being held in the Barry County Jail in lieu of a \$10,000 cash-only bond.

cording to the statement, Charles lit the fire and Theodore kept the match as a souvenir.

At the time of the fire, two dogs were in the house. One dog was found dead after being trapped on the porch. The couple assumed the other dog was dead until they were told that the suspects had stolen it. When one of the victims went to Theodore Peterson's home on Urchin Road in Rocky Comfort, she saw the dog. Cindy Kay Jones always knew she had a special gift. Now that she has made her gift her profession, she is utilizing it to help a local family in need.

Jones is an animal communicator and intuitive medium who was born and raised in Exeter.

In the 1990's, Jones moved to Oklahoma where she currently owns and operates her own practice.

Jones' grandparents used to have a farm and ran an in-house hospice center inside their home in Exeter. That is where Jones said she first started to feel presences. Jones said she connected with the outside farm animals, as well as the spirits of the patients who had passed on that were staying in the hospice center.

"When I was about three is when I knew about my animal communication and medium abilities," said Iones.

Jones also added, "At first it was hard for me to believe; sometimes I wondered if I was making it up."

Jones said that the gift she had was very evident, but she was always ashamed and embarrassed of it. She knew that if people knew about her ability, she would have a hard time fitting in and being accepted by her peers.

When Jones got older, she finally sought advice and assessments from a woman by the name of Naomi B. McDonald, who is a wellknown and highly respected animal communicator.

McDonald explained to Jones that her ability was true and genuine, and after shadowing McDonald for a while, Jones started her own practice.

Jones works with people from all over as she can perform most of her services over e-mailing or the phone.

Through Jones' abilities, she can usually locate where a missing pet is. She also says she can transfer to the owner how the pet is feeling and explain to the owner if the pet is going through a hard transition.

Approximately three ago is when Jones made her special ability her

profession. In addition to her animal communication practice, Jones also teaches workshops to inform others of what she does.

"I receive a lot of validation through what I am doing when an owner will tell me, 'There is no way you could have known that," said





Murder mystery book released set in Cassville





Melton Scholarship turned over to Community Foundation

On Monday morning, former State Senator Emory Melton approved the transfer of the Melton Scholarship endowment funds from the Cassville Schools to the Cassville Community Foundation. The switch was made to increase the interest return on the funds and possibly allow more than one student to receive the scholarship each

The Melton Scholarship was created by Emory and Jean Melton as a memorial legacy scholarship for their late son, Russ Melton, who passed away in 2001. The scholarship amount varies each year based on how much interest is accrued annually. In the past, the scholarship has ranged anywhere from \$200 to \$1,200.

The move to transfer the funds to the Cassville Community Foundation will increase the interest return and allow bigger scholarships and possibly the expansion to allow two students each year rather than one. Superintendent Dr. Richard Asbill said, "They'll be able to manage it better than we could."

The school will put together a scholarship committee to give recommendations on recipients each year. So the school will still maintain control over which student locally is selected.

Monett retains Barry County Brawl trophy with 36-6 win Meshell wins three WKA

The Monett Cubs won a slugfest at Cassville on Friday night, beating the Wildcats 34-6 with a relentless ground game. Michael Branch, Monett's powerful junior running back, piled up 191 yards and a pair of touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead the Cubs to victory. Senior Cameron Witt added 88 yards rushing and two touchdowns on just five carries and also caught five passes for another 53 yards in Monett's balanced attack.

It was a busy night at Wildcat Stadium. Class reunions, introductions of MIghty Mites players, coaches, and cheerleaders, and the Duck Dynasty themed-Cassville student section had the stadium buzzing long before kickoff and all throughout halftime.

Even though Monett seemed to dominate the early action, the Wildcats trailed by only 14-0 at half, with the defense mounting another inspired effort. But the offense struggled to move the chains consistently, and the Cubs won the field position battle with timely first downs and a great night of punting by Witt. The average starting field position for the Wildcats was their own 23-yard line, with three of their nine possessions starting inside the 15-yard line.

Monett opened the scoring when Ian Meyer found Jonah Paszek with a quick slant from 6 yards out at the 4:15 mark of the first quarter. Caleb Hilton's PAT gave the Cubs a 7-0 lead.

Branch rumbled through the Cassville defense for a 28yard score midway through the second quarter as Monett opened a 14-0 advantage.

On the opening drive of the third quarter, the Cubs drove deep into Cassville ter-

ritory. But on 4th and 3 at the 13-yard line, Cole York knocked down a Meyer pass at the goal line and the Wildcats took over on downs.

After a first-down incompletion, Leigh Cox scrambled out of the pocket to avoid the blitz and crashed into a Monett defender as he reached the second level. Both players went down but Cox never touched the grass, rolling over the defensive player and regaining his feet. Cox burst down the Wildcat sideline, picking up a timely block from Allen Lambel, before cutting back inside the hashmark for a desperate sprint to the end zone with 6:14 showing on the thirdquarter clock.

The 87-yard scoring run ignited the crowd, and spawned memories of Ricky Nichols' dazzling run to paydirt against Branson in 2010. Cox's superlative effort deserves an ESPN "Top 10 Plays of the Week" nomination. Seriously.

Lance Parnell elected to go for two on the conversion to give his team the opportunity to take the lead with another touchdown and conventional PAT, but Cox's quick out was incomplete and Monett continued to lead, 14-6.

But after a short kickoff by Cox, Monett scored in just two plays. Witt burst off left tackle and beat the Cassville secondary to the end zone in a 45-yard footrace. Hilton's PAT pushed the lead to 21-6.

The Cubs would score twice in the final quarter. Witt popped through the line to score on a 19-yard run, and then Branch reeled off a 66-yard touchdown highlight as Monett posted the 34-6 final score.

By the end of the contest, the Cassville sideline resembled a M.A.S.H. unit, with the alarming number of injured players bearing witness to the ferocity of the contest. The Wildcats were in unknown territory, with players filling unfamiliar spots late in the game.

"Injuries are a part of the game, and we never use them as an excuse," said Cassville's Parnell. "It's always next man up.'

The Wildcats slipped to 2-3 overall after dropping consecutive conference games, while Monett improved to 4-1. The Cubs retained the Barry County Brawl trophy with the vic-

The three-game gauntlet against Lamar, Monett, and Carl Junction has been an uphill battle in recent years. The Wildcats defeated all three of those conference opponents in 2012, defeated Monett in 2013, and went 0-3 in 2014. Now in 2015, Cassville's hopes for a Big 8 title have been seriously damaged by the back-to-back losses to Lamar and Monett.

The Wildcats host the two-time defending conference champion Carl Junction Bulldogs for Homecoming on Friday night. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.
