Barry County brothers accused of arson captured

The two brothers who allegedly burglarized a house and then set it on fire were captured this week after a tip led officers to where they were hiding. Charles “Charlie” Peterson and Theodore “Teddy” Peterson are each being held in the Barry County Jail on charges of burglary in the second degree, theft/stealing and arson.

The Peterson brothers were connected with the burglary after the owner of the home that was burned down found her dog living with Charlie. When officers confirmed that it was the same dog, the Peterson brothers were charged, but fled before they could be

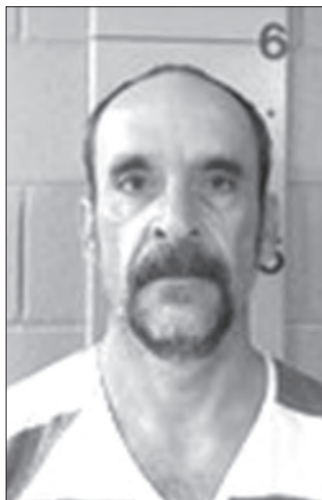
arrested. After a tip, Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly said they were found.

He stated, “They were found in McDonald County. We had a lead on it, and I called over there and sent them over there to look for them.”

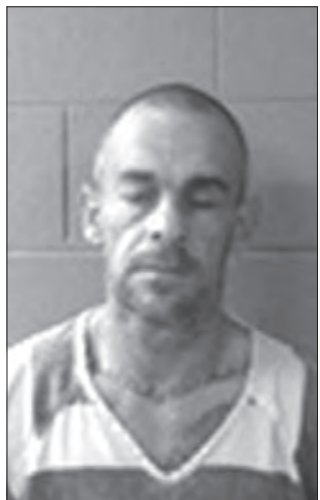
According to Epperly, when the officers arrived, Charlie was found sleeping on the couch in the home. Teddy was unable to be located at that time. When officers went back that evening, Teddy was found hiding in the attic.

Epperly said, “They were taken into custody without any problems.”

The Peterson brothers are each being held in the Barry County Jail on \$30,000 bonds.

15 year-old airlifted after Bus. 37 wreck

Two Cassville teenagers were seriously injured, with one being airlifted, in a wreck on Wednesday evening. According to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report, the driver and passenger were ejected from the vehicle when neither were wearing seat belts.

Around 8:45 p.m., Nathaniel A. Travis ran off Business 37 one mile north of

Cassville in a 2002 Chevrolet Monte Carlo and overturned. When the car flipped, both he and a 15 year-old passenger were ejected.

The 15 year-old was airlifted to Cox South Hospital in Springfield for serious injuries, and Travis was taken by ambulance to Cox South Hospital with serious injuries, as well.

The car was totalled and towed from the scene.

Spiritual Streams celebrates 35th anniversary

This year marks a special occasion for Spiritual Streams Fellowship church in Cassville. The small church is celebrating their 35th year and will mark the achievement with a special Sunday service and a dinner with the community invited.

Spiritual Streams is a Church of God of the Apostolic Faith church that was started by John and Edna Atchley 25 years ago. John passed away in 2003, preaching at the pulpit up until a week before his death, which shows his dedication to the church.

The Atchleys had worked planting a number of churches across Arkansas, Oklahoma, Kansas and Missouri before coming to Cassville.

After serving in the Evangelistic tour for two years, the Atchleys decided it was time to settle down. Around that time, they were approached by a couple of families who wanted to have that denomination church in Cassville.

Edna, who still attends Spiritual Streams, said, “We first started out with a tent meeting on the Legion grounds, and when there was interest in starting a church, we bought the property we have now.” John preached for a time in people's homes before they moved a double-wide mobile home out to the property where the church currently sits on Highway 112 toward Roaring River State Park.

In their fourth year, the congregation built the cur-

rent building with donations and a loan. The church back then had 15 members. Of all of the original members, Edna is the only one who remains, but she is still active in the church.

Over the years, their membership has fluctuated, getting up to over 100, and today remains steady at around 20, but the people in that number are what make the church great, according to the current pastor Johnna Curry.

Curry said, “We're very diverse. We just love people, and we have a very loving congregation.”

She continued, “We believe strongly in everyone being a part of the body and

The voice behind the call: Honoring emergency dispatchers

Emergencies can happen in the blink of an eye. Fires rage, cars crash and hearts stop. Every American learns from childhood what to do in these times of crisis: get to a safe place and dial 911. But few have stopped to realize that without the men and women working as dispatchers at 911 call centers, help would never come.

“We are the ‘first’ first responder,” stated Mike Phillips, executive director at the Barry County E9-1-1 Center. Most dispatchers will say that their job is like reading a book and never getting to finish it. “They sit behind the scenes and have a vision of what is happening in their heads, but after their job is done, that is it,” said Phillips. “We tell our new trainees that if

you're looking for all the glory, this isn't the place to work. You do this job because you want to, and you take pride in it.”

Operations Manager Eddie Laning said, “Our dispatchers deal with people's worst days, every day.” Rusty Dilbeck has been a dispatcher for four years and said he still learns new things daily. “You have to be constantly thinking what your next step is. I never realized all the aspects of being a dispatcher until I started working here; I gained a lot more respect for this profession.” Rusty went on to explain, “This is our job. People put a lot of trust in us. Sometimes it can be very challenging, but every call is of the same importance.”

Stuart Lombard has been an E9-1-1 dispatcher for five

years and stated, “You have to leave your personal emotions out of the calls. You have to be able to remain calm no matter what. Anything involving a child is always the hardest for me and everyone else working dispatch.” Lombard is also a police officer. He says he likes to partake in public safety.

Melissa Wilson, a new dispatcher, says it is the hardest job she has ever had, yet very rewarding. “It's kind of like you have to have three ears at one time, you have to pay a lot of attention and know how to multi-task,” said Wilson.

Dispatcher Tony Hinkle said, “There is no such thing as an average day here. Everything is always changing and no call is ever the same. Most people

Oklahoma woman life-flighted after wreck

An Oklahoma woman had to be life-lighted for her injuries after a single-vehicle wreck on Highway 39 on Monday evening.

Mary L. Lawless, 68, of Bartlesville, Okla., was driving a 2001 Dodge Intrepid southbound on Highway 39 when she wrecked, according to the Missouri State Highway Patrol crash report. Lawless failed to negotiate a curve and went off the right side of the roadway about seven miles south of Aurora around 5:15 p.m.

Lawless struck two chevron signs and her vehicle came to rest in the ditch. She was life-flighted from the scene and taken to Cox South Hospital in Springfield with moderate injuries. She was wearing a seat-belt at the time of the crash. The Intrepid received extensive damage in the crash.

Zachary Denton, Senior at Cassville High School (CHS), has been recognized as a Commended Student in the 2016 National Merit Scholarship Program.

Denton is being recognized for his exceptional academic performance on the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test he completed last October. Nationwide, 1.5 million students took the test and Denton scored in the top 5%.

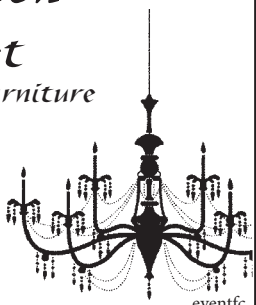

don't realize what our job entails. We handle everybody's problems. The public doesn't understand what we do every-day. This job has to be something you truly love to do."

For all the dispatchers, their job makes them feel like they are making a difference and being a good service for the community. Although this job can come a sense of helplessness as well. You can only do so much, and you have to realize that you cannot save everyone. All you can do is your job.

"You have to make sure work doesn't follow you home. Car rides after work are the best ways to decompress what happened that day," said Hinkle.

Since the dispatchers spend 12- hour shifts together in the same room, you can see that they have a family like relationship.

The goals of the E9-1-1 center is to be one of the top ten percent centers in the nation for their performance. They partake in training courses often to keep up on the latest technology.

Three people usually work at one time together, and those three people take the calls of the 38,000 people, the population of Barry County. Their job comes with an enormous amount of stress, but it is what they love and want to do.

There are thirteen dispatchers in Barry County and they include: Sharon Amos, Jacqueline Breazzeal, Kandra Connelly, Rusty Dilbeck, Alice Eutsler, Tony Hinkle, Carrie Jabben, Stuart Lombard, Chanda McCrary, Amber Schreiner, Melissa Scott, Jenall Watkins and Melissa Wilson.

"These guys are professionals and always try to reach the highest standards. The dispatchers make me proud on a weekly basis," said Phillips.

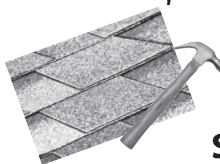

14 years and counting: Geraldine Fields, breast cancer survivor

January will mark a special occasion for lifelong Barry County resident Geraldine Fields: 15 years as a breast cancer survivor. To mark the milestone, Geraldine shared her story in conjunction with breast cancer awareness month.

In January 2001, Geraldine received heart-breaking news; she had a mammogram come back abnormal. "So they did another mammogram and another and then a needle biopsy before scheduling me for surgery," Geraldine discovered that she had stage 2 breast cancer and would need a mastectomy.

Geraldine had heavy family history of cancer which affected her father

and many of her 11 siblings. Still, the diagnosis was shocking in its own right. It's news that no one wants to get.

Her right breast was removed in February 2001, along with a few lymph nodes. Thankfully, her lymph nodes were tested and came back cancer-free. Ahead of her was four rounds of chemotherapy.

Geraldine said, "The chemo treatments had to be two or three weeks apart, and I was lucky. I only had to wait on my treatments once because of my blood count being too low. So I stayed on track."

After four rounds of chemo treatments, the cancer was behind her. While her story has a happy ending, the treatment was extremely hard on her. She said, "The chemo treatments made me really sick. You hear people say that they couldn't eat, and I didn't understand that until then. I would get a piece of toast, put it to my mouth and just couldn't eat it."

She attributes getting

through the entire ordeal to her support system. She stated, "I had really good family support: church family, friends, regular family and lots of prayers."

When asked what the hardest part of her experience was, aside from the treatment, Geraldine shared, "When the hair started coming out, that was the hardest part." As a show of solidarity, her son and grandson showed up to shave her head and shaved their's, too. She said, "It really helped to see them do that, too."

When asked what advice she would give to other people facing a breast cancer battle, she said, "Reach out to other people. They will help you get through it. And use lots of prayer. That's what you don't want to go through by yourself. That's what I did had that's what you need."

Geraldine has been married to her husband, Willie, for 53 years. Together they have two sons, Greg and Les, seven grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Ways to lower your breast cancer risk

Breast cancer is the second most common cancer among women, second only to lung cancer. One in eight women is expected to develop breast cancer in her lifetime, and a recent survey by the Society for Women's Health Research found that 22 percent of women named breast cancer as the disease they fear most. The specter of breast cancer makes it no surprise that women are eager to seek various ways to reduce their risks of developing this potentially deadly disease.

Though cancer treatments continue to evolve, there remains no cure for breast cancer or any other types of cancer. However, there are steps men and women can take to reduce their risks of developing breast cancer. In fact, the National Cancer Institute

says avoiding breast cancer risk factors is the best path to prevention.

- Avoid exposure to radiation. Repeated exposure to radiation therapy used to treat illnesses like Hodgkin's disease can increase a person's risk of breast cancer, particularly if treatments begin at an early age.

- Keep a healthy weight. Obesity increases the risk of breast cancer, particularly in postmenopausal women. Healthy eating and exercise can help women control their weight while reducing their risks of developing breast cancer and a number of other diseases. Scientists at The Mayo Clinic believe there is a link between estrogen production in fatty breast tissue and breast cancer.

- Get your exercise.



Regular exercise can help women lower their risk of developing breast cancer.

Many tests available to diagnose breast cancer

Self-examination is often the first step toward discovering the presence of breast cancer. The importance of self-examinations is immeasurable, and many women are taught from a very young age to conduct such inspections to protect themselves from breast cancer. Breast cancer that is detected early is very treatable, but the longer a person with breast cancer goes undiagnosed the less effective and the more difficult that treatment becomes. But even women who don't find anything during self-examinations may want to ask their physicians to conduct the following tests designed to find and diagnose breast cancer.

- Biopsy: A biopsy, which is the removal of cells or tissues so they can be viewed under a microscope by a pathologist to check for signs of cancer, may be conducted to determine if breast cancer is present. When a lump in the breast is found, doctors may remove a small piece of the lump to perform a biopsy. There are four types of biopsies. An excisional biopsy is the removal of an entire lump of tissue, while an incisional biopsy removes just part of a lump or a sample of tissue.

A core biopsy removes tissue using a wide needle, whereas a fine-needle aspiration, or FNA, biopsy uses a thin needle to remove the tissue.

- Blood chemistry studies: A blood chemistry study checks a blood sample to measure the amounts of certain substances released into the blood by organs and tissues in the body. An unusual amount of a substance, whether that amount is higher or lower than normal, may be indicative of disease in the organ or tissue that makes it.

- Clinical breast exam: A clinical breast exam, or CBE, is an examination of the breast that is conducted by a doctor or another health professional. The person conducting the examination will carefully feel the breasts and under the arms for lumps or anything else that seems unusual.

- Magnetic resonance imaging test: Commonly referred to as an MRI or a nuclear magnetic resonance imaging, or NMRI, this procedure employs a magnet, radio waves and a computer to produce a series of detailed pictures of areas inside the body.

- Mammogram: A mammogram is an x-ray of the

breast that can be used to check for breast cancer in women who have no signs or symptoms of the disease. Mammograms also may be used to check for breast cancer after a lump or other sign or symptom of the disease has been found. According to the National Cancer Institute, a mammogram performed on a pregnant woman may appear negative even if cancer is present. The NCI also notes that mammograms miss roughly 20 percent of breast cancers that are present at the time of screening.

- Physical exam: Women should get a routine physical examination of their bodies once a year. Physicians conducting such exams will check for general signs of health while also checking for signs of disease, including breast cancer. Breast cancer symptoms may include swelling and lumps on the breast or under the arms. During a routine physical, a doctor also will request the patient provide a history of her health habits and past illnesses, and women with a family history of breast cancer should make note of that history when discussing their own medical histories.

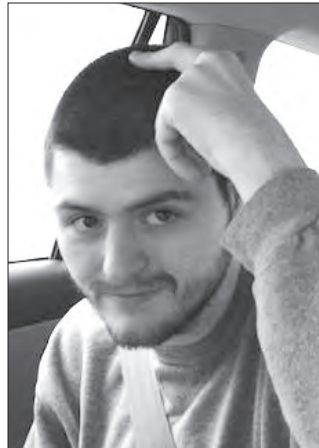

Mountaineers win heated battle with Wildcats

High school football saw its first cold temperatures of the season in southwest Missouri on Friday night. Despite the thermometer readings, things got hot in Mt. Vernon. Really hot.

The Mountaineers won a hard fought homecoming battle with Cassville, 23-16, despite being penalized over one hundred yards in the contest. Garrett Hadlock found Jarrett Massie in the deep right corner of the end zone with a 23-yard strike for the winning touchdown with just 1:39 left in the game.

That score capped off a wild second half that saw Mt. Vernon flagged four times for unsportsmanlike conduct and a personal foul.

The game started on a sour note when the officials misreported Mt. Vernon's response to winning the coin toss. The Mountaineers wanted to defer to the second half and defend the north end. The official signaled that the home team won the toss and would receive at the south end. Both teams sent their kicking teams onto the field, at opposite ends of where they belonged no less, and it took several minutes to sort out the confusion.

The surreal scenario brought back memories of infamous NFL referee Phil Luckett botching the coin toss for overtime of the Steelers and Lions Thanksgiving game in 1998.

After an ineffective opening series for both teams, things got rolling.

All week long, the internet chatter was about whether or not Cassville would start freshman Shannon Haney at quarterback. On Cassville's first series of downs, Leigh Cox answered that mystery, taking his normal spot behind center. But on the next Wildcat possession, Haney joined the fray at quarterback. The young signal caller went almost unnoticed on his first snap because Cox, now at running back, was still calling the plays in the huddle.

The Wildcats stormed down the field, covering the 60 yards in 9 plays, to take the early lead on a River Phelps 7-yard touchdown run. Phelps added the PAT for a 7-0 score with 4:32 on the first quarter clock.

Mt. Vernon answered immediately. Payton Oehlschlager bounced out-

side on an off-tackle veer and raced 66 yards for a touchdown less than a minute after the Phelps score. The Mountaineers went for two on the conversion following a Cassville penalty, but Oelschlager was stuffed at the line and the score remained 7-6 in favor of the Wildcats.

Cassville then mounted a long drive that carried into the second quarter. Starting from their own 15-yard line, the Wildcats gained a first-and-goal on the tenth play of the drive. But a mixup in the backfield led to a fumble that the Mountaineers recovered at their own 2-yard line. Even though Zane Everett trapped Clay Eldridge for a safety on third down, that turnover became one of the defining plays of the game.

With the safety, Cassville held a 9-6 lead with 10:01 left in the first half.

The Wildcats turned the ball over on downs following the free kick after the safety, and then Mt. Vernon tied the game when Jaden Buttram drilled a 32-yard field goal with 5:09 on the clock.

The Wildcats again surrendered the ball on downs, and Mt. Vernon came out throwing in the final two minutes of the half. Hadlock hit Massey for a 39-yard gain to the Cassville 22-yard line. Then on 3rd and 10, Hadlock and Massey combined again, this time for a 22-yard touchdown. Buttram's PAT gave the Mountaineers a 16-9 lead at halftime.

Mt. Vernon punted after one first down to start the third quarter, and then Cassville went to work. The Wildcats moved the chains twice, but Haney was stopped short on third down at the Cassville 46-yard line. Mt. Vernon was whistled for a personal foul at the end of the play, and then an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty compounded the mistake.

Instead of a punting situation on their side of the 50-yard line, the Wildcats owned a first down in the Mt.

Vernon red zone. Four plays later, River Phelps dove over the line for a one-yard touchdown. His PAT tied the game at 16-16 with 1:34 left in the third quarter.

The teams traded three-and-outs, and then Oehlschlager fumbled at the Cassville 16-yard line. The Wildcats were awarded the ball after the officials huddled, and the Mountaineers erupted in a self-destructive tantrum. The three consecutive unsportsmanlike conduct flags that followed sent the teams to the other end of the field, where Cassville had a first down at the Mt. Vernon 39-yard line.

Keep in mind this was a tie game at that point. But even if it was a 50-0 blowout, the degree of lack of composure was unacceptable. To his credit, Mt. Vernon's Tom Cox called time out and huddled with his players on the sideline for a little life lesson.

Their backs against the wall from the self-inflicted wounds, the Mountaineers made a defensive stand. The Wildcats reached the 17-yard line, but the drive stalled. Phelps attempted a 35-yard field goal, but his kick hit the right upright and deflected back onto the field. The score remained tied halfway through the fourth quarter.

The teams traded three-and-outs again, and with less than three minutes left in regulation, the Mountaineers put the game in Hadlock's hands. On first down, Hadlock bombed away into triple coverage and Massey made a clutch catch for a 40-yard gain to the Cassville 27-yard line. Three plays later, the Mountaineer duo teamed up again.

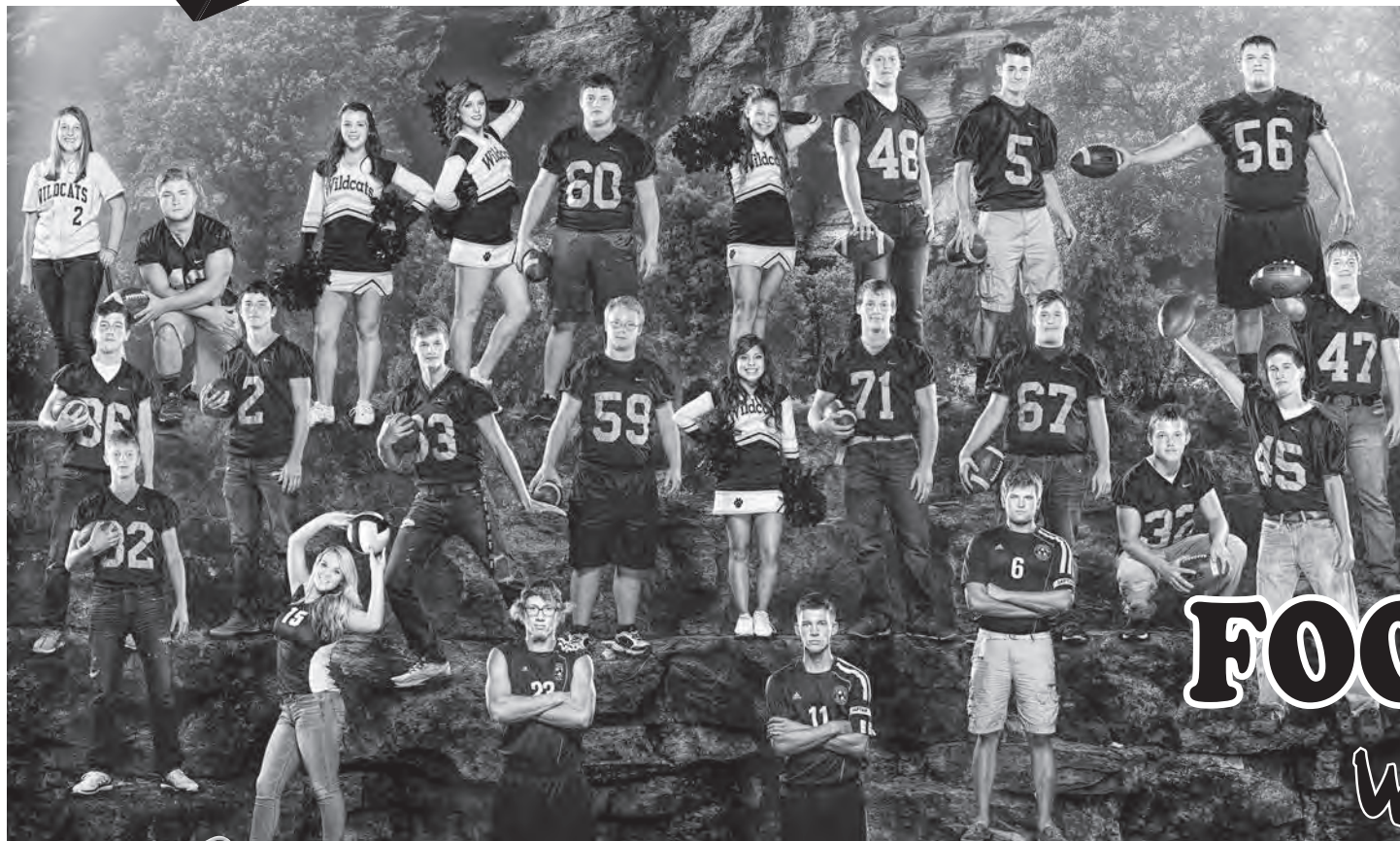

Barry County courts send 4 to prison in September

• **Christopher John Brezinsky**, 27, had his probation revoked after pleading guilty to burglary in the first degree and burglary in the second degree in 2010. Brezinsky was sentenced to six years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Brezinsky was originally charged when he broke into a window of a home on Elsie Corn Lane in Seligman in June 2009. A victim was in the home at the time and later identified Brezinsky in a photo lineup.

• **Michael Gene Bruxvoort**, Eagle Rock, had his probation revoked after pleading guilty to nonsupport in excess of \$5,000 in 2010. Bruxvoort was originally granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and has now been given a suspended execution of a four-year incarceration sentence and four years unsupervised probation.

Bruxvoort was originally charged in 2008 after failing to make child support payments. Bruxvoort was in arrears for \$28,052.43 as of July 8, 2009.

Bruxvoort is to serve probation until September 22, 2019.

• **Ronnie Lee Champion**, 50, Branson, pled guilty to property damage in the second degree. Champion was granted a suspended execution of a six-month incarceration sentence and two years

unsupervised probation.

Champion was originally charged after two storage units were broken into in Shell Knob in June 2014. Security footage showed the suspects' vehicle and two fingerprints were lifted from the scene. A Taney County detective identified the vehicle as belonging to Champion, and the fingerprints matched his.

Champion is to serve probation until September 22, 2017

• **Charlotte Mae Frazier**, 33, of Washburn, had her probation revoked on multiple charges that occurred over the last two years. Frazier pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and distribution of a controlled substance in December 2014 and burglary in the second degree, distribution of a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance in September 2015. She is to serve seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In August 2013, Frazier was arrested by the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force for having methamphetamine, paraphernalia and the supplies to manufacture in her home.

Then, in July 2014, she was arrested again when she was found to have a methamphetamine lab at a residence on Main Street in Seligman. In July 2015, Frazier and three other people broke into a home on Pineville Road in Washburn and were identified after the van they were driving got stuck in the mud. Later that month, she was also found to be manufacturing methamphetamine.

• **Johnathan William Gee**, Purdy, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree. Gee was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

Gee's charges originate from an incident on January 14, 2014. According to the probable cause, Gee held a lock blade knife to the victim's throat on school property. The victim had a cut on his hand from trying to defend himself.

Gee is to serve probation until September 22, 2019.

• **Jimmie F. Goodman, Jr.**, 51, of Aurora, pled guilty to driving while revoked.

Goodman received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Goodman's charges originated from an arrest in August 2014. He was pulled over by the Missouri State Highway Patrol for expired tags and was found to have a revoked license.

Goodman is to serve probation until September 22, 2018.

• **Gabriel Guerra**, 32, of Bentonville, Ark., pled guilty to fraudulently obtaining a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance. Guerra was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

In the months of May and June 2014, Guerra and his wife used a stolen pad to write fraudulent prescriptions for oxycodone. The prescriptions were given to both Whitley's Pharmacy and Sater Pharmacy in Cassville.

Guerra is to serve probation until September 22, 2019.

• **Keisha Dawn Jester**, 26, of Washburn, entered an Alford plea to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. Jester was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On January 14, 2013, Jester and another woman were arrested when the Barry County Sheriff's Department responded to a call on Pineville Road in Washburn regarding child welfare. Jester was unresponsive, as was another woman in the home. Two children, one being a six-month old baby, were unattended. Both women admitted to taking Xanax that day.

Jester is to serve probation until September 22, 2018.

• **Jessica Marie Koory**, 27, of Cassville pled guilty to two counts of possession of a

controlled substance. Koory was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In July 2014, Koory sold methamphetamine to an undercover officer with the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force twice.

Koory is to serve probation until September 21, 2020.

• **Derrek S. Laurens**, 27, of Coffeyville, Kan., pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Laurens was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years unsupervised probation.

In April 2014, Laurens was asked to move out of a rental property in Golden for not paying rent. When he left, he took \$1,321 worth of items, including a flatbed

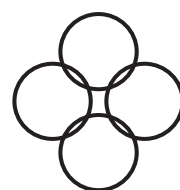



This quilt, made by Clara Cartwright was the judge's choice for Best of Show at the Discovery Quilters "Check Out Our Bloomers" quilt show. The quilt was made as a tribute to Clara's mother, who purchased the Boston Commons quilt pattern and fabric after being diagnosed with cancer in 2000. She presented the bag containing these items to Clara at the time of her first chemo treatment.

Clara did not quilt then, but her mother planned the project as something they could do together after her treatments. Clara's mother lost her battle six months later, and Clara decided that she would save the pattern and fabric until she had become accomplished enough that the finished quilt would be a fitting memorial for her mother.

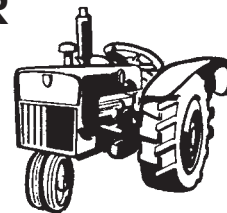

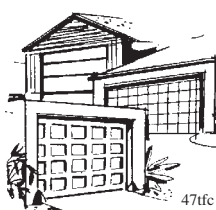
