
arrested. After a tip, Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly said they were found.

He stated, "They were found in McDonald County. We had a lead on it, and I called over there and sent them over there to look for them."

According to Epperly, when the officers arrived, Charlie was found sleeping on the couch in the home. Teddy was unable to be located at that time. When officers went back that evening, Teddy was found hiding in the attic.

Epperly said, "They were taken into custody without any problems."

The voice behind the call: Honoring emergency dispatchers

Emergencies can happen in the blink of an eye. Fires rage, cars crash and hearts stop. Every American learns from childhood what to do in these times of crisis: get to a safe place and dial 911. But few have stopped to realize that without the men and women working as dispatchers at 911 call centers, help would never come.

"We are the 'first' first responder," stated Mike Phillips, executive director at the Barry County E9-1-1 Center. Most dispatchers will say that their job is like reading a book and never getting to finish it. "They sit behind the scenes and have a vision of what is happening in their heads, but after their job is done, that is it," said Phillips. "We tell our new trainees that if

you're looking for all the glory, this isn't the place to work. You do this job because you want to, and you take pride in it."

Operations Manager Eddie Laning said, "Our dispatchers deal with people's worst days, every day." Rusty Dilbeck has been a dispatcher for four years and said he still learns new things daily. "You have to be constantly thinking what your next step is. I never realized all the aspects of being a dispatcher until I started working here; I gained a lot more respect for this profession." Rusty went on to explain, "This is our job. People put a lot of trust in us. Sometimes it can be very challenging, but every call is of the same importance."

Stuart Lombard has been an E9-1-1 dispatcher for five years and stated, "You have to leave your personal emotions out of the calls. You have to be able to remain calm no matter what. Anything involving a child is always the hardest for me and everyone else working dispatch." Lombard is also a police officer. He says he likes to partake in public safety.

Melissa Wilson, a new dispatcher, says it is the hardest job she has ever had, yet very rewarding. "It's kind of like you have to have three ears at one time, you have to pay a lot of attention and know how to multi-task," said Wilson.

Dispatcher Tony Hinkle said,"There is no such thing as an average day here. Everything is always changing and no call is ever the same. Most people

For all the dispatchers, their job makes them feel like they are making a difference and being a good service for the community. Although this job can come a sense of helplessness as well. You can only do so much, and you have to realize that you cannot save everyone. All you can do is your job.

"You have to make sure work doesn't follow you home. Car rides after work are the best ways to decompress what happened that day," said Hinkle.

Since the dispatchers spend 12- hour shifts together in the same room, you can see that they have a family like relationship.

The goals of the E9-1-1 center is to be one of the top ten percent centers in the nation for their performance. They partake in training courses often to keep up on the latest technology.

Three people usually work at one time together, and those three people take the calls of the 38,000 people, the population of Barry County. Their job comes with an enormous amount of stress, but it is what they love and want to do.

Mountaineers win heated battle with Wildcats

High school football saw its first cold temperatures of the season in southwest Missouri on Friday night. Despite the thermometer readings, things got hot in Mt. Vernon. Really hot.

The Mountaineers won a hard fought homecoming battle with Cassville, 23-16, despite being penalized over one hundred yards in the contest. Garrett Hadlock found Jarrett Massie in the deep right corner of the end zone with a 23-yard strike for the winning touchdown with just 1:39 left in the game.

That score capped off a wild second half that saw Mt. Vernon flagged four times for unsportsmanlike conduct and a personal foul.

The game started on a sour note when the officials misreported Mt. Vernon's response to winning the coin toss. The Mountaineers wanted to defer to the second half and defend the north end. The official signaled that the home team won the toss and would receive at the south end. Both teams sent their kicking teams onto the field, at opposite ends of where they belonged no less, and it took several minutes to sort out the confusion.

The surreal scenario brought back memories of infamous NFL referee Phil Luckett botching the coin toss for overtime of the Steelers and Lions Thanksgiving game in 1998.

After an ineffective opening series for both teams, things got rolling.

All week long, the internet chatter was about whether or not Cassville would start freshman Shannon Haney at quarterback. On Cassville's first series of downs, Leigh Cox answered that mystery, taking his normal spot behind center. But on the next Wildcat possession, Haney joined the fray at quarterback. The young signal caller went almost unnoticed on his first snap because Cox, now at running back, was still calling the plays in the huddle.

The Wildcats stormed down the field, covering the 60 yards in 9 plays, to take the early lead on a River Phelps 7-yard touchdown run. Phelps added the PAT for a 7-0 score with 4:32 on the first quarter clock.

Mt. Vernon answered i m m e d i a t e l y . P a y t o n Oehlschlager bounced outside on an off-tackle veer and raced 66 yards for a touch-down less than a minute after the Phelps score. The Mountaineers went for two on the conversion following a Cassville penalty, but Oelschlager was stuffed at the line and the score remained 7-6 in favor of the Wildcats.

Cassville then mounted a long drive that carried into the second quarter. Starting from their own 15-yard line, the Wildcats gained a first-and-goal on the tenth play of the drive. But a mixup in the backfield led to a fumble that the Mountaineers recovered at their own 2-yard line. Even though Zane Everett trapped Clay Eldridge for a safety on third down, that turnover became one of the defining plays of the game.

With the safety, Cassville held a 9-6 lead with 10:01 left in the first half.

The Wildcats turned the ball over on downs following the free kick after the safety, and then Mt. Vernon tied the game when Jaden Buttram drilled a 32-yard field goal with 5:09 on the clock.

The Wildcats again surrendered the ball on downs, and Mt. Vernon came out throwing in the final two minutes of the half. Hadlock hit Massey for a 39-yard gain to the Cassville 22-yard line. Then on 3rd and 10, Hadlock and Massey combined again, this time for a 22-yard touchdown. Buttram's PAT gave the Mountaineers a 16-9 lead at halftime.

Mt. Vernon punted after one first down to start the third quarter, and then Cassville went to work. The Wildcats moved the chains twice, but Haney was stopped short on third down at the Cassville 46-yard line. Mt. Vernon was whistled for a personal foul at the end of the play, and then an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty compounded the mistake.

Instead of a punting situation on their side of the 50-yard line, the Wildcats owned a first down in the Mt.

Vernon red zone. Four plays later, River Phelps dove over the line for a one-yard touchdown. His PAT tied the game at 16-16 with 1:34 left in the third quarter.

traded The teams three-and-outs, and then Oehlschlager fumbled at the Cassville 16-yard line. The Wildcats were awarded the ball after the officials huddled, and the Mountaineers erupted in a self-destructive tantrum. The three consecutive unsportsmanlike conduct flags that followed sent the teams to the other end of the field, where Cassville had a first down at the Mt. Vernon 39-yard line.

Keep in mind this was a tie game at that point. But even if it was a 50-0 blowout, the degree of lack of composure was unacceptable. To his credit, Mt. Vernon's Tom Cox called time out and huddled with his players on the sideline for a little life lesson.

Their backs against the wall from the self-inflicted wounds, the Mountaineers made a defensive stand. The Wildcats reached the 17-yard line, but the drive stalled. Phelps attempted a 35-yard field goal, but his kick hit the right upright and deflected back onto the field. The score remained tied halfway through the fourth quarter.

The teams traded threeand-outs again, and with less than three minutes left in regulation, the Mountaineers put the game in Hadlock's hands. On first down, Hadlock bombed away into triple coverage and Massey made a clutch catch for a 40-yard gain to the Cassville 27-yard line. Three plays later, the Mountaineer duo teamed up again.

Remember that 22-yard touchdown pass between Hadlock and Massey in the final 90 seconds of the first half? The Mountaineers ran the same play from one yard further out, and Massey laid out in the corner of the end zone for a 23-yard score to give his team the lead. But-

tram's PAT gave Mt. Vernon a 23-16 lead with just 1:39 to play.

The Wildcats could not answer with a frantic final possession, and the Mountaineers claimed the victory.

There were some good things that came out of this game for the Wildcats. The anticipated appearance of Haney at quarterback turned out to be a positive move, mostly because of the running yards that Cox accumulated from the halfback position.

But the passing game, both on offense and defense, led to Cassville's demise. The Wildcats could not cover Massey, giving up touchdowns to Mt. Vernon's star







Barry County courts send 4 to prison in September

• Christopher John Brezinsky, 27, had his probation revoked after pleading guilty to burglary in the first degree and burglary in the second degree in 2010. Brezinsky was sentenced to six years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

Brezinsky was originally charged when he broke into a window of a home on Elsie Corn Lane in Seligman in June 2009. A victim was in the home at the time and later identified Brezinksy in a photo lineup.

• Michael Gene Brux-voort, Eagle Rock, had his probation revoked after pleading guilty to nonsupport in excess of \$5,000 in 2010. Bruxvoort was originally granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and has now been given a suspended execution of a four-year incarceration sentence and four years unsupervised probation.

Bruxvoort was originally charged in 2008 after failing to make child support payments. Bruxvoort was in arrears for \$28,052.43 as of July 8, 2009.

Bruxvoort is to serve probation until September 22, 2019.

• Ronnie Lee Champion, 50, Branson, pled guilty to property damage in the second degree. Champion was granted a suspended execution of a six-month incarceration sentence and two years unsupervised probation.

Champion was originally charged after two storage units were broken into in Shell Knob in June 2014. Security footage showed the suspects' vehicle and two fingerprints were lifted from the scene. A Taney County detective identified the vehicle as belonging to Champion, and the fingerprints matched his.

Champion is to serve probation until September 22, 2017

• Charlotte Mae Frazier, 33, of Washburn, had her probation revoked on multiple charges that occurred over the last two years. Frazier pled guilty to possession of a controlled substance and distribution of a controlled substance in December 2014 and burglary in the second degree, distribution of a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance in September 2015. She is to serve seven years incarceration with the Department of Corrections.

In August 2013, Frazier was arrested by the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force for having methamphetamine, paraphernalia and the supplies to manufacture in her home.

Then, in July 2014, she was arrested again when she was found to have a methamphetamine lab at a residence on Main Street in Seligman. In July 2015, Frazier and three other people broke into a home on Pineville Road in Washburn and were identified after the van they were driving got stuck in the mud. Later that month, she was also found to be manufacturing methamphetamine.

• Johnathan William Gee, Purdy, made an Alford plea to assault in the second degree. Gee was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

Gee's charges originate from an incident on January 14, 2014. According to the probable cause, Gee held a lock blade knife to the victim's throat on school property. The victim had a cut on his hand from trying to defend himself.

Gee is to serve probation until September 22, 2019.

•Jimmie F. Goodman, Jr., 51, of Aurora, pled guilty to driving while revoked. Goodman received a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

Goodman's charges originated from an arrest in August 2014. He was pulled over by the Missouri State Highway Patrol for expired tags and was found to have a revoked license.

Goodman is to serve probation until September 22,

• Gabriel Guerra, 32, of Bentonville, Ark., pled guilty to fraudulently obtaining a controlled substance and possession of a controlled substance. Guerra was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years supervised probation.

In the months of May and June 2014, Guerra and his wife used a stolen pad to write fraudulent prescriptions for oxycodone. The prescriptions were give to both Whitley's Pharmacy and Sater Pharmacy in Cassville.

Guerra is to serve probation until September 22, 2019

• Keisha Dawn Jester, 26, of Washburn, entered an Alford plea to endangering the welfare of a child in the first degree. Jester was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and three years supervised probation.

On January 14, 2013, Jester and another woman were arrested when the Barry County Sheriff's Department responded to a call on Pineville Road in Washburn regarding child welfare. Jester was unresponsive, as was another woman in the home. Two children, one being a six-month old baby, were unattended. Both women admitted to taking Xanax that day.

Jester is to serve probation until September 22, 2018.

• Jessica Marie Koory, 27, of Cassville pled guilty to two counts of possession of a controlled substance. Koory was granted a suspended imposition of sentencing and five years supervised probation.

In July 2014, Koory sold methamphetamine to an undercover officer with the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force twice.

Koory is to serve probation until September 21,

• Derrek S. Laurens, 27, of Coffeyville, Kan., pled guilty to theft/stealing of \$500 to \$25,000 in value. Laurens was given a suspended imposition of sentencing and four years unsupervised probation.

In April 2014, Laurens was asked to move out of a rental property in Golden for not paying rent. When he left, he took \$1,321 worth of items, including a flatbed






Exeter Class of 1965 holds 50th reunion


