Cecil Clayton executed for killing Barry County Sheriff's Deputy

Cecil Clayton, the Barry County man convicted of killing Barry County Sheriff's Deputy Christopher Castetter in 1996, was executed by lethal injection last night at 9:13 p.m. at the Eastern Reception, Diagnostic and Correctional Center in Bonne Terre. His death was pronounced at 9:21 p.m.

Clayton, 74, was the state's oldest death row inmate, and his attorneys argued up to the last-minute through appeals that the dementia and brain damage he suffered from a saw mill accident made him mentally unfit to be put to death. The case has drawn national attention.

However, both the U.S. Supreme Court and Missouri Supreme Court denied his stay of execution. Missouri decided on Saturday with a 4-3 vote and the U.S. Supreme Court vote was 5-4 late Tuesday. In a statement released by the Department of Corrections, "Justice Ginsburg, Justice Breyer, Justice Sotomayor and Justice Kagan would grant the applica-

tion for stay of execution." On Tuesday, a representative for Governor Jay Nixon stated that Nixon had denied the request, as well.

Clayton was convicted of the crime in which he shot Deputy Castetter in the head before he could exit his patrol car while responding to a call of a violent argument that prompted Clayton to arrive at his former girlfriend's parents' house with a loaded gun. Castetter left behind a wife and three girls.

In a statement released by Governor Nixon's office on Tuesday, he said, "My office has completed its review of the petition for clemency from convicted murderer Cecil L. Clayton, and after due consideration of the petition and of

the facts in this case, I am denying his petition.

"In addition to considering the nature of the crime, I have given extensive consideration to Clayton's competency. Clayton was found competent to stand trial in 1997 for the murder of Deputy Castetter and again in 2006 to bring his federal habeas action. In 2014, at the request of the Director of the Department of Corrections, Clayton was comprehensively examined by a certified forensic examiner with the Department of Mental Health and determined to be competent to be executed. I accept that finding."

During the briefing for reporters, Castetter's brother, James Castetter, read the following statement:

"I wish I knew all the names and agencies to personally say "thank-you" and give my family's gratitude that is so well deserved for all the professional endless hours of work that was put into this case to convict Cecil Clayton for the senseless murder of our brother, Barry County Deputy Sheriff Christopher Lee Castetter. We know this execution isn't going to bring Chris back, but it destroys an evil person that would otherwise be walking this earth.

"There has been so much talk about the mental capacity of Cecil, but just him going to Martin Cole and wanting him to say he was with him all evening, telling Martin that he just

According to Cassville R-IV Superintendent Richard Asbill, the district is actively seeking Abramovitz's replacement. The new athletic director will be expected to start with the school district as early as July 1.

Cadillac crashes into Westco storefront

A car crashed into Cass-ville's Westco on Thursday morning after the accelerator supposedly got stuck, causing significant damage to the storefront and some of the furniture inside. The huge crash garnered a lot of attention from people who were around the Cassville square that morning, with many outside looking on shortly after the wreck.

The car, a 1985 Cadillac Fleetwood, driven by Wallace H. Adams, 89, of Cassville, was parking in front of Westco, according to Lt. Danny Boyd with the Cassville Police Department, when it accelerated and crashed through the front of the building around 9 a.m. Boyd said that no charges were filed in the incident, nor were there any reported injuries.

According to store manager Mark Whittemire, there were four people in the store at the time of the incident: himself, employee Sandy Baker

and delivery personnel Karl
Brant and Jason Rayburn.
Whittemire said, "It sounded like a bomb went off. It was very loud inside the building."
He also said that all of the employees were back at the desk, in the care

and delivery personnel Karl out of harm's way when the car don't know if it was stuck or if Brant and Jason Rayburn. crashed. he had his foot on it, thinking

Whittemire said that he and Brant were the first to reach the car once it stopped. He said, "The driver was still in the car and accelerating. I

don't know if it was stuck or if he had his foot on it, thinking it was the brake, but the back wheels were still spinning and it hit very fast.

Casas enters plea bargain for child pornography charges

Cassville man Matthew Paul Casas recently pled guilty in Federal Court, accepting a plea bargain on child pornography charges stemming from an April 1, 2014, indictment.

Casas, 26, of Cassville, was initially charged with three different counts related to child pornography and was formally indicted on July 22, 2014. Since then, Casas has changed his plea from not guilty to guilty in exchange for one of the charges related to sexual

exploitation of a minor being dropped. Casas signed a plea bargain on two of the counts of the superseding indictment on February 5 for distribution of child pornography and possession of child pornography.

For the distribution charge, Casas faces no less than five years imprisonment and up to 20 years imprisonment, a \$250,000 fine, no less than five years or lifetime supervised release, and a \$100 mandatory special assessment per felony count of conviction

that must be paid in full at the time of sentencing. For the possession charge, the Court may impose no more than 10 years imprisonment, a \$250,000 fine, no less than five years or lifetime supervised release, and a \$100 mandatory special assessment per felony count of conviction which must be paid in full at the time of sentencing.

According to the plea bargain, Casas pled guilty to the two charges in exchange for the government

Major sidewalk improvements slated for Cassville's Main Street

Main Street in Cassville will get a major improvement thanks to a project initiated by the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT). The sidewalks on Main Street from 5th Street to 17th Street will be improved to be Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant.

The project is tentatively slated to begin in April 2016, but according to Cassville Public Works Director Steve Walensky,

"That really is a guess, because they haven't finished the plans yet."

However, employees with MoDOT were out working on the project by pushing a wheelchair up and down the sidewalks and taking notes and measurements on Monday and Tuesday this week. By the end of the project, a multitude of guidelines will be met that will make the sidewalks safe and easily accessible for persons with disabilities. Everything from

the surface of the sidewalk to the curbs, ramps and drainage systems have to meet certain criteria.

Walensky said, "[Mo-DOT] said they have had this on the books for a long time with the Southwest District in Springfield." That district will be the ones completing the over-

The sidewalk improvements will not cost the city anything, but instead there was a maintenance agreement established for when the project is complete. Once the project is done, the City of Cassville will maintain the sidewalks as part of the established agreement with the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission. The City Council voted unanimously to accept the agreement at their regular meeting on Monday, March 9. Walensky said, "Maintenance costs are going to be minimal, if any, for a long time." One issue that could

have cropped up with the improvements were the sidewalks at the Cassville High School where graduated senior classes have their names stamped into the concrete. However, Walensky said, "I confirmed that the graduates names won't be disturbed. They've assured me of that."

Cassville man arrested for pulling a gun at Jump Stop

One man is in jail after allegedly pulling a gun on a couple at Jump Stop in Cassville. Jeffery Crumpler, 38, of Cassville, is currently being held in the Barry County Jail on a \$100,000 cash-only bond for class B felony assault in the first degree.

According to the affidavit of probable cause written by Sgt. Donald Privett with the Cassville Police Department, Officer Fohn had a report that a white male had pulled a gun on two people in the parking lot of Jump Stop on Main Street and threatened to shoot them on March 8 around 5:28

The male victim said that Crumpler waved the gun, which he believed to be a .45, around and threatened to shoot him unless he kept his mouth shut. The probable cause referenced that Crumpler believed that the male victim was talking badly about

one of his "people." Crumpler allegedly pointed the gun at the male and his girlfriend.

The two victims were interviewed the next day, and a warrant for Crumpler's arrest was issued on March 11. Officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department arrested Crumpler on March 15.







RRSP Ranger Jabben State Employee of the Month

After being named the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Employee of the Month for February, Roaring River State Park Ranger Steve Jabben was awarded the March Employee of the Month for the entire state.

Jabben's nomination stemmed from an incident on November 16, 2014, when a car crashed on Highway 112 south of the park. When he arrived, two men were trying to pull a man from the passenger side of a truck that was on fire. He heard what sounded like a rifle shot and was told that the truck contained ammunition.

According to the DNR Employee of the Month recognition, "Jabben, without regard for his own safety, grabbed the victim away from the burning truck to an apparent safe distance." He and a bystander moved him again when more ammunition began to detonate.

While Jabben tended to the man by covering him with a warm blanket and ensuring that he could breathe, he also instructed MoDOT and the Seligman Fire Department personnel to shut down the highway to prevent another accident on the blind curve where the truck had crashed.

When Jabben was nominated for the DNR award for February, Capt. David Snyder, the Region Captain, who joined Sgt. Dustin Young, Jabben's immediate supervisor, in the nomination said, "Ranger Jabben's leadership, courage and quick response during this stressful situation was outstanding."

"Ranger Jabben takes a great amount of pride and determination to always go above what is expected of him in his normal duties," said Young.

"He could very well have saved lives of not only the driver, but unsuspecting motorists who drove up on that blind curve after the wreck. Putting the victim's well-be-

ing before his own is a true testament to his commitment to the citizens he serves," said Snyder. "He brings that same work ethic to the park every day, looking to protect and serve."

Jabben's acts also garnered the attention of the Missouri Office of Administration who chooses a state-wide employee of the month from nominations from all 22 state departments. According to the office, "The purpose of the State Employee of the Month Program is to recognize individual contributions of a Missouri State employee who has provided outstanding service for the citizens of Missouri."

Jabben said, "I was very surprised when I found out I was nominated by my Captain David Snyder, for Department of Natural Resources Employee of the Month for February and got that. I was even more surprised I was nominated for State Employee of the Month by the Director of Natural Resources, Sara Parker Pauley."

When asked if he felt he went above and beyond the call of duty, Jabben replied, "No, I do not. Incidents like these are part of the job."

Jabben resides in rural Cassville with his wife, Carrie. He has lived in Barry County since 1999 and has worked in law enforcement since he graduated from the academy at Missouri Southern State University in 2001. He was hired as the Park Ranger on March 17, 2014, after serving as a Barry County Sheriff's Deputy

dismissing the first count of the superseding indictment and avoiding a trial because of the "impact a trial could have upon his family members." The plea bargain states that they agreed to not less than 15 years and not more than 25 years imprisonment for the guilty plea.

The plea bargain also states that the agreement of 15 to 25 years is advisory in nature, so it does not guarantee that those parameters will be met. The plea bargain was filed with District Judge M. Douglas Harpool, but the case was transferred to District Judge Stephen Bough for sentencing. A sentencing hearing date has yet to be set.

The case was prosecuted by the United States Attorney's Office for the Western District of Missouri by U.S. Attorney Tammy Dickinson and Assistant U.S. Attorney Abram McGull II. Casas was represented by Assistant Federal Public Defender Ann Koszuth.

Former Southwest Missouri Cyber Crime Task Force (SMCCTF) Special Agent Brian Martin originally investigated the case when he was contacted about a rented smart televi-

sion that contained stored images of child pornography. According to Martin's report, the television was rented by Casas from May 2, 2013, through May 20, 2013, from Aaron Rentals in Monett. The Monett Police Department then received a report from the rental establishment that the person who rented the tv after Casas had returned it because of the inappropriate images stored on the tv. The case was passed on to Martin on December 19, 2013.

During Martin's investigation, he found that the images had been created by a Kodak Easy Share camera and depicted an adult male performing sexual acts on a female child no more than 12- to 18-months old. It didn't appear that those images had been obtained from the internet, according to Martin.

Then, on February 14, 2014, Martin received a tip from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) that a person had created Facebook accounts and was posting child pornography. On February 21, 2014, the NCMEM submitted another Cybertip related to someone posting 130 images of

child pornography on a Flickr social media account that had been established on January 17, 2014. The IP address was a Mediacom account that assigned to Casas under the name Michael Crum at his residence on 11th Street in Cassville where he resided with his father, Henry Casas, a convicted sex offender.

A search warrant was issued on February 26, 2014, and the SMCCTF, the Barry County Sheriff's Office and the Cassville Police Department executed the warrant on February 28. During an interview, Casas admitted to posting images online from an SD card that he had

received from a co-worker at Justin Boot.

As part of that investigation, Casas' wife had stated that she left him partially due to the child pornography on his phone. According to her statement, he informed her that he was selling it. He had also been violent toward her in the past and had threatened to harm her and other family members. Casas' father had also confronted him regarding the pornography issue, encouraging him to get help.

Casas also had previous arrests for assault and endangering the welfare of a child



Four arrested in Washburn meth lab bust

Four were arrested last week during a methamphetamine lab bust in Washburn. Officers with the Barry County Sheriff's Department and the Southwest Missouri Drug Task Force investigated the crime on Old Wire Road in Washburn.

According to the affidavit of probably cause, on March 10, law enforcement went to the Washburn residence with a search warrant. Officers were outside the home for three hours while the suspects refused to come out. Five suspects were found at the residence and four were brought up on charges of manufacturing a controlled substance.

Bradley M. Hufford, Jr., 35, of Seligman; Jeremiah Brown, 31, of Bella Vista, Ark.; Samantha Chesner, 19, of Bentonville, Ark.; and Jessica M. George, 25, of Seligman; were each charged with manufacturing a controlled substance

and each were booked into the Barry County Jail on \$25,000 bonds.

At the scene, officers found multiple precursors to make methamphetamine, including pseudoephedrine, lithium batteries, lye, lighter fluid and more. There were also multiple lab components with granular substance and residue left on them. In a black Pontiac at the residence, officers found syringes with clear liquid in them.

During the investigation, another female suspect, Brandi Lakey, who has not been formally charged, became combative and attacked one of the detectives. On her person, officers found three meth pipes, a white pill and three syringes. The suspect showed signs of drug overdose and admitted to officers that she took everything she had, including morphine, so that she wouldn't be charged with

possession.

Lakey was taken to the Cassville hospital before being transferred to a Springfield hospital. Barry County Sheriff Mick Epperly confirmed that Lakey



should be facing charges, as well. He stated, "She wasn't fit for confinement, but we are working on a probable cause and will hopefully have a warrant soon."

Nixon concluded, "I ask that the people of Missouri remember Deputy Sheriff Christopher Castetter and keep his family in their thoughts and prayers."

Man caught for sexual misconduct warrant

A man wanted for alleged sexual misconduct in Barry County is behind bars this week. Harry Samuel Wilson, 31, of Rockaway Beach, was arrested after a warrant was issued for his arrest on December 31.

According to the affidavit of probable cause written by Officer Terry Meek with the Barry County Sheriff's Department, Wilson committed sexual misconduct with a child when he exposed himself to a 13-year-old girl in Cape Fair on the Barry County side in July 2014. Wilson allegedly went into the girl's room while he thought she was asleep and climbed into her bed to expose himself. Officers could not interview Wilson at the time because his whereabouts were unknown.





TIM'S TROUT TIPS



The water is still up a foot over normal with a good flow and is still a bit murky and will remain so for a few more days unless we get more rain. Fishing was pretty good this weekend. Bigger jigs, heavier flies, glo balls, and San Juan worms did very well. I fished with a #8 olive bead headed woolybugger and did very well and landed eight and caught three more on a white Mega Worm. I used a 5X fluorocarbon tippet and a 9 foot leader was my total length.

Several people were catching very well around me using roostertails. One guy was doing very well on a gold spoon. The upper end looks a bit better than the lower end, and the plastic worm fisherman were doing well and saw a lot of fish being caught on a yellow worm.

I saw a couple of guys in the upper hole up by the hatchery fishing small micro-type jigs. They were catching fish nearly every cast at least for the 15 minutes I watched them fish. Most people were using 1/32nd ounce and heavier jigs this weekend.

Orange power eggs, and yellow power eggs have been good all week, white is very good also, and some are still catching trout on the big gulp worms in brown.

With the water being murky, 4 or 3 pound line is fine. We will go back to mostly 2 pound line when the water clears. Good luck on the river this week.
