Barry County voterspass ambulance district tax

The voters of Barry County passed a new 1/2-cent sales tax to secure the future of the South Barry County Ambulance District (SBCAD). The property tax rollback passed with a a significant margin, according to the unofficial election results.

Of the 13 precincts voting on the SBCAD sales tax issue, 2,058 votes were cast and 65.79 percent voted in favor of the sales tax. The final tally was 1,354 votes in favor and 704 votes against. The new sales tax is expected to generate between \$560,00 and \$615,000 annually for the district, a significant jump from the approximate \$220,000 collected from the present property tax levy.

Ken Cieslinkski, chairman of the SBCAD Board. said, "We would like to thank the voters of South Barry County for their support and taking time to come out and vote on such an important issue. It is truly a blessing to live in such wonderful country that uses a great system for the voice of the people to be heard. They have spoken, and we, as a board for South Barry County Ambulance District, will continue to do our best to serve the people."

The SBCAD Board decided to ask for the tax when their budget struggled to keep up with the demands of

the community in the ambulance district. The SBCAD is responsible for the upkeep of the two ambulance facilities located in Cassville and Shell Knob, the ambulances and much of the equipment on the ambulances, like the cots and Cardiac Monitors.

CoxHealth EMS runs the ambulance service and provides all of the medical supplies on the ambulances, the fuel and maintenance on the vehicles, and the salaries and benefits of the 16 full-time EMTs and Paramedics, two PRN EMTs and one PRN Paramedic.

Now that the sales tax has passed, property owners in the SBCAD will see a rollback on their real and personal property taxes. The tax should begin being collected in October, but the District will continue to operate on property tax levy funds for 2015. According to State statute 321.554.2RSMo, both property and sales taxes must be collected until August 2016 when the property tax rollback will begin. In 2017, the district will then have a full 100 percent reduction in ambulance property taxes.

If the District feels that the revenue being generated by the tax is not necessary, the board can reduce the amount of the sales tax in coming years.

Challengers take Cassville Council seats, incumbents favored for school boards

Two contested races in the Cassville City election on April 7 went to challengers over incumbents this year. Ann Hennigan, the current north ward alderman, was beat by challenger Jon Horner, and south ward alderman Jan Anthony was unseated by Cindy Carr.

Horner had 166 votes to Hennigan's 96. Carr re-



ceived 125 votes to Anthony's 59. Cassville City voters had the second highest turnout at the polls in the Barry County precincts.

For the Cassville School Board, the race was much closer. Incumbents John Sullivan and Carolyn Bowen faced opponents Wade Hermansen and Dale Phelps.

Chamber to offer student leadership program

The Cassville Chamber of Commerce has created a new leadership program in which a select group of Cassville High School students will get the opportunity to learn more about the city and the importance of community involvement. The program, called Tomorrow's Leaders Today (TLT), begins during the 2015-16 school year and will bring the students together with community leaders and local business owners. In this program, which begins in the next school year, the students will participate in a day-long session each month, beginning in November 2015 and

going until March 2015. During each session, they will tour Cassville businesses and participate in workshops designed to educate them about leadership.

TLT is the brainchild of Mindi Artherton, director of the Chamber of Commerce. Artherton learned of a similar program in Joplin and decided it could be beneficial to students at Cassville High School. "I felt that it would be a good fit for Cassville," she said.

Artherton first brought her proposal to the Chamber Board. They approved of the idea and formed the TLT Steering Committee to develop the program. The members of the committee are Gary Whyte, Larry Eden, Chuck Pilant, Stacy Runnels, Angela Seymour and Dana Kammerlohr.

Artherton also spoke to Dr. Richard Asbill, superintendent of the Cassville R-4 School District, and Jeff Swadley, principal of Cassville High School, and got their approval for the students to participate in the program. The Steering Committee worked closely with high school counselors Jordi Miller and Michelle Johnson to determine the training sched-

Hermansen and Phelps both ran on platforms focusing on their status as parents of students in the district which drew a lot of local attention. Incumbents John Sullivan and Carolyn Bowen kept their seats, but by a narrow margin. Hermansen lost the seat by only eight votes to Bowen. The final tally was Sullivan with 688, Bowen with 647, Hermansen with 639 and Phelps with 374.

Incumbents were also the winners of the Purdy R-II School Board election with Ken Terry and Randy Rex Henderson maintaining their current seats. Challenger Carla Schad ended up with 24.47 percent of the final vote with 92 ballots cast her way. Terry's final was 148 and Henderson's was 133.

ule and application process. They were also instrumental in planning an assembly with the current junior class to announce the program.

TLT was introduced to the junior class at Cassville High School in early March. Students who wanted to participate were urged to apply before the deadline on March

According to Artherton, the exact number of students who will be allowed to participate has not yet been chosen. "We know it will be less than 20, but we haven't determined the exact number," she said.

Participation in the program requires an adherence to high standards. Students who are chosen to take part in TLT are expected to attend each session, dress appropriately and actively participate in the program. Students may miss one session if they notify Artherton in advance, but

those who miss two sessions for any reason will be dropped from the program.

LEADERSHIP from FRONT

Each session will cover a different topic. The topics that will be covered are: Government and Law; Industry; Leadership Development, Community Service and Small Business; Healthcare and Natural Resources. At the end of the program, there will be a graduation celebration and participants will be eligible for one of two \$500 scholarships.

Artherton said the Chamber is still looking for Cassville businesses willing to sponsor TLT. Sponsorships cost \$200, and the money will be used to provide lunch to the students, ensure funds are available for the two scholarships, cover the costs of any materials that might be needed and to offset expenses for the program's opening lunch and the graduation celebration. Businesses

that sponsor the program get first opportunity to speak during lunches, first opportunity to be involved in tours, recognition during the opening day luncheon and the graduation celebration, and their logos will be on the graduation cel-

ebration program.

So far, seven Cassville businesses are sponsoring the program: Freedom Bank, All-Points Recycling, Runnels Chiropractic, Commerce Bank, MariCorp, Barry Electric and Regal. Hutchens Construction has provided polo shirts for all of the participants to wear during the program sessions.





If you want to make some extra money by selling furniture or appliances you no longer use, but don't have time have a yard sale, you might want to give Bill Larecy a call. Larecy, who has owned and operated Bill's Appliances in Cassville for over 16 years, opened a consignment shop in his store.

Larecy said he had been thinking about opening the consignment store for awhile but decided to open the store in March when a slowdown in his appliance sales gave him time to focus on taking his business in a new direction.

In terms of merchandise, Larecy is very open on what he will take for consignment. "I will accept appliances, furniture, tools, lawn mowers, weed eaters, chainsaws, fishing tackle and anything else of value," he said.

Larecy is also very flexible about how much he charges. While most consignment stores take 50 percent of whatever they sell, Larecy said he will use







City of Seligman helps with education fees

The difference between having a high school diploma versus trying to make it without one could be over \$10,000 in yearly earnings. College Board, an organization that studies the link between education and income, says high school graduates earn, on average, \$35,400 a year while those without a high school diploma earn only \$25,100.

In Seligman, residents who never graduated from high school and wish to earn their High School Equivalency Diploma (HSE) may be eligible for some assistance from the city. The Seligman City Council has budgeted \$520 to cover the testing fees for those who cannot afford the cost.

The benefits of getting an HSE can be very lucrative for those who never graduated from high school, according to Janet Dart Ballard, the Crowder Adult Education Literacy (AEL) instructor in Seligman. "I've had people get a \$2 or \$3 per hour raise when they pass their high school equivalency exam," Ballard said.

Earning an HSE can also provide a leg up in seeking higher education. According to Ballard, anyone making at least a passing score on the HSE exam has the chance to take a class at Crowder for free. "When they pass the high school equivalency test through us, they're offered a class at Crowder, tuition paid. That saves them \$300," she said.

Crowder also has a scholarship available for those who pass the exam with a score of 75 or higher. Ballard said the scholarship pays \$600 per semester for four semesters. Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA each semester to keep the scholarship.

While the city wants as many people to earn HSEs as possible, it is not going to pay the testing fees for just anybody. Ballard said Seligman residents who wish to take will only pay for those she has approved to take the test, and she doesn't approve anyone until they've taken classes and demonstrated they can pass the exam. Students must also show they have a financial need. Based on her recommendation, the city may pay from half to all of a student's \$95 testing fee.

"Before the students can take the test at the city's expense, I make sure that they are not able to pay for it themselves. I also make sure that they are first ready and that they have met their class obligations," Ballard said.

Ballard prefers for students to come to class at least two hours a day, two days a week. Her classroom, which is located in the Seligman Community Center, is open Mondays and Wednesdays from 2:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m., and students can come and go as they need during these times.

While the testing fee is a barrier to some who want to take the exam, Ballard said another challenge is the distance to a testing center. In the past, when the students could still earn the General Education Diploma (GED), the exam required was paper-based and could be taken at the Crowder-Cassville campus. However, in January 2014, the GED became the HSE, the exam went from being paperbased to computer-based, and the Cassville campus ceased to be an approved testing site.

As a result, Seligman

the exam must travel to the Crowder campus in Neosho, Ozark Technical Community College in Springfield or Missouri Southern State University in Joplin. The distance to a testing center, Ballard said, can be prohibitive to many test takers.

Angela Seymour, the campus director of Crowder-Cassville, said the campus is very close to regaining approval to be a testing site. She said the school's IT department had set up a room that meets all of the requirements set by Hi-SET, the organization which handles the tests like the HSE exam. Seymour also said that photos of the room have been submitted to HiSET, and she is currently waiting on their response. "We're just waiting to hear back from HiSet, and once we have their approval, we're good to go," she said.

Ballard said she would like to see more people come take advantage of the AEL classes in Seligman, even if they do not need or want to get an HSE. She said many come to take the classes, which are free, to brush up on skills they need for work or to be able to help their kids with their home-

"We're not just about passing the high school equivalency exam," Ballard said. "We help people with work skills also.



Eggleston Trade and Pawn Shop in Seligman is undergoing big changes and expanding services for the people of southwest Missouri. By opening up new storage units and offering U-Haul rentals, the choices are more than just the standard pawn shop.

Burgess said, "Once these fill up, we'll build more and offer different sizes. At that point, there will be 24-hour keyed entry, as well."

If you need a U-Haul to move into or out of your storage unit, that's available, too. At any given time, Eggleston rents out three to seven trucks and trailers a week. Reservations can be made by calling the shop or going online to Uhaul.com and requesting a

truck there.

Customers can also purchase moving boxes and supplies for their move. Some speciality boxes, such as for flat screen tvs, are also available.

On the pawn side of the business, a new pawn program is also drawing attention. Burgess said, "We've got a new program where we're offering seven-day free loans on pawns up to \$500." So, based on the value of an item, people can get up to \$500 and, if the item

is picked up within seven days, no interest is charged. The offer is only available for new customers.

Inside the shop, everything from guns, tools, ammo, televisions and video games are offered. There is a little bit of everything, offering a wide array to suit people's needs.

While you're at the shop, don't forget to bring your propane tank for a fill up for grilling season. Burgess said, "People don't realize when they trade in their tanks, they're usually paying 25 percent more for 25 percent less propane." Typically, when a 20-pound tank is traded in for a full one, it is only filled with 15 pounds of propane. However, when a tank is refilled, Eggleston fills it with a full 20 pounds.

Table Rock Lake Plan comment deadline April 17

The United States Army Corps of Engineers is in the process of drafting a new Shoreline Management Plan for Table Rock Lake. According to information released by the Corps of Engineers, the current Shoreline Management Plan was adopted in 1982, and was last updated in 1996. The new Shoreline Management Plan will govern the utilization of the shoreline and set limitations and requirements for boat docks. Adoption of the new shoreline plan is the culmination of the process tat began with the creation of a new Master Plan for Table Rock, which was adopted by the Corps of Engineers in 2014.

Though no Shoreline Management Plan proposals have provided to the public, the Corps of Engineers is requiring the public to make any comments concerning it prior to April 17, 2015.

Last year significant changes were made in the Master Plan with the designation of approximately two-thirds of the Table Rock shoreline as "Environmentally Sensitive". The Master Plan does not define how the "Environmentally Sensitive" areas will be administered, but it appears the Corps does not intend to allow vegetation removal or mowing permits in these areas. What uses will be allowed in the areas designated "Environmentally Sensitive" will enunciated in the new Shoreline Management Plan.



Prior to the moratorium now in place the Corps of Engineers granted Vegetation Permits which allow property owners to cut small trees and shrubs and to mow and maintain the government property adjacent to their homes. Part of the historical basis for allowing homeowners to mow and remove vegetation was to reduce the risk of fire. In addition under the existing Shoreline Management Plan homeowners, with a permit were allowed to remove dad trees that endangered their homes, build" meandering pathways" out of natural materials across the government property to access the lake and do erosion control.

How existing Vegetation Permits will be treated under the new Shoreline Management Plan appears to be up in the air. According to the documents distributed by the Corps there are a number of ideas being considered that could make major changes in what would be allowed.

Currently in areas that the Corps of Engineers has granted Vegetation Permits,

to remove underbrush and trees which are less than 2 inches in diameter at a point on the tree four feet off the ground. The Vegetation permits generally allows the homeowner to remove vegetation within 200 feet of a habitable structure. It appears that one of the issues the Corps of Engineers will consider is whether 200 feet is the proper distance to allow vegetative removal? From documents the Corps has provided it appears there may be proposals to reduce the distance from homes that vegetation management would be allowed. The Corps has not said whether homeowners with existing vegetation permits would be grandfathered allowing them to continue to manage vegetation up to 200 feet from their homes or if the existing permits would be reduced when and if they are renewed.

homeowners are allowed

The "Major Items For Consideration" distributed

by the Corps, included a list of ideas including whether a property owner should be required to obtain a survev of his property prior to obtaining a Vegetation Permit? Since a typical survey can cost between \$1500 and \$2000 the question becomes will homeowners be required to get the survey prior to their vegetative permit being renewed or is this proposal only for new vegetative permits.

Another idea included in the "Major Items For Consideration" is whether the new Shoreline Management Plan will require homeowners to have a vegetation management plan as condition for a permit. The Corps has offered no suggestion of what a vegetation management plan would consist of, but sources have reported that proposals have been floated to require a professional botanist or arborist prepare a vegetation management plan as a condition of granting a


permit or possibly even the renewal of a permit.

Other ideas raised in the "Major Items For Consideration" include: Whether the diameter of trees that are allowed to be removed under the existing Vegetative Permits will be changed from the existing 2-inch diameter at 4-feet off the ground standard? Whether homeowners may remove invasive species? Whether the footpaths are allowed and whether homeowners would be allowed to remove dead trees? A complete copy of the "Major Items For Consideration is at the

end of the article. The Major Items For Consideration also raises questions concerning what boat docks will be allowed on the lake, the location and makeup of the docks, including removal of the restriction of the minimum number of slips, changing the parking requirements and restricting the new dock permits/slips to adjacent landowners.


The Corps in its Major Items For Consideration has also raised proposals concerning Shoreline Zoning. The first proposal is to "Eliminate Table Rock specific shoreline allocation, roll these into the 4 nationwide required shoreline allocation, The Corps has given no information of what that statement means or how it would affect Table Rock. This could be in reference to the unique characteristics of Table Rock Lake which has significant private ownership of boat dock slips rather than the requirement that all slips be controlled by the zoning.




