Cassville's Public Park Getting Improvements

Cassville's city park will soon be refurbished, according to Public Works Director David Brock.

"We'd been working on two projects," Brock states, with one being the playground at the downtown park, and now the restrooms next to it. "We were given

George has an equipped team to help her serve the community's needs.

Trojans dominate relays at Class 2 district track

Every Missouri track and field fan knows that conference is about bragging rights, but district paves the road to state. On Saturday at Sarcoxie, the Southwest Trojans dominated three of the four relay events, and qualified runners and jumpers in six individual events to take that important first step towards the Class 2 state track meet.

Southwest has never had an All State relay team. This could be the year.

The Trojans started the running events with a bang, eclipsing a long-standing school record in the 4x800 meter relay. The Fab Four - Matteo Lumetta, Robert Humphries, Caden Uthe, and Christian Long - won by the length of a straightaway, posting a time of 8:26.44. That time is the second fastest Class 2 time recorded this

The Southwest foursome of Otis Rainer, Ezra Sprowes, Uthe, and Lumetta won the 4x200 meter relay in 1:35.65. Then the team of Otis Rainer, Lumetta, Uthe, and Long edged Stockton to win the 4x400 meter relay, 3:35.36 to 3:36.13.

Southwest qualified in the 4x100 meter relay, but just barely. Braydan Eggleston joined, Sprowes, Rainer, and Lumetta to nab fourth place in 47.43.

Long took second in the 1600 (4:48.56) and 3rd in the 800 (2:08.32) to lead Southwest's individual qualifiers.

Uthe placed second in the 400 meter dash. His 51.99 boosted him into the second spot on the All Time Trojan list, trailing only the 50.83 that Danny Ickes turned way back in 1989.

Humphries also qualified

She placed third in the long jump (4.58 meters) and fourth in the triple jump (9.18 meters). Cally Bowyer squeezed out a fourth place

We are serving 30 to 40% more food insecure persons now in 2022 than we were helping during the heightened volume peak of the pandemic last year. Inflation has taken a large slice out of the household budgets of low and fixed income families in the community.

As the prices of groceries become increasingly more expensive, low income residents are feeling the pinch. They are forced to cut back on what they buy, purchasing less food and opting out of more expensive menu items. Meat is a highly desirable component to every meal. Meat and protein sources are the items which cost the most for the consumer to purchase.

The deer meat harvested by area sportsmen and donated through Share the Harvest came just at the perfect time because inventory at the Pantry has been very challenged to keep up with the demand.







to reduce the stigma surrounding mental health, help improve access to care, educate communities on signs and symptoms, and highlight mental health progress globally.

There are multiple things that you can do to be involved during Mental Health Awareness Month. -Mood swings.

-Inability to perform daily tasks, such as basic hygiene, missing appointments, or not cleaning up after themselves.

-Unexplained aches and

Some actions people can do to help a family member or friend that is struggling with mental health are:

-Express your concern and willingness to listen, reassure them that you care about them.

-Use "I" statements. For example, use "I am worried about you," or "I would like you to consider talking with a counselor," rather than "You are," or "You should."

-Try to show patience and caring and not be judgmental of their thoughts and actions.

- Listen; don't disregard or challenge the person's feelings.

-Encourage them to talk to a mental health professional or their primary care provider.

-For some people, it may be helpful to compare the situation to a physical health concern and how they would respond. For example, if there was a concern about diabetes or high blood pressure, would they be likely to seek medical care?

-Remind them that seeking help is a sign of strength.

-Work your strengths. Do something you're good at to build self-confidence, then tackle a tougher task.

-Send a thank you note to show your appreciation for

"Often, depression and

anxiety come about by a significant life change. Feelings of sadness, guilt, hopelessness, or worthlessness occur due to some of these common older adult life transi-

"Retirement, kids growing older with their own families, your physical abilities are different than they used to be, potential new home environment, losing loved ones, feeling more dependent on others for care. As we grow older, we experience more of these life transitions, and often they can be painful and more complex."

To George, as we compare older adulthood to the previous chapters in our lives, many changes that had occurred are things we initi-

As we get into later adulthood, it is much more likely that some of the things we experience are because of involuntary circumstances. "Change is hard even it we initiate those changes ourselves," George says.

"It is significantly different from having change forced upon us and all of the other experiences we did not anticipate.

"Discussing issues you notice as you age is so important, especially if this is something an individual has experienced over a long period of time," George states. "If sadness is all you have ever experienced, then how would you know you needed help?

In fact, according to a recent study done by MHA, about 58% of people aged 65 and older believe it is "normal" for people to get depressed as they grow older. are very prolific, so you only need one or two of this varietv. Loosen the soil and dig a deep hole four to six inches wide to plant. Then add some water to the hole to encourage the roots to reach deep. I put some dried, pulverized eggshells in the bottom for calcium.

Calcium adds to cell growth, making the stalks sturdy and increasing the plant's ability to transport water throughout the plant. It also helps prevent blossom rot, which is the blackness that can grow on the bottom of the tomato fruit. You can buy the calcium soil amendment in the garden center if you prefer. After you have added water and calcium to the hole, take the plant from the container by pinching the bottom of the container

and tipping it to its side. The plant should slide out. Before I have watered the seedlings for the day, I do this, and the soil will all slide out. Then pinch off the bottom leaves of the tomato plant to plant two-thirds of the tomato plant underground.

Work the dirt attached to the roots (which was in the container) a bit to loosen those roots up. Set the plant deep into the hole, leaving one-third of the plant above the ground, and add more water. Not much, just enough to cover the roots. Fill the hole up around the plant. Roots will grow off the stem underground, making for a more vigorous plant. Place a tomato cage or stake for support at this time and mulch with straw. By mid-summer, you should be enjoying freshly grown tomatoes.


