Third Fugitive Caught

The last of the three escaped inmates, Lance Stephens, has been taken into custody.

“Stephans was caught in San Antonio, Texas, last night around 8 p.m.,” Barry County Sheriff Boyd has confirmed. Lance Stephens, of Washburn; Matthew Crawford, of Springfield; and Christopher Blevins, of Golden, all escaped from the Barry County jail in the late overnight hours of June 2-3

though all three have now been taken into custody.

According to online records, Stephens had been arrested on drug-related charges, Crawford for theft, and Blevins for driving with a revoked license, among other charges.

On Wednesday, June 8, the Wyoming Highway Patrol conducted a traffic stop on a flat bed Dodge, in Mills, Wyo., just outside of Casper, in which the officers found Blevins alongside a woman

he was traveling with. Authorities arrested Blevins and released the female.

Matthew Crawford was taken into custody in Springfield on Monday, June 13, by U.S. Marshalls, Greene County deputies, and Springfield Police. According to Sheriff Boyd, Crawford was reportedly located in an abandoned building within Springfield city limits. Crawford is currently being held in Greene County.

Three Crashes Across Barry County

On Tuesday afternoon, a Rogers woman was seriously injured in a crash at the junction of MO-90 at MO-37 in Washburn at 12:50 p.m. According to a crash report by the Missouri Highway Patrol, Ellen Wilson, 61,

of Seligman, was eastbound on state Route 90 and Missouri State Route 37 in Washburn in a 2001 Ford Explorer when she hit Paula Grider, 63, of Rogers in a 2015 Toyota Rav4. Martha Ballard, 69, of Rogers, was an occupant of Grider's vehicle. Wilson

failed to yield after stopping and pulled into the path of Grider and Ballard, causing Wilson to be struck and the vehicle to overturn. Ballard suffered serious injuries and was transported by ambulance to Mercy Hospital in Rogers. All persons involved

June 11, Michael Hands, 66, of Ness City, Kan., was southbound on a 2008 Kawasaki motorcycle when he traveled off the edge of Highway 39, and overturned four miles north of Shell Knob. Hands suffered moderate injuries, and was transported to Mercy Hospital in Springfield by EMS. Hands was wearing a safety device at the time of the accident. The vehicle sustained moderate damage and was toed by Wilson's Towing. According to another

Missouri State Highway Patrol report, at 3:20 p.m. on June 12, Zachary Newman, 27, of Aurora, was eastbound on a 2007 Victory motorcycle when the motorcycle began skidding, causing Newman to overturn. Newman suffered moderate injuries, and was transported to Cox South Hospital in Springfield. The motorcycle sustained extensive damage and was towed by Jim Carr's Towing of Aurora. Newman was wearing a safety device at the time of the accident.



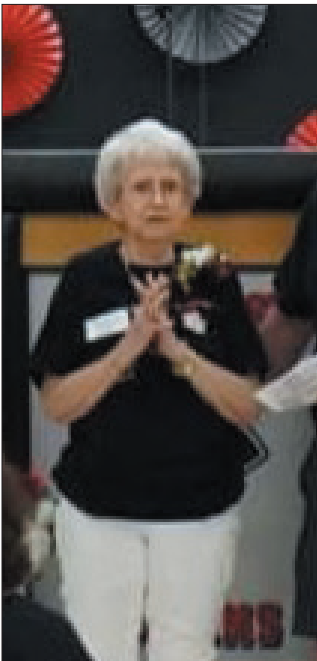

MU Extension urges farmers to sign up for the USDA Census of Agriculture

University of Missouri Extension economists urge farmers to sign up for the USDA's 2022 Census of Agriculture. The deadline to sign up to receive a census form is June 30. Sign up at nass.usda.gov/AgCensus. MU Extension economist Ryan Milhollin says federal, state and local governments as well as agribusinesses, researchers, trade associations and others use the data to serve farmers and rural communities.

It's not necessary to sign up if you already receive surveys from the USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service.

USDA conducts the survey every five years. It is the only source of uniform, comprehensive and impartial data on agriculture for every county in the U.S., Milhollin says. USDA will release the information in 2024. Information from the census helps shape agricultural policy and farm programs, including MU Extension programs, he says. It gives a picture of agriculture's economic impact in the U.S.

The Census of Agriculture counts U.S. farms and ranches and the people who operate them. Even small plots of land, rural or urban, that are growing fruit, vegetables or food animals count if the owner raised and sold – or normally would have sold – \$1,000 or more of such products during the census year.

Milhollin says the data helps policymakers see emerging trends such as land uses, renewable energy, food marketing practices, young

and beginning farmers and ranchers; women, veteran and minority farmers and ranchers; specialty crops; and organic production. This

helps legislators make decisions that protect the future of agriculture, he says.

USDA does not publish any data that discloses in-

formation about individual farms. However, USDA does publish counts by ZIP code.

The fishing at Roaring River is better right now than it has been in several months. The water conditions at the moment are normal and clear with a CFS of 105, and the dry fly fishing has been fantastic. Beetles, ants, grasshoppers, blue wing olives, elk hair Caddis, crackle backs, and small sulfurs are all working pretty well through-

out the day. Nymphs that are working right now would be pheasant tails, gold ribbed hair ears, sow bugs, and zebra midges in dark colors. Right now is also a good time to do soft hackles, and other small wet flies work well when the water drops to this level. Small egg patterns work really well and are easy to see when the water gets

lower. We are also doing very well on chamois worms, and on pink, cheese yellow, and orange San Juan worms. I will mainly use a 9 foot 6 X leader right now, if I am only fishing dries and the fish are acting a little spooky, I will put on a 9 to 12 foot tapered leader that tapers to 7 X. Right now is a great time for Sight fishing. There will be lots and lots of trout caught in this manner as long as the water is clear. Micro jigs, marabou jigs, Roaring River specials, and other small Leadhead jigs will work really well in clear water. First thing in the morning, a rooster tail will still be a good bet. They work pretty good for about 30 or 40 minutes, and then it's time to start looking at plastic

worms, salmon eggs or other plastics, and it is also time to start learning how to fish a marabou jig. Good jig colors right now are, white, black/ yellow, olive, and olive /orange together have been pretty good. With the water getting clear, it is time to put away the 4 pound line and fill your reels with 2 pound clear or a green tinted monofilament. There are some fluorocarbon lines that are very nice but check the diameter on them they're not all the same. The 1 inch yellow, and the Brown power bait gulp crawlers are working very well, we are also doing very well on white eggs, orange eggs, and we are catching a few fish on the Hatchery Brown eggs. Have fun this week.

Is Skin Cancer Hereditary?

Dear Savvy Senior,

Is skin cancer hereditary?

My 63-year-old brother died of melanoma last year, and I'm wondering if I'm at higher risk.

Younger Sister

Dear Younger,

While long-term sun exposure and sunburns are the biggest risk factors for melanoma – the deadliest form of skin cancer – having a sibling

or parent with melanoma does indeed increase your risk, according to the Skin Cancer Foundation.

Each year, around 100,000 Americans are diagnosed with melanoma, and about 7,500 people will die from it. While anyone can get it, those most often diagnosed are Caucasians, age 50 and older. And those with the highest risk are people with red or blond hair, blue or green eyes, fair skin, freckles, moles, a family history of skin cancer and those who had blistering sunburns in their youth.

Skin Exams

The best way you can guard against melanoma and other skin cancers (basal and squamous cell carcinomas) is to protect yourself from the sun, and if you're over age 50, get a full-body skin exam done by a dermatologist every year, especially if you're high risk.

Self-examinations done every month or so is also a smart way to detect early problems. Using mirrors,

check the front and backside of your entire body, including the tops and undersides of your arms and hands, between your toes and the soles of your feet, your neck, scalp and buttocks.

Be on the lookout for new growths, moles that have changed, or sores that don't heal, and follow the ABCDE rule when examining suspicious moles.

Asymmetry: One half of a mole doesn't match the other.

Border: The border is blurred or ragged.

Color: The mole has uneven colors, often shades of brown, tan or black, with patches of pink, red, white or blue.

Diameter: The lesion is new or at least a quarter inch in diameter.

Evolving: The mole is changing in size, shape or color.

For more self-examination tips and actual pictures of what to look for, see SpotSkinCancer.org or use a skin cancer detection app like Miiskin.com, MoleMap-

per.org or SkinVision.com.

In the spring and summer, there are also a variety of places that offer free skin cancer screenings, like the American Academy of Dermatology (spotskincancer.org) and the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery (asds.net/skincancer-screening.aspx), which offer screenings done by volunteer dermatologists across the U.S.

Sun Protection

Even though you can't change your skin or family history, there are some proven strategies that can help you protect yourself.

For starters, when you go outside put-on broad-spectrum SPF 30, water-resistant sunscreen on both sunny and cloudy days. If you don't like the rub-on lotions, try the continuous spray-on sunscreens which are easier to apply and re-apply and less messy. Also, seek the shade when rays are most intense – between 10 a.m. and 2 p.m.

You can also protect your skin by wearing a

wide-brimmed hat, and long sleeves and pants when possible. The best clothing options are tightly woven fabrics that help prevent the sun's rays from reaching your skin, or you can wash in an invisible shield sun protection into your clothes with SunGuard laundry additive (see sunguarduv.com). You can even buy a variety of lightweight clothing and hats that offer maximum UV protection in their fabric. Coolibar.com and SunPrecautions.com are two good sites that offer these products.

Treatments

If caught early, melanoma is nearly 100 percent curable. But if it's not, the cancer can advance and spread to other parts of the body where it becomes hard to treat and can be fatal. Standard early treatment for melanoma is surgical removal.

In advanced cases, however, immunotherapies and targeted therapies have shown positive results, or chemotherapy and radiation may be used.

Highly toxic poison hemlock in full bloom

It is as if a florist decorated Missouri roadsides, hill-sides and pastures with white spring flowers. But those flowers are poison hemlock, a weed that is highly toxic to humans and animals, says University of Missouri Extension weed scientist Kevin Bradley.

Poison hemlock is one of the first weeds to green up in

spring and grows up 6 feet high. Once found primarily in pastures and fence rows and along roadsides, it now appears as a weed in no-till cropping systems. It is a biennial, taking two years to grow and germinate seeds. Poison hemlock produces up to 38,000 seeds per plant.

In its first year, poison hemlock develops as a basal rosette, Bradley says. By the second year, it grows erect vegetative stems. Umbel flowers are 7-15 inches across. All parts of the plant are poisonous.

Nonchemical control options include weeding, mowing and tillage, Bradley says. In crops, growth regulator herbicides and products that contain 2,4-D, dicamba or 2,4-D plus triclopyr are options.

Bradley says research at Purdue University showed that dicamba plus glyphosate may offer more consistency and control than applications of glyphosate and 2,4-D.

The key to control is applying the herbicide when plants are young and still in

the rosette stage, he says. Mature plants do not respond to chemical control measures.

The alkaloids in poison hemlock are particularly toxic to cattle and horses, even in small amounts, says Tim Evans, toxicology section head at MU's Veterinary Medical Diagnostic Laboratory.

In relatively small doses, the alkaloids can affect the nervous system like nicotine, with clinical signs including dilation of the pupils, increased or reduced heart rate, coma, trembling, nervousness and respiratory paralysis, suffocation and death.

Remove animals from infected pastures and contact a veterinarian immediately if animals show signs of poisoning, Evans says. Death can occur quickly.

Cattle, sheep, goats and pigs that eat this plant during the first trimester of pregnancy may give birth to offspring with limb deformities, a condition known as crooked calf syndrome in cattle and more generally as multiple congen-



ital contractures.

Immature poison hemlock leaves seem to be most palatable to unsuspecting livestock. Animals usually avoid mature plants, especially when offered other palatable feedstuffs. However, poison hemlock can be part of a hay mixture, Evans says.

When dealing with poison hemlock, wear protective gear including gloves, long sleeves, pants and eye

protection. Sap from poison hemlock touching the skin can cause blisters and welts, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. There is no known treatment.

Poison hemlock looks like Queen Anne's lace, another weed that bears white, lacy flowers and fern-like leaves. Both have hollow stems, but poison hemlock's stem is hairless with purple blotches. Queen Anne's Lace, or wild

carrot, rarely grows more than 2 feet and poses no danger to humans or livestock.

Free Stress Management Training Program for First Responders

The Missouri Department of Public Safety has launched a free Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) training program open to any first responder – law enforcement, fire service, EMS and dispatch personnel – in the state. The free training is being offered regionally and is designed to assist individuals experiencing stress or trauma related to their first responder duties, help agencies build critical incident support teams, and strengthen supportive environments within responder agencies.

In 2021, Governor Mike Parson signed into law Senate Bill 57 and House Bill 8, which directed DPS to es-

tablish a Critical Incident Stress Management Program and provide services to first responders to assist in coping with stress and potential psychological trauma resulting from responses to critical incidents or emotionally difficult events.

“Missouri’s first responders make tremendous sacrifices as they work tirelessly to respond to emergencies, protect us and save lives,” Governor Parson said. “The dangers they face, violence they confront and tragedies they experience can be a very heavy burden. That’s why it’s so important that we support the brave public servants and their families and make this

type of training available.”

“This new Critical Incident Stress Management training is available at no cost to any first responder – law enforcement, fire, EMS, dispatch – to help deal with traumatic events they might face on the job and to assist in building peer-support teams across the state,” Department of Public Safety Director Sandy Karsten said. “My 36 years in public safety have made it clear that the experiences first responders face on the job can take a toll.

Proactively addressing this and building up support resources across Missouri makes for healthier responders and agencies that are pre-

pared when critical incidents occur.” National studies have shown that first responders are subject to elevated levels of stress related to both specific critical or traumatic events and the accumulation of day-to-day occupational stress associated with incident responses, challenging work schedules and extreme family-work demands. Studies have shown that law enforcement officers and firefighters are more likely to die by suicide than in the line of duty.

Two Course Offerings

The training is being offered in two courses:

Three-day Critical Incident Stress Management

(CISM) class that combines assisting individuals in crisis and group crisis intervention training. This training is eligible for 27 hours of Missouri Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Continuing Law Enforcement Education credit. Two-day Peer-Support Sustainment Training focused on creating and maintaining proactive peer-support teams within agencies or regions. (CISM course completion required to register.) Registration Is Open For Training Scheduled Across Missouri. The video highlighting the new Missouri CISM training course and objectives also includes how to register for upcoming

ing class sessions in Kansas City (June 6-8), Springfield (June 13-15, Nov. 14-16, Dec. 5-7), St. Charles (July 11-13), St. Louis County (Aug. 1-3), Cape Girardeau Aug. 22-24), Macon (Sept. 12-15), St. Joseph (Sept. 27-29) and Joplin (Oct. 25-27). The video is available here. Additional training sessions are being scheduled.

DPS has teamed with the Warrior’s Rest Foundation to provide the training to first responders at no cost. The Warrior’s Rest Foundation has years of experience providing mental health counseling, crisis intervention, and CISM and peer support training across the nation.

Property Rights Protections in Missouri Bill Passed

During the Missouri Cattlemen’s Association’s annual Steak Fry Dinner, Governor Mike Parson signed House Bill (HB) 2005 into law. HB 2005 expands protections under the law for Missouri’s farm and ranch families in certain eminent domain proceedings.

“We are happy to join the Missouri Cattlemen’s Association, farmers, and ranchers from across the state to sign this long-awaited legislation into law,” Governor Parson said. “As a farmer myself, I understand the importance of strong property rights and that no farmer wants to be forced from the family farm by the government or anyone else. That’s why we are signing HB 2005. This legislation provides fair protections for our farm families, tightens

the use of eminent domain, and ensures the interests of Missouri farmers are always considered and balanced with the public good.”

HB 2005 contains several provisions that modify state statute as it relates to the use of eminent domain by certain electrical utilities:

Electrical corporations must have a substation or converter station in Missouri that provides an amount of energy proportional to the length of their transmission line within the state; Electrical corporations must secure necessary financial commitments within seven years of when an involuntary easement is obtained or the easement must be returned to the original title holder without repayment to the utility;

The compensation rate

for agricultural or horticultural land is increased to 150 percent of the fair market value, which is determined by the court; and

In condemnation proceedings where disinterested commissioners are appointed, at least one member must be a local farmer who has operated in the county for at least 10 years.

“This bill is about the farmers and ranchers from across our great state that travel to Jefferson City and beat the halls of the Capitol weekly,” said State Senator Jason Bean. “These farm families have made their case for years and with the expected approval of more electric transmission projects, the time for property rights reform was absolutely now.


“We appreciate the lead-

ership of Missouri’s Ag groups who helped pursue a fair negotiating position. Missourians shouldn’t have to spend their hard earned money on legal fees trying to get a fair price for their land; their livelihood, which simply isn’t for sale.”

“We embrace economic development, especially when it comes to improving our electrical grid,” said State Representative Mike Haffner, “But we will not do it on the backs of Missouri farmers, ranchers, and the Missouri agricultural industry.”

“Keeping the farm in the family is important to me, Governor Parson, and the entire agriculture community,” said Missouri Director of Agriculture Chris Chinn. “It is important to protect all opportunities for the next generation to return to farms and ranches across Missouri.”
