Barry County Co-op Sends Delegates to Nation's Capitol



Ninety-three high school students participated in Missouri's 59th annual Missouri Electric Youth Tour to Washington, D.C., June 13-19. Local delegates were Sharayah Seymour and Elizabeth Ray of Cassville. They were sponsored by Barry Electric Cooperative.

After two years of virtual tours, the Youth Tour headed back to Washington this year.

The seven-day tour provides an action-filled week for high school students, offering them opportunities to learn firsthand what it is like to be involved in politics, leadership positions, community service and today's pressing issues.

"The Youth Tour is the highlight of the summer for many students and we're proud to send our best and brightest to our nation's capital to participate," said Chris Massman, vice president of Member Services for the Association of Missouri Electric Cooperatives.

Highlights of the trip include the young people visiting with representatives from their congressional districts, touring monuments, the Smithsonian Institution's museums, Arlington Na-

tional Cemetery and for the first time, touring the International Spy Museum.

The group also took a sightseeing and dance cruise on the Potomac River one evening.

Other events of the week included participation in the Electric Youth Day, during which a special program coordinated by the National Rural Electric Cooperative

Association brought together over 1,000 Youth Tour delegates from across the United States. The delegates enjoyed featured speeches by government leaders and motivational speakers, such as Mike Schlappi, an inspiring fourtime Paralympic medalist and two-time world wheelchair basketball champion.

Since 1964, the nation's cooperative electric utilities

have sponsored more than 55,000 high school juniors and seniors for visits to their U.S. congressional delegations, energy and grassroots government education sessions and sightseeing in Washington. Cassville to Annex Land for New Jail

The Cassville City Council has unanimously voted to annex the 25 acre property behind Baywash Carwash.

Officials say this annexation is being performed as an effort to extend water and sewer services to the future jail, health department buildings, and the residential areas that are presently beyond city limits, and therefore, not provided with city water services.

"I totally understand the concerns of the residents there," says Jon Horner, Cassville City Council alderman. "The county has made the decision, so the county was going to build regardless of what decision we made. From the standpoint of the city, our objective is to expand water and sewer services to that area. This gives us the opportunity to do so for new roads, and new expansion."

Due to the properties of residents being incorporated into city water and sewer systems, Horner states that the annexation may cause property values of nearby homeowners to rise. The increased proximity to the city itself, as well as the renovated infrastructure, could additionally increase marketability, says Horner.

Horner also says that "by bringing this into the city, it does give you a layer of governance and protection for residents," because then, he says, the builders have to abide by city guidelines of construction.

In the city council meeting that this issue was presented and discussed, local citizens mentioned that they felt Cassville faced a hous-

ing crisis, and that annexing residential property for city construction could be a mis-direction of city resources. Horner addressed these concerns: "The next phase of the Cassville Heights is in the process of being constructed, which is great. A lot more housing would be available."

Steve Walensky, City Administrator for Cassville, has stated that this construction project will add 32 new apartments to the city.

Correction:

In last week's issue of The Barry County Advertiser, a description of the Presiding Commissioner's role in local government was given. It has since been brought to the attention of the staff that the phrasing of said description could be misleading. It is vital to note, the Presiding Commissioner has no more authority than the Northern and Southern commission-

The commission must act as a team and vote as equal parts of a collective to arrive at a final decision on county finances. Spotlighting the gravity of the role of Presiding Commissioner in local politics was the intent, and was in no way an assertion that the Presiding Commissioner has the singular vote.

It is true that the Presid-Commissioner must sign many documents and payments, though in their absence, either of the other commissioners may sign in their stead. The phrasing in the original article was intended to show the weight of the signature once the vote has been made, not that the Presiding Commissioner has the only vote. Each of the three commissioners must agree on a county budget, with the constraints of checks and balances implemented in local governance. Additionally, the County Treasurer and County Clerk must also sign off on the budget.

Exeter Woman Life Flighted to Springfield

An Exeter woman was seriously injured in a crash on Highway 76 on Saturday at 3:45 a.m.

According to a crash report from the Missouri Highway Patrol, Mariah Sweaney, 26, of Exeter, was northbound on Highway 76 west of Farm Road 2192 in a 2003 Toyota 4 Runner. Sweaney failed to navigate a left turn and traveled off the right side of the roadway.

Sweaney returned to the roadway, then overturned causing her to suffer serious injuries. Sweaney was life flighted to Mercy Hospital in Springfield, and was not wearing a safety device at the time of the incident.

Shell Knob Man

A Shell Knob man was seriously injured in a crash west of Shell Knob last Wednesday at 7:25 p.m. According to a crash report from the Missouri Highway Patrol, Garrett Brixey, 29, of Shell Knob was westbound on Farm Road 1230 one mile west of Shell Knob in a 2007 Yamaha V-Star 650. According to the police report, Brixey failed to navigate a curve and traveled off the left side of the roadway and overturned. Brixey suffered serious injuries and was taken to the Mercy Hospital in Springfield by ambulance. Brixey was not wearing a safety device at the time or

disappearance that could indicate her location.

That morning, at approximately 8 a.m., her husband Linn woke up, made his breakfast, and left for work at the Paul Calico dairy farm, leaving Christine and their two year old son, David, asleep in the home.

Reportedly, after some time, David awoke and ate a small amount of toast, but after soon discovering his mother was gone, the child became frightened and began to cry.

At approximately 9:25 a.m., "a mailman saw the boy standing in the door, crying," says Bruce Nickle, Christine's brother, "but assumed the child had gotten in trouble or something, he didn't think anything of it."

Reportedly, about five minutes later, the husband returned home, and found their son crying for his mother. Linn checked throughout their mobile home for Christine, locating her purse on the table, and determining that all that was missing was the nightwear she had been wearing, and a light house

Linn could not locate his wife, and called the Lawrence County Sheriff's Office at approximately 11 a.m.

Trudy Nickle, Christine's mother, says that "by the time we got there, there were so many people there looking for her." A horde of officers, volunteers, and neighbors searched the grounds and surrounding woodlands that night. Volunteers in cars, on foot, in planes, and on horseback searched for her the entire afternoon and night. Even bloodhounds were reportedly sent to find a trail, but it allegedly led only to the driveway.

"The day she disappeared," Bruce begins, "they estimated that 200 people had gone through her house. A lot of very good people searched that area, 500 people volunteered."

According to Trudy, nothing was found to indicate where the missing 22-yearold beautician had gone.

"Nobody from the time he headed to work had any sight of her," says Bruce. "The sheriff blew it off as 'she ran off, but Christine and her husband had been at my apartment the night before, they'd been at the lake with mom and dad, and had dinner with them.

"They stopped to visit me for a little bit before going home, and Christine said they were thinking of having another child. The car was there, her purse was there, it's highly unlikely she ran off. Everything was normal until that Monday.

"The odd part is that there was nothing out of place there was no sign of any altercation, just the house as

In the five decades since Christine's disappearance, investigations have continued with infrequent severity, though Trudy says that over

the 50 years, there were no leads that led to anything at

"What we thought may have been something turned out to be nothing. It's a sad story," Trudy says. "Somebody's bound to know something, somebody knows. But, on the other hand, now, after 50 years, people have died. It's a never-ending search, never-ending thoughts of 'Have we missed anything?' You can't think of anything else. The whole thing was just hopeless."

Trudy explains that for years after the disappearance of her daughter, her eyes would search everywhere she went, scouring the faces in public for Christine.

"I try to keep my mind off it as much as I can, but it's always there. I try to keep busy, I still work at the hospital, and I'm 94 years old. After 50 years, you kind of get used to the way things are, and you learn that you aren't going to find out what happened, I don't think."



Letter #1

Thank you Anonymous for your letter to the editor regarding the conditions around Cassville. We seem to have lost all pride and respect for our personal property and the city as a whole.

On Main Street, two blocks from the Square, for the past two weeks there has been a large amount of dog waste. Grass and weeds grow in the sidewalks along Main Street. In the past, a business would not open their doors until the sidewalk had been swept. One business has a coffee lid that has been there over a week. Where's your pride?

We have six marked pedestrian crossings from the Kit Kat Avenue and to the Chamber of Commerce building. A pedestrian is risking their lives at these crossings. Too many are distracted with their cell phones to worry about pedestrians.

Our roads are in poor to deplorable condition. If we have another eight inch rain, half of 11th Street will float away. It already looks like a jigsaw puzzle. Fifth Street between Main Street and West Street has eight patches. To find an un-patched street in Cassville is rare. In the summer of 2021, one of the few roads that received work was in Wildwood Estates in front of two city council member's houses.

A shout out to Fohn Funeral Home and the courthouse on the square for the way property is maintained. Also to Kelly Wade for sweeping the sidewalk

in front of the Clell Wade Coaches Directory. We have a few in Cassville who think it is their right to remove anything from private property if it is not chained up or nailed down. Example: Smithson Property, whose air conditioner was stripped of copper tubing, while the house was also broken into. Also, copper was taken from the tops of the shoe factory buildings. They will go into yards late at night or early morning to pick up things that have been scouted out during the day.

MoDot put in nice sidewalks from Main Street to the library on both sides of the street. The city signed a contract to maintain them. Some residents and businesses seem to think the sidewalk is a place to collect grass clippings. No one seems to know what a weed eater does.

If the property along Main Street gets cut, they can't see beyond the curb to the weeds. Many places in Cassville look like a jungle. There are vacant lots with weeds over six feet tall. The land owners know their property needs to be maintained. By the time they are cited, notification is made, then wait on a court date, summer is half of the way over.

Drainage ditches are overgrown with weeds and saplings. After last week's paper came out, someone pulled the weeds on the west side of the old Westco Building. Great. No, they left piles of weeds.

Our roads are not acceptable for your trash. Here is an example of items found along the road: used needles and syringes, a plastic bag of meth, soiled diapers, used condoms, pop cans, beer cans, water bottles, cigarette packs, straws, styrofoam cups and containers. The list goes on and on.

To protect our reproductive freedoms, we need to expand the Supreme Court.

The Judiciary Act of 2021 would add four new seats to the Supreme Court, bringing the number of justices to 13. It would help restore balance to a Court that Mitch McConnell has packed with right-wing extremists who just dismantled abortion care in America.

Recent polling showed that not only do a majority of Americans believe that the Supreme Court should uphold the right to abortion care, they also agree that we need to restore balance to the court and support adding additional judges to the Supreme Court.



The Cassville Arts Council (CAC) is a local nonprofit organization dedicated to promoting access to art and cultural events for the Cassville community. From July 7 through 10, CAC will present a production of Joseph and

the Technicolor Dreamcoat at the Crowder College Community center.

Joseph is a musical retelling of the familiar bible story composed by acclaimed playwright Andrew Lloyd Webber, and will be the council's first performance since taking a two-year hiatus due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and its second musical overall.

The council, which also presented a performance of Gilbert and Sullivan's The Pirates of Penzance in 2019, strives to provide opportunities for members of the Cassville community to enjoy and participate in the arts locally. Though it focuses on musical theater while still in its early stages, the Council intends to expand to include other artistic endeavors in the future.

"Right now, the only program we have is our yearly musical," explained director and CAC president Trent Oliphant, "but we would also like to bring in plays, other concerts and recitals, maybe dance recitals and visual arts shows, and eventually we'd like to be able to offer classes if we can find the volunteers and resources."

The council intends to use the proceeds from the event to fund the production of such events, as well as next year's musical, and hopes to find more local volunteers with diverse creative backgrounds to facilitate future programs.

Oliphant explains his commitment to the CAC's mission. "It's for the artists

There's a quote attributed to Winston Churchill from WWII that I think says it well. He had chosen to continue state support of arts programs, and when he was asked why those funds for the arts weren't being spent on the war, he replied, 'If we don't have the arts, then what are we even fighting for?' I don't know whether he really said it, but I love the sentiment."

According to Oliphant, that is why the Arts Council finds making art accessible such a worthy cause: "Art is about living, about life."

The cast and crew of Joseph, which is composed of volunteers from all across the Cassville area and Barry County, have been working hard to fulfil this mission since rehearsals began in

"I'm really pleased with the talent of the cast," Oliphant reports. "I'm very exited for opening night. We still have a lot of work to do, but the cast has been working hard, and it's starting to look and sound great. I think it's going to be magical."

The cast-members share his excitement for the performance.

"The play has definitely been a testament to the cast's dedication, and I think that will really shine through in the performance," says Haley Fratus, who plays one of three narrators in the musical, as well as choreographing several numbers.

Nolan Crain, who plays the leading role of Joseph, commented: "It's been great to get back into music... I haven't really had an opportunity to touch music since high school, so it's fantastic to have a chance to get back into it. I think the whole thing is coming together very well, it's going to be a great showcase of everyone's

The production is set to take place over four performances from Thursday, July 7, to Sunday, July 10, and will be presented at the Crowder College community building on 404 N. Main Street in Cassville, with tickets available online and at the door.

Meeting people who share the same interests as you was even better when it was followed with "Oh, by the way, I'm from Hawaii," or another good one was Alaska.








MU Extension offers cool gardening tips for hot days

Both gardeners and their plants need extra care when it's hot outside, says University of Missouri Extension horticulturist Donna Aufdenberg. Consider gardening in the early morning and late evening to avoid high temperatures and harsh sun. Choose lighter-colored clothing. Hats, sunglasses and sunscreen lotion with

an SPF of 45 or more are a gardener's friend as well, Aufdenberg says. Work in short increments. Drink water often and seek shade during rest breaks. Know the signs of heat stress: lightheadedness, weakness, nausea, headache, muscle cramps, excessive sweating and irritability.

Plants need extra love

when it is hot, too. Aufdenberg offers these tips:

• Water seldom but thoroughly. Watering a little each day could result in runoff or root rot because of too much

• Know what "dry" looks and feels like. This varies by plant and soil. Check by looking at and touching the soil and checking the weight of the pot.

• Water next to the root system. Avoid aerial or overhead watering. Use drip emitters or soaker hoses when possible. Water in the early morning or early eve-



Over 3,500 emergency communication centers worldwide use the medical, fire, police, and emergency nurse triage protocols developed and maintained by the IAED. The protocol-based system-known as the Priority Dispatch SystemTM-is recognized as the standard of care and practice for emergency dispatch and is used in 46 countries.

Spreadsheet to estimate farmland value

Buyers and sellers who need an estimate of the value of a piece of farmland may not always find it feasible to get an appraisal, particularly one that reflects the land's historical value needed to calculate taxes and settle estates. University of Missouri Extension offers a publication and spreadsheet that give estimated value of farmland by county in Missouri, says Ray Massey, MU Extension professor in agricultural business and policy. Massey and Ryan Milhollin, assistant extension professor of agricultural business and policy, are co-authors of the "Missouri Farmland Values" guide and the accompanying county land value estimator spreadsheet. Every five years since 1950, the U.S. Department of Agriculture has surveyed farmers and reported countylevel land value in its Census of Agriculture. USDA also updates the average statewide

market value of agricultural land and buildings each year. Since 1997, the state-level values are provided in four classes: all cropland, nonirrigated cropland, irrigated cropland and pastureland. This annual report does not break values down by county but is helpful in observing trends, says Massey. Values can vary considerably within a county depending upon location, land quality and other factors, says Milhollin. For this reason, USDA estimates may not provide an acceptable estimate of land values. However, it does provide a consistent historical perspective, he says. In the guide, Milhollin and Massey recommend steps to estimate historical land values at a county level. The accompanying spreadsheet reports the average market value for individual Missouri counties starting from 1959.

Apply for MDC deer hunt July 1

Beginning July 1, deer hunters can apply online through the Missouri Department of Conservation's (MDC) website for a shot at more than 100 managed deer hunts throughout the state this fall and winter. MDC offers managed deer hunts for archery, muzzleloading, crossbow, and modern firearms from mid-September

through mid-January at conservation areas, state and other parks, national wildlife refuges, and other public areas. Some managed deer hunts are held specifically for youth or for people with disabilities. The managed deer hunt application period is July 1 - 31. Hunters are selected by a weighted random drawing. Draw results will be available Aug. 15 through Jan. 15. Applicants who are drawn will receive area maps and other hunt information by email, or mail if an email address is not located on the customer's account. Get more information on managed deer hunts, preview hunt details, and apply starting July 1 at mdc. mo.gov/managedhunt

Consider food safety when donating to pantries

Donating to food pantries and food banks is a way for neighbors to help neighbors, reduce food waste and aid families in need, says Londa Nwadike, extension food safety specialist for the University of Missouri and Kansas State University.

While donations are greatly appreciated at food pantries, Nwadike said, be mindful of what you donate. "Many times, people don't

want to throw food away, so they donate it, but it is always important to ensure that when donating food, we also think about it from a safety perspective," she said.

"Many of the people who

consume food from food pantries are from groups that are more vulnerable to foodborne illness – the young, old, pregnant and sick," Nwadike said.

Nwadike recommends NOT donating the following foods:

- Home-canned or home-prepared foods.
- Opened or repackaged foods.Food in damaged pack-
- ages or dented cans.

 Food past its labeled
- "best by" date.
 - Spoiled, moldy foods. "Always check with the

food pantry or food bank before donating fresh fruits and vegetables, frozen foods and any food that requires refrigeration to ask if they are able to safely handle those foods," she said.

Nwadike suggests donating nonperishable items like these:

- Fruits that are canned in light syrup or juice or are dried, such as peaches, applesauce and pineapple.
- Canned vegetables that are low in sodium, such as corn, peas and carrots.
- Healthful grains, such as whole-grain crackers, brown

rice and granola bars.

- Protein foods, such as canned tuna or salmon (water packed), canned chicken and nut butters.
- Nonperishable dairy products, such as evaporated milk, shelf-stable milk and nonfat dry milk.

Aside from donating food, there are other ways to help food pantries, Nwadike said

"Food pantries also appreciate monetary donations so they can buy what they need the most in bulk, and they also appreciate volunteer time," she said.

Cassville Food Pantry Receives \$30,000

Cassville Pantry recently received a \$30,000 capacity building grant thanks to Ozarks Food Harvest's \$1 million investment in agency infrastructure in southwest Missouri.

The grant funding will purchase a walk-in cooler which will help increase perishable food storage capacity for fresh produce, dairy, and meat products and assist our ability to feed food insecure families in Barry County. Cassville Pantry was one of more than 70 organizations chosen by Ozarks Food Harvest to receive an agency capacity grant to assist with hunger-relief efforts.

"This grant is a significant boost to our agency's ability to manage a higher level of perishable food inventory.

"It is a tremendous blessing as the children, families and seniors we serve are dealing with difficult economic challenges of inflation and cost of living increases," said Janet Mills, Pantry Director.

"Thanks to Ozarks Food Harvest, we will have the ability to store and distribute more healthy items and perishable foods.

"Once the walk-in cooler is on site, we will be able to expand our inventory and increase our offerings to include more nutritious foods including produce and dairy products. The cooler is on order from the manufacturer and we hope to have it installed by September 2022."

Ozarks Food Harvest is the Feeding America food bank for southwest Missouri, serving 270 charities across 28 Ozarks counties. This capacity building investment is part of The Food Bank's multi-faceted strategy to address needs identified in Missouri's Food Assistance and Hunger in the Heartland 2021 report conducted by the MU Interdisciplinary Center for Food Security.

Cassville Pantry has seen an alarming and increasing level of demand upon our resources in the past two months. The challenge to put healthy food on the table for many will be an ongoing obstacle looking ahead navigating the prospective economic climate.

Our visitor numbers have been escalating over

the same time in previous years. In a typical morning we are serving an average of 30 households daily.

Four-hundred-fifty families per month are utilizing the weekday Pantry program for food assistance. Through all of the agency's programs combined, Cassville Pantry is serving 725 families comprised of 1400 individuals with a food box each month.

40% of our visitors are elderly or disabled persons on fixed incomes who are really struggling with the increased cost of groceries. Should You Take Daily Aspirin for Your Heart?

Dear Savvy Senior,

I've been taking daily aspirin for almost 20 years now because I have a family history of heart disease. But I recently read that using aspirin is not recommended anymore.

What can you tell me about this change in philoso-

Confused Aspirin User Dear Confused,

There's no doubt that taking low-dose daily aspirin is beneficial to most people who have had a heart attack or stroke. However, in the case of someone who does not have heart disease, should that person take it as a preventative measure? The answer for most people is probably not, according to new guidelines from the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF), a widely respected independent panel

that develops recommendations on preventive health care. Here's what you should

New Guidelines

For years, aspirin has been a go-to pill Americans use to help ward off cardio-vascular disease because of its blood thinning capability. But like most medicines, it can cause serious side effects. Aspirin irritates the stomach lining and can cause bleeding in the stomach, intestines and brain which can be lifethreatening. And the risk of bleeding increases with age.

About one-third of Americans age 40 and older, and more than 45 percent of people over age 70 – who don't have cardiovascular disease – already take a daily aspirin to help prevent cardiovascular disease because it's been recommended for decades by many different health experts

But in the past few years,

new research has emerged showing that for many people without diagnosed heart disease, the risk of bleeding may outweigh the benefits of taking a daily aspirin. This research, along with the advent of other effective therapies in preventing heart attacks and strokes that don't cause bleeding – better blood pressure drugs and statins for lowering cholesterol – has narrowed the role aspirin plays.

Here's a breakdown of the updated USPSTF guidelines of who should, and shouldn't, take a daily aspirin, and for those who should, how to take it safely.

Who Should Take It?

There are two categories of people who can still benefit from using aspirin. People with established cardiovascular disease, especially those who have already had a heart attack or stroke.

There's strong evidence that taking a daily low-dose aspirin significantly reduces the risk of a second cardio-vascular event. And adults ages 40 to 59 with a 10 percent or higher risk for a cardiovascular disease over the next decade.

They may see a small benefit to daily aspirin, but it should be an individual decision and discussed with your doctor.

Who Should Skip It?

People who are 60 and older – without established cardiovascular disease – who do not currently take a daily

* Repairing

aspirin to prevent heart disease should not start now. This is particularly true for people with a history of bleeding, say from ulcers or aneurysms, or those taking medications such as blood thinners, steroids or antiinflammatories such as ibuprofen or naproxen. If they already take a daily aspirin now, they should ask a doctor about how to proceed, because there may be a serious risk to suddenly stopping.

How to Use it Safely

The best approach is to talk to your doctor about the potential risks and benefits of aspirin specifically for you. Because the risk of bleeding raises with dosage, if aspirin is recommended, take the lowest possible amount, which for most people is an 81 mg baby aspirin.

And if you experience any stomach pain, talk to your doctor.

You should also know that in 2016 the USPSTF suggested that daily aspirin use could also help lower the risk of colorectal cancer along with cardiovascular disease. But the group now says there's not enough evidence to support that claim.

The water level is very good at roaring River State

The water is now clear enough to sight fish, and sight fishing is very good right now. I recommend the use of 2 pound line on a spinning rod or casting rod, on your fly rod a 9 foot 7X leader is probably the best for fishing dries. For fishing nymphs, I will generally use a 9 foot 6 X leader.

Dry fly fishing has been very good. Beetles, ants, Cracklebacks, elk hair caddis, blue wing olives, and there is lots of midge activity all day long.

We are still catching good numbers on a grass-hopper with a nymph under it. The old hopper dropper works very well right now. A good nymph right now to fish would be a pheasant tail nymph.

A burlap works very well right now, copper Johns, and gold ribbed hares ears work well most of the time. A black zebra midge is also a good choice on most days.

A San Juan worm also works most of the time. Orange, the pink, and the white worms have been working the best most days.

With the water being

lower and clear, micro jigs, John Deere green, and marabou jigs have all been very good.

We are still using marabou jigs up to size 1/8 but most people probably throw smaller when the water is in this condition.

Most jigs, right now, are doing very well. Black and yellow, white, olive green, and brown have been doing very well in all zones.

Plastic baits are still working very well the best colors have been natural with a fish oil, and shrimp have been working very well, orange, white, and fluorescent yellow have also been good colors this past week.

The power bait 1 inch crawlers are still working very well. The yellow is still out-producing brown and the pink, but all three will catch trout on most days.

If you are facing plastic worms, white, pink, chartreuse, and cheese yellow have all been doing well. Thirty minute specials (rooster tails), are still working pretty good in the morning. Black, brown, and the frog green have been pretty good the past few weeks.

Good luck on the river this week.


