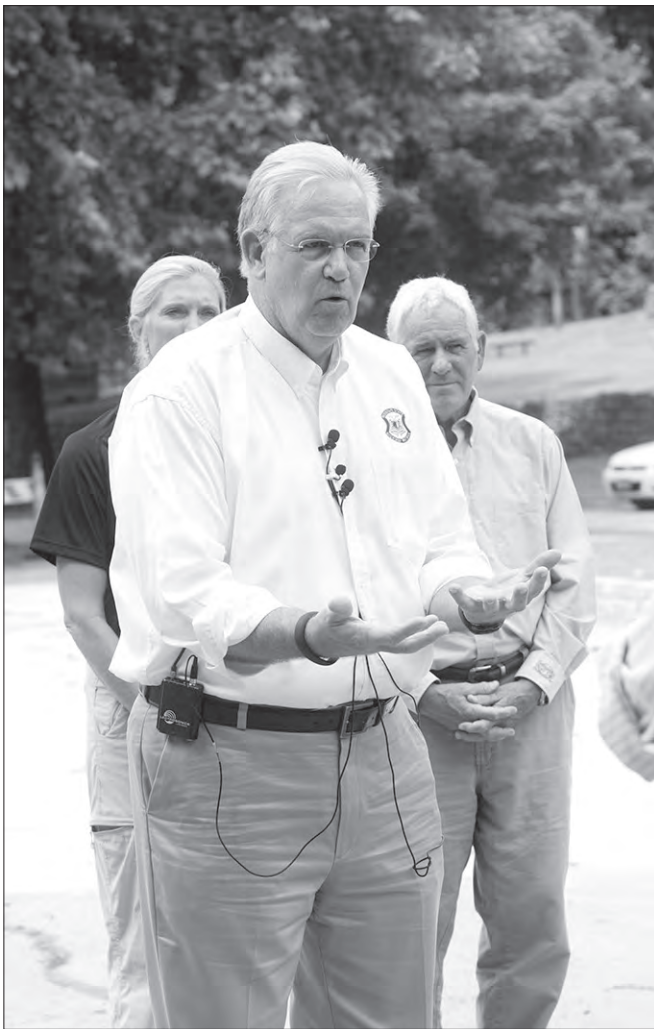

City Council discusses transportation projects

At the Cassville City Council meeting on Monday night there was a heated discussion about using the city's transportation money on repairing city roads.

It was proposed that an engineer be brought in to perform a study and decide what roads need the most attention the quickest.

Alderman Terry Heinz opposed and said, "We do not need to spend money on an engineer when it isn't necessary and we don't need to spend tax payers money for no reason. I have total confidence that Hutchins Construction can tell us what needs to be fixed."

Alderman Jon Horner rebutted Alderman Hines view and said, "The purpose for hiring an engineer is to give us an overall plan and provide us with some numbers

of what it will cost to fix our city. We need to prioritize what we are going to do first, and maybe come up with a five year plan."

"We will be paying someone to do Steve Walensky's job, he can determine when our roads and what roads need to be fixed," said Alderman Heinz

Alderman Horner went on to explain that the reason why he believes the city should come up with a plan and do five years worth of road work now is so the tax payers can see the progress. "If we do five years worth of roadwork now we are getting a bigger bang for our buck. If we do it in small sections our tax payers will say it is taking forever."

The council came to the conclusion to put a request in and see what it would cost the city to hire and engineer.

Governor Nixon made an appearance in Cassville on Friday afternoon and addressed the media at Roaring River State Park to assess and discuss recent flood damage to the park and surrounding areas.

"I want to thank specifically the Missouri Department of Conservation, Missouri State Parks, and the Department of Natural Resources who made strong, quick decisions that got over 250 people out of these campgrounds and out of these areas as the water rose over nine feet on the first day of the flooding," Nixon said. "Because of that smart and quick action taken we are here talking about what we can do to get this park rebuilt and fully operational as quickly as possible, instead of talking about what sort of injuries there were."

After thanking the Mis-

souri Department of Transportation and the Department of Natural Resources. Nixon applauded the people who worked on the ground saying they did an, "unbelievable job," getting people moving and out of the area. They "definitely saved lives," Nixon said.

"We're in a weather pattern here that's going to continue, especially in steep areas like this you're going to see potential quick rises not just in parks but in the entire southern part of our state over the next 30-60 days. So as you hear from the media or law enforcement to move out of areas, please do."

"I always tell people please don't ever drive into water, it can be extremely dangerous. The two deaths we have had so far this summer from flood related incidents have been because of people crossing high water." Added Nixon.

Roaring River re-opened and resumed selling trout tags on Friday. Although the park sustained significant damage no fish were lost from the hatchery, and almost all the campsites are back open. "The water makes fishing a little harder but not impossible." Nixon said, encouraging people to get out and enjoy the fishing and nice weather.

"While some trout have escaped and are on their way to Governor Jindal in Louisiana, there is still going to be plenty of trout here." Stated Nixon.

Earlier in the day Nixon visited with town officials in Cassville and he noted that everyone is pitching in together to get the debris cleaned up. Cassville is making, "good and solid progress." Nixon said.

Memorial 5K to kick-off annual Purdy Festival

The fourth annual Purdy Festival is set for Saturday, July 18. The festival will kick-off with the Angie Swadley 5K Run/Walk at 7:30 a.m.

Check-in and day of registration will be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:20 a.m. on Saturday. This year there is a new course for the 5k (3.1 miles) race and have added a Mile Madness (one mile) course for kids and adults.

All proceeds from the race go to the Angie Swadley Memorial Fund and provide

one scholarship to a Purdy Senior who chooses a career in working with kids.

The Purdy Police Department will be closing State Highway C on Saturday July 18th for the 4th annual Purdy Summer Festival.

Traffic will be shut down starting at 9 a.m. from Commercial Street east on Fifth Street and the highway will remain closed until the festival ends on Saturday evening.

Barricades will be erect-

ed on State Highway C to prevent traffic from driving through the festival area and endangering pedestrians.

Barricades will also be erected on the south ends of Commercial, Third, and Fourth Streets to prevent traffic from exiting onto State Highway C.

Anyone that is caught removing a barricade or tampering with a traffic control device may be issued a citation.

Missouri Baptist Disaster Relief assists locals in flood clean-up

Charles McCray has been participating in the Missouri Baptist Disaster Relief program since 2005 when he helped with Hurricane Katrina in New Orleans. The organization responds to disasters all over the nation.

The Baptist Disaster Relief program isn't just in Missouri, most states have a local station where they also respond to local and national disasters.

The organization responds to floods, wildfires, hurricanes, tornados and other disasters that may happen throughout the U.S.

There is a station in Springfield although people who volunteer come from many different areas.

When a disaster strikes the state director of the organization sends out e-mails asking for trained volunteers to devote their time to help the people affected from the disaster.

Some volunteers from the organization are currently lending a helping hand in Cassville for flood victims.

When people are in desperate need of help they will call and ask for assistance or

an assessor from the organization will make personal contacts of people in need.

"We don't know how long we will be in the Cassville area, it just depends on how long it takes to get all the debris cleaned up," said McCray.

Two years ago the organization started a collegiate team that consists of six college students and their group leader.

The students apply online and are committed to 10 weeks. They are trained in five different areas. Running a chainsaw, recovery efforts, child care, mass area feeding and providing shower trailers. They are also certified to run a skid steer.

Their group leader Joe Banderman said, "I have to make them stop working so they can take a break." He is very proud of how much effort the students are putting into helping the flood victims.

Student Ryan Steel from Park Hills said, "I knew this

is what I needed to do, I really think God wanted me here." Steel wants to continue participating in the organization for many years to come.

Caleb Brubaker, a student from St. James said, "I was searching for a way that I could serve God. I didn't want to just talk about it, I wanted to do it." Brubaker wants to help with the organization every time he has the chance.

"I love this program," said student Gabe Craig from Park Hills. "It is helping me gear up for when I want to do some mission work."

Student Lindey Broyles from Neosho said, "My pastor contacted me about this program. He is the reason I got involved. My family is going to start participating too. I like the traveling and meeting different people."

"I just got involved," said student Ashley Palmer from Joplin. "When my pastor brought it up I thought it would be a great way to serve God. It is challenging but

very rewarding."

Student Jessica Sherrill of Bonne Terre said, "This has trained me in disaster relief for when I want to do some mission trips. God has really spoken to me through this

experience."

The Family Life Center has been supplying the organization with a place to stay while they continue to work on damaged homes in the area.



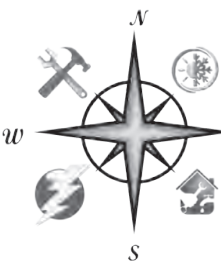

State disaster assistance agencies provide resources to local flood victims

State disaster assistance agencies are teamed up today to provide a one-stop shop for Cassville-area residents with questions and seeking assistance following the recent flooding and severe storms. The Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC) will be held from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the Missouri Department of Social Services office at 208 E. 8th Street, Cassville.

The MARC includes representatives trained to identify possible assistance resources, including temporary public assistance, mental health counseling and assistance with questions about insurance and health and safety issues. Residents seeking assistance should bring photo identification and proof of address, if available.

Among the participating state agencies is the Missouri

departments of Health & Senior Services, Mental Health, Insurance, the Family support Division of the Department of Social Services and the University of Missouri Extension. A Department of Insurance representative will be able to provide consumers with assistance understanding their insurance policies and the process of filing a claim.

A consumer specialist from the Missouri Department of Insurance is able to provide consumers with assistance understanding their insurance policies and the process of filing a claim as well as company contact information. Residents affected by storms and flooding who have not already contacted their insurance agent or company should do so immediately.

Policyholders who have

questions or concerns about their insurance coverage should contact the department's Insurance Consumer Hotline at 800-726-7390 or visit insurance.mo.gov.

"Local residents who have questions about their insurance policies or claims should meet with our consumer specialist at the Multi-Agency Resource Center," said John M. Huff, director of the department. "We can answer general insurance questions and may be able to assist with the claims process if you have reached an impasse with your insurance company."

The Department of Insurance offers these tips for consumers affected by the storms:

Contact your insurance agent or your company's toll-free claims number as soon as possible. If you have lost the contact information, the department may be able to help you locate it. Visit insurance.mo.gov or call 800-726-7390.

Make temporary repairs to prevent further damage. For example, a hole in the roof should be covered by a tarp or other materials to keep out rain. The same goes for a broken car window. Otherwise, further damage

will likely not be covered by your insurance policy. Keep the receipts for materials you buy so you can be reimbursed.

Don't make permanent repairs until your insurance company has inspected the damage. If you do, your company may not reimburse you.

Once your claim is processed, get estimates from contractors or auto repair shops known to you or recommended by someone you trust. Be suspicious of strangers who offer to do repairs for you.

If you believe your insurance company has not handled your claim properly,

file a complaint with the department. The department will determine whether your insurance company has followed Missouri law in processing your claim.

Don't let contractors inspect your property if you're not watching. Some unscrupulous companies will cause damage to drive up the repair cost, and your insurance company will likely not cover the additional cost.

Don't pay the whole repair bill in advance. Pay in full only when the work is completed according to your agreement.

Business owners can visit the department's "Small Business Insurance" Web page, which offers information on commercial property, business interruption insur-

ance and more. The department recently produced a video podcast that discusses flooding and what a typical homeowners insurance policy does not cover. The video is posted on the department's website.

The Missouri Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP) is responsible for consumer protection through the regulation of financial industries and professionals. The department's seven divisions work to enforce state regulations both efficiently and effectively while encouraging a competitive environment for industries and professions to ensure consumers have access to quality products.

“This park is an important asset, and we want to make sure it is safe. The bottom line is these folks acted quickly and because of that this park is going to be up and operational to full capacity very soon. None of the clean up will prevent people from fishing and enjoying this part of the Ozarks.” Stated Nixon.

Missouri has three trout parks and according to Nixon they are all naturally low areas that get hyper charged quickly. During the flood at Roaring River the gage on the bridge went from 1.9 to 9 feet in a little more than an hour. Nixon stressed that if there is any further flooding to please listen to the experienced staff when they tell you to move out of the area.

Gov. Nixon stated that in order to receive 75 percent reimbursement for recovery efforts, there must be at least \$8.3 million dollars worth of damage to public assets statewide.

Nixon expects to work with the mayor of Cassville Bill Shively and the Pubic Works Director Steve Walensky to get all of Cassville up and operational, including the Greenway Trail that received significant damage.

State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) will have representatives on Wednesday at the Division of Family Services on Eighth Street from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. They will be meeting with flood victims whose homes have been damaged.

The Convoy of Hope and the Missouri Baptist Disaster Relief are already helping residents clean up and get rid of debris.

Gov. Nixon praised the Cassville Police Chief for making quick decisions that saved lives.

“The people of cassville were ready and made quick decisions,” Nixon said. “What we try to do as a state is called ‘force amplify.’ We try

pening. With state resources and regional resources we do our best to back them up. In Cassville there were direct

decisions made by the Police Chief and Public Works personnel to get folks out of those harmful areas and that clearly saved lives.”

The Missouri Department of Conservation (MDC) announces the following 2015 hunting season dates, hours, and limits for early-migrating game birds.



ACCESS Family Care of Neosho receives \$150,000 to tackle chronic diabetes

Diabetes is particularly acute in the Ozarks section of Southwest Missouri where 14% of ACCESS Family Care's 20,000 patients grapple with the chronic condition compared to 9% of people nationwide. To tackle this growing problem, the RCHN Community Health Foundation has awarded ACCESS Family Care \$150,000 to support a project to help diabetic patients discharged from the hospital to better manage their condition.

"Rising numbers of people with diabetes is leading to higher rates of avoidable emergency department visits and hospital admissions," said ACCESS Quality Assurance Manager Venice Green, RN. "This grant will help us to streamline patient care from hospital to home and community, lower ER visits and hospital admissions that can be avoided with preventive care, and improve our capacity to serve as a comprehensive health home for our patients."

ACCESS Family Care is partnering with the Freeman Health System, Mercy Hospital, and Missouri Primary Care Association on the initiative. The new initiative, ACCESS Comprehensive PCMH Integration, will assign a community outreach worker to serve as a liaison with local hospitals to identify discharged patients with

poorly controlled diabetes and connect them to services to better manage their condition.

Diabetes is particularly widespread among older adults and in low-income, minority, and other vulnerable communities, where access to healthy foods or an ability to afford on-going medications can be a challenge. This intervention program aims to improve patient education as well as to identify services to help diabetic patients overcome barriers to controlling their condition, while strengthening the health centers systems of care.

"A critical part of improving our nation's health is to more effectively reach and care for those who face cultural or systemic barriers that limit their access to care and ability to lead healthier lives," said Feygele Jacobs, president and CEO of the RCHN Community Health Foundation (RCHN CHF). "Our foundation is pleased to support innovative projects to improve the health of vulnerable populations and share lessons learned on how to deliver health care that works better for our communities."

ACCESS Family Care is one of six grantees in five states that will receive \$150,000 each to develop and launch a population health

focused program. Other projects include initiatives to improve pediatric care management and reduce child and teen ER visits by Hudson Headwaters Health Network, Queensbury, NY; reduce smoking among Asian Americans by the Charles B. Wang Community Health Center, New York, NY; improve colon cancer screening rates by Adelante Healthcare, Phoenix, AZ; improve cervical cancer screening rates in health center communities by Colorado Community Health Network, Denver, CO; and establish a medical home for the homeless by Santa Rosa Community Health Centers, Santa Rosa, CA.

Safeguard yourself from summertime ailments and accidents

Pickleball gaining in popularity

From its humble, home-made beginnings in 1965, pickleball has evolved into America’s fastest growing sport. A simple game for all ages, pickleball has soared in popularity among seniors who have abandoned the traditional - and grueling -racquet sports of tennis and racquetball. Even some golfers, tired of their expensive and often frustrating hobby, are trading in their clubs for the simple tools of pickleball.

Pickleball is a hybrid of whiffleball, racquetball, badminton, and table tennis. Played on a regulation doubles badminton court with a low net, the game is played by teams using distinctive solid paddles and a modified whiffleball. Rules are similar to tennis and badminton.

The smaller court is a boon to seniors who struggle to cover an expansive tennis court. The paddle, shorter than a tennis racket, takes some getting used to. Your first foray onto the pickleball court may produce more whiffs than hits until you adapt to the paddle length.

Pickleball has grown rapidly and even has its own national association, the USAPA. This organization provides for standard playing rules and procedures, and oversees a number of state, regional, and national tournaments for various levels.

There are pickleball facilities in all 50 states. Pickleball can be played both indoors and outdoors. Many gyms now include pickleball courts in their basketball facilities, and city parks de-

partments are adding pickleball courts to meet the growing demand.

Cassville’s First Baptist Church has an active pickleball community that meets twice weekly in the Family Life Center. Steve Walensky, Cassville’s Public Works Director, announced recently that the city will be adding two pickleball courts to the city park sports complex in the near future.

Avoid heat related illnesses

Even if you think you're getting used to the triple-digit temperatures, you need to watch out for signs of heat-related illness.

Forms of heat-related illness include heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat stroke, says Tammy Roberts, University of Missouri Extension nutrition and health education specialist.

Heat cramps usually occur as a result of heavy sweating, sometimes several hours after a person has been out of the heat, Roberts said. The cramps can be very painful and usually affect the arms, legs or abdomen.

"To help prevent heat cramps, drink a fluid that has electrolytes during and after long periods of heavy sweating," she said.

Heat exhaustion happens when the body loses the ability to cool itself. This can occur when a person has been sweating heavily and not replacing fluids and electrolytes. Symptoms of heat exhaustion include headache, dizziness, loss of coordination, impaired judgment, anxiety, clammy skin and a weak, rapid pulse. Someone with these symptoms needs to be cooled down and slowly drink fluids. Have them checked by a doctor.

Heat stroke, the most serious heat-related illness, is life-threatening. It occurs when the body has lost too much water and salt. That loss, along with the body's inability to cool itself, makes body heat rise to dangerous levels. Symptoms of heat stroke include a high body temperature with no sweating; any of the above symptoms of heat exhaustion; nausea and vomiting; seizures; difficulty breathing; and high blood pressure. If you suspect someone has heat stroke, call 911 and try to cool the person as quickly as possible.

Anyone can suffer from a heat-related illness, but the people at greatest risk are

infants and young children, senior citizens, people who are obese and those who are already physically ill.

Roberts urges people to drink plenty of fluids during times of extreme heat. "Water is a great choice. Fluids with electrolytes are recommended for long periods of heavy sweating."

Digesting food actually creates heat in your body, so if the heat is bothering you, Roberts suggests eating smaller but more frequent meals.

Heat-related illness can be very serious but is avoidable. "Remember, shade and water are your friends," she said.
