Couple Found Dead in Monett Home; Cause Unknown

Monett Police have released information regarding two deaths in Monett on June 30, though no cause of death is known at this time.

Last Thursday, at approximately 8:04 p.m., officers of the Monett Police Department responded to a call from the 100

block of West Nellie in Monett in reference to two deceased subjects. Entering the residence, the officers located 71-yearold white male Daniel Olson, and spouse 64-year-old white female Tamara Olson, both deceased in the home.

The two deceased individuals were then transported by the county coroner, where the subjects will undergo an autopsy to

determine the cause. At present, nothing is known as to the cause of the deaths, though the autopsy is expected to provide answers. The incident is currently under investigation by the Monett Police Department. There has been no evidence discovered to indicate the community of Monett are in danger.

51 Crashes in Southwest Missouri Over Holiday Weekend

Hawkins failed to negotiate a curve and traveled off the right side of the roadway and struck a tree. Hawkins suffered minor injuries and was transported by ambulance to the Cox Hospital in Monett. Hawkins was wearing a safety device at the time of the incident.

Man Charged with Resistance of Arrest

According to a probable cause statement filed by Officer Jacob Negre with the Monett Police Department, warrants were issued for the arrest of Anthony Snow, 40, of Neosho for the alleged resistance of arrest for a felony.

Officer Negre states he observed two people walking east on the gravel portion of Front Street, from seventh street toward a closed business in Monett. Negre made contact with the two. One was a female and discussed with Officer Negre, while the other was a male who avoided eye contact with the officer.

Officer Negre asked the female who she was with and the male spoke up and said that his name was John. Officer Negre recognized his voice and face to be Anthony Snow from precious Law Enforcement contacts.

Officer Negre asked the man his last name and Snow stated he had done nothing wrong, therefore he did

not have to identify himself to the officer. Officer Negre agreed with Snow stating that he was correct and that the interaction between the three of them was only voluntary contact. Snow told the officer that his last name was "Fable." Negre made sure to confirm with Snow that his name was "John Fable" and Snow agreed. Officer Negre mentioned to Snow that he matched the description of Anthony Snow and the man stated that he didn't know anyone by the name of Anthony. Officer Negre concluded with Snow's defensive and evasive behavior that Snow had a warrant out for his arrest.

Officer Negre used his car Mobile Data Terminal and searched in house records and located Mr. Snow's information. He then conducted a M.U.L.E.S. check on Mr. Snow's information and

observed he had failed three times to appear for warrants out from the Monett Police Department and 1 felony probation violation warrant out of McDonald County Sheriff's Office. While Officer Negre was conducting those searches Mr. Snow moved freely in front of the patrol car, pacing back and forth, then walking away from the patrol vehicle.

Officer Negre exited the patrol vehicle and yelled out to Mr. Snow "Hey Anthony" to which he did not reply, Negre then yelled out "Anthony" to which he turned his head towards Negre but did not stop, Negre then yelled out "Anthony come back here" but he began running away.

Officer Negre drove the patrol car towards Mr. Snow, activating his emergency lights, but he still did not stop. Mr. Snow jumped into

the Kelley Creek drainage ditch and ran north from Front Street towards ninth, under Broadway. Officer Negre made his way to the area of Broadway and 9th and checked the drainage access, but did not see Mr. Snow.

A short time later he observed him running west, across eleventh Street, behind the Dollar General 816 E Broadway. Officer Negre was unable to locate Mr. Snow after that.

Mr. Snow committed the crime of Resisting Arrest for a Felony, by having a felony warrant for his arrest Mr. Snow failed to comply with the instruction of a Police Officer attempting to arrest him.

Roaring River State Park Holds Yearly Informational Meeting

Roaring River State Park held its annual meeting on June 30. Given by Joel Topham, the presentation gave insight into the many projects that Roaring River State Park, spanning 4,820.68 acres across Barry County, have been working on and planning. The presentation also explained the projects of Roaring River's affiliate park, Big Sugar Creek.

In 2021, Roaring River State Park had 1.9 million visitors, an increase of 30% from 2020. However, according to Topham, improvements are being implemented to ensure that the park continues to be enhanced.

A new fish cleaning station has been built at the end of Campground 3. Nearby, also in Campground 3, the park was able to conduct a

controlled burn of the surrounding area in the winter, with the hopes of to diminishing the population of weeds. A goal for this area is to promote the growth of natural and native flowers, says Topham.

With recent flooding, potholes are a persistent issue in the park. However, Topham states that the park is filling in and repairing these holes as they arise.

There have also been additional memorial picnic tables installed in the day use area, with six added over this past year. Accompanied by the assistance of MODOT, Topham states that the park has reclaimed the view along the River Road.

New renovations have also been put in place. In Cabin 7, new flooring has been installed, and the bath-

room has been redone. In the Emory Melton Inn, all air ducts were cleaned and sanitized, and the room renovations in rooms 101-118 of the inn were completed. Additionally, the park has installed hallway lights throughout the building. Lastly for the inn, the park replaced a seven-ton HVAC unit, with two more set to be replaced this year.

All of Deer Leap Walkway has been power washed, and the informational kiosk on the overlook has been replaced.

Looking ahead, the Fish Cleaning Station Donor Wall is planned to be completed, and the construction on the

project is underway. In the day use area, the playground structure was shut down for safety issues, but the park is constructing a new one sponsored by Power Play, with the new equipment being paid for by grants from the Ozark Community Foundation.

The park also plans to replace Deer Leap boardwalk sections along the west section, near Devils Icebox. The park also plans to apply another coat of paint to Shower House 3 bathroom floors. The repaying of the park by MODOT will begin in September of this year.

This winter, the park will work to stabilize the river bank along Campground 2. This is planned to be accomplished by adding riprap to help hold the soil in place and help stop erosion in this

In Campground 3, the park plans for the lower end Revenue Bond Project to start in October. This will upgrade 32 sites to full hook-up, and will add a two room bathroom as well.

In Campground 2, 13 sites are to be redone to help with the holding of water. This project is set to happen in the fall of 2023.

The public swimming

pool has been closed for two seasons, and with the repair costs being very high, Roaring River is on the list to convert this space into a splash pad zone for guests. The park is awaiting a start date to be given for this project at this

In the Campground 3 Pollinator area, the park will be looking to seed in wildflowers to promote local pollinators to visit this site.

The park hosted a ribbon cutting for the FCS on June 4, and currently, the station is running as expected with no problems. It has helped to serve the park well with the disposal of fish remains. The park took the suggestion of some visitors, and added water station faucets. This way, people will be able to use the water and not get the person across from them wet.

The next phase of construction will be the Do-

nor Wall. Work scheduling became an obstacle during the COVID pandemic, says Topham, though now the park has poured the concrete pad to signify the ground has been broken for the wall. This is planned to be completed by the end of July.


Regarding the cave dives, Topham states that WA Adventure Dive and the KISS Rebreathers dive team will be remapping the cave spring. Last July, the team was able to venture beyond the flow restriction. Roaring River is now officially the deepest cave spring in Missouri and the entire United States of America.

The new depth has been confirmed as 472 feet. The park will have the team returning in July, August, September, and October. "We are very excited about this new discovery," says Topham.













Rose rosette continues to plague garden roses

Rose rosette is a devastating disease of roses. There is no cure. Infected rose bushes should be removed from the landscape and destroyed, said David Trinklein, horticulture specialist for University of Missouri Extension.

The disease first appeared on wild multiflora roses, which are considered a noxious weed in many states, including Missouri. At first, there was delight that a natural biological control for this troublesome rose was found, Trinklein said. Then it also started infecting garden ros-

The culprit is a tiny bug, he said. An eriophyoid mite spreads the pathogen. For gardeners familiar with the two-spotted spider mite, the eriophyoid mite is only about one-fourth the size of a spider mite and nearly impossible to see without a hand lens. The mites can't fly, but wind can carry them. If the mite has the virus in its gut, one bite of the rose bush on which it lands can infect the plant.

You can't prune the disease away. "Viruses are systemic to the plant," Trinklein said. "It's in all parts of the plant all the way down to root system. There is no cure, and it's a slow death for the

The symptoms are very distinct. First, malformed leaves will unfurl. As the disease progresses, the plant will produce rosy-purple stems with excessive thorns and feathery leaves. The common term is "witches' brooms." The plant will gradually stop producing flowers and eventually die.

To keep the infection from spreading, gardeners need to tear out the plant, including the roots, carefully place all the plant material into a bag and take it somewhere where it can be destroyed.

Of course, before destroying a rose bush you should verify that it is actually infected with rose rosette, Trinklein said. New growth of many garden roses has a reddish color but lacks the other abnormalities caused by rose rosette. Trinklein suggests taking a picture of the diseased plant and sending it to your county MU Extension center.

Because the disease is so devastating, plant scientists and horticulturists are searching for ways to protect roses from infection, Trinklein said. So far, efforts to find a control for the mites have not succeeded. Typical miticides that work well on the two-spotted spider mite have little effect on the eriophyoid mite. Some authorities have suggested using pesticides that act as suf-

focants, such as horticulture oils or insecticidal soap. But the chances of controlling the mite before it starts feeding are very remote, he said.

Infection can also take place without the mites. "It can be spread during the grafting process, which is a common production practice for most garden roses," Trinklein said. "This makes it very important that you purchase roses from a reliable source."

Time heals all, and for rose rosette it will take time to stem the tide.

"When a majority of wild roses are eventually killed by the disease, then that host will no longer act as a reservoir for the pathogen," Trinklein said. "Once we get rid of that natural storehouse of inoculum, it will be more difficult for the disease to spread."

In the meantime, Trinklein says don't give up on

How to plan for a post-50 career change

The water level at Roaring River State Park is 55 CFS at the moment. This is fantastic if you're dry fly fishing or sight fishing, this is wonderful water. There are lots of trout in the water, they are running just a little bit smaller than they were the spring, but there are still good numbers, and there are still plenty of 15 - 17 inch fish to catch.

Good flies to fish right now are blue wing olives, elk hair Caddis, Adams parachute or otherwise are great right now, beetles, ants, crackle backs, grasshoppers, and sulfurs are very good right now.

If you want to use a

nymph, I would probably use a pheasant tail or a burlap right now, but a black zebra midge will catch fish most of the time. Copper Johns have been pretty good also. If you are fishing plastic baits, white pink and yellow have been very good this week. The worms are doing extremely well. Fished with the number 14 or number 12 Longshank Hook with one B or one BB shot on the line. When the water is this low,

2 pound line and one small shot is generally better than a bigger sinker, unless you're fishing extremely fast water, 1 BB will probably be all you need. Marabou jigs are a lot of fun right now. With low water, we are fishing jigs. A small is 1/100 of an ounce, a lot of people are still throwing 1/32 and 1/16 in the Fly area where distance is more of a factor A lot of fish were caught this week on a John Deere Green and/or a white

thread jig fished under a 1/2 inch teardrop float.

Rooster tail spinners or spinners similar to a rooster tail are still very good first thing in the morning. Black, brown, and yellow spinners have been fairly decent all week. We generally only fish these for about 30 minutes, so they have become known as 30 minute wonders.

Good luck on the river this week, the river is fishing very well have fun.

I had the opportunity to talk about plant diseases with some of the kids. All my tomato plants look great, full of blooms except for two. I have two golden jubilee yellow tomato plants in cattle lick tubs in the full sun down by a water spicket. (I save seeds, so all my various plant varieties are separated around the


farm.) Well, these two plants (sadly the only two of this variety I planted this year) are not looking so good. A few weeks ago, I discovered aphids on the leaves, so I treated them for this, and now I have a fungal disease on the leaves.

So this morning, I showed grandkids how to prune a tomato plant, using a pair of small scissors to trim off all the yellow, curling, dried leaves and cutting off whole branches to open the plant up to some air. Airflow for tomato plants is critical. Then I showed them how to dispose of the sick branches by burning the cuttings so the disease would not spread. After we finished burning, we cleaned my tools with dawn dish soap and a splash of bleach in a bucket of water. Washing the garden tools is very important as the disease can be carried from plant to plant if not careful.

It was a great morning in the garden!

Electric Trikes Provide Older Riders Fun, Fitness and Safety

Dear Savvy Senior.

What can you tell me about electric trikes for semiseniors? I used to cycle a lot in my younger years but have some balance problems and don't trust myself on a twowheeler anymore. I've read that electric powered trikes are a good option for older riders but could use some help choosing one.

Unsteady Eddie

Dear Eddie,

Electric powered adult tricycles - also known as etrikes - are a great cycling

option for older adults with balance or stamina issues because they're safe and super fun to ride, and easy on an aging body. Here's what you should know, along with some tips to help you shop

Safer Cycling

If you're interested in cycling, but worry about falling or injuring yourself, e-trikes are a great choice because of the three-wheeled stability they provide. With a trike you can ride as slow as you want without ever losing your balance, which is very reassuring for most older riders.

E-trikes also come with a small electric powered motor to enhance the riding experience, so when you saddle

up and apply the throttle the motor will give you a boost when pedaling, or it will do all the work for you. This makes it much easier to whiz up hills and ride into headwinds without gassing yourself or taxing your knee joints. In addition, most adult e-trikes are also made with a low "step through" design making mounting and dismounting easier; they typically come with big tires that ensure a smooth ride; have ergonomic handlebars that are easy to reach and grip; and offer oversize seats (some even have backrests) for comfort and support.

There are many different types of adult e-trikes to choose from with prices ranging anywhere from around \$2,000 up to \$7,000. To shop for one, contact some bike shops in your area to see what they offer, or you may need to order one online. When shopping for an e-trike, pay special attention to the motor, which determines how fast it will go, and the battery, which determines how far it will go between charges. Most e-trikes can reach speeds of anywhere between 15 and 28 miles per hour, and typically go somewhere between 20 and 55 miles on a single charge, depending on how

much pedaling you do. Battery charge times will vary too, ranging anywhere from 3 to 8 hours.

How to Choose To help you figure out the right kind of e-trike for you, ask yourself how and where you plan to ride it. If you're primarily interested in a leisurely ride around the neighborhood for pleasure, fitness or running errands, an upright cruiser e-trike that has a rear cargo basket would be a nice choice. Some popular options in this category include: Addmotor's M-340 Electric Fat Trike and M-360 Semi-Recumbent Trike (both \$3,000, addmotor.com); Emojo Caddy Pro (\$2,900,emojobike.com); Sixthreezero EVRYjourney 250W Tricycle (\$2,200, sixthreezero.com); **EWheels** EW-29 (\$2,000, ewheelsdealers.com); and Buzz Cerana T (\$1,700, buzzbicycles.com).

Or, if you're looking to take longer road rides a recumbent e-trike may be a better option. These are aerodynamic, low-to-the-ground stretched-out frame trikes that allow you to recline with your legs positioned in front of you. Catrike (catrike. com) and TerraTrikes (terratrike.com) are two of the biggest U.S. companies that make recumbent tadpolestyle trikes (the two wheels are in front) and they both offer electric assist options at prices ranging from \$5,000 to \$,7000. There are also folding e-trikes, which are practical if you have limited home storage space or would like to take your trike with you when traveling. Some good options here include the Liberty Trike (\$1,600, libertytrike.com) and Eunorau New-Trike (\$2,500, eunorauebike.com).
